## Road And Bridge Fund: Commissioners Pull \$170,000 Savings Coup

An effort by County Judge Jerome Owens and Commissioner Maxie Riley has resulted in a \$170,000 savings for Tyler County.

Backed by the entire Commissioner's Court, Owens and Riley's proposal to the state Department of Highways and Public Transportation that the agency finance the remainder of costs involved in construction of the road linking the Gib Lewis Prison Unit to Hwy. 190 was accepted in Austin this week.

In addition to financing the remainder of the costs, the agency also agreed to refund \$5,000 the county has already paid toward the project.

"The support of the Commissioner's Court, Sen. Bill Haley and Rep. Allen Highower has paid off," said Owens. "And as a result we have an extra \$170,000 in the road and bridge fund."

Owens said that in 1988 when Tyler County was in the running for the Gib Lewis Unit, the county agreed to finance half of the cost to build the link to Hwy. 190 as part of the proposal to have the unit located here. After the county agreed to build the road, he said, the county sought a grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce.

"When the Texas Department of Criminal Justice and the U.S. Department of Commerce couldn't reach an understanding on the grant provisions and the grant was denied, we tried a 1,000 to one shot and went to the department of highways and public transportation," he added.

According to Owens, he approached Franklin Young, the district director for that agency about its financing 100 percent of the remaining cost. The county had already paid \$85,000 toward its obligation by that time.

"He (Franklin Young) told us we had to take our request to the highway commission," said Owens. "So, we contacted Austin and asked to be put on the agenda for consideration," Commissioner Riley and Owens attended the meeting, and, according to Owens, in a meeting where many others items "dwarfed" theirs in the amount of money being discussed, showed "strength and effectiveness."

"After all, added Owens, "We were the only ones represented by a representative and a senator."

According to Riley, the \$170,000 was allocated from the county road and bridge fund. In a year when extreme flooding caused excessive road damage, the extra \$170,000 was badly needed by the county.

"You can imagine how hard it is to get money back once it is in somebody's hands," said Owens.

According to TDCJ Public Relations Officer Charles Brown, the state plans to build one 2,250-bed and three 1,000-bed units.

The 2,250-bed unit will provide between 700 and 800 jobs once in operation, and would an annual local payroll of \$1.6 million. The 1,000-bed units will employ between 250 and 300, with a monthly payroll of about \$650,000, said Brown.

## Input Sought On Effort To Secure New Prison

In preparation for round two in the bout to secure a second prison unit in Tyler County, the local Chamber of Commerce is soliciting input from proponents and opponents of the effort.

On July 5 the Texas Tyler County Chamber of Commerce President Larry Phillips was notified recently that this county was one of about 20 eligible for consideration for location of one of four new units the state Legislature recently approved funding during a special session.

On July 5 the Texas Department of Criminal Justice will notify these communities which ones made the "short list," a list of about eight communities chosen from the original list. On July 10 these communities will be notified which were actually chosen for location sites.

Part of the process the chamber (which is spearheading the effort) must follow involves soliciting public input.

According to literature provided by TDCJ, should Tyler County be one of those communities, 15 minutes will be available for those in attendance with opposing comments. Persons wishing to address comments to the board can complete an information card which is available from the chamber. These cards will also be available at the meeting site, but must be filled out before the meeting begins.

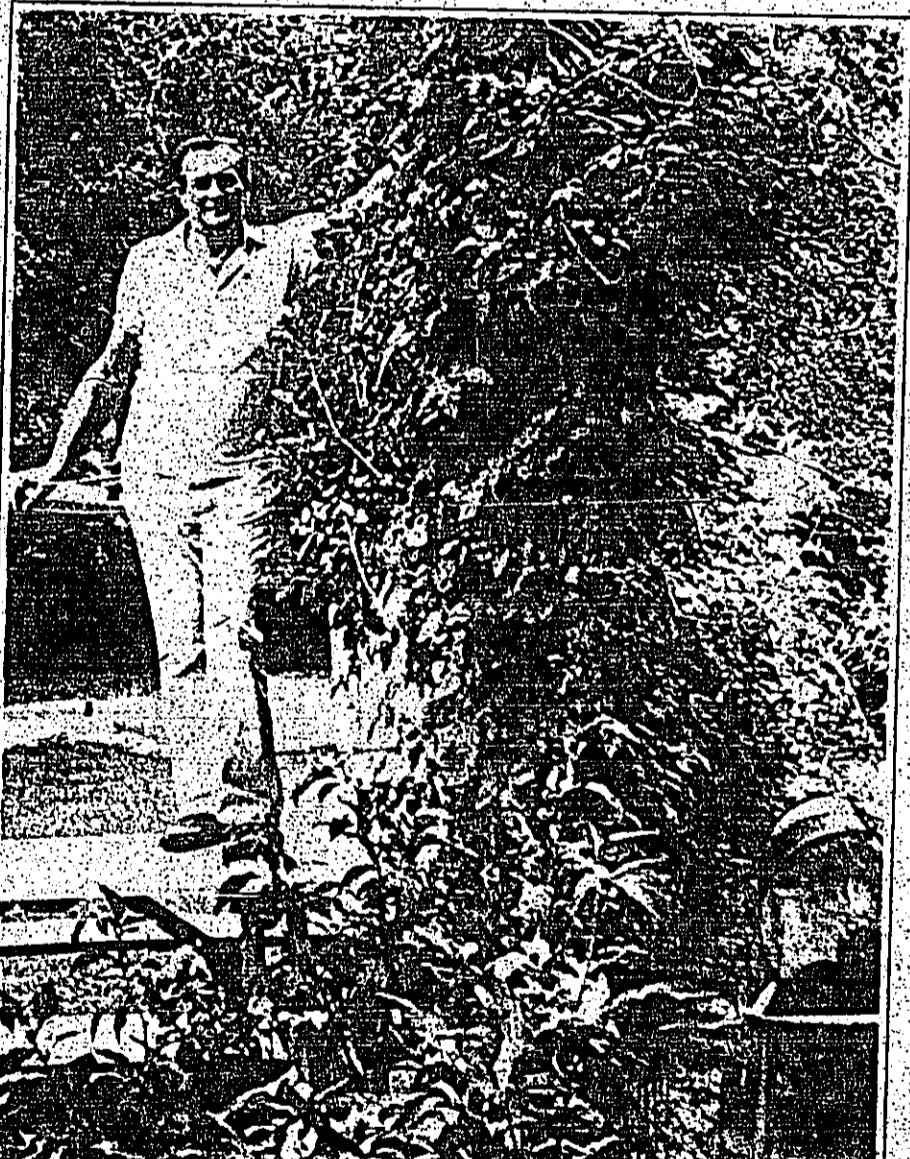

## Chief Colabe Monument Dedicated

The dedication was held Saturday, June 23, 1990, at 1:30pm, at the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation in Livingston, Texas. The master of ceremonies was Perry D. Williams.

Sub-Chief Colabe was assistant to Chief Antonio in the mid 1850's. Both chiefs signed documents relating to the creation of the Reservation.

Chief Colabe's gravesite is west of the present cemetery and was, for years, known and cared for only by a few members of the Tribe. The late James L.D. Sylesline urged this memorial for Chief Colabe and the Tribal Council has effected this wonderful tribute to a famed leader of the Tribe. This is a very special occasion where we choose to honor one of our own, by our own effort, cost and experience.

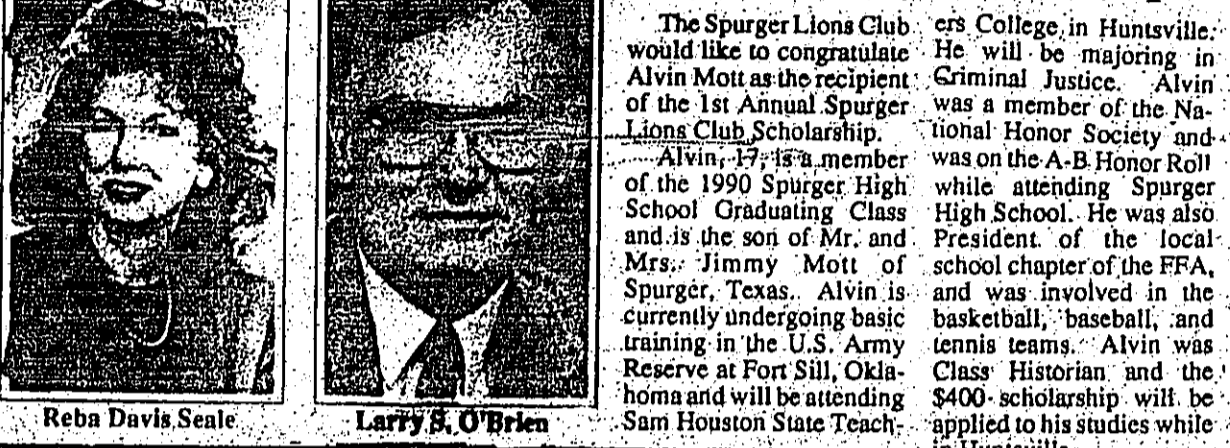

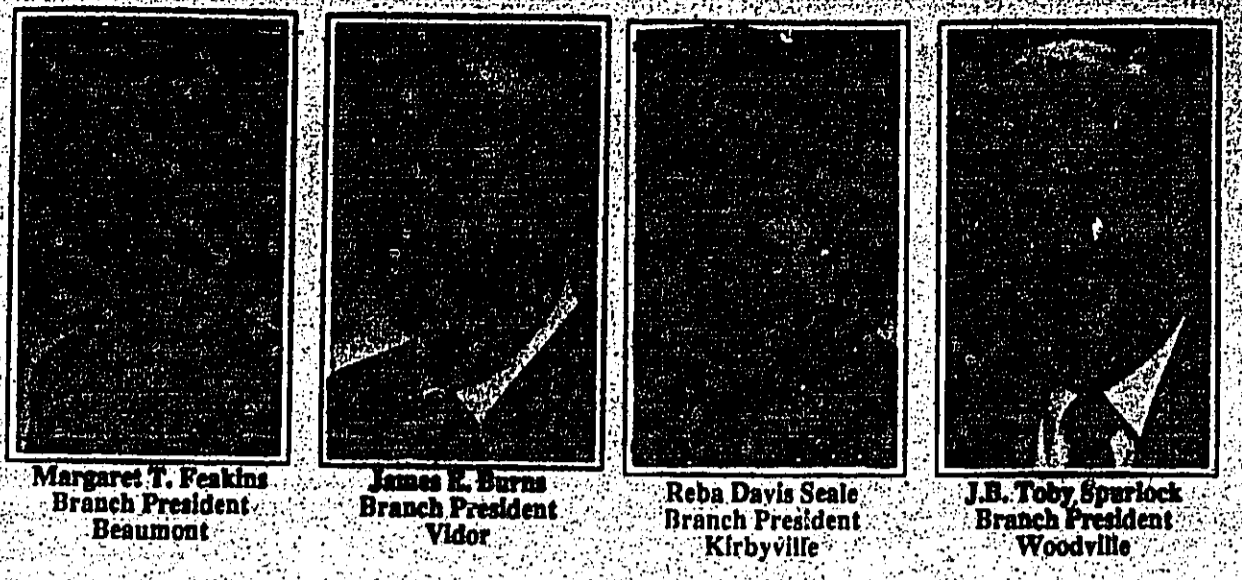

More than 300 fire departments submit fire data to the Texas Fire Incident Reporting System (TEXFIRS) is operated by the State Fire Marshal's Office, a division of the State Board of Insurance, to determine the number, nature and severity of fires occurring throughout the state and to communicate pertinent information about these fires to the public. The setting of uncontrolled fires to destroy or damage vegetation, fences or structures on open space land was added to the Penal Code by the 71st Legislature. Violation of this act is a second degree felony, but if someone is injured or killed as a result of such a fire, it is a first degree felony. "Controlled burning" fires are not considered as arson when the property owner gives consent for the burning of unwanted vegetation and such fires are controlled or limited to designated areas.

# Business Hotline

By simply following the indicators reported in the financial press and watching for the same signals as the economists do, anyone can spot the signals that mean that the caution flag should go up.

The five indicators to watch:

\* **Total employment.** Released on the first or second Friday of the month. The number of people employed reflects labor demand. Thus, it's more meaningful as a recession indicator than the rate of unemployment (which reflects the labor supply) which is released the same day and usually gets more attention in the media.

\* **Monthly retail sales.** This indicator is published about the tenth of the following month. It takes a sales increase of 0.6% to 0.7% month-to-month just to stay even with inflation. If the increase in dollar

sales is less than that, it means that unit sales have actually declined. And if retail sales in dollar figures actually decrease from month to month, showing that unit sales have dropped sharply, consider that to be a strong negative indicator.

\* **Industrial production index.** Issued about the 15th of the following month. This index measures physical production, not dollar sales. If the industrial production index declines, that's the negative signal. But it may be a negative signal if it rises, too. Here's why: Suppose industrial production rises while retail sales for a month are up less than

0.5% in dollars, which means no real change in unit sales. That shows that the factories are producing more goods than the stores are selling. Which means that inventories are building up. Sooner or later, production will have to be

cut back in order to bring inventories into line.

\* **Personal income.** This figure is released about the 18th of the following month. Since it's measured in dollars, it should go up by at least 0.6% per month just to stay even with inflation. Any smaller increase is a negative signal, which shows that the buying power of consumers is falling.

\* **Consumer price index.** This is the principal fever chart of inflation. Compare it with retail sales and personal income for the same month to determine whether those indicators are staying even with the inflation rate or falling behind it.

These five are what economists call coincident indicators. They do not forecast the future, rather they tell what is happening in the present. Figures that are released this month tell what happened last month. Why not use the highly

publicized leader indicators? Because they just are not dependable. They sometimes give a false negative signal and predict a recession that doesn't happen. Even when the signal is right, there's no way of knowing how soon the turn will come. It could be as little as three months or as much as nine months.

## Brides Need New Social Security Cards

Since June is the most popular month for marriage, it seems an appropriate time to discuss the need for brides to apply for new Social Security Cards.

Unless the bride plans to continue using her maiden name after marriage, Social Security records should be changed so that earnings are correctly posted to the right record. Also, the change may prevent IRS from questioning identity on tax returns.

As with all other services at Social Security offices, there is no charge for getting your name changed and a new card issued. This is mentioned because there are several organizations in the country that solicit Social Security business for a fee. Helping a newlywed obtain a Social Security card is a favorite target for these organizations.

Getting a new Social Security card is a very simple matter. It can be done by phone or mail. Evidence of identity

showing both the old and new name is required. The most common document used is the marriage license itself. Only original documents are acceptable. They are returned to the applicant.

It will take about two weeks to receive a new card. The card will reflect the new name but the number itself will be the same since a person's number never changes.

Even if you weren't a June bride-you still need to get a name change with Social Security. And if you've been married to long to be called a bride, and still haven't changed your name with SSA, you need to do it right away.
