

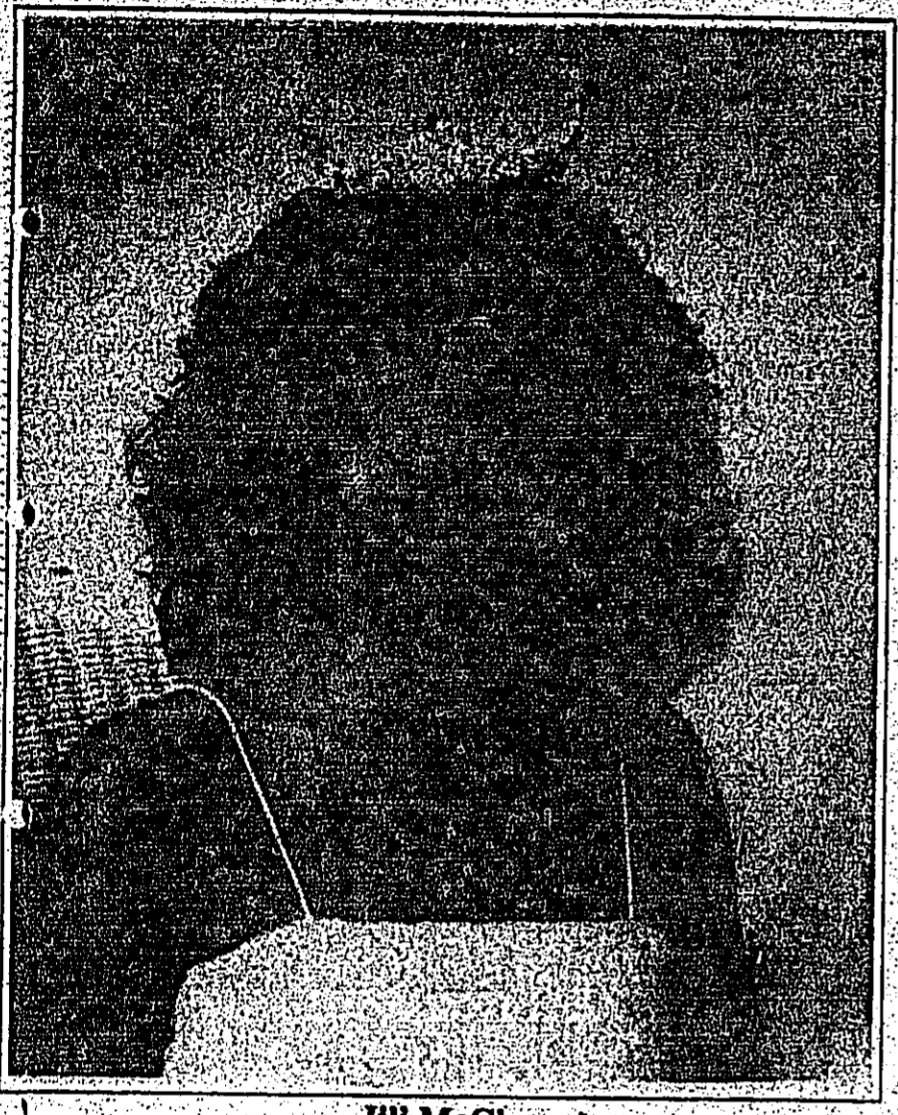

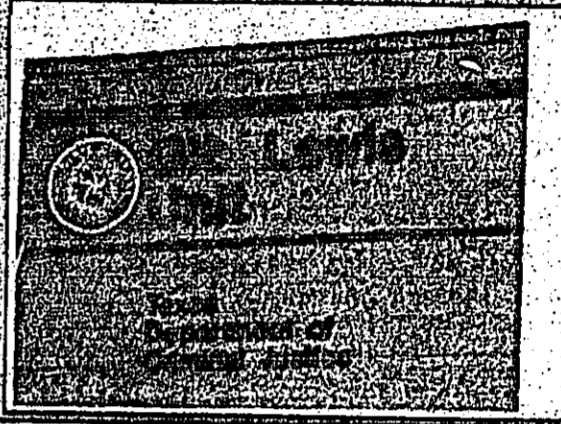
Gib Lewis Unit Open House August 11, Polk County Gets 2,250 Man Prison!

Officials of the Polk County Chamber of Commerce were celebrating in Austin Tuesday night following the announcement earlier this month that the Texas City Livingstone Correctional Institute will be replaced by one of four prisons offered with three other smaller, 1,000-man units being awarded to Gib Lewis, 1,000-Man Prison Unit "Open House" set for Saturday August 11.

Local officials are being instrumental in the decision. Meanwhile, during regular Woodville City Council meetings on Monday night, Tyler County Chamber of Commerce President Dr. Larry Phillips reported to council of the upcoming Woodville Gib Lewis 1,000-Man Prison Unit "Open House" set for Saturday August 11.

Phillips told the council that the prison would open a 5-acre and would officially be named the "Gib Lewis Unit" during ceremonies scheduled for 10 a.m. The public will be allowed to tour the facility from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

"With all the dignitaries being here we wanted to ask your help in putting our best face forward for the event."

Youth Thrown From Truck Bed Released From Hospital

Two Colmesnell youth sustained severe injuries Friday after being thrown from a truck bed while the driver, apparently tried to swerve back into his lane on FM 256 near Lake Tejas after crossing the center stripe according to Department of Public Safety reports.

Richard "Rip" Ogden, 53, the driver, was fined by Justice of the Peace Precinct 3 John Ed Hanks for "having children under 12 riding in an open bed." Ogden was then jailed in the Tyler County Justice Center on DPS charges of driving while intoxicated and resisting arrest. He was then released on bond set for \$1,750.

Judges Attend Seminar

Seventy-two justices of the peace from around the state were certified at a 20-hour basic justice of the peace seminar April 3-6 in Houston. The seminar, conducted by the Texas Justice Court Training Center headquartered at Southwest Texas State University in San Marcos, is held in compliance with supreme court rule and statute (Art. 27.005) Texas Government Code. Topics covered included judicial demeanor, new legislation impacting the Justice of the Peace Court, code of judicial conduct, criminal trial procedure and simulations, forcible entry and detainer, emergency detentions (mental, drug and alcohol), judicial liabilities, juvenile law, alcoholic beverage laws, parks and wildlife laws, protective orders and peace bonds, rules of evidence, search and arrest warrants, duties of magistrate, hot checks, inquests and financial management.

Medical Benevolence Foundation Supports Third World Hospitals

"Hospitals and clinics in the United States throw away enough supplies and equipment each year to completely outfit hundreds of third world hospitals."

"The standards we have set for our health care has led to this waste," said Medical Benevolence Foundation Director Keith McCaffety, adding, "good equipment is discarded after five years, hospital gowns are tossed out if not sewn properly, a package of 10 sponges are opened, two used, the rest trashed. We each receive our own thermometer and bodpan at the hospital that is disposed of as soon as we leave."

"According to McCaffety, the Medical Benevolence Foundation, headquartered in Woodville, began when a group of physicians traveled to several countries including Korea, Mexico, Brazil and India and discovered how inadequate the hospitals were equipped. "Hospitals, with well-trained physicians, were working with no laboratories, x-ray machines, and many other important items. For example, McCaffety said, Dr. Birch Rambo from Zaire was running a 120 bed hospital with 200 TB patients and no x-ray machine. He was forced to release these patients without even one x-ray of their lungs. These 12 doctors got together in 1963 with a plan to transport good used supplies from the United States hospitals to other countries by sea freight."

"For five years the MBR was nothing more than a mailbox in Nashville, Tennessee. The vision for this project was more than these doctors could handle without a full time person directing and organizing. One doctor had a friend in Houston, Texas who was a school teacher. They asked him to quit teaching for one year in work with MBR. McCaffety was then hired as the full time executive director and has held that position for the past 23 years. In 1972, the Foundation was able to build offices in Woodville, Texas to house a full time staff. The office handles all donations and also keeps the hospitals stocked with needed equipment and medical supplies."

The local Tyler County Hospital has always been helpful to MBR with their advice and expertise as

Social Security For Divorcees

Social Security benefits for divorcees have been around for a good many years. According to David Bennett, District Manager of the Lubbock Social Security office, at one time, a duration-of-marriage of 20 years was required and a man, to receive benefits on his ex-wife's record, had to be supported by her during a specific period of time. Support was not required for a woman to receive benefits on her ex-husband's record.

Today, Congress reduced the duration of marriage to 10 years and the Federal courts determine the support requirement for ex-husbands to be sex-discriminatory, so this law was in effect abolished.

A divorcee is entitled to the same benefits as the ex-spouse, or widow(er) if the marriage lasted at least 10 years. This is true even if the worker is not even receiving benefits. The ex-spouse benefits will be paid on the ex-spouse's record if the ex-spouse is not receiving benefits. The ex-spouse, however, must meet all requirements for retirement benefits except the filing of a claim. In other words, Bennett stated, the ex-spouse could actually receive payment were they to file.

In addition, the divorce must have occurred at least 2 years before the claim is filed. If the worker died before the divorce, the benefits will be paid on the worker's record. If the divorce occurred after the worker's death, the benefits will be paid on the worker's record if the worker was receiving benefits at the time of death. If the worker was not receiving benefits at the time of death, the benefits will be paid on the worker's record if the worker was receiving benefits at the time of death.

Says Local Conservationist Install Permanent Firebreaks.

With the many forest fires that have occurred across East Texas last year, woodland owners should seriously consider installing permanent firebreaks in their woodlands, says a local conservationist.

"A firebreak is one of the simplest and cheapest means of fire protection you can provide your woodlands," says Tom Mackey, district conservationist with the Soil Conservation Service. "Firebreaks serve several important functions. First, they divert the timber tract into compartments. This serves to contain the fire to a smaller area and provides the least amount of fuel for the fire. This helps firefighters to be more successful.

"Access is important in fighting forest fires in our country," said Yal Broton, chieftain of the Long Leaf Soil and Water Conservation District. "Fires which burn many acres so because firefighters cannot get through the woods to the front of the fire. Firebreaks and firelines can provide ready access for firefighters to get around the fire."

Speed is also important. The Texas Department of Health, Public Health Region 7 office announced today that the continuation of a series of essential immunization clinics for all children needing immunizations, who meet the required family income and termination guidelines.

The clinic will be conducted at 717 W. Bluff (Hwy. 190 E.) in Woodville, Texas.

The most clinic will be held July 17, 1990. Clinic hours will be from 9:00 - 11:00 A.M. and 1:00 - 3:30 P.M.

Future clinics will be held on the first and third Tuesday of each month. The Health Department emphasizes that this clinic is available to all preschool and school age children who meet the family income guidelines, beginning at two (2) months of age. Immunization services offered include: Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR), Oral Polio (OPV), Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis (DTP) and Tetanus/diphtheria (Td). The Haemophilus Influenzae type B (Hib) vaccine is also available to medically eligible children between the ages of 18 months and 60 months. All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

August "Immunization Month"

Under Texas law, all public and private schools, as well as licensed day care facilities, require that the immunization status of young children be kept current as a condition for school enrollment. Jack Frost, Community Health Manager for Public Health Region 7, suggests putting immunizations "at the very top of your back-to-school agenda, well in advance of the beginning of the new school year to avoid the measles, mumps, rubella, diphtheria, polio, and whooping cough, as well as tetanus, pose an ever-threatening menace to our young children and their parents.

If your child needs immunizations or periodic booster shots - or if you have questions about your child's immunization status - consult your pediatrician, family physician, local health department, or your nearest field office clinic operated by the Texas Department of Health," said Frost.

All programs of the U.S. Department of Agriculture are available without regard for race, color, national origin, age, sex, religion, marital status or handicap.

Bell Issues New Books

Southwestern Bell Telephone customers now will be able to choose the long distance company they want when they dial an operator to make certain long distance calls.

"Previously, when a telephone customer dialed an operator to make a long distance call outside our calling area, called a LATATA, we routed the call to AT&T," said Ken Wood, area manager for the telephone company. "However, now we will be able to route the call to the participating long distance carrier requested by the customer."

A LATATA (Local Access and Transport Area) is the geographic area in which a local telephone company, such as Southwestern Bell Telephone, offers local and long distance telecommunication services. The telephone company is prohibited from carrying long distance calls between LATATAs.

Now, when a customer dials a Southwestern Bell Telephone operator to make an inter-LATATA long distance call called an LATATA, the operator will ask the customer to identify his or her preferred long distance company to carry the call.

"If a customer does not have a preference, long distance company, the operator will suggest one from a randomly assembled list of subscribing companies and transfer the call to that carrier. Each operator's list will be assembled differently."

If a customer requests a long distance carrier, the Southwestern Bell Telephone operator will instruct the customer to contact that carrier directly for assistance. Southwestern Bell Telephone now will provide these services to other long distance companies.

The services include: verifying that a telephone number in Southwestern Bell Telephone's service area is busy; extending an emergency interrupt of a telephone number in Southwestern Bell Telephone's service area that is verified as busy; and providing the local exchange or long distance operator with assistance or instructions, such as validation of billing information, for third number and collect calls.

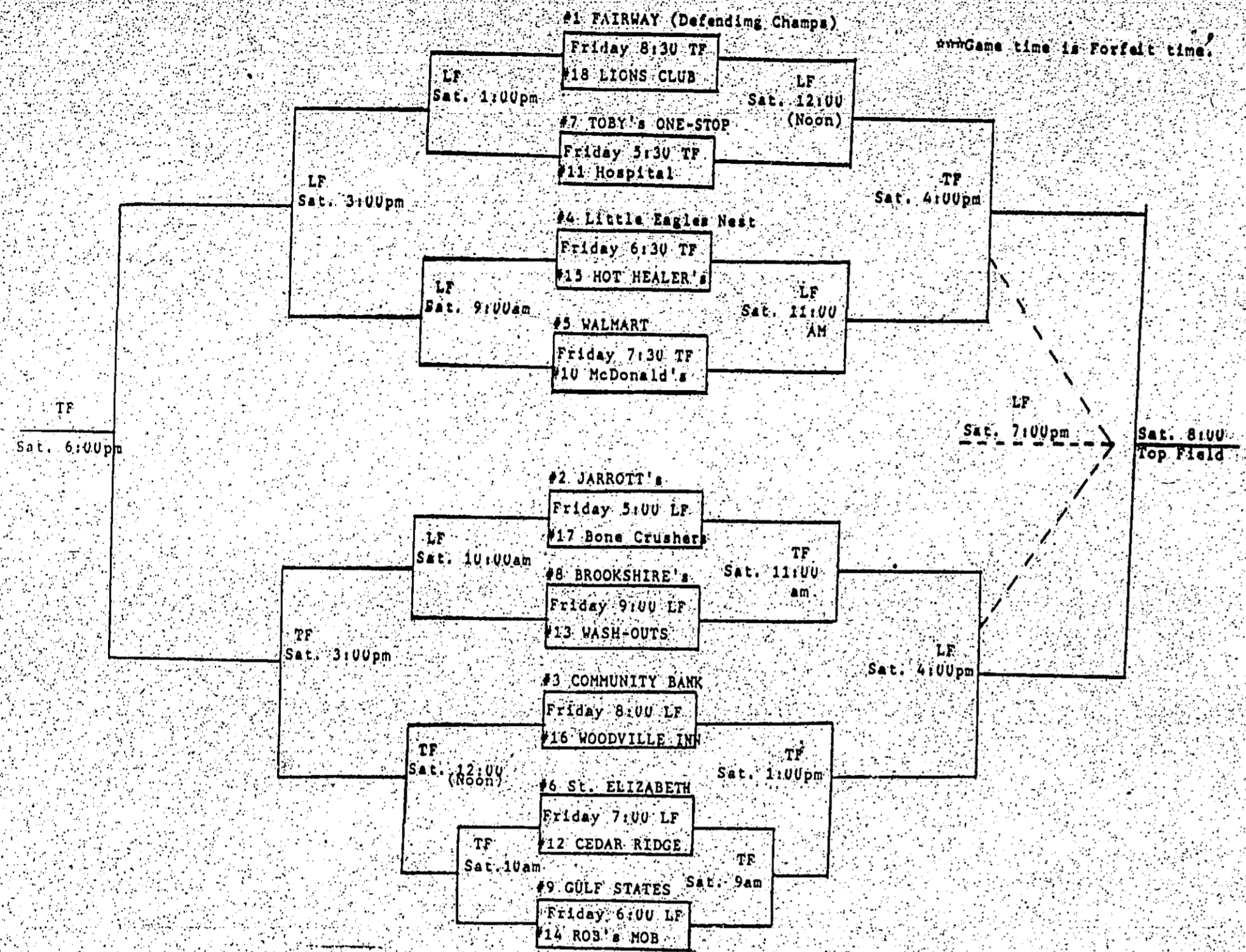
