DETDA To Meet

Russell Davis, former mayor of Jackson, Miss., and one of the South's leading experts on economic development, will address the membership meeting of the Deep East Texas Development Association in Livingston Friday, May 25.

The meeting will begin at 10 a.m. in the Park Inn on U. S. 59 south of Livingston.

Davis, a business consultant who has developed successful economic development plans for a number of communities in the South, will discuss methods in which a community can bring a new industry and business.

He will also discuss the Alabama Economic Information Center, a model for economic development in Birmingham, Ala. The project is similar to one proposed for East Texas under the sponsorship of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments, the Deep East Texas Development Association, and others.

"For communities in Deep East Texas interested in economic development, Mr. Davis' speech will be interesting and instructive," said Tony Bennett of Diboll, president of DETDA.

W.I.S.D. Rejects Field House Bids

The Woodville Independent School District Board of Trustees voted Tuesday, May 15, 1990, unanimously to reject all five bids submitted for construction of a new Field House for the district. The bids, which ranged from \$242,000.00 to \$289,750.00, were substantially higher than the Board expected. Ernest Musick, Architect with Musick Associates of Lufkin, Texas, recommended that the Board consider other options of building the Field House. The Board will consider a modular unit facility built at the site of the old Field House which burned. The Board expects to meet in the near future to make a decision on the Field House.
