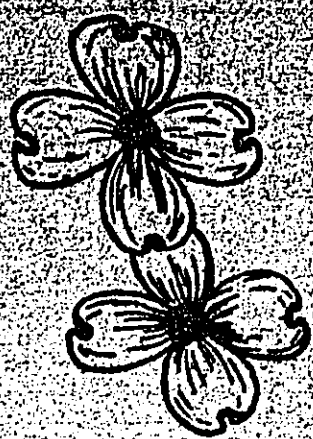

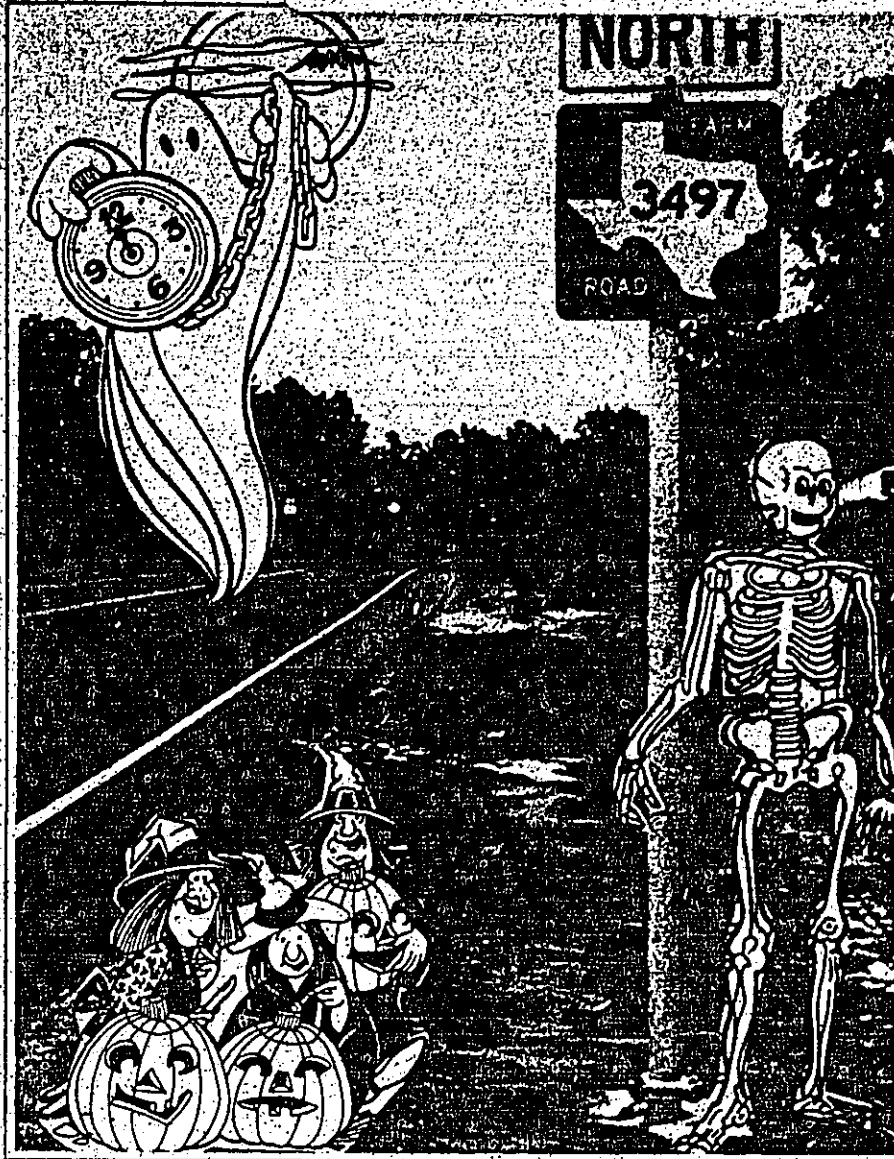

## Village Annual Harvest Festival Unfolds

What a weekend this is going to be!

Old time craft demonstrations, sacred harp singing, good old timey food, antique farm equipment, shoot-outs, wagon rides and a Texas Revolutionary encampment are just a few of the exciting things awaiting you at the third Annual Harvest Festival at Heritage Village Museum this weekend.

The fun starts at 9 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 20, and keeps on going till 5 p.m. that evening, then repeats itself again on Sunday, Oct. 21.

And all you have to do to get there is drive out to the fair grounds a mile past the Village, board a free shuttle bus and ride back to the Village for a day designed to take you back in time to the days of your ancestors.

On the way to the Village, the bus will stop at Hennigan Park, where you can stop off for a ride in a handsome turn-of-the-century wagon, belonging to Kreiter Gear-Tech of Houston.

The wagon, which once took an Ohio family across the plains to their new home in Colorado, was recently restored by Harvey Winegar of Texas Wagon and Wheel Works of Cleveland, Texas.

Bringing the entire Village to life will be the Blacksmiths as they set their forges roaring and their anvils ringing with a major demonstration of old time blacksmithing, featuring members of the East Texas Blacksmith Alliance and Lance Clouder of the Artist-Blacksmiths Association of Texas.

Among the famous names who will appear during this two day festival

are Bill Brett, East Texas favorite folklorist, and Whittlin' Sid Owens, who demonstrates his skills at the Texas Folklife Festival in San Antonio each year. Nelda Wagner and family from El Campo will be back demonstrating their spinning, weaving and dyeing skills, and Gordon Baxter will be on hand to show the Beaumont-shot film "One of the Missing", in which he appeared and which will be shown in the Whitmeyer Library several times each day.

Causing the nostrils to tingle and the taste buds to come alive will be the hearty aroma from the chuck wagon cookery of Dr. Booster Severson of Wallisville and Tooter Haynes of Anahuac. The scent of homemade apple sauce cooking on an old wood burning stove will once again fill the air from the Heritage Society Booth, where homemade jellies and jams, cider and sassafras tea will be sold.

And to keep you going with something more substantial, the Woodville Lions Club will be serving up sweet potatoes, corn-on-the-cob and their famous sausage-on-a-stick with plenty of soft drinks to wash them down.

Other taste treats to be offered throughout the day will be Preston Woodrime's delicious hoe cakes cooked over the open fire, tamales from the First Pentecostal Church in Jasper and Indian fried bread and tacos from the Reservation.

There will be antique farm equipment and early day single motor engines displayed by folks who collect and restore these treasures. There will be farm animals to see and






