## Two Injured In Warren Fracas

Two Warren men were injured late Saturday following an altercation in the parking lot of the Citgo Convenience Store reportedly involving several Woodville juveniles following a Warren/Lumberton football game.

Charges of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon were filed separately against three Woodville youth who, as of late Tuesday, and according to Sheriff Gary Hennigan, were being detained at the Angelina County Juvenile Detention Center.

Injured in connection with the case were Jonathan Schultz, 18, who was reportedly stabbed with a knife while John DeWayne Conner, 21, was allegedly hit in the head with a baseball bat.

Schultz was treated and released from Tyler County hospital. Conner was admitted to St. Elizabeth Hospital with head wounds.

According to sheriff's reports two juveniles suspected in the matter were arrested immediately after the incident while another was arrested on Monday. The three were turned over to Tyler County Juvenile Probation Officer Jackie Culp and remanded over to the Angelina County Detention facility. Hennigan told the BOOSTER Monday that three other Woodville juveniles were being charged with disorderly conduct charges in connection with the case.

Tyler County investigating Officers in the case are Deputies Jesse Wolf and Tracy Ferguson.

According to Tyler County Sheriff Hennigan who indicated Tuesday that the arrests came quickly and efficiently, "We as law enforcement officers will not condone...will not tolerate any sort of repercussion in this matter," and, "he added, "any repercussion will be dealt with swiftly and efficiently."

A statement given to THE BOOSTER Tuesday by Justice of the Peace Precinct 1 Wanda Brasher:

"Further investigation has shown a possibility of more serious charges being filed and due to the fact that because of the decision by the U.S. Supreme Court in Grady vs. Corbin, any plea to a Class C. Misdemeanor would bar to prosecution

of more serious charges; therefore to protect the State's right to file more serious charges, the Disorderly Conduct charges are dismissed. The statements and cases have been turned over to District Attorney's office for investigation of more serious charges being filed."

## 'Apology' Read Over Warren Loudspeakers

Woodville High School Principal Larry Dickerson wasted no time Monday in sending a message of apology to the Warren Student Body following an incident which occurred late Saturday after the Warren/Lumberton Football game in which two Warren men were injured.

"The incident involved "only a few" Woodville youth who have been subsequently arrested and were being detained late Tuesday at the Angelina County Juvenile Detention Center.

Warren students heard the apology as it was read over the loudspeaker system during their afternoon classes.

"We don't want to penalize the entire student body for the irresponsible actions of a few," Dickerson told THE BOOSTER Tuesday.

## Woodville Sets New Tax Rate

The Woodville Independent School District Board of Trustees met Tuesday, September 18, 1990, and voted unanimously to set the tax rate for 1990 at \$1.22-25. The new rate is an increase of slightly less than 3% over the 1989 effective tax rate.

The Board approved a trip for the Woodville High School Band to Disneyworld in Florida. The trip is scheduled for June 5-9, 1991, and the Band will march in a parade at Magic Kingdom. Band Director Tom Harvey estimated the cost of the trip to be \$32,000. The Band will do various fund raisers to pay for the trip.

The Board accepted a bid from Jostens Learning Corporation for twelve IBM computers and software for the computer assisted lab at the Intermediate School. The bid was \$86,486.

## GSU Issues Local Franchise Taxes

The Tyler County cities of Woodville, Colmesneil and Chester recently received checks totaling approximately \$101,000 from Gulf States Utilities Co. for the payment of 1990 franchise taxes.

Woodville received \$90,200, Colmesneil was paid \$8,100, and Chester

received \$2,700.

Other area cities receiving franchise tax and/or street rental fee payments were: Silsbee \$167,400; Lumberton \$154,200; Kountze \$53,600; and Sour Lake \$53,600.


"These tax and fee payments certainly have a

positive economic impact in the cities we serve," said Gulf States' Woodville District Superintendent Gene Koci. "The company also purchases supplies and services at the local level whenever feasible, and our employee payroll helps support local businesses as well."

In 1989, GSU provided a total of approximately \$4 million in state and local taxes. Roughly \$1.5 million went directly to the state, while the remaining \$2.4 million was paid to Texas cities and other local taxing authorities in the service area.

Lieutenant Colonel Stephen Jones took command of the 9th Military Airlift Squadron during a change of command ceremony recently at Dover Delaware. The group is involved in the current C-5 Cargo plane airlifts in support of the Desert Shield operation in Saudi Arabia.

Colonel Jones took the reins from Lt. Col. Joe Toftbas who commanded the 9th MAS for 20 months.

A Texas native, Steve finished high school in Woodville and is the son of the late Frank and

Dorothy Jones (deceased) and the grandson of Lee and Jeanette Phillips, of Hillister. He graduated from Baylor University in Waco where he received his commission from the Reserve Officer Training Corps in 1974.







### Off And Running... Wade White of Lumberton takes a pass from Ryan Verde and turns upfield against Warren last Friday.




### DOWN TO THE ONE... Quarterback Lindy Haynes carries the ball down to the one yard line against Lumberton. Woodville Shocks Newton

### Is Your Child Sick ... Or Not?

By: Carol Brochtrup. When your child tells you "I'm sick," he doesn't feel well enough to go to school, there are just minutes to decide if he really needs to stay home. Here are some guidelines. Keep your child home if he has fever over 100 degrees, diarrhea, vomiting, severe cough, an undiagnosed rash, or severe pain. Many childhood illnesses and injuries don't interfere with school. You might worry that a child with a runny nose will infect other children. Most experts agree kids are contagious several days before the actual runny nose or mild respiratory problems occur. Other children are already exposed before any actual symptoms develop, so it's really too late to exclude the child in an attempt to control infection. Children with strep throat, impetigo, conjunctivitis (pink eye) and ear infections may require control infection. Hours of antibiotic treatment and release by their doctor. 
