Colmesneil Bulldogs Baseball: Quadruple Crown Winners!

There is a new capital of high school baseball in the state of Texas. The new capital is located in Colmesneil, Texas (Population: 553). The Governor is Ben Stewart, JR., who has coached Colmesneil to four state titles and six state play-off births.

Forget Jon Peters and the Brenham Cubs who won six state titles from 1970 to 1988. Forget south San Antonio which won seven state baseball titles in the 50's and 60's under the helm of now University of Texas head baseball coach Cliff Gustafson.

The pride is now in Colmesneil where the Bulldogs last Friday won its fourth state class 1-A baseball title since 1980.

This state title "was the sweetest of all", according to Stewart. The Bulldogs took their All-State pitcher and his dislocated finger into Austin last week and took care of defending state champion, Maude, along with Cinderella, D'Hanis, in less than 24 hours.

The Bulldogs did it with outstanding pitching against Maude, in a 3-2 semifinal win, and a rock

solid defense, timely hitting and pressure pitching in a 5-1 win over D'Hanis for the title.

Without a doubt the star of the show was all star pitcher Alex Davis. The senior righthander who the previous Sunday had dislocated his little finger on his pitching hand, pitched a one-hitter against Maude in the semi-final on Thursday afternoon, and then came back at 8:30 the next morning to pitch seven more innings, allowing only six scattered hits against D'Hanis in the championship. As one baseball observer put it, "He should dislocate his finger everytime he pitches."

There were other heroes, including bulldog catcher Ellison Davis, first baseman Thomas Moye, third baseman Glen Brown and centerfielder John Dubose, who along with Davis were named to the All-Tournament Team.

All of these, plus second baseman Chris Guilory, shortstop Swain Barker, left fielder Jason Broussard and right fielder Chad Guiley made history in Austin.

No other class 1-A baseball team has been more prolific than Colmesneil. The Bulldogs

have won the state baseball title in 1980, 1985, 1986, and now again in 1990. Colmesneil was also the state runner-up in 1979, the first year a class B school was eligible to participate, and a state semi-finalist last year. Take into consideration that for two years, in 1987 and 1988, Colmesneil was in class 2-A, the feat is even more astonishing.

Colmesneil got to Austin with pitching. Davis hurled back to back no-hitters against High Island (7-0) in the Bi-District Championship and Kennard (10-0) in the area championship. In those two games the hard throwing righthander struck out a total of 31 batters in 14 innings.

In the area championship against Valley Mills the Bulldogs came alive after being down, 1-0 in the sixth inning to win it 5-1. Davis pitched a two hitter in that contest while striking out 13.

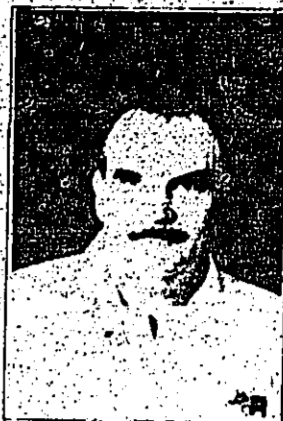
The Riesel Indians was the next victim. Colmesneil eased past the Indians, 3-0, at Olsen Field in College Station in the quarter-finals to set the stage for Austin.

The Bulldogs, ranked as the top team in the state in class 1-A with a record

of 23-2, entered the state tournament as the number two seed behind the Gorman Panthers who sported a record of 21-1.

With another state title in their sights Colmesneil baseball fans were severely shaken four days before the playoffs when Davis dislocated his little finger on his pitching hand in a sandlot game on Sunday.

Davis' father, Jimmy Davis, called in the assistance of orthopedic surgeon Dr. Jim McClain of Nacogdoches, to get the (To Page 4A)
