

Democratic Gubernatorial Candidate... Richards: 'Spread The Word As You Spread The Gravel'

"Spread the word as you spread the gravel" was the message delivered to a large group of East Texas Area County Commissioners and Judges as the Ann Richards for Governor Campaign swung through Tyler County Thursday. East Texas area County Commissioners and Judges were assembled to discuss new state imposed restrictions and standards on solid waste disposal (county land fills).
Richards, speaking to the assembled county officials at the Humphrey Ranch near Hillister, described those standards as still another example of the state legislature passing new mandates and standards without providing the funds necessary to implement the new standards. Richards accompanied by State Attorney General candidate Dan Morales, stated her support for legislation introduced by then state Representative Morales in the last legislature for a "don't pass the bill, if you can't pay the bill" constitutional amendment, which the legislature subsequently voted down.
Both Morales and Richards referred to supposed problems East Texas voters might have in voting for a Spanish surnamed candidate for Attorney General and East Texas men voting for a woman for Governor. Morales said he was surmounting that problem, Richards, characterized talk of East Texans not voting for a woman as "Hogwash; men will vote for anyone they feel is competent and will do a good job."
Current State Treasurer and former county Commissioner Richards, in indicating that experience in government was an issue in the gubernatorial campaign with an opponent who had never held public office, said that "if elected it is my belief that I will be the first county commissioner elected Governor in the state's history." She promised the assembled county officials across the state; a "syrup and biscuits" breakfast - indicating Tyler County Commissioner Maxie Riley and Deep East Texas MIMR Board Chairman Allen Sturrock had already promised to bring the syrup.

Gramm Wins Golden Bulldog Award

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Senator Phil Gramm (R-Tx) was presented with the Golden Bulldog Award by the Watchdogs of the Treasury, Inc. for his 1990 voting efforts to cut federal spending, eliminate waste and reduce the deficit, the Watchdogs announced October 10.

It was the Senator's 10th Bulldog Award. The award is presented to those members of Congress who vote to contain unnecessary government spending at least 75 percent of the time, based on a compilation of selected votes on economic and fiscal issues published in the "Economy Voting Record."
This year's Golden Bulldog trophies were presented to 185 members of Congress - 149 in the House of Representatives and 36 in the Senate. Thirty-four percent of the Congress received the award.

Deer Season Means Get Ready!

OVERTON - In addition to the obvious rituals of the hunting season, both beginning and experienced hunters should begin planning now for the opening day of deer season, says a wildlife and fisheries specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.
The general gun season for whitetail deer in Texas opens Sat., Nov. 3 said Billy Higginbotham, headquarter at the Texas A&M University Agricultural Research and Extension Center at Overton.
"The first step is to purchase the required license. In addition to the license, persons born between Sept. 2, 1971 and Aug. 31, 1974 are required to attend a hunter safety shortcourse and have proof of attendance."
Firearms should be inspected for proper working order, Higginbotham said. Many scopes get out of alignment for various reasons, therefore, annual sighting-in is required.
All camping equipment and other gear used during the season should be in good condition. Replace if questionable.
If existing blinds are to be used, a pre-season inspection is a necessity to avoid surprises from rotten boards, wasps and other unexpected inhabitants.
"Pre-season scouting or time spent in the woods bow hunting provides hunters with valuable information regarding deer movement patterns," Higginbotham said.
For those hunters using a few area, this time also gives them an opportunity to familiarize themselves with property lines and topography.
"By being prepared and extending courtesy to other hunters and landowners, we can make this season more successful and safer," he said.

BETTER VISION

People who are myopic...nearsighted...see better at near distances than they do farther away. Many nearsighted people can see adequately to read, eat or work at a desk without corrective lenses. At longer distances, as across a room or across the road if driving a car, their vision is blurred.

In normal eyes, light rays entering the eyes are focused precisely on the retina. In nearsighted eyes, because of the shape of the eyeball itself, the sharp focus appears in front of the retina, nearer the lens. Beyond this point, light rays diverge and produce a fuzzy image on the retina. Conversely, in farsighted eyes, the sharp image would occur behind the retina, farther away from the lens.

Corrective lenses put the sharp image precisely on the retina so vision is clear and sharp. Do your eyes need the assistance of corrective lenses?


