Chrysler Center Closes

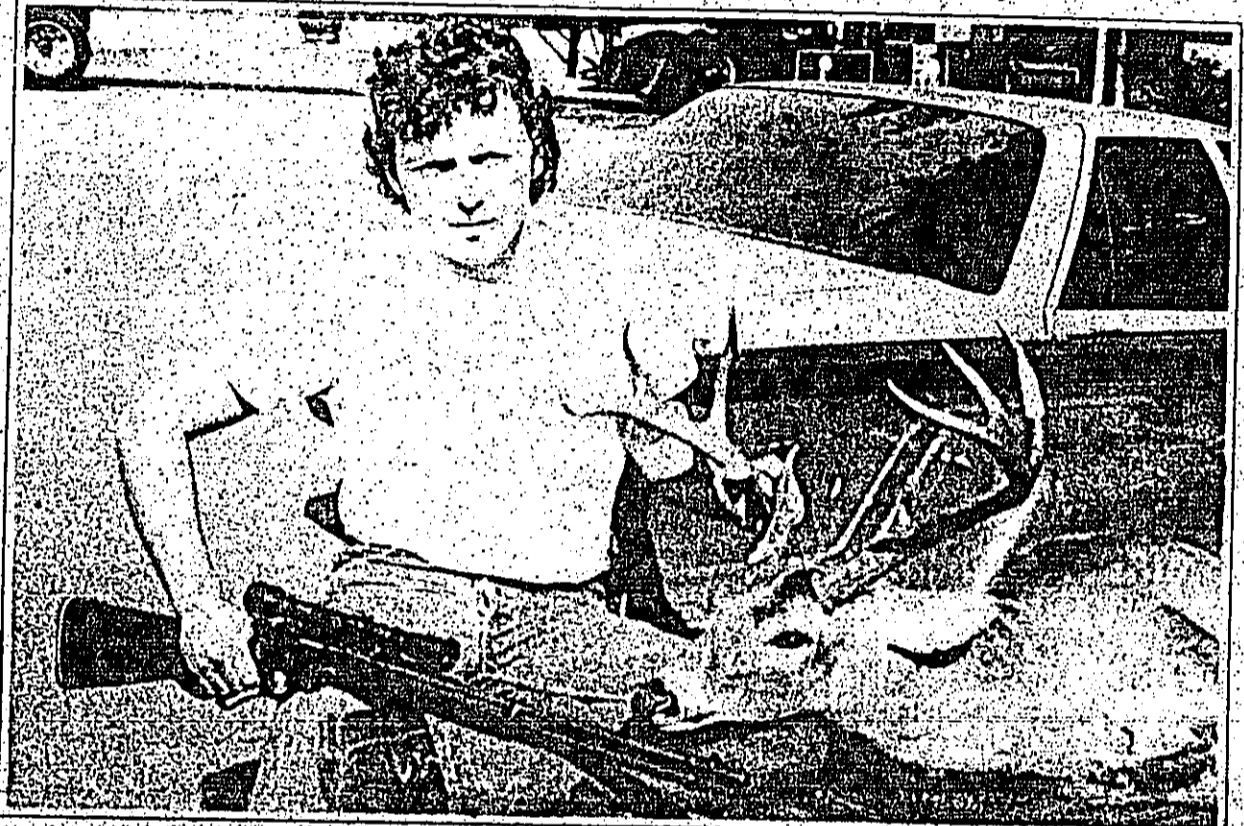
Citing "a poor new car economy, a local credit crunch and an overall current economic slowdown", Larry Trest closed the doors of the Larry Trest Chrysler Center Auto dealership on Friday, Nov. 9. Trest said Tuesday he wanted to thank all his former customers for their patronage but the closure couldn't be avoided. "We were able to deliver on service during the time we were open and earned a Customer Satisfaction rating on a scale of 1 to 4 of 3.84," Trest said, adding, "so we delivered in that area. Chrysler Corporation officials were at the dealership Monday transferring vehicles to other locations. Trest will maintain ownership of the property, the Chrysler officials said.

Community Bank Picks Up Failed Jasper Thrift

Community Bank has purchased the failed Deep East Texas Savings Association in Jasper, and opened the institution as Community Bank's Jasper Branch on Monday, November 5, 1990 at 9:00am. The Jasper Branch will become Community Bank's sixth local bank branch. Community Bank was formed on July 2, 1990 with the merger of Vidor State Bank, Kirbyville State Bank, First National Bank of Woodville, and Plaza National Bank of Beaumont. Community Bank also opened a branch in downtown Beaumont at the Stedman Building. Community Bank is a locally owned and managed financial institution. Community Bank President and CEO Bill McNinch said that Community Bank's market niche is in the smaller area communities, such as Jasper, where personal service from local bankers is so important. Community Bank also offers the banking advantages of local ownership and management. The Jasper Branch will be a full service branch, offering installment and commercial loans, personal checking and savings accounts, certificates of deposit and PULSE automatic teller machine cards. The bank's capital strength and commitment to the local area will benefit both the customers and the community, according to McNinch. Community Bank will open the branch with expanded banking hours for customer convenience. The new lobby hours will be 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Friday. Drive-in hours will be expanded to 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Heading the new Jasper will be Reba Davis Seale, currently Branch President of Community Bank's Kirbyville Branch. Ms. Seale has been involved in banking in the Jasper/Kirbyville area since 1979 and was President and CEO of Kirbyville State Bank prior to its merger with Community Bank. Among many civic affiliations, Ms. Seale is a director with Sabine-Neches Economic Development, Inc., a Kirbyville Consolidated Independent School District Board Member, a member of the Jaycees and the Citizens Advisory Council for the City of Kirbyville. "We're excited about the new Jasper Branch! Many of our customers already know us, and bank with us, and we know the people of Jasper. We're anxious to become their bank and meet their financial needs," said Ms. Seale.

Blanchette, Barnes Re-elected

V.E. Blanchette of Colmesneil, and A.M. Barnes of Chester, were recently re-elected to the Long Leaf Soil and Water board of directors. Blanchette represents Zone 2 of the district while Barnes represents Zone 1. The purpose of the Long Leaf SWCD, with headquarters in Woodville is to promote sound soil and water conservation programs on farm and ranch lands within the district and to serve as a voice for farmers and ranchers on conservation matters. The board of directors coordinates the conservation efforts of various local, state and federal agencies and other organizations and has authority to enter into working agreements with these governmental agencies and private concerns to carry out its purposes. As two of five individuals serving on the district board of directors, Barnes and Blanchette will be responsible for district policies and procedures for carrying out the district program within the framework of the Texas soil conservation district law. In Texas there are 210 soil and water conservation districts. Each is a legal subdivision of state government organized by local agricultural landowners with the assistance of the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board. Unlike most other legal subdivisions of state government, SWCDs do not have the powers of taxation or eminent domain. All conservation programs managed by the districts are of a voluntary nature to the landowner or operator.

It's Too Late For Mrs. Allison!

Imagine driving down your neighborhood street to find that your home is engulfed in flames. This was the feeling of Mrs. Grady Allison of Warren when she realized that fire had broken out on her front porch. The Warren Volunteer Fire Department was called immediately, and this is where the trouble began. "I always felt safe being right down the street from our fire station," Mrs. Allison said. Unfortunately she was not safe at all. The Warren VFD was handicapped because of broken fire trucks. Woodville and Ivanhoe stations were called in, but by the time efforts began to contain the fire, the whole house, including a new apartment built on the back of the home was destroyed. Due to high winds and the delay, the next door neighbor's home was in serious danger of catching on fire also. In the past, according to Fire Chief Richard Foxworth, the Warren VFD has had to deal with problems from the group "in charge" of the station, but since April of this year, efforts have been made by Foxworth and approximately ten volunteers to reorganize. "Things are not all bad," Foxworth said, adding, "We have trucks, they just need repair. The Forestry Service has agreed to pay for 1/2 of the repairs needed for our tanker truck (used to fight house fires) if we can just raise the other half." At the present time Warren VFD receives \$75 per month from the County, and a \$10 monthly donation from one Warren citizen. "This is hardly enough for truck maintenance, gasoline, etc.," replied Foxworth. Of the ten volunteers Warren VFD has, five help fight fires and five are auxiliary members who plan fund raisers. "I always felt safe being right down the street from our fire station!" Mrs. Grady Allison. "How can you as a citizen help?" Warren VFD needs more members to help with the maintenance of trucks and fighting fires. If you are interested, plan to attend the next fire meeting. They are held the first Monday of each month at 7 p.m. in the fire station. Another way the community can help is by participating in future fund raisers including: The Turkey Shoot held Sundays from now until the second Sunday in December. It is from 1-5 p.m., one mile South of Warren on Hwy. 69. At the same location there will be a garage sale Thursday - Saturday, Nov. 15, 16, & 17. If you have donations for the garage sale, call 834-2826, and someone will pick up your items. In order for the Warren Volunteer Fire Department to be able to successfully provide a much needed service, community efforts to become involved are a must. It is too late for Mrs. Grady Allison, but if you would like to help her in this time of need, donations can be made to Citizens State Bank in Woodville. Proposal For Senior Citizen GSU Rate Discount

A proposed \$7 discount on the monthly electric bills of low-income senior citizens would offset any rate increase. Call States Utilities may receive in its present rate case. The proposed discount was a part of the Regional Recovery Plan rate case filed by GSU in March, 1989. Although the case was in hiatus for several months while the Texas Supreme Court considered issues related to part of that case, the discount remained a part of the rate case when hearings resumed on Oct. 12.

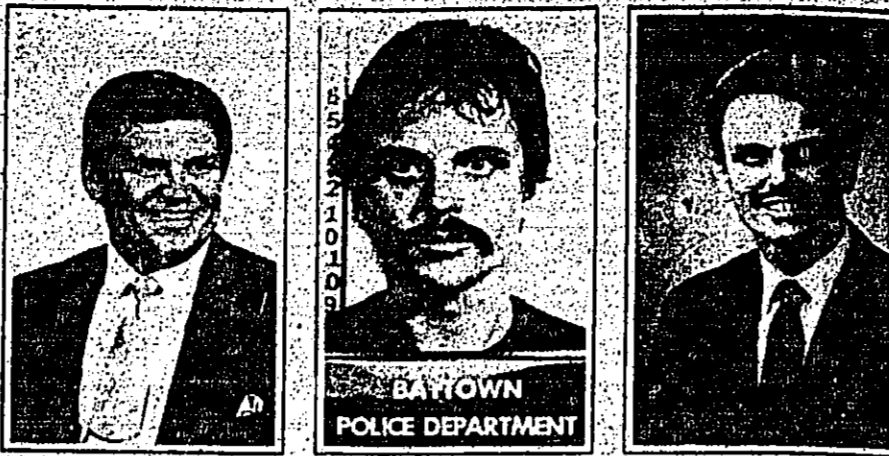
GSU is the first utility in Texas to propose such a discount and the concept has been endorsed by the staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas. Numerous social service agencies, including the Texas Department of Human Services, have endorsed the GSU proposal.

"We realize that older customers living on low, fixed incomes are having a tough time making ends meet," said Ann Smith, GSU manager of community affairs. "Based on customer research and what we had heard from the social service agencies, GSU management felt it was time to propose some relief."

All residential customers pay a \$7 basic monthly charge. In the present case, GSU has requested elimination of that charge for customers who are 65 or older and who have annual household incomes of \$10,000 or less.

"Programs like Project CARE are very helpful," Smith said. "But many of them are designed for emergency situations and not to provide continuing relief for senior citizens who are truly in need."

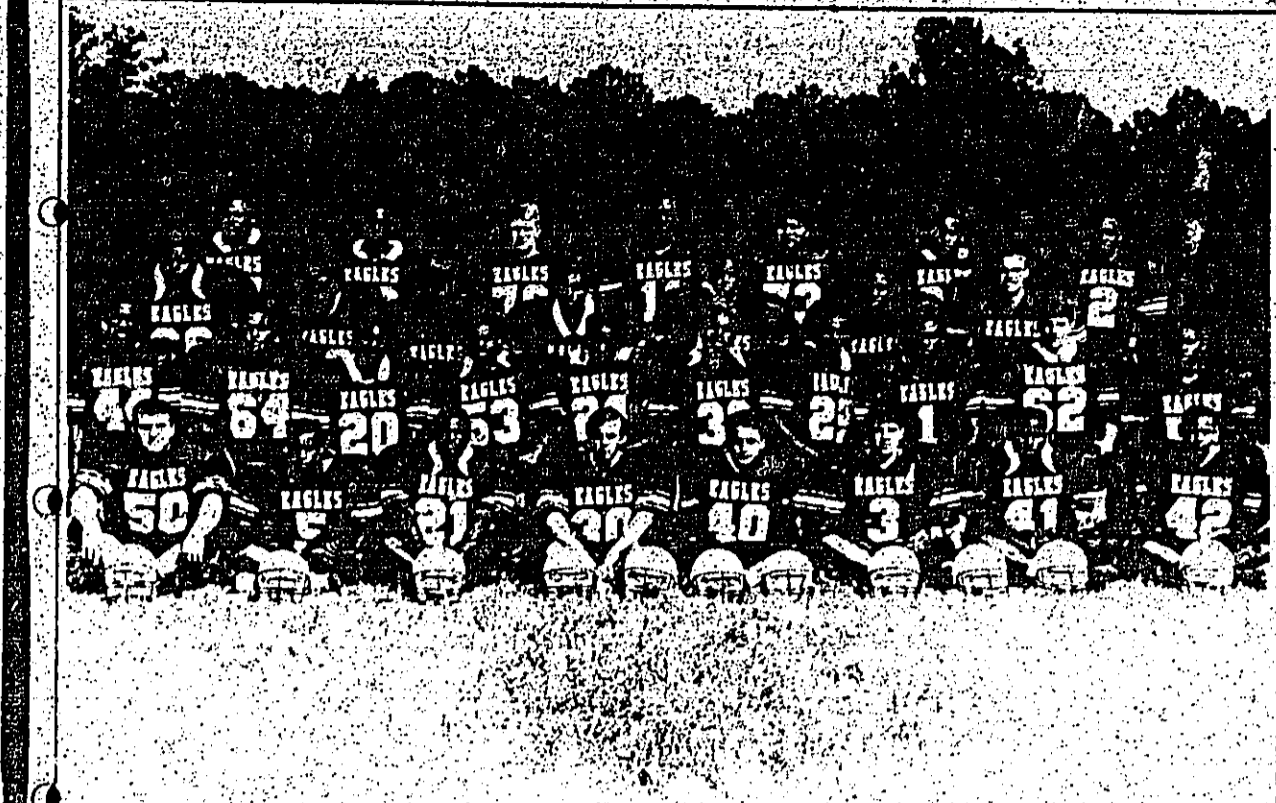

Warriors Record Sixth Shutout 20-0

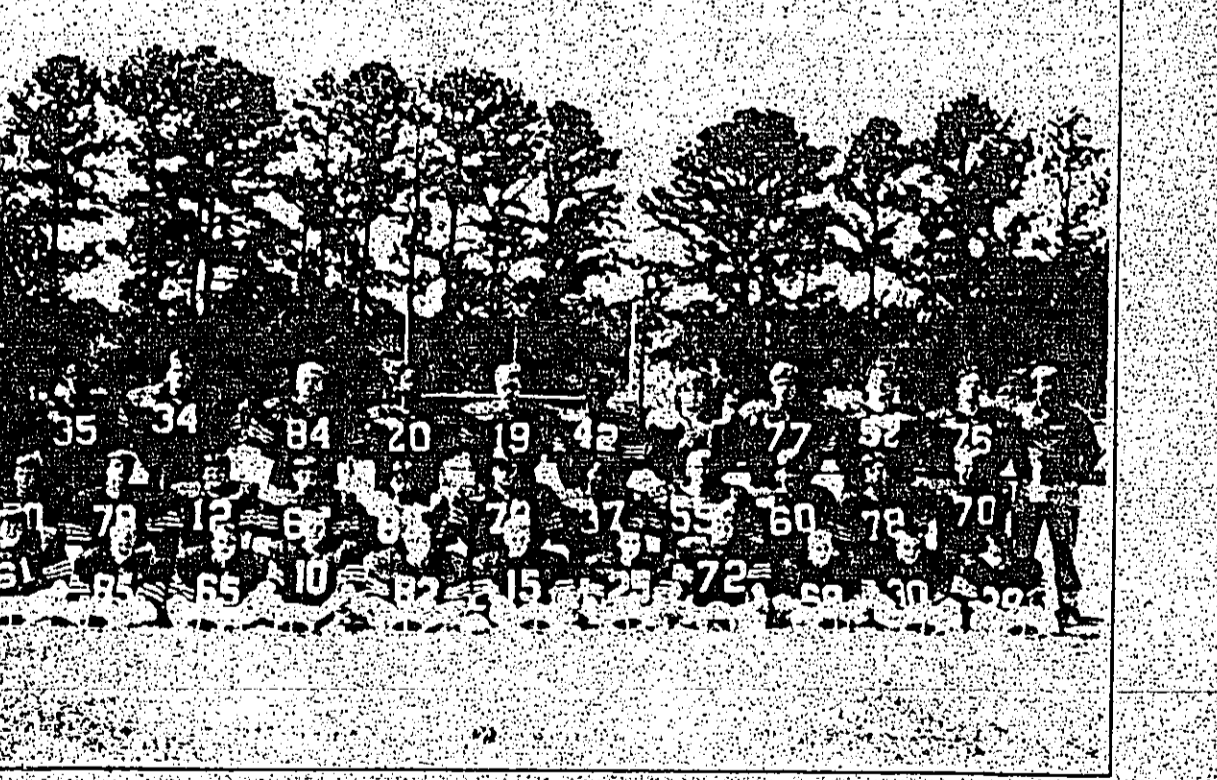
