A delicious fish dinner will be served along with a silent auction conducted of merchandise, dinners and other items during the course of the evening.

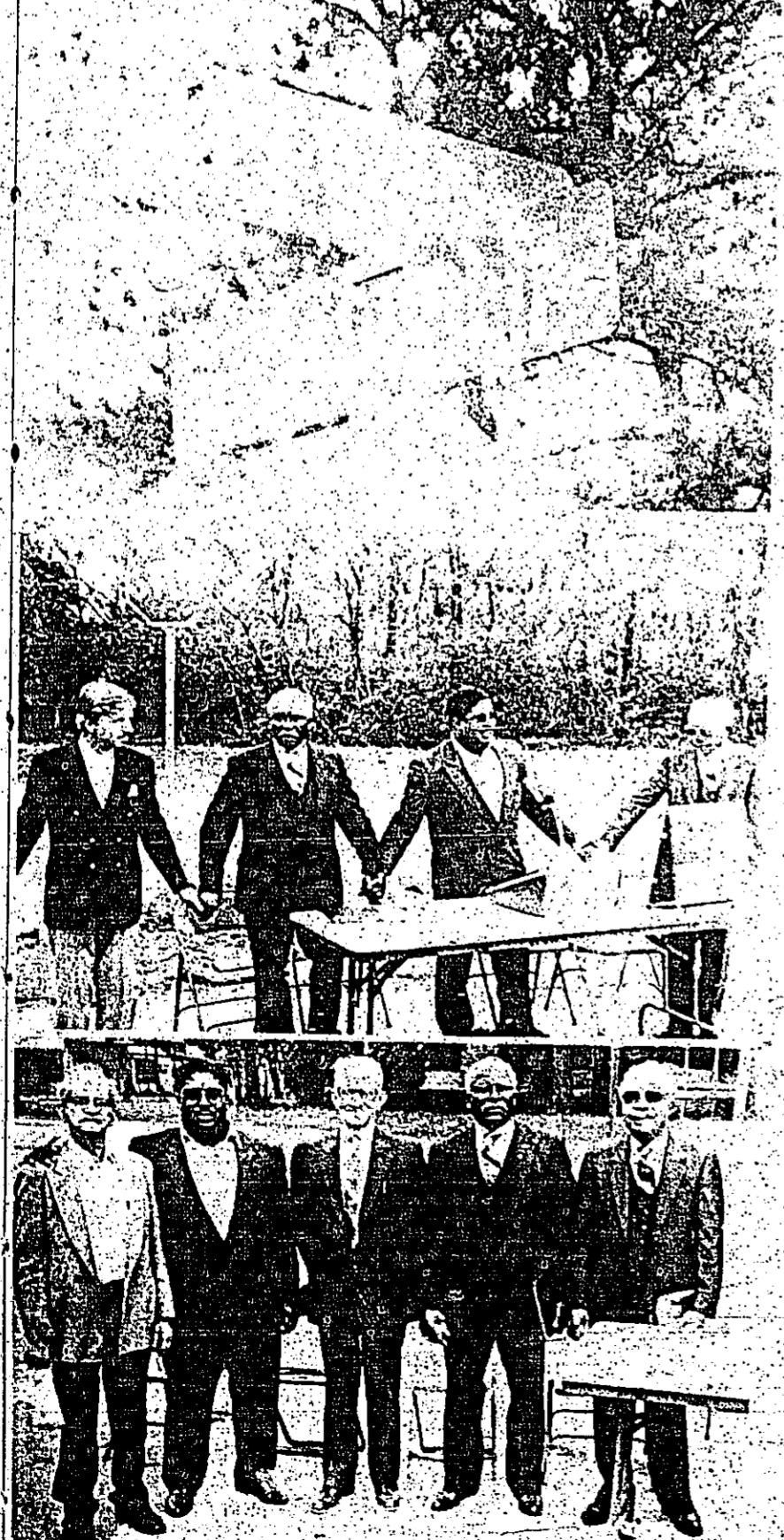
The public is urged to get their tickets early so they can participate. Take out dinners will be available as well as seated dining.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Street Dedication A "Success"

Woodville Mayor Tom Knapp welcomed the dignitaries to the dedication of Martin Luther King, Jr. Street On Monday by saying "His peaceful methods to get things done have been copied with the tearing down of walls, in the name of Freedom in Europe for example. He's done more to change things peacefully than any other human being in our time."

The featured speaker of the dedication was Amos Evans, the President of the Port Arthur National Association for the Advancement of Colored People NAACP. Amos was introduced by various Woodville dignitaries including Willie Jerue, The Rev. Fred Mattox and The Rev. Percy Lewis.

Evans told the group "We need to concentrate in this celebration of Martin Luther King, Jr., as a man of peace. We assemble to honor the memory of Martin Luther King. His perspective until his death was non-violence."

Evans spoke to the mostly black audience of about 300 and drew applause when he said, "The white man is not our problem. we are our own problem. We have to teach our kids self-esteem with motivation."

Evans referred to Martin Luther King as "A man of vision and we need to pay tribute and salute him for his vision of putting God first."

The ceremony began with the Woodville High School choir and ended with the unveiling of the new MLK Street sign.
