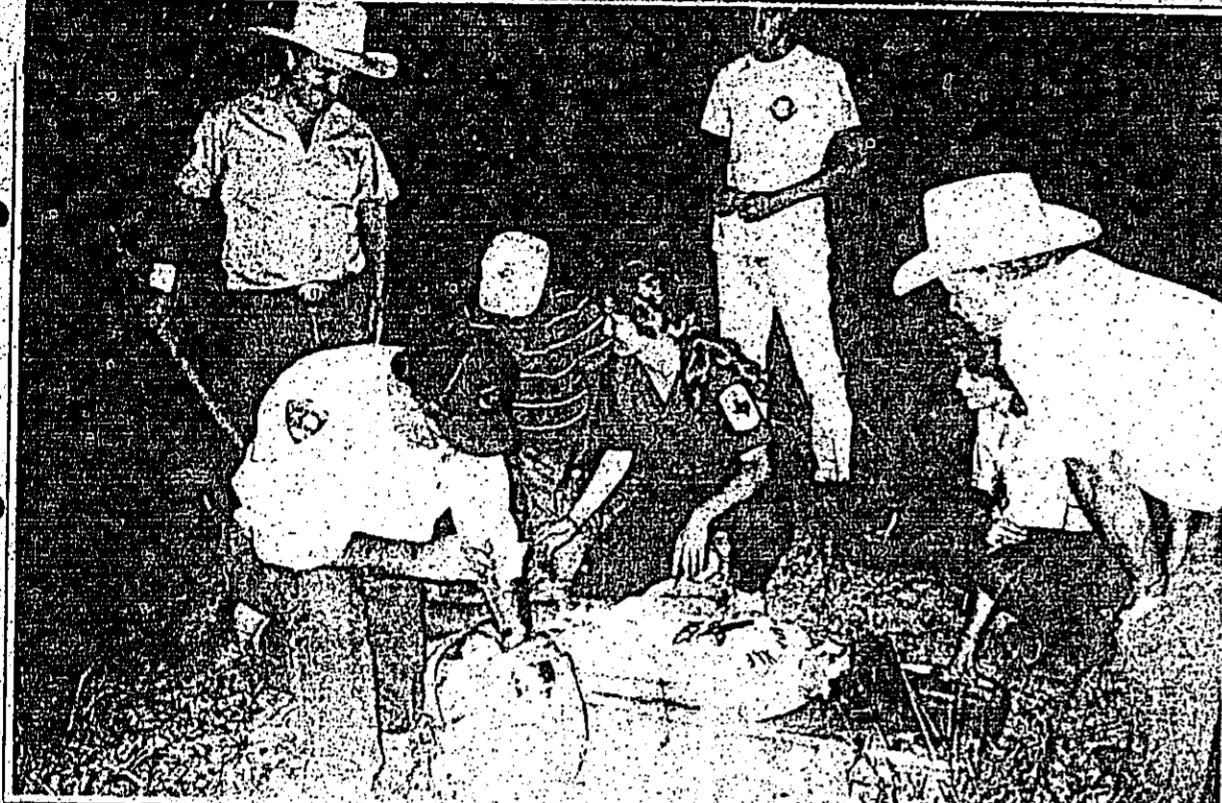

Sheriff's Posse Executes Mock Search, Rescue

The Tyler County Sheriff's Posse held a mock search and rescue operation last Sunday in a heavily wooded area West of Woodville. Twenty-eight riders and four non-mounted members searched an area of approximately 100 acres for a lost child, a doll hidden earlier in the day by a volunteer.

Two teams of 14 riders and the non-riding mem-

bers which included medical personnel known as First Responders stayed in communication with CB radios.

When the child was found the First Responders were advised of her condition and the closest place they could drive to meet riders bringing her out of the woods. The medical team in turn told riders what steps to take regard-

ing her condition and how she should be brought out of the woods.

The drill concluded with First Responders treating the child for shock, putting a splint on her broken leg and transporting her to the Emergency Room.

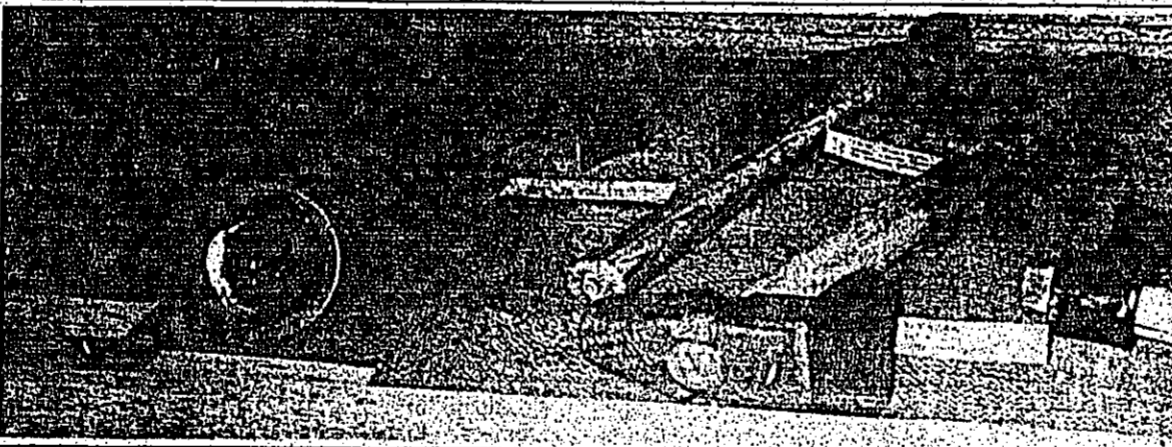
'Hammer Fest 1990'

The East Texas Blacksmith Alliance enjoyed a "Hammer Fest" at the Heritage Museum this past Saturday. Interested persons spent the day observing demonstrations and participating in a forging competition.

Lance Cloutier of "Rams Head Forge" in Tyler, Texas, did an educational demonstration showing how a blacksmith heats the iron to a red glow in a forge which is kept hot by hand operated bellows. At this point, the blacksmith can make a variety of iron shapes such as hinges, household utensils and horse shoes by using a hammer.

Winners of the forging contest were: First Place - Hollis Woolridge of San Antonio, Texas; Second Place - Eddie McCain of Lumberton, Texas; and Andy Quittner of Austin, Texas.

Anyone interested in learning more about the blacksmith trade can visit the Heritage Village museum anytime during the month of August. The museum is displaying articles, pictures and other items relating to blacksmithing and modern day commercial forging.

Texas Bond Review Board Ok's Another \$5 Million For Veterans Land Program

AUSTIN - The Texas Veterans Land Board (VLB), chaired by Land Commissioner Gary Mauro, today approved another \$5 million bond issue for the purchase of land for the program. Mauro said the bond issue is the largest in the program's history. He noted that although the bonds are available to anyone interested, the VLB is especially encouraging Texas veterans to buy them for their children and grandchildren. Mauro said the bonds will help finance the purchase of land for the program, which provides low-interest loans to veterans for the purchase of land. Mauro said the bonds are sold as capital appreciation bonds, which means that the price of the bonds will rise over time. He said the bonds are sold at a discount to their face value, and the difference between the purchase price and the maturity value is exempt from federal taxes. For example, a person might spend \$250 for a \$1,000 bond which matures in 20 years. At the time of maturity, the \$750 difference would be tax exempt. Mauro said the yield on the security was as high as 10 percent at the time of the sale. He said the bonds are sold at a price that is 75 percent of their face value. Sarah's Bread

Last week, Ann Morrison called me to tell me about an old recipe she found in a new book. The recipe: Sarah's Bread. The book: The Good Book Cookbook by Goodman, Marcus and Woolhandler, Publishers: Fleming, H. Revell. Sarah's Bread: 1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour plus extra for flouring boards; 1 tsp. salt; 3/4 cups lukewarm water; Sesame or vegetable oil. Sift together flour and salt; add the water and mix with a wooden spoon into a smooth paste. Turn onto a floured board and knead at least 10 minutes. Put dough in a bowl and cover with a damp cloth. Let sit in a warm place for 1-3 hours. Divide the dough into eight pieces and form into balls on the floured board. Roll each piece into a flat circle about six inches across. Cover these pieces with the damp cloth and sit for 30 minutes. Cook each bread individually in a lightly oiled frying pan or bake several pieces at 500 degrees until the edges curl up.

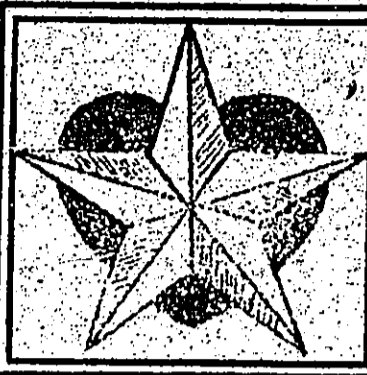

Woodville School Bells Ring Aug. 27

The schools of the Woodville Independent School District will open for all students on Monday, August 27. Teachers begin their work year on Monday, August 20, according to Dorman Jackson, school superintendent.

Preschool registration for all students new to Woodville Public School should register now at the principal's office. Those who register in kindergarten or first grade will be required to have a certified birth certificate in order to establish eligibility for registration. Pupils new to the Woodville schools should have grade, book, and credit records, as well as vaccination and health information from previously attended schools, ready at registration time.

Freshman orientation for high school students will be August 14 at 10 a.m. and August 15 at 1 p.m. Sophomores, juniors and seniors can pick up class schedules at the high school on August 14 through 17, between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m.

State law requires that all pupils entering and attending the public schools of Texas must have been immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, poliomylitis, mumps, measles, rubella, and pertussis, subject to provisional admittance if the required immunizations have been started, as certified by a physician.

Students who are at least six years of age, or who have been previously enrolled in first grade, but who have not completed the academic year in which the 17th birthday occurred, shall attend school or have an excused absence for a minimum of 85 days during each semester in which the student is enrolled.

Attendance in Kindergarten is optional. Students 4 years of age may enroll in pre-kindergarten. All pre-kindergarten applicants must have a minimum of 36 months of age as of September 1, be eligible to attend kindergarten, while students aged 6 years old are eligible to enroll in the first grade.

The pre-kindergarten and kindergarten programs of the district will operate a half day all year. Woodville Independent School District offers vocational programs in Auto Mechanics, Production Agriculture, General Farm Mechanics, Marketing Education, Home Economics, Cooperative Education. Admission to these programs is based on grade level and student preference.

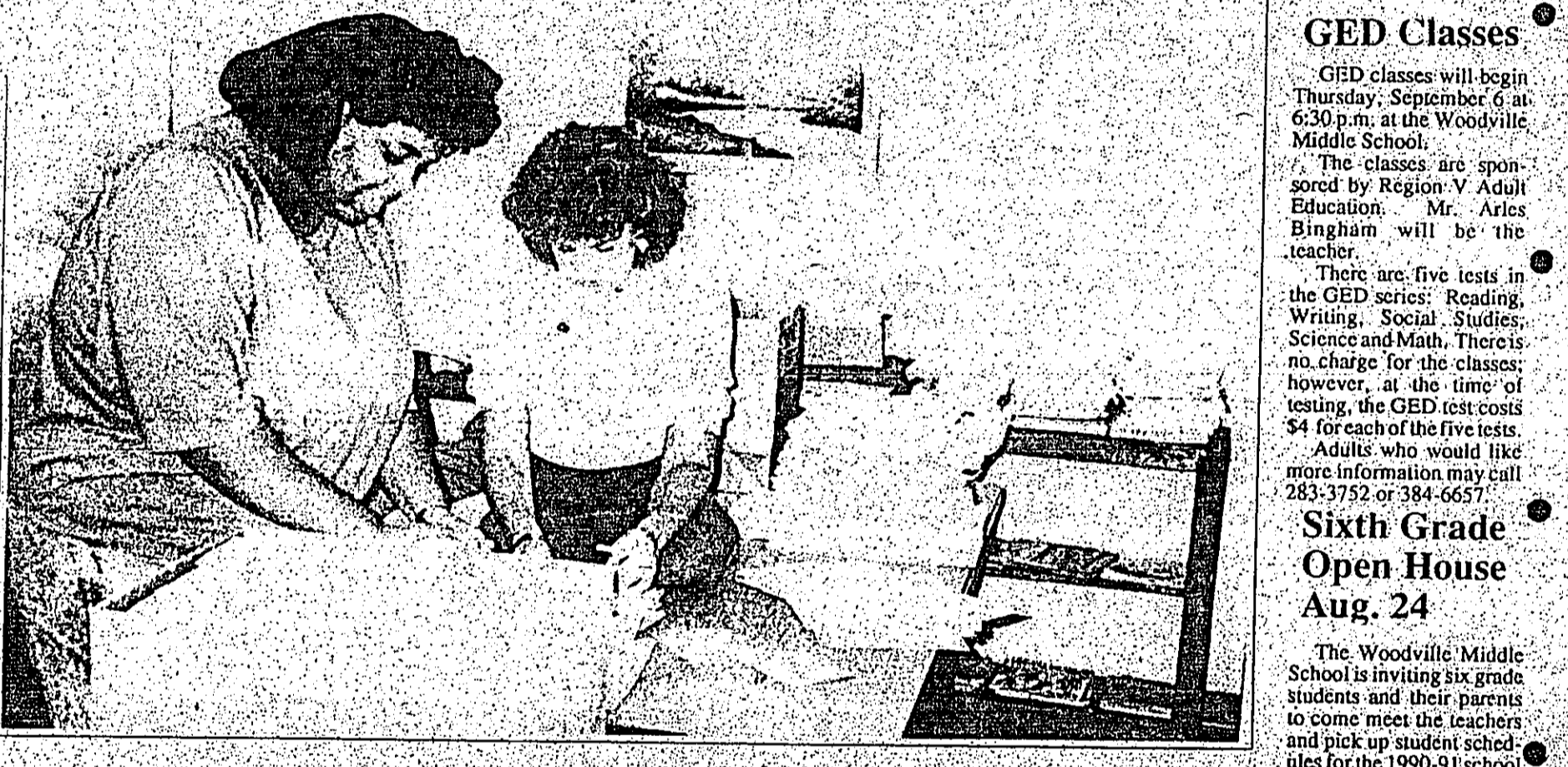

GSU Bills Not Immediately Affected By Persian Gulf

BEAUMONT - Persian Gulf developments will not immediately affect electric bills for Gulf States Utilities Co. customers, a GSU official said today.

"Thanks to our fuel diversification program, we use virtually no fuel oil to generate electricity," said Ed Loggins, the company's senior executive vice president of operations. "So far in 1990, 69 percent was with nuclear and 10 percent was coal

and nuclear plants to supplement its gas-fired generation. Since the Nelson 6 coal unit near Lako Charles, La., began operating in 1982, oil has never accounted for more than 1.2 percent of the company's total annual generation.

"If your next bill appears to be higher than normal, it will be because you used more electricity to combat July's hot temperatures - not because our fuel prices have gone

up," Loggins added. Actual August fuel costs for electricity generated by GSU with coal and nuclear total about \$13.5 million. If that power had been produced with No. 6 fuel oil, the cost on Aug. 1 would have been about \$24.6 million. With the past week's oil price increases, today's cost for the same amount of No. 6 fuel oil would be about 32.3 million.

Electric utilities that use oil - primarily those along the East Coast - are warning their customers to expect higher bills. The fuel costs reflected in the bills of GSU customers have not increased since mid-1988 and cannot change without the approval of the Public Utility Commission of Texas.
