W.I.S.D. Field House Guttled

The field house of the Woodville High School burned late Sunday in a fire that lit up the Southeast quadrant of Woodville for several hours. The fire was discovered by a neighbor who called the Woodville Volunteer Fire Department at 8:52 p.m. The building which housed the equipment for the football, baseball and track teams burned despite the valiant efforts of the Woodville Volunteer Fire Dept. According to Tommy Weaver, financial officer of the Woodville Schools, the South end of the building was engulfed in flame when he and superintendent Dorman Jackson arrived behind the firemen. The flames quickly spread to the North end of the building.

It took one hour for the fire to be brought under control by the 25 Volunteer firemen and three hours before it was completely extinguished according to Fire Chief Alva Cook. All available fire equipment was in service and 125,000 gallons of water was used in the effort put out the fire in the frame building.

One fireman, Tommy Shane, received the only injury, he suffered a nail puncture, was treated and released at Tyler County Hospital.

According to Fire Marshall, Otis Fortenberry, there was no indication of arson in the blaze, but a routine investigation will be conducted by the State arson investigator into the source of the fire.

The adjuster from the Texas Association of School Boards insurance program, Steve Boyles, Tuesday set the amount of damages to the building as between \$85,000 and \$100,000. The policy according to Tommy Weaver is for replacement cost was for \$81,000 for the frame concrete finished building and \$45,000 on the contents. The Building

team were also ordered, and according to Larry Pickett, High School principal, the baseball team will play next week. The 50 plus students who are athletes in sixth and seventh period athletic classes are presently in regular classes and in the gymnasium. Further arrangements are being completed for the period before a new facility is available.

Two Injured In Fred Fracas

A family disturbance late Thursday in the Fred Community left two persons injured while Tyler County Sheriff's Deputy Tracy Ferguson received "trauma" to his chest while reportedly trying to subdue a Fred man, Michael Anthony Reeves, 31. Reeves was wounded in a gunfight with a host of law enforcement officers who came to the assistance of

Ferguson who was investigating a family disturbance call from Maxine Reeves, mother of Reeves who lives on Gore Loop Road. Reeves was charged in connection in the incident with three counts of attempted capital murder.

The disturbance allegedly began when Mrs. Reeves was trying to get her son out of her house while his wife, Teresa, was hiding in the woods

behind the home officers reports indicate when Ferguson arrived at the home about 8:45 p.m. Mrs. Reeves asked Ferguson to talk to her son, but to no avail, then Mrs. Reeves, according to Sheriff's reports, shouted, "Reeves had a bottle, and he has a gun." Ferguson, apparently tried to talk to the man again but he brandished a gun and then according to witnesses at the scene aimed the gun at the deputy, and then Ferguson fired striking the man in the wrist, the man threw down the gun and Ferguson followed the man into the back of the trailer, scuffling and fighting, trying to get handcuffs on Reeves. The fighting continued and Ferguson was able to call for assistance, but still had only one hand cuffed.

Chief Deputy Sam Bible and Mark Collins, Tyler County Game Warden arrived first at the scene, they were quickly joined by Woodville Police officers Randy Rieder and Alex Pellerin, District Attorney Pat Hardy, James

Lee Chapman, John Hensberger and Ray Stewart of the Sheriff's department, Constable Pat. 4, Steve Fountain, Department of Public Safety officers, Mike Seales and Stuart Summerlin.

Bible and Summerlin, from behind a vehicle reportedly tried to talk with the man, but were unable to make him throw down his shotgun, which he had barricaded with him in the trailer. Deputy Bible called for Sheriff Gary Hennigan to call the Reeves on the phone, which he did not help. The officers then asked for assistance of Reeves' wife, talked her into coming out of the woods to assist them, she was apparently unable to talk the man into surrendering. Reeves asked for his wife to come in the trailer. The officers refused to allow her to enter.

Reeves fired his shotgun at officers near the end of the trailer, but toward the ground, then reportedly fired a second shot toward Deputy Bible and DPS

officer Summerlin, the officers then returned fire at the man in the trailer. After 30 seconds of gunfire Bible yelled "cease fire" and when the shooting stopped Reeves apparently called for help and crawled out of the trailer on his stomach, but when he reached the officers he allegedly began to fight again. Reports indicate it took several officers to handcuff the man. Reeves suffered a wound to his foot, thigh and groin.

Reeves was transported to Tyler County Hospital and was then transferred to a Beaumont Hospital and returned to Tyler County Hospital, according to the Sheriff's office Reeves will be hospitalized for several more days. When Reeves is released he will be jailed in Tyler County Justice Center Jail. Reeves was denied bail by J.P. Pct. 4 Roy Drake.

Deputy Ferguson was treated for a bruised chest at Tyler County Hospital and released. Deputy Bible and DPS officer Summerlin were also treated and released.

W.I.S.D. "Success Definition Must Change"

In the past, many researchers defined student academic success only in terms of the achievement of the ablest individuals. Others argued that educational success requires instilling values, providing universal literacy, and teaching basic skills competencies. Today, with more than 30 percent of the nation's young people at risk of dropping out of school, there is a growing consensus that past definitions of academic success must change.

A report from the U.S. Department of Education, "Rethinking Education: A Report from the National Commission on Excellence in Education," states that the current definition of success is too narrow. It suggests that success should be defined in terms of the achievement of all students, not just the top performers.

The report argues that the current system of education is designed to identify and reward the few students who are most academically gifted. It suggests that the system should be redesigned to provide a high-quality education for all students, regardless of their ability.

The report also suggests that the definition of success should be expanded to include not only academic achievement, but also the development of character, social skills, and a sense of responsibility. It suggests that the system should be redesigned to provide a well-rounded education that prepares students for life in a democratic society.

Texas Employment Commission Offers Variety Of Services To County Residents, Businesses

The Texas Employment Commission office in Woodville offers a variety of services to local businesses, according to an employment interviewer with that agency.

Etta Pettijohn, employment interviewer with TEC, said that the agency can refer potential employees whose qualifications fit the needs of an employer, and can provide both temporary and permanent, as well as part-time and full-time personnel.

"A lot of employers in Tyler County may not realize that we do have a TEC office in Woodville," said Pettijohn. She added that when construction on the Gib Lewis Prison Unit began, TEC placed a mobile office at the site to help provide subcontractors working on the unit with both skilled and unskilled labor.

"Hundreds of Tyler County residents have gone to work since construction on the unit began," said Pettijohn. "And the majority of the subcontractors here have told me that our services have helped make their job much easier."

According to Pettijohn, TEC can coordinate hiring when an employer is short-handed or in a bind as well as provide a pool of qualified applicants for future hiring.

"The response from the local employers presently using our office has been good, and it indicates a need for a permanent office here," Pettijohn said. Therefore, our home office in Lufkin is considering opening a permanent office here.

The key to that decision is based on cooperation from local businesses, she said. If the agency has enough local businesses' hire through the TEC office, the probability of a permanent office here is much greater.

Having TEC here can serve a number of purposes, said Pettijohn. It could help in the effort to induce new business and industry to the area.

"TEC can provide to potential new business and industry statistics on what kind of labor pool and what type of skilled labor is available," said Pettijohn.

Pettijohn added that she urges local business owners to feel free to call her if they have any questions regarding TEC's services that are available, or if they need employees.

"We want to work together with business and industry here in an effort to put Tyler Counties to work, and to provide qualified, capable employees to help our local businesses grow," she said.

Weekly Column

Small Business Development Center Offers Everything From 'Advertising' To 'Employees'

Sooner or later you, as a small business person, will be making judgments about the performance of your employees. Your business will grow to the degree that new people will come on board and established employees will be promoted. Those are happy days because it is good news to those workers promoted and to their families that they are progressing. It is good news to you because it marks an incremental step in your company's progress.

Unfortunately, when one employee is promoted that may mean another has been passed over. In such a case you must not assume that things will go on as usual or that all those passed over for the promotion will take things in the same way.

To find out how those who have not been chosen for a promotion feel, ask them. Find a quiet time when you can both talk at leisure. Create a time when you can talk together with few interruptions and in confidence. Ask them to openly express how they feel about the decision and its effects. By listening to what is being said you will find out something of how that employee feels. By listening "between the lines" you may get an idea of just how this circumstance may affect their future performance. It will certainly help you to determine how you might deal with the situation.

Importantly, focus on the contributions that they are making to the firm and their importance to the achievement of the goals of the firm. Positively remind the employee of past successes and the contributions make in those situations. Reflect on circumstances in the firm and the value that he will be in those coming days. Do not make promises which you cannot or may not keep to relieve tension or to compensate.

Focus your conversation with the second employee on organizational goals and how he might be able to fulfill those goals. Perhaps there is a new task or series of tasks or goals for which he would like to take responsibility.

It is possible that ill feelings concerning this promotion are really indicative of deeper problems that he has with the circumstances in his job. This would be a fine time to explore those feelings and begin to find ways to remedy them. Similarly, you employee may have applied for the promotion because it was one of only a few opportunities that he believed available. If the situations were different he may not have wanted the promotion at all, but would have preferred other duties. This meeting can help you determine that if true.

In any event, the temptation will be to avoid an employee who temporarily appears hostile or is antagonistic. To do so or to give the employee "time to cool off" will save nothing. Keep the lines of communication open. Make time to talk with him until new lines of communication are opened and avenues for service to the firm are opened. To avoid them may make them think you have no interest in their well being or productivity on the job. If you have questions concerning

Gib Lewis Unit Will Open Soon

What has the Gib Lewis Prison Unit meant to Tyler County during its construction?
 According to Etna Pettijohn, employment interviewer for the Texas Employment Commission, it has meant jobs for Tyler County residents-jobs that weren't available in this area before.
 "Hiring for prison construction jobs peaked in the summer months," said Pettijohn. "From April through June of 1989 the number of jobs available at the prison site steadily grew. Then, in July and August they peaked-when in July over 70 people went to work, and in August over 90."
 According to Pettijohn, the majority of these jobs went to Texas County residents. In some cases, certain skilled labor was not available in this county, so some employees had to be brought in from out-of-county.
 "This project has had an effect not only on Tyler County, but also on surrounding counties," she added. "People from Jasper, Livingston, Lufkin and other nearby areas also benefited from construction of this unit."





No-Alcohol Cough and Sore Throat Remedies

And taking decongestants at night and early in the morning will help stop the build-up of mucus in the throat from a cold or postnasal drip. Remember that any cough that lasts more than one week and persists even after taking medication requires doctor attention.

Q. What is the most common cause of sore throats?

A. Although sore throats can be caused by pollutants in the air, allergens in house dust and the dry heat prevalent in winter-time, the most common cause is viral or bacterial infection.

Viruses cause 80 to 90 percent of sore throats. Since viruses don't respond to antibiotics, you must wait for the body to heal itself by developing antibodies that destroy the infection.


