Over 230 First Gib Lewis Unit Paychecks Will Be Issued September 1st!

Only 60 jobs out of a total of 297 remain to be filled at the Gib Lewis Prison Unit said Warden W.E. "Bruce" Strickland Tuesday.

"We made a lot of anxious people happy and a few sad but we've placed as many as we could according to our criteria. We tried to help Tyler County," Strickland said.

"Where they live, months of service, performance ratings and disciplinary status provided the basis of our decision. The waiting list is compiled according to months of service, the warden said.

"Those who didn't make it this time who were approved for transfer will get to come at a later date," Strickland said a teletype was posted Monday with all 162 correctional officer slots filled. "That's out of 220 who applied."

"All of those correctional officers who were hired will be on the payroll as of August 1," Strickland said, "with actual reporting dates soon after that."

Some 60 positions remained to be filled including school teachers, vocational teachers, medical personnel and clerks. "The majority of clerks will not be hired until a week before the Saturday, August 11 public open house."



Commissioners Accept \$85,000 Rebate Check From State

'Taxpayers In County Are The Real Winners'

The Tyler County Commissioners Court gladly accepted a check Friday for \$85,000 from the Texas Department of Highways that was a reimbursement for the cost of the new six-tenth mile road leading to the Gib Lewis Prison Unit.

"At the beginning of prison construction, Tyler County agreed to pay one-half of the estimated cost of the new 'Prison Road' which was \$140,000, and the County had already paid \$85,000," reported Paul Cook, Texas Department of Highways Representative, adding, "I was supposed to be asking for the final payment but because of the persistence of the Commissioners and Judge Jerome Owens, the Highway Department is reimbursing Tyler County the \$85,000."

According to Judge Owens it took at least fifteen telephone calls requesting the prison road be paid for in full by the Highway Department, to finally get a definite answer, and it was well worth it. "The taxpayers are the real winners. That \$140,000 was the taxpayers money and it can now be used in other ways to benefit Tyler County," Owens emphasized. The state has full maintenance responsibility for the road, officials said.

In other court business a plan to consider accepting and approving an agreement between Champion International and Tyler County that will allow Tyler County to have "free" rock from Champion land. "Champion wants the road to this land to remain private, and we want to have access to this road by either leasing or agreeing to pay repairs if the road is damaged," said Judge Owens. The court was unable to reach an agreement on this issue because Pat Hardy, Criminal District Attorney for Tyler County, was not satisfied with the wording of the agreement Champion wrote, so this matter will be brought up again after Gowen submits a different agreement to Tyler County.

What's going on around the school house this summer? Plenty! According to assistant superintendent for Woodville Independent School District, Tommy Weaver.

After this year's January fire at the Woodville Field house, efforts began to replace all of the athletic equipment that was damaged or destroyed. "We had to order the equipment immediately to ensure its arrival before the season this year," said Weaver. "Everything for the players is here except the football helmets, and we are expecting those anyday. Woodville will have the sharpest dressed team around."

According to Weaver, the replacement cost for everything burned was right at \$115,000, and that is not including costs for rebuilding the field house. "If construction is not completed by the beginning of football season, the team will be based from the campus gym each game."

Weaver went on to say that Athletic Director and Head Football Coach Melvin Houston, is busy interviewing applicants for a new assistant coach and trainer. This position became available when former assistant coach for Woodville, James Largent, accepted a position with Henderson ISD as Head Baseball coach. "Houston hopes to get a combination man, but coaches with trainer certification are hard to find," said Weaver.

Sources say that Houston will make his decision before the end of the week. This will give the new coach time to get ready for the first practice of the 1990-91 season which will be August 13.

9-1-1 Here February 1992

What is 9-1-1? It is an easy to remember three-digit telephone number that has been designated by the American Telephone Industry to give citizens immediate access to help in any emergency. A trained call-taker will answer your call and immediately notify the appropriate fire, police or medical agency. When will 9-1-1 be available in Tyler County? Tyler County's 9-1-1 planned system is scheduled to begin service in February 1992.

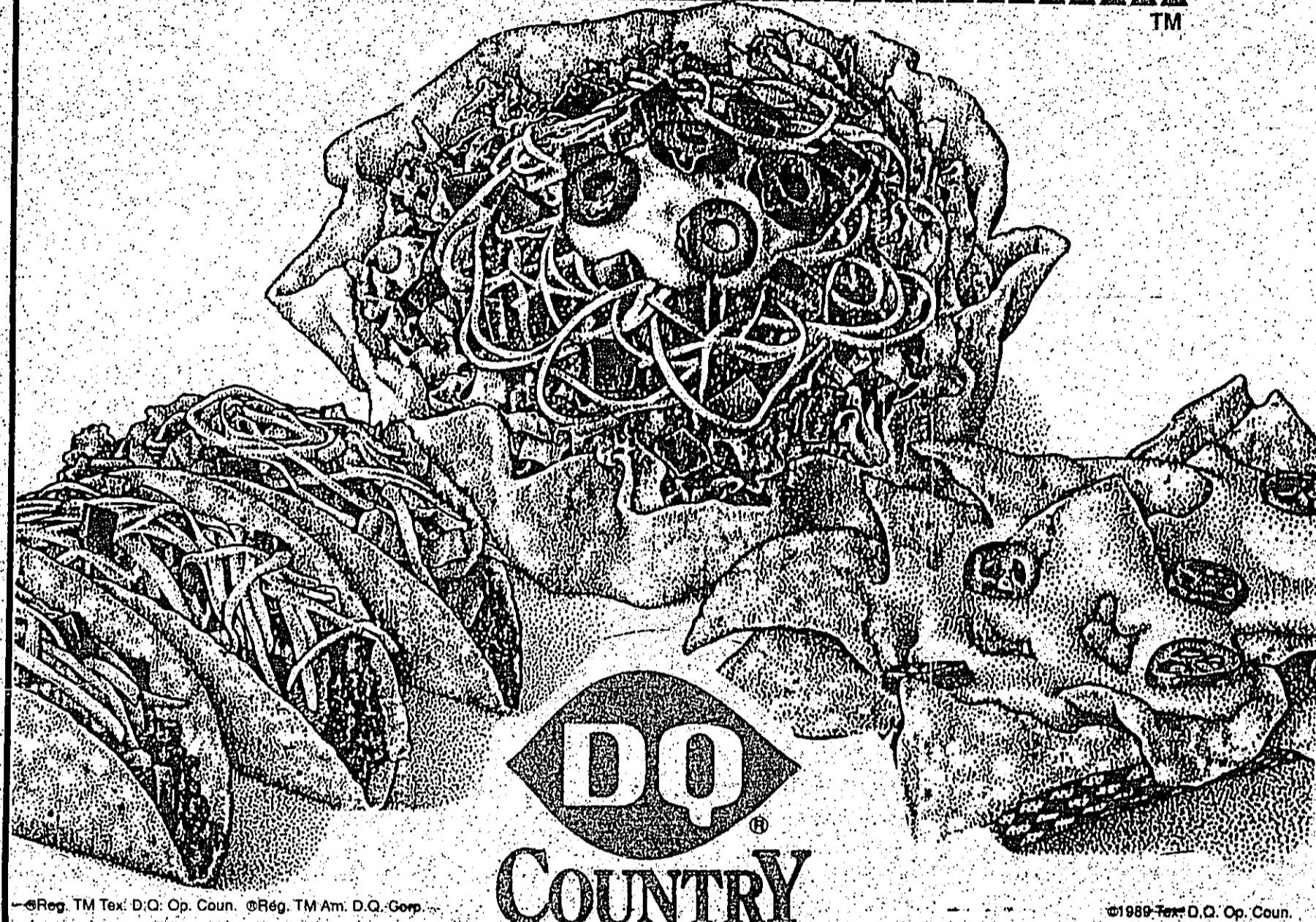

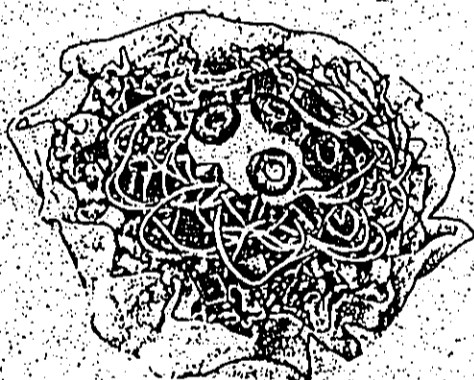

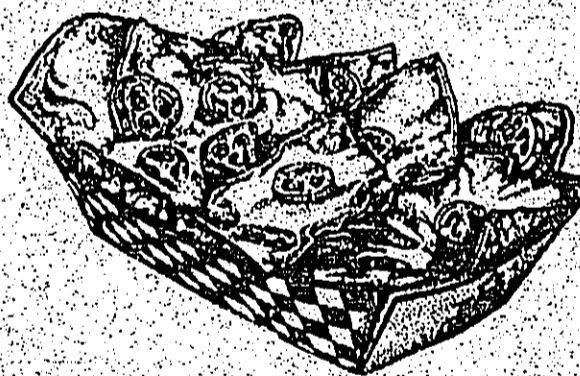
