Archeology Week At Village

WOODVILLE-In recognition of Archeology Awareness Week, April 7-14, Heritage Village Museum will present a series of special archeological programs and exhibits throughout the month, beginning on Saturday, April 14.

On that date, at 2:00 p.m., James Corbin, Professor of Archeology at Stephen F. Austin University, will talk about the significance of recent archeological finds in

Woodville. The site was uncovered in early February during a survey made by the Water Development Board prior to the digging of a new waste water line for Keller Industries.

What the Water Board archeologist saw in his first few shovels full of dirt, taken from the site near Tyler County's Turkey Creek, was enough to call in Dr. Corbin. In addition to his teaching duties at SFA in Nacogdoches, Corbin has been serving as

Traveling Exhibit At Village

People have been exploring and settling Texas for at least 12,000 years, yet written records depict less than 500 years of this exciting history.

Archeology in Texas, a traveling exhibit produced by The University of Texas Institute of Texas Cultures at San Antonio, explores how archeological research helps Texans of today gain an understanding of the state's first inhabitants.

Museum from April 20 to May 19, 1990. Texas history and material culture have been revealed through various archeological sites around the state. Dark stains in the soil indicating house patterns and hearths and relics such as stone tools and broken pottery discovered at the sites represent a precious irreplaceable record of the past. The exhibit emphasizes the responsibility of everyone to protect such artifacts and guard their historical im-

portance because they are such an integral part of Texas heritage. In addition, Archeology in Texas explains how to recognize a historical site and outlines the proper techniques for reporting the information to the Texas Archeological Society.

Earth Day At Martin Dies Park

Officials and volunteers at Martin Dies, Jr. State Park are preparing to celebrate the 20th anniversary of Earth Day on April 22. Activities at the Hen House Ridge Unit will begin at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday. Superintendent John Yarbrough hopes that many volunteers and nature enthusiasts will join the State Park System in celebrating efforts to protect our natural resources.

Earth Day, 1990 reminds us all that twenty years ago, the government took steps to clean up the environment with amendments to the Clean Air Act and the organization of the Environmental Protection Agency.

Activities are planned to clean and beautify the park and to educate on environmental issues. Texas Parks and Wildlife Corps of Engineers, National Park Service and Jasper Scout Troup 932 have worked to compile several activities for park visitors. Scout groups from Jasper, Woodville and Beaumont will plant trees in the park and distribute loblolly pine seedlings to visitors. Volunteers will demonstrate proper planting techniques, also local wildlife

rehabilitator Carol Philip will display techniques to rescue injured wild animals. State Game Warden Mark Collins will be on hand to advise on the various hunting and fishing techniques effective in protecting our natural resources. Visitors will be able to participate in bird watching tours, assisted by TPWD's Randy Hilton. Recycling demonstration by Champion International and the City of Woodville can also be seen.

Judge Sends Duhon Hearing Back To School Board

Board was squelched Thursday, April 12, 1990, when Judge Earl "Smoky" Stover ruled that the hearing should be heard in Colmesneil by the Board of Trustees. Superintendent

Larry Stinson said that Judge Stover lifted two injunctions against the District which had kept them from holding meetings regarding Duhon. He said that a hearing on the pro-

posed termination of Duhon will be held as soon as attorneys from both parties can agree on a date. Duhon has sued the Colmesneil School District for 1.2 million dollars.

GSU Employees Start Paper Recycling Project

covers the difference between your down payment and the amount of down payment the lender typically requires on the same loan. Check with your lender, who obtains the insurance, on how the premiums could work for you, where it typically costs less than a commercial bank. SRG&T seeks a permanent rate adjustment to the wholesale rates charged to its member cooperatives, Houston County Electric Cooperative, Jasper-Newton Electric Cooperative, and Sam Houston Electric Cooperative. The rate adjustment will result in an increase over adjusted test year revenues of \$4,935,550 or 11.5%. However, the rate adjustment will maintain power costs at current levels. SRG&T's permanent rate change request is related to changes in the cost of service resulting from a purchase of a 7% undi-

vided ownership share in the Big Cajun No. II, Unit 1 (Cajun Unit) coal generating unit. This unit will be jointly owned with Cajun Electric Power Cooperative, Inc. (CEPCO). The permanent rates are proposed to become effective 35 days after filing. However, the rates are proposed to be implemented on the same day that SRG&T closes on the purchase of the Cajun Unit. The closing is currently scheduled for May 29, 1990. At the present time, SRG&T is purchasing an equivalent amount of capacity and energy from CEPCO (Firm Power Purchase) and the costs of the purchase are being recovered through existing rates through the purchased power cost recovery mechanism. When SRG&T generates more of its power requirements, it substitutes the power it is generating for the power that previously had been purchased from other utilities and paid for through a purchased power cost recovery provision. The reduction in purchased power costs is automatically flowed through the purchased power cost recovery provision, but the equivalent costs associated with the ownership and operation and maintenance of the Cajun Unit are not flowed through or recovered. For this reason, SRG&T needs a rate adjustment effective as described above. SRG&T has also proposed adjustments to its economic de-

velopment, Contract Load Growth (CLG) rate. These proposed changes in the economic development rate are a result of changes in the terms and conditions between SRG&T and a wholesale power supplier. Generally, the proposed incentive rate is slightly lower than the present incentive rate and the availability of rate is proposed to be liberalized. The proposed change in permanent rates results in no change in the cost of power to its members on a mills/kWh or cents/kWh basis when compared to the revenues under present rates that includes a continuation of the present CEPCO Firm Power Purchase.
