
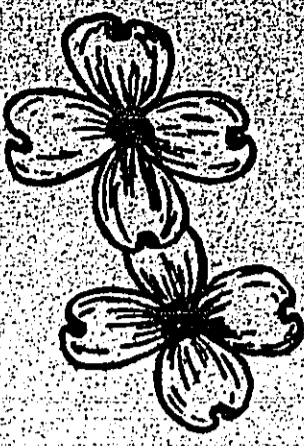

## Economic Resource Info Center (ERIC) Is Topic

The Deep East Texas Development Association will review the progress of one of its major projects, a proposed economic resource information center, when it meets on Friday, Dec. 7, in Nacogdoches.

The meeting will be held in Regents Suite A of the University Center on the campus of Stephen F. Austin State University, starting at 10 a.m. The meeting has been scheduled earlier in the month because of the Christmas holidays.

"This will be an important meeting for economic development efforts in Deep East Texas because it will outline plans for the proposed Economic Resource Information Center (ERIC)," said DETDA president Tony Bennett of Diboll.

Dr. Kent Adair of Nacogdoches, DETDA chairman for the ERIC project, is in charge of the meeting.

The Pineywoods Foundation of Lufkin recently helped form up funding for the preliminary development stage of the ERIC project with a \$12,000 grant.

The funds, coupled with others previously committed, will help pay for the development of a computer program design, which will drive the data base for economic development.

"We are very grateful to the Foundation for its support," said Bennett. "The Pineywoods gift will go a long way toward bringing about realization of ERIC as a major economic development tool for Deep East Texas."

In addition to economic development, the ERIC project will have the capability to create a bank of addresses in rural and city areas for the new Deep East Texas 911 emergency response system, as well as mapping/information services for appraisal districts and others who need sophisticated maps and property data.

## JTPA Program More Than 'Just Pay Check'

For some Americans work is a natural part of life. But for others the struggle to achieve is a story of great courage and determination to beat the odds. Those with no skills and few hopes, many family responsibilities but few resources. Here then is a JTPA story that is indeed a portrait of progress.

Larry Cornelius and his family moved back to Tyler County from McAdoo, Texas leaving behind him the life of farm working and low paying low skilled jobs. In the fall of 1988 Larry and his family arrived in Tyler County without job, home or even skills required to support his family. He found the situation about the same as in McAdoo. Soon he and his family were receiving public assistance, but Larry wanted more. After working several low paying, low skilled jobs, a friend told Larry about the JTPA program. A program where he could gain Job Search experience and a pay check.

Larry applied at the JTPA office and was certified eligible to participate in the OJT program, a program designed to train employees in high skilled jobs at the worksite, he received a training assignment at Texas Pacific Wood Products in Hillister, for 1040 hours which led to a permanent position. Larry made remarkable progress and in a short time was promoted to Yard Foreman. Larry attributes his progress to courage, his determination to beat the odds and efforts of the JTPA program.

Helping those most in need of assistance is a challenge, for those are the most difficult to reach. That is where the JTPA can help. The program offers a unique opportunity for local government, labor, business industry and community organization to bind together to address local concerns.

### Patsy Duke Thanksgiving Fare

As our thoughts turn to Thanksgiving, I'd like to share with my readers a recipe that has, for many years, been a family favorite.

**POTATO ROLLS**

1 yeast cake  
1/2 cup milk warm water  
1 cup scalded milk  
1/2 cup shortening

3 eggs well beaten  
1 cup mashed potatoes  
2 tsp. salt  
1/2 cup sugar

5-6 cups flour

In a small bowl dissolve yeast in lukewarm water. In a separate container, mix milk and shortening. Four dissolved yeast and water into large bowl. Stir in scalded milk and shortening. Add eggs, mashed potatoes, salt and flour. Mix thoroughly. Gradually stir in flour for desired consistency. Dough will be sticky. Place in a large greased bowl. Grease top of dough, cover and put in refrigerator for 24 hours. Knead as dough rises.

Remove dough 2 hours prior to baking. Knead and form into rolls. Place on greased pans and brush tops with melted butter. Cover and let rise until double in bulk. Bake at 400 degrees F. until golden brown.

Rolls can be kept in refrigerator for at least two weeks. Rolls can be baked ahead of time, frozen and heated immediately prior to serving.

Sprinkle baked, thawed rolls lightly with water. Seal in aluminum foil and place in 350 degree oven for 15 minutes. Serve immediately.

### Letter To The Editor

More Old Trees Fall Victim To Highway Department.

On a recent trip to Lake Toledo Bend via Livingstone, Woodville and Jasper, I was shocked and grieved to see beautiful old specimen trees along the highway right-of-way near Woodville are rapidly being felled.

I have driven this route for twenty years. Hwy. 190 was once a beautiful drive bordered on both sides in a lovely diamond pattern of stately old Pines, hand-some Beeches, tall Magnolias, Dogwood, Sweet Bay, and a wide variety of very fine old Oaks.

I was saddened and outraged to see that these wonderful old trees had been cut down but I felt I was helpless to do anything about it. I just sell my property at Toledo Bend. Lake and move to some state where majestic old trees are held in greater esteem. But then I kept waking up at night with a sick feeling, seeing the huge old stumps. I could not sleep. Finally, my horror and anger prodded me to action.

My investigations revealed that the Texas Highway Department had required Southwestern Bell Co. to remove the trees as a condition of its permit to lay fiber-optic cable along the Hwy. 190 right-of-way. Bell officials explained that the cutting was not necessary for the laying of their cable and that they were reluctant to cut the old trees. They were forced to destroy the trees by the Highway Department. Highway Department officials tried to justify the cutting by saying that there are plans to widen Hwy. 190. I'm sure that park-barrel agency has plans to widen every road in this state at taxpayer expense. They didn't say when the road was to be widened, nor, more importantly, did they offer any proof that all the trees would have to be cut for the widening.

Well, anyway, they said trees are dangerous because people kill themselves by running off the road into trees.

What a twisted world we live in today. Guns don't kill people; alcohol doesn't kill people; pesticides don't kill people; trees kill people! Can you believe the gall of this agency that "hopes" it's doing a good deed, called, "Forest Trails"?

I suspect the Highway Department's real concern is to prevent the venerable old trees obstructing the view of parish new billboards, large concrete parking lots and cheap enterprises that are sure to develop on a widened road. You can see it starting to happen now. Oh, and we surely wouldn't want to have anything in the way of their precious mowers.

Anyone familiar with photography knows how light entering the lens will "burn out" the exposed film. Conversely, too little light results in a dim, underexposed picture. In the same way, your eyes must adjust and regulate the amount of light entering if you are to see properly.


