Economic Consultant: 'Hire Ball of Fire'

Livingston—An economic development consultant has told Deep East Texas residents they must develop a regional approach if they are to be successful in luring new businesses and industry to the area.

Russell Davis, former mayor of Jackson, Miss., and founder of the nationally-acclaimed Jackson 2000 Approach to economic development, spoke at the monthly meeting of the Deep East Texas Development Association here.

Davis said the development of a strong regional cooperative approach makes "a lot more sense" than 11 different Chamber of Commerce economic development programs.

"If all of your cities, your counties and Chambers will put their resources together, you will stand a much better chance of succeeding," he said.

Davis also offered these other suggestions for economic development planners:

- "Hire a ball of fire who knows how to talk to prospects, and who will look for opportunities."
- "Cultivate relationships with your state agencies in the state capital. They have tremendous resources which can be at your disposal."
- "Make decisions quickly. Don't delay or let your decisions drag on until you become too late to serve a prospect."
- "Survey your existing industries. Find out how their suppliers and contractors can fit into your plans."
- "Contact successful people who come from your area, where they have roots. Get them interested in their home towns."
- "Cultivate the visitors who use your golf courses, lakes and retirement areas. They are often retired corporate executive who can open gates for you."
- "Capitalize on your natural heritage and the things that are not familiar to today's generations. Make Deep East Texas more attractive to visitors."
- "Urge your banks to set up a venture pool of capital to serve the startup needs of new businesses and industries."
- "Work for the improvement of your educational institutions. Support a system that rewards achievement."

In connection with Davis' speech, Dr. Kent Adair of Stephen F. Austin State University described the workings of an economic resource information center being proposed for Deep East Texas under the sponsorship of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments and the Deep East Texas Development Association.



Prison Nearing Completion

Official estimated completion date "as of Monday May 28" for the Gib Lewis 1,000-man prison unit is now July 31, according to Texas Department of Corrections Major Chris Bell who told THE BOOSTER as of presstime Tuesday that items to be completed in the unit are mainly detail finish work involving craft trades, Bell said that approximately one-third of the support personnel had been hired but that corrections personnel won't be brought on until closer to the completion date.

WISD Board Hears Parents Complaints

Parents of four students in the Drivers Education program at Warren High School met in separate Executive Session Hearings under a "personnel heading" on Tuesday May 22, 1990 with Coach Mike Ellis, Superintendent Bertie Rae Yates, School Attorney Jerry Hatton, and seven W.I.S.D. School Trustees.

According to Parents Donna Callaway, Madella Higgins and Frances Gober in comments to "The Booster" following the executive session hearings, all had children who apparently failed the Drivers Education Class the fifth marking period. All three students were in the band and missed two parades and two contests, they alleged, as a result of missing Ellis' class. According to the three students who met in the executive session with their parents and who were interviewed following the meeting by "The Booster," they were "absent" from class and missed work. The students said they asked Coach Ellis several times for the work but reportedly to no avail.

The parents said they could not understand how students who had always made "A's" and "B's" could fail Drivers Education. Nineteen students failed the class during the fifth marking period according to official records, Coach Ellis, reportedly denied that students ever asked for their make up work.

When the board returned to open session a motion was made to deny the parents the relief they requested and instructed them to turn all their complaints over to the superintendent for further consideration. The motion passed with a 4-2 vote. Voting against the motion were Board members Paul Hickman and Julia Greenwood.

During Open Forum, Joe Ventrello questioned the financial statement presented for the Board's approval. According to Ventrello, checks #12259 through #12406 and checks #1449, 1453, 1454 and 1455 were missing from the statement and checks #6002, 6003, 6004 and 6046 were double entered. Ventrello was told that checks #12259 thru #12406 were payroll checks and did not show on the statement, and that checks #6002, 6003, 6004 and 6046 were voided. According to bookkeeper Ann Reese, the double entries were the result of punching in the wrong number. LaVern Hatton, who works in the central office, met with Ventrello during the break for Executive Session. Ventrello reported to the Board that all checks were accounted for, but that his position suit was that all checks and all voids need to be recorded on the financial statement. Ventrello told the Board, "You people are responsible for every check, even the ones missing."

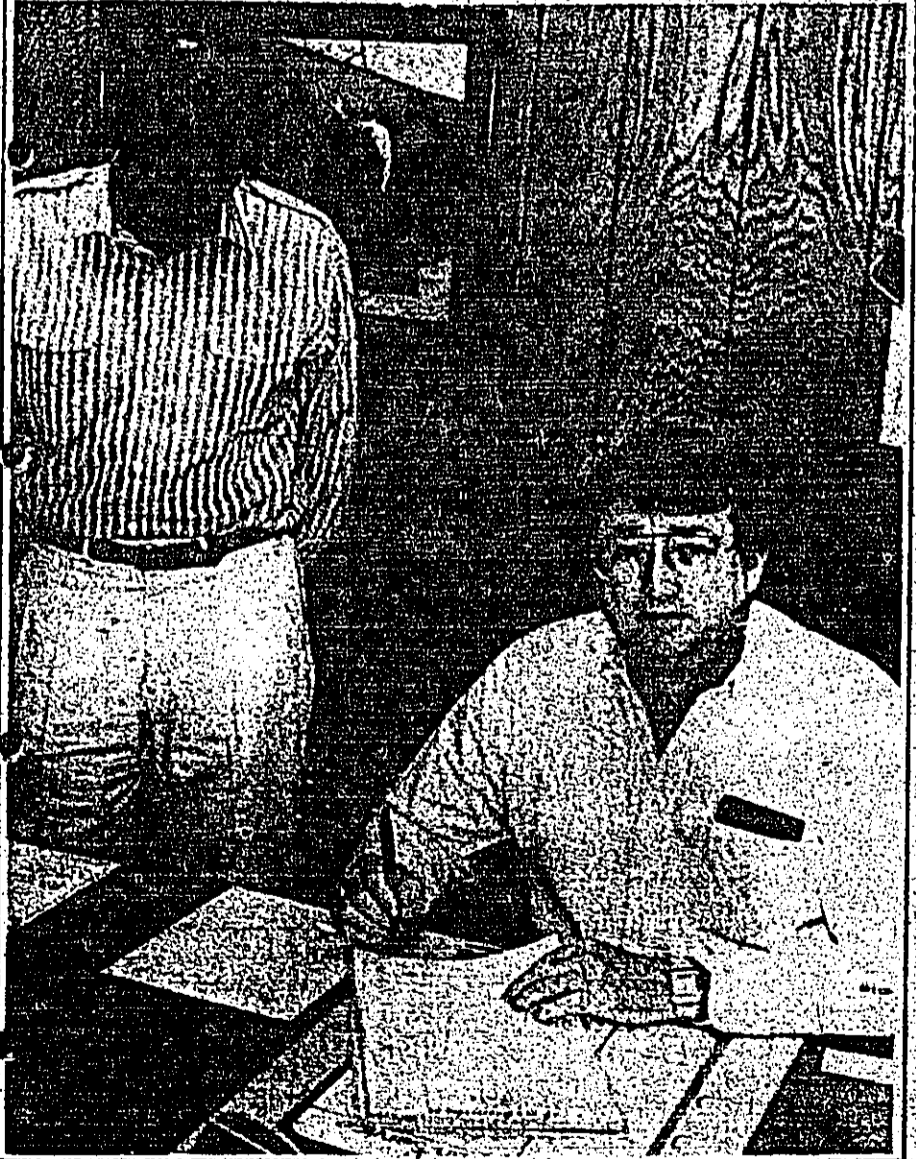

In the Superintendent's Report, Yates reported that Art teach David Drinkard has formed an Art Club. The Club has rented a room at Wildwood for \$22/month where they will display their art for sale. The Art Club is asking for sponsors at \$20/student/year. Sponsors will receive a 10% discount on any artwork purchased at the gallery.

High School Principal Howell reported that the school is printing a district-wide newspaper. He was also proud of the literary magazine "Smoke Signals" which has just been completed by high school students. Howell reported that the baseball team made it to the District Playoffs.
