Child Protection Is Topic

There will be a Community Forum on Nov. 29 at the Crossroads Restaurant, 249 East Gibson in Jasper. The forum, sponsored by the Jasper County, Tyler County, Newton County and Sabine County Child Welfare Boards is co-sponsored by the Texas Department of Human Services Children's protective services division.

The purpose of the forum is to foster open communication and joint planning between the community and the Department of Human Services on critical issues that affect abused, neglected or exploited children.

The participants of the forum will be asked to help carry out the action plan developed during the forum. Forums of this type are being held in communities all across Texas to open communications and build relationships that more adequately meet the needs of children and their families in the Lone Star state.

The ultimate goal is to improve the protection of Texas children from abuse and neglect and carry out the mandated responsibilities of the Department of Human Services.

GSU's Project CARE Delivers Goods

Emergency energy funds totaling \$24,808 were distributed to 336 households in Texas during the third quarter of 1990 by Project CARE (Community Assistance Relating to Energy), reported a Gulf States Utilities Co. spokesman.

Project CARE was established through the cooperation of Gulf States and community leaders throughout the GSU service area in Texas and Louisiana. The program provides emergency financial assistance on utility bills and some weatherization and repair projects for the needy elderly. GSU customers and employees support the program through contributions.

Throughout GSU's two-state service area during the third quarter, Project CARE distributed \$98,737.18 to 1,445 households, the spokesman added. Since January

payments totaling \$275,869 have been made to 4,164 households.

Since the program began in March 1983, over 36,000 households in the two states have received Project CARE payments averaging \$63, the GSU spokesman said. Total payments amount to nearly \$2.4 million.

Monitoring councils in Texas and Louisiana oversee the program and conduct annual audits and spot checks to ensure that funds are properly spent, the spokesman said.

Inspector Bids For County Health Work

The following is a letter submitted by Nova Rae Michaux prior to her appearance at Tyler County Commissioners Court on Monday, Dec. 10 regarding the need for a health/food inspector for Tyler County which has some 38 restaurants or food service establishments.

LETTER TO TAXPAYERS

As Woodville City Health Inspector, my job is to inspect and educate food handlers (establishments) as to the rules on Food Protection and Food Service Sanitation. All food establishments must comply with these rules, which are set by the Texas State Department of Health and the City of Woodville Department of Health.

Routine inspections eliminate potentially hazardous food conditions which could cause a threat to the public health. I am seeking a position as Tyler County Health Inspector. Food establishments outside the city yet in Tyler County number between 35 to 40. These establishments do not receive attention or routine inspections as necessary to prevent potentially hazardous food conditions. Please let your commissioners know your feelings on this matter before Dec. 10, 1990, at which time I will present it to the Commissioners Court.

Homes Tour Dec. 8

When the weather turns wintry in Tyler County next month, the warmest ears and jauntiest souls are apt to belong to the six citizens who got Lollie Robinson's hand-knitted watch-caps during the Annual Christmas Tour of Homes on December 8.

"They go fast," recalls a member of the Woman's Study Club, one of the three clubs sponsoring the tour. "They're not only very distinctive gifts, and highly practical too—they're also exquisitely done." Knitted in white, Christmas red, and Christmas green, the caps follow a design created decades ago by the Episcopal Women of New York for sailors standing watch on icy voyages through the North Atlantic. Lollie is putting pom-poms on five of the six caps she's knitted for this year's homes tour. "The skiers and bicycle riders seem to like that style," she says.

The same tributes paid to Lollie's watch-caps are lavished upon scores of hand-crafted gift items and homemade foods put on sale by the Woman's Reading Club, the Civic Heritage Club, and the Woman's Study Club at the homes on the tour. Proceeds are used for scholarships for Tyler County youths.

For example, Thelma Minyard's quilts deserve to be framed and passed down from generation to generation. This year's quilt, to be awarded to some lucky ticket-holder, features blue and white stars design-garlanded with flowers.

"The henscratching is quilted-in," says Thelma, Woodville's favorite second grade teacher who is now retired. She donates a quilt each year for the Woman's Reading Club to

raffle off and raise funds for a worthy project. Chances to win her Star Quilt will be sold during the Homes Tour.

"We make the best pies in town," Judy Hancy says of the members of the Civic Heritage Club, "so that's what we sell at the home we sponsor." And not only pies, but also many kinds of baked goods and toothy treats, from breads and cookies to cheese balls and jellies.

"Cindy Sager's sugar-free apple pie is a special treat," Judy says. "It's sweetened only by natural juices, so diabetics and other folks who have to watch their diets can have a feast, too."

As in past years, Judy and Sam Hancy have made their popular Snow Goose stained glass art to be raffled off during the Homes Tour. Tiffany-folled, it portrays a lordly snow goose with a green Christmas wreath around its neck. The scene is displayed on a stand. Those are only a few examples of the dozens of gift items crafted and cooked by the creative members of the three clubs that arrange the Annual Christmas Tour of Homes for local folks and visiting friends from other places.

The charming and impressive homes on this year's Tour are: the David Provost home on FM 1746, sponsored by the Heritage Civic Club; Magnolia Hill Ranch on US 190; the Tyler County retreat of Mrs. Allan Shivers and the late governor, sponsored by the Woman's Reading Club; and the Heyward Feiner home on FM 256 South, sponsored by the Woman's Study Club.

October Accident Report

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated a total of 21 rural traffic accidents in Tyler County during the month of October according to Sergeant Roy D. Henry, supervisor of Highway Patrol Area 2B-4. As a result of these accidents, Troopers reported 13 injuries and no traffic fatalities.

Thus far in 1990, Troopers have investigated a total of 186 motor vehicle accidents in Tyler County resulting in 119 injuries and 3 traffic deaths.

In the ten East Texas Counties that comprise Highway Patrol Sub-District 2B-B; Angelina, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby, Trinity, and Tyler; Highway Patrol Troopers have responded to a total of 1950 rural traffic accidents since Jan. 1, 1990. These accidents have resulted in 48 deaths and 1496 injuries. This will compare to 1786 accidents; 47 deaths; and 1242 injuries during the same period last year (1989).

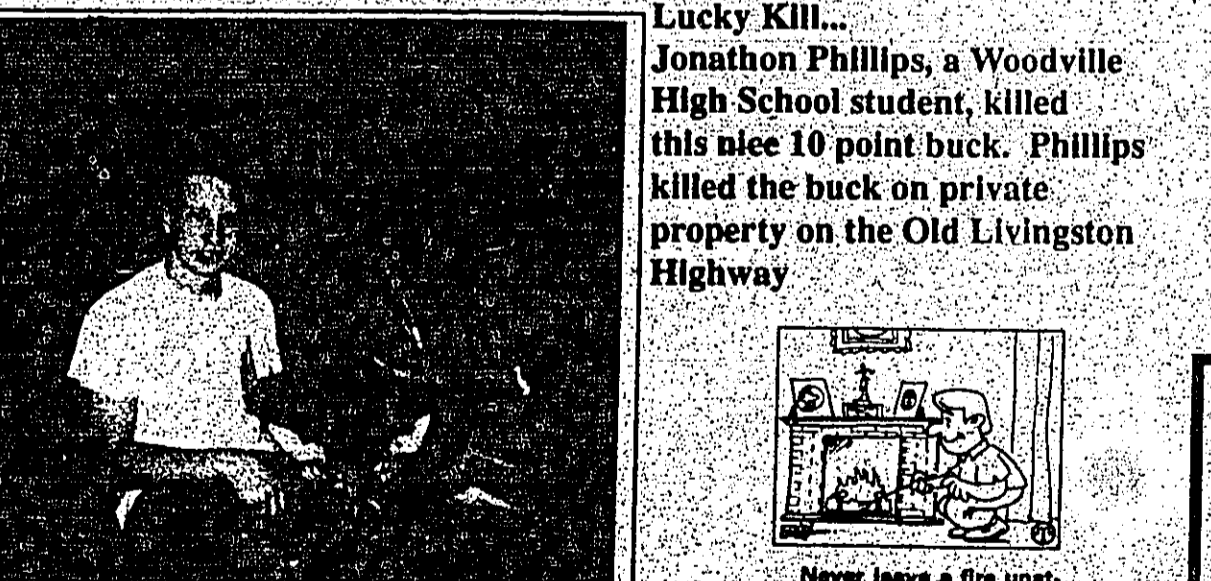

Social Security While In Prison

According to David Bennett, District Manager of the Lufkin Social Security office, an often asked question is whether a person may be paid Social Security benefits while in prison. In general, the answer is "no," but there is an exception which will be addressed later.

Until 1980 there were no restrictions in the law which prevented an incarcerated person from receiving benefits. If all factors of entitlement were met, benefits were paid. The types of benefits included retirement, survivors, disability and even student benefits, if appropriate.

In 1980 legislative changes suspended disability payments to those imprisoned for a felony and also student benefits to those in prison. These were the most common types of benefits paid to inmates.

Retirement benefits for inmates age 62 or over were not affected by the 1980 legislation. Neither were dependent benefits payable on the work record of incarcerated individuals. Additional language was added to read, in the case of disability, that any impairment that arose or was aggravated during the commission of a felony would not be considered in determining medical ne-

Home Mortgage Rates Cut For Vets

WASHINGTON—The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs has lowered the maximum interest rate on VA-backed home mortgages to 9.5% for qualified veterans, says U.S. Senator Phil Gramm.

This is good news, not only for veterans who can now expect to pay less for a new mortgage, but to the

entire real estate and homebuilding industry in Texas," Gramm noted.

The new VA interest rates are 9.5% for houses, townhomes, and condominiums; 12% for manufactured homes; 11.5% for loans covering both manufactured homes and lots; and 11% for home improvement loans.

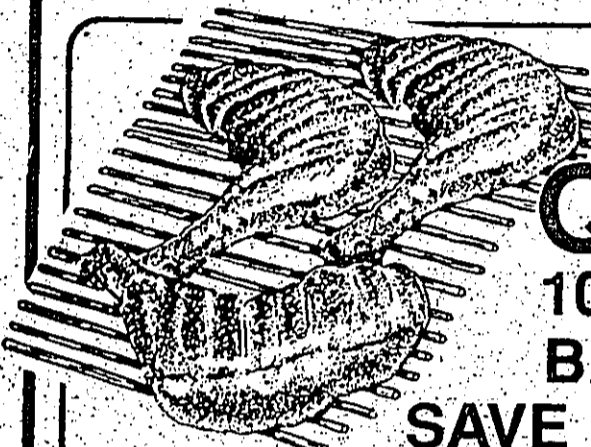

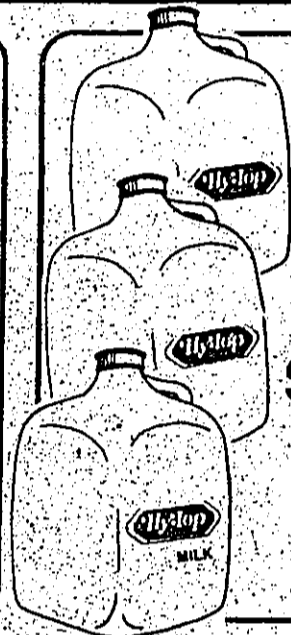
