## Details Sketchy In Youth Shooting

Details were sketchy as of presstime Tuesday as to the shotgun death reported around 12 noon Monday of a Woodville Elementary 6th grader who lived with his family, named Garcia, in the Campground Community for the past 7 months after reportedly coming from the Corpus Christi area. Precinct Justice Wanda Brasher said late Tuesday she is withholding a ruling in the matter "until everything is in and subsequent to an autopsy report by a Beaumont Pathologist. Authorities close to the scene suggest that either "accidental homicide" or "suicide" are being considered in the matter, but that other rulings were possible in the case. Tyler County Sheriff's Deputies Sam Bible and Tracy Ferguson are investigating the incident.

## Water Well Loan Completed

AUSTIN - August 8, 1990 - Bond proceeds from today's closing of a \$250,000 Texas Water Development Board loan with the city of Woodville will be used for the construction of a water well and an aerator. These components were part of the original plans and specifications of the Woodville's \$1,070,000 water supply project. Due to bids on the \$1,070,000 project coming in over anticipated cost these components were eliminated. The completion of the entire original project will allow Woodville to provide water service to the Texas Department of Corrections prison facility and an area of existing population outside the city limits. Woodville is the county seat of Tyler county and is located at the junction of U.S. Highways 69, 287, and 190.

# Over 3,000 Attend Gib Lewis Prison Open House

Calling it "the most significant event that will occur in our lifetime", Woodville Mayor Tom Knapp officially welcomed the guests and dignitaries to Woodville for the official opening and formal "Open House" for the 1,000 medium-minimum security Gib Lewis Prison here. "It is truly a joyous occasion Knapp said" which will change the destiny of Woodville and Tyler County forever. Knapp complimented former Chamber of Commerce President Don Forse "for having conceived the idea even before the prison expansion plans were drawn", and further complimented the Tyler County Industrial Foundation and specifically Attorney Harry Stafford, and local liasons Gil Tubb and Otis Fortenberry for putting together the total package. Knapp complimented City Manager Walt Davis for having "The vision and the financial and engineering ability to carry out the plans." "No one person, however, has made a big difference as State Representative Alan Hightower" said Knapp. Knapp told the correction boardmembers and officials present "We want Woodville to be just the beginning...let me assure you that we want you to know how much your presence means to us."  featured guest Gily Lewis by saying "Without the leadership of Speaker Lewis the job would have been 10 times harder. It has the ability to bring both sides together on an issue."

Highwater went on to say "The criminal justice system can't work without a board that recognizes the needs of the agency."  
 Speaker Lewis told the crowd gathered "The legislature has adopted a strong law enforcement ideal and at the same time we're not going to put someone in a warehouse. The prison system is doing a good job."

"More emphasis should be put on education," Lewis said, "many of these offenders you'll find here are very young...and it's very sad state of affairs that we need a facility that will have to provide more educational facilities but that's the way life is."  
 Lewis also said that he would try to investigate the possibility of securing a "dedicated" chapel space at the Gily Lewis Unit. Presently the space is officially designated as "multipurpose." Lewis said he "Didn't know how that one slipped through the cracks...we need a dedicated chapel here at the Woodville Unit. We'll see about that...we want it if the facility with a fine dedicated chapel."

#### Football Season Almost Here

The 1990 Woodville Eagle football team begins practice Monday, Aug. 13. The team will play its first game Aug. 24 against Hampshire-Fannett in Hampshire.

The Eagles surprised a lot of people in 1989 with a team record of 8-3. Woodville was the district 22-3A "runner-up" behind Newton, eventually losing to Crockett in the Bi-District round of the 1989 state playoffs. The U.I.L. district realignment for the 1990 season finds the Woodville team in familiar territory. The Eagles will be in the district with old rivals Diboll, Center, San Augustine, Huntington, and Corrigan. Other teams on the Eagles schedule include Liberty, Livingston, Newburg, and Clarksville.

According to "Texas Football Magazine" the Eagles are picked to finish first. But as Head Coach Melvin Houston said "The magazine and newspaper predictions do not mean anything, it boils down to which team blocks and tackles the best on Friday night." The Eagles return 16 letterman that include 5 on offense, and 9 on defense.

Reggie Williams tops the list of returning starters on offense. Williams will start his fourth consecutive season at running back. He rushed for 1170 yards and scored 20 touchdowns last season. Willie Cunningham will call the signals once again for the Eagle offense. Cunningham passed for over 1100 yards, and was second team all-district behind Orangefields "all overting athlete" Jeff Cranger. Buck Odum is the lone returning offensive lineman, but should have ample help from Craig Battles, David Shown, Derrick Hennigan, John Wooten, and Willie Mitchell.

Defensively the Eagles should have very few questions. Opposing offensive teams facing the Woodville defense ought to be terrified of their 9 returning starters. Jacob Mitchell and Dion Gill are two leaders on the Eagle defense. The defensive front three consist of Gill, Shannon Foster, and Dalton Wlao. The three will average 250 pounds in weight. Other returning starters are Sammie Deloach and Craig Foster. Defensive ends Gary Johnson and backer, Roderick Hamilton. Linebackers, and Tim Foster, corner-back. Other letterman from last season to watch are Tyson White, running-back(4-40 lbs) and Nicholas McDaniel, running back.

## Hunter Ed Class Set

A course in hunter education has been scheduled for August 20-23 from 6:00 - 8:30 p.m. in the Tyler County Courthouse, according to Bob Armentrout, County Extension Agent.

"According to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's mandatory requirements, effective September 1, 1990, the age group affected will be those whose date of birth is during the period September 2, 1971 through August 31, 1974, and so on. By September 1, 1993, all hunters born on or after September 2, 1971, must have successfully completed the course to hunt in Texas. However, any individual may take the course on a voluntary basis and is encouraged to attend regardless of requirements," according to Armentrout.

"The course is open to adults and youngsters and will include instructions in rifle, shotgun and bowhunting handling and safety; outdoor responsibilities and ethics; laws and regulations; conservation hunting traditions; wildlife identification; field care of game; wilderness first aid and survival." Armentrout added.

Students 12 years of age or older successfully completing the course will be issued a hunter education certificate from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. Those less than 12 years of age will receive a certificate of attendance, but must take the course again for proper certification.

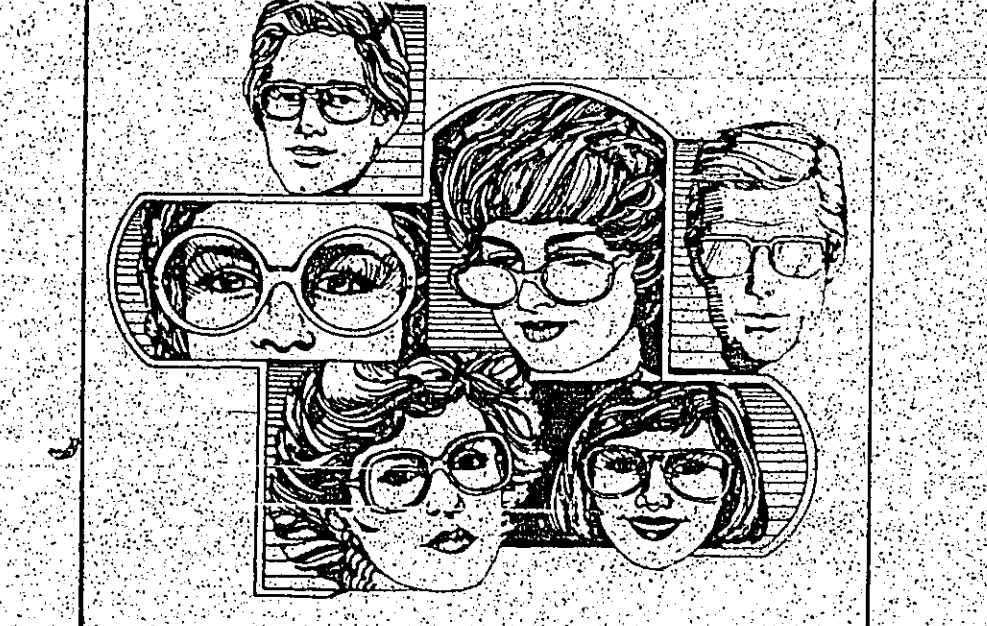



If a student has attended another college, an official copy of the college transcript is required instead of the high school transcript along with the completed application for admission and residency proof. Courses are scheduled

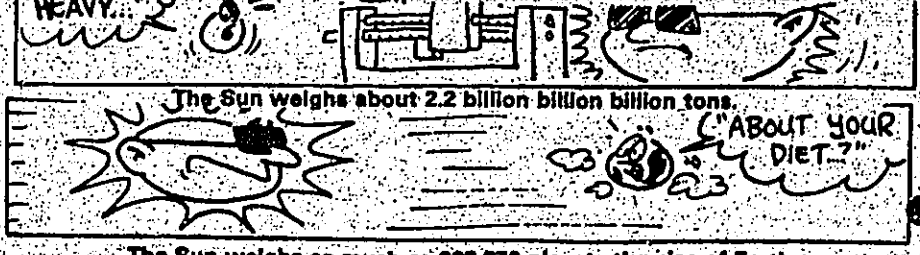
