The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees approved the 1990-91 school calendar Tuesday, April 24, 1990 at their regular Board Meeting. Students will start classes August 27, 1990, and graduation will be May 29, 1991. Scheduled holidays are September 3, November 21-26, December 20-January 1, February 25-March 1, and March 27-April 1.

The Board approved a request from the Warren Community Volunteer Fire Department for use of the Junior High Cafeteria for a Bar-B-Que and Cake Auction May 19-20, 1990.

Pat Long thanked the Administration and Board for allowing her to go to Washington D. C. where, through the Texas State Teachers Association, she was able to have impact with 200 other schools. She also had the opportunity to meet with Representatives on the Childcare Bill and Education Bill.

## Tortello In TALL Program

Sue Tortello of Woodville has been selected as a member of the new Texas Agricultural Lifetime Leadership program. Dr. L. S. Pope, who coordinates the program for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, says that "TALL" is designed to improve the leadership skills of young agriculturalists from across the state.

"TALL provides a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to build leadership potential in young men and women in the 25-40 year age range," Pope said. "We must recognize that agriculture is changing and that leaders of tomorrow will face different challenges from today. They must understand the complex nature of society and be aware of a broad range of issues facing agriculture."

The two-year program includes nine sessions within the state, plus trips to California, Washington, D.C., and an out-of-the-state experience. Sessions last three days to one week and touch on the major issues facing agriculture and the food and fiber industry.

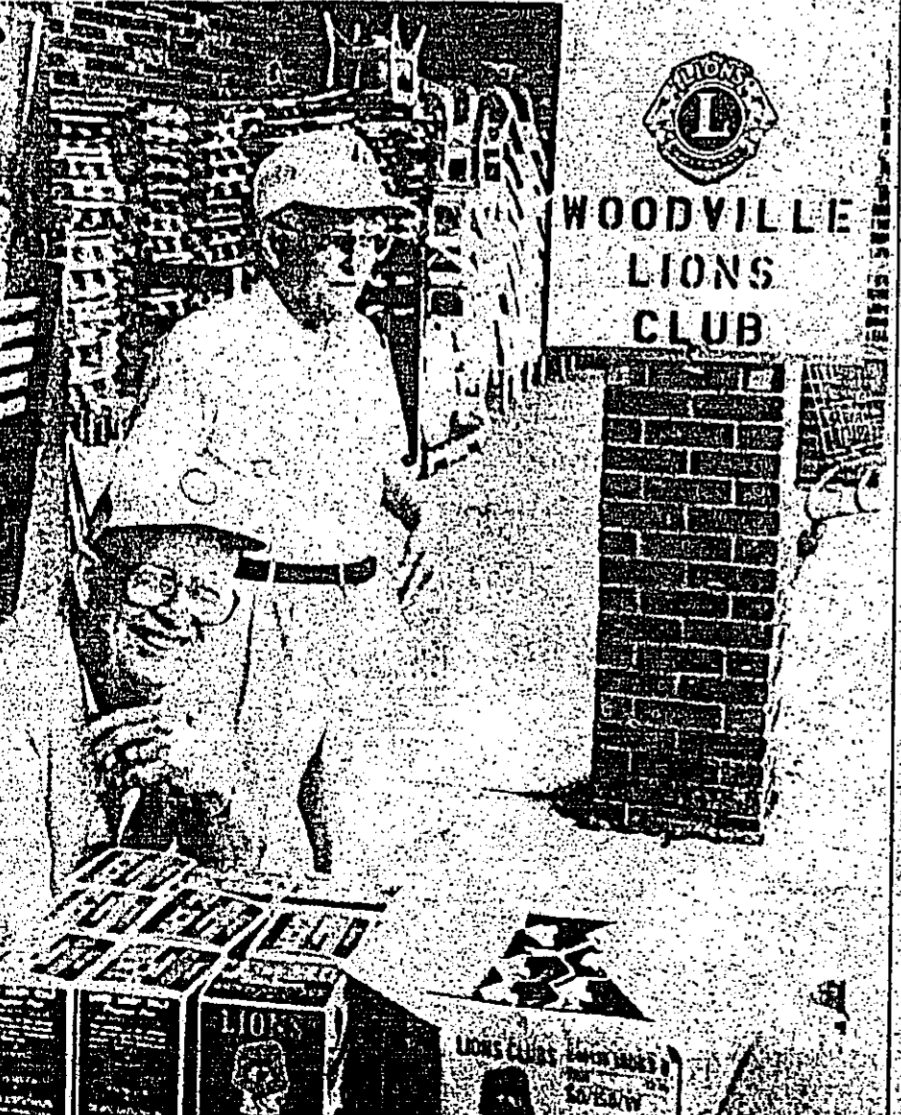

Mountain director of the Heritage Regions Program, Heritage Cantada. Another Railroad line has re-opened that runs from Williams, Arizona to the South rim of the Grand Canyon. This is about 64 miles each way, and it is called, "The Grand Canyon Railroad." It has been idle for about 40 years, but has brought out the tourist. It is another steam engine with the steam whistle and all else that goes with it. The engineer can blow a "high ball" with the steam whistle that make your hair raise on your head. "Santa Fe" had a line to the Grand Canyon but it failed in 1968. Depending on the number of people to ride it will make two or three trips a day. Two steam engines are becoming popular again. There are two or three in Colorado and one up in East Texas that runs between Palestine and Rock. This is a steam engine here in the heart of Central Park on display but a high fence was installed around it. It had a drive wheel on each side and a "coal pull" a big load. Steam was used in the engines' whistles, heat and to drill oil wells. The big steam engines were called "Ironhorses." The steam engine train that use to run between Colmesneil and Trinity was called the "W.B.T. & S." which stood for Waco, Beaumont, Trinity, & Sabine Pass but better known as wobble, bobble, turn over and stop. It was not a fast motor (the freight trains as they say you could get on the engine and go off when you got to the Billums Creek bottom and kill a mass of squirrels and catch the caboose, as it came by. I would like to see someone bring out a steam train from retirement and have a run from Beaumont to Rockland with a rest stop in Hillister. It is a good track and laying idle would be a fun and added attraction for our part of the Country. Scott Lemons would make a good engineer. Frank Grimes a good fireman and Woodrow Davis a good conductor. "All Aboard. All Can't get a board get a plank." Hang in there folks. Walls to go.

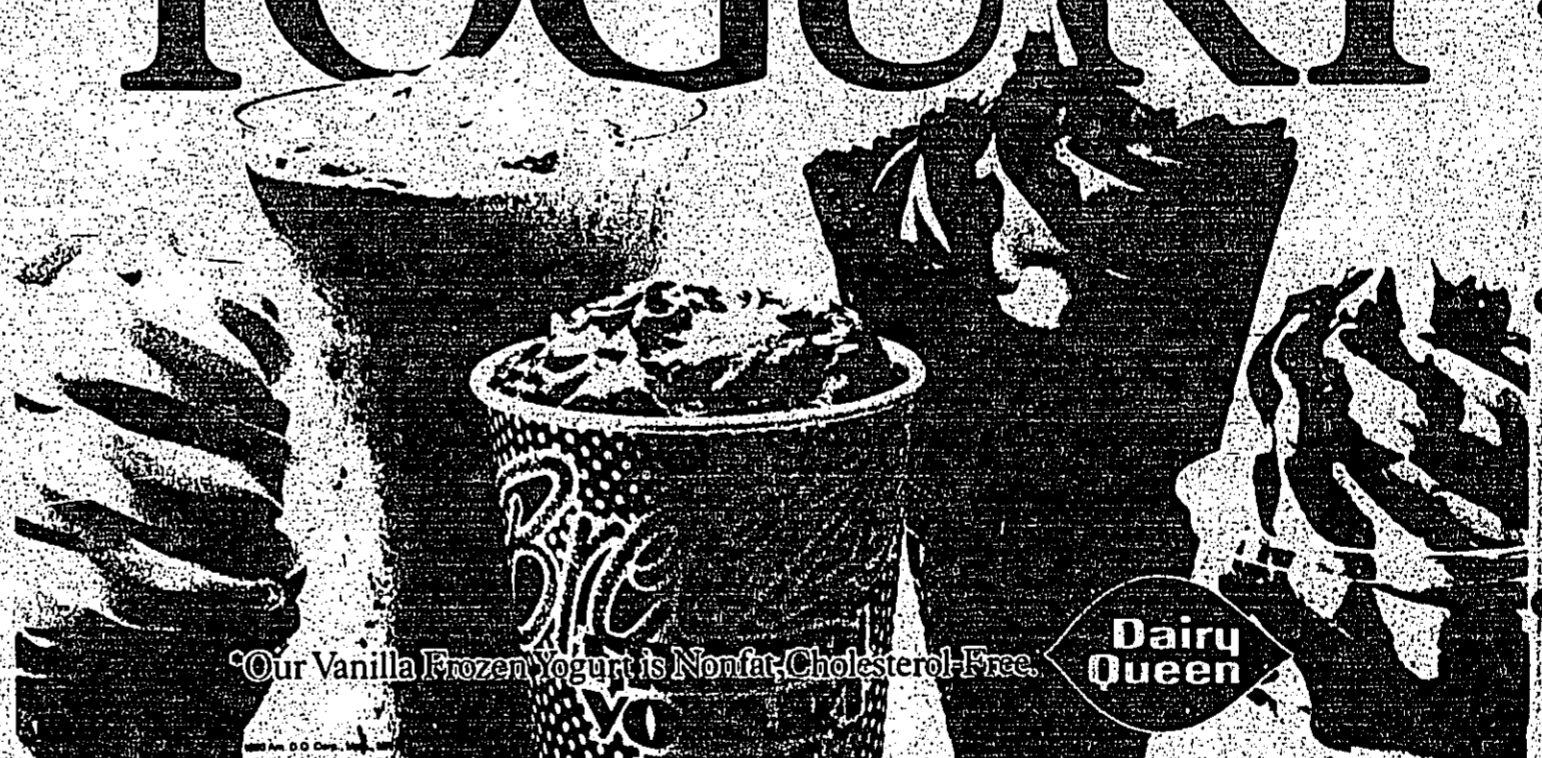
