By Gib Lewis Hightower Appointed To Senate Bill 41 Committee

House Speaker Gib Lewis has appointed State Representative Allen Hightower, D-Huntsville, to the 10 member conference committee on SB 41, the special session appropriation bill.

Legislators are now in a fifth 30-day special session since the regular session ended last May. It is the third devoted to solving a Texas Supreme Court ruling that the state must substantially equalize the funding available to rich and poor school districts alike.

Earlier this week the House and Senate approved a similar \$555 million school finance bill the Governor vetoed last special session. On Wednesday, May 9, 1990, the House passed SB 41 which sets out part of the funding mechanism to implement the school finance bill.

"This conference committee will strive to compromise the differences between the two versions of SB 41. I am pleased to have been selected as a conferee on this committee. What we do with this legislation will affect all Texas schoolchildren," stated Representative Hightower. He continued by replying, "We have the opportunity to provide for the future of our schoolchildren with this legislation and I am hopeful to have a bill satisfactory to both houses and ready for passage by mid-week."

Haley Announces OK \$1.4 Million Federal Narcotics Grant

Third District State Senator Bill Haley announced the Texas Narcotics Control Program has awarded \$1.4 million in Federal grants to Hardin County, Nacogdoches County and the City of Palestine for new or expanded drug law enforcement programs.

Governor Clements approved the grants on April 30, said Senator Haley. "These resources of the Texas Narcotics Control Program are targeted toward producing cooperative efforts among agencies and local governments to crack down on both rural manufacturing and smuggling of drugs and their urban sale and distribution."

A \$330,517 grant for 1990-91 sets up the Southeast Texas Narcotics & Intelligence Task Force to serve Hardin, Jasper, Newton and Tyler Counties, to coordinate the work of several agencies to improve the rate of arrest and prosecution of those illegally growing, transporting, or possessing controlled substances. The agencies participating have not previously had full-time narcotics officers assigned to drug investigation.

Other grants establish or continue programs in the City of Palestine and in Nacogdoches County.

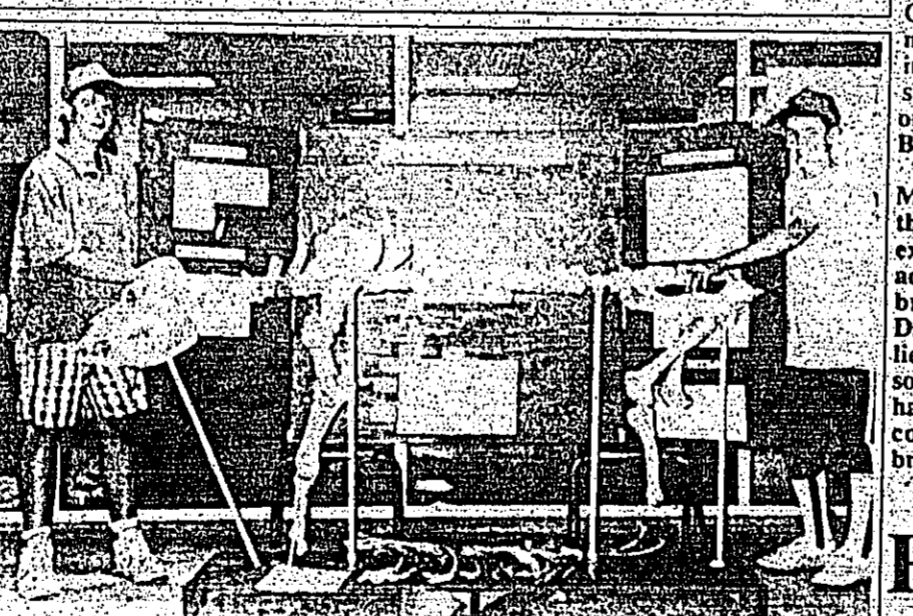
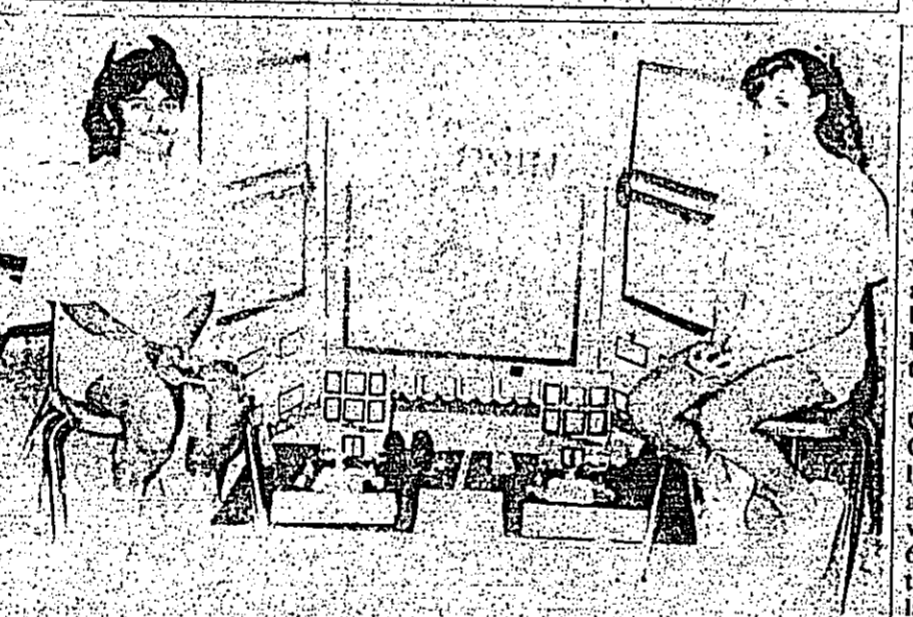
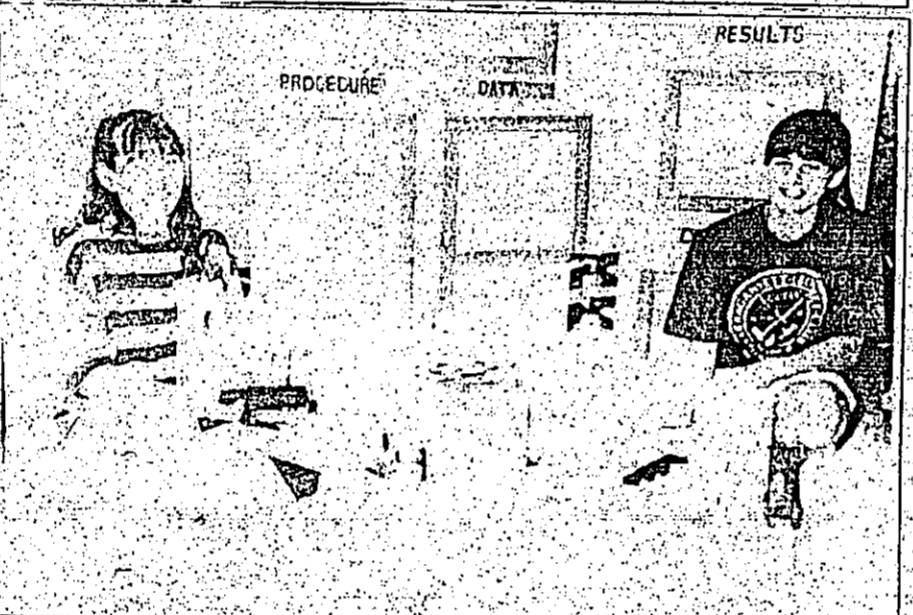
"Texas Narcotics Control Program through which these East Texas Projects are funded has produced 13,584 drug-related arrests since it began in 1987," Senator Haley said. "This program has removed drugs worth over \$714 million in street value from Texas communities. Contributing to this success is the cooperation the program encourages between local, State and Federal law enforcement agencies in Texas."

City Council Meeting Monday

'Water On At Prison' City Manager Reports

Woodville City Fathers heard a long awaited report from City Manager Walt Davis that the City of Woodville had completed its contract with the Gib Lewis Prison Unit by delivering water on Monday.

Davis told the council that there was still a pressure test or two to make, but the job was completed.

In other action Mayor Tom Knapp and Councilman Dr. Malcolm Radford took their oath of office with new City Councilman Don Shaw. Myra Odom conducted the swearing in ceremony.

In related business the council agreed to issue a resolution thanking Councilman Gordon Anderson for his service to the City of Woodville.

Texas State Highway Department officials Richard Cardwell, assistant District Engineer of Beaumont, and Paul Cook, Resident Engineer of Jasper, were on hand to accept a petition from Woodville Mayor Tom Knapp regarding a lower speed limit request on South Hwy. 69.

"We have a very severe problem with speed limits and for that reason we have done research to substantiate our request," Knapp said.

Cardwell said he would study the proposal adding, "An unjustifiable lowering of the speed limit won't do any good in the world."

Resident Engineer Cook reported to the Council that bids will be let, "Sometime in February," for a 4-lane undivided highway south on 69 from The First National Bank with turning lanes for a distance of 1.25 to 2.25 miles. Cook said a widening to meet a four-lane status would also occur on the Turkey Creek Bridge.

Cook assured City Manager Walt Davis that there would be no undue expense to the city in adapting to their new bridge configuration. Davis had indicated earlier that there would be some costs that would be hard for the city to bear in connection with the bridge construction.

Someday Woodville

will be bypassed," Cook said, "but it may not be for 20 years. The decision is made by the highway commission, and they won't make the decision until the need is clearly demonstrated."

In other street business the council approved Phase 8 of the Woodville streets construction plan of \$330,400 to the Porter Company who is also constructing Phase 7.

In other business the Woodville City Council heard a request from Bobby Gibson, owner of Tyler County Garbage Disposal, who reportedly has 300 customers and services the communities of Spurger, Fred and Hillister. Gibson asked the council if he could install Curbside Recycling in the City of Woodville. Mayor Tom Knapp asked that the question be held till a

workshop meeting could be held on all solid waste considerations. Sue Tortello reported to the council of setbacks regarding the Recycle Saturday Program but said the group would keep trying to identify plans to continue improving the cities program.

"We'll be missing out on a good thing if we let this one slide," said Councilman Billy Rose. Tortello told the council "This one is getting to be a very big baby," and new thinking is needed from the city council on how I should proceed."

In other business the council reinstated Mayor Pro-Tem Doug Tolbert to that office.

approved the April financial statement, heard a request from Mrs. Foxworth for city services on property that has not been adequately decided to the City Council, said the would consider the matter once in receipt of proper deed, newly elected Councilmember Don Shaw was appointed to the Deep East Texas Council of

Governments. heard an engineers report which suggests the demolition of the Old Scott School building; tabled discussion of Drainage ditch east of Reid Street on Hwy 287.

heard petitioners requesting city water services on the old Doucette Road. Councilmen told the group to make the request of the City.

Mayor Knapp asked council consideration of possibly curbing a portion of Reid Street. So it would become a better thoroughfare.

council heard reports of someone dumping trash on South Pecan Street by the bridge. It was decided to police the area more closely to abate the problem.

council moved to publish the first reading of an ordinance governing the operation other than that of pick-up trucks upon the streets of Woodville. The ordinance suggested reads as follows:

"It shall be unlawful for any person to drive and operate a truck, other than a pickup truck, or for the owner of such a vehicle to allow the same to be driven and operated upon any street of the City of Woodville, Texas, other than Magnolia Street, Pine Street, Bluff Street, provided, however, that no such vehicle shall be prohibited from using any street in the city for the purpose of going directly to or from any residential or commercial establishment abutting on such a city street for the purpose of delivering or picking up materials or merchandise at such establishment. It is provided, however, that any operator or owner of such a truck being operated for the purpose of delivering or picking up such materials or merchandise shall be liable to the City for any damage done by such truck to any street, bridge or culvert in the City and the use of any such street for such purpose shall be conclusive evidence that the operator as well as the owner of such truck have agreed to pay and will pay, jointly or severally, the costs of repairing all such damages upon demand therefor made by the City.

Rites held For Ruth Gillespie, 85; First Woman District Clerk Here

First woman district clerk, Ruth Gillespie died early May 9, 1990 in Tyler County Hospital at the age of 85.

Active in the political life of Tyler County and Woodville since 1945, she served 18 years as district clerk under four district judges. During her years in the courthouse, she witnessed the first woman juror and the first black juror.

The first woman grand jury foreman was appointed by District Judge H. A. Coe during her time.

Born in San Antonio to Emma Tyler and John T. Gillespie, Ruth moved to

Woodville with her parents and two stepbrothers, the late Justice Clyde Earl Smith, Supreme Court of Texas, and the late Clifford B. Smith. The family took residence in the old Central

Hotel better known as the Gillespie Hotel. It later was known as the Eden Boarding House when the Widow Emma married Dr. John A. Eden. The hotel guests often included jurors held over

for a trial across the highway at the courthouse. Thus Ruth's political association began.

Vashaw Honored For Academic Achievement

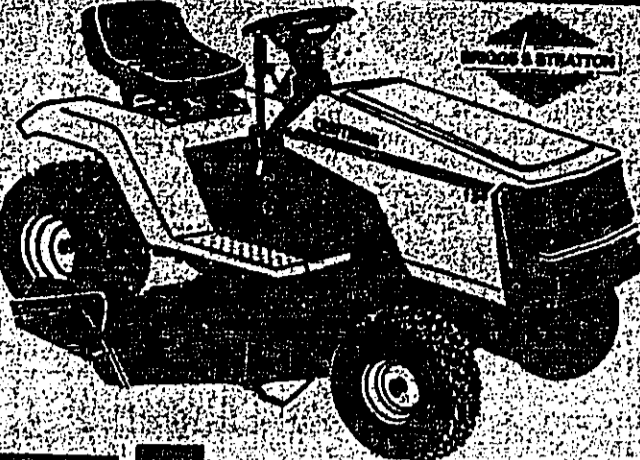

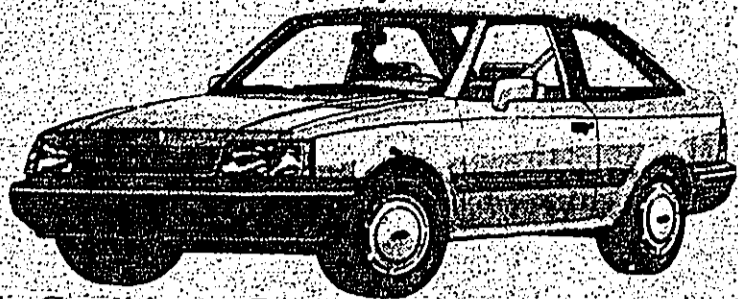

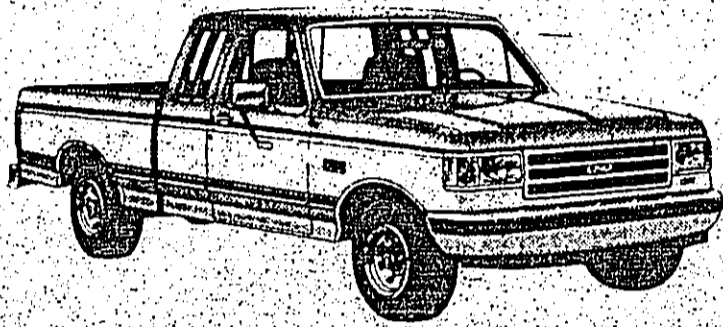
