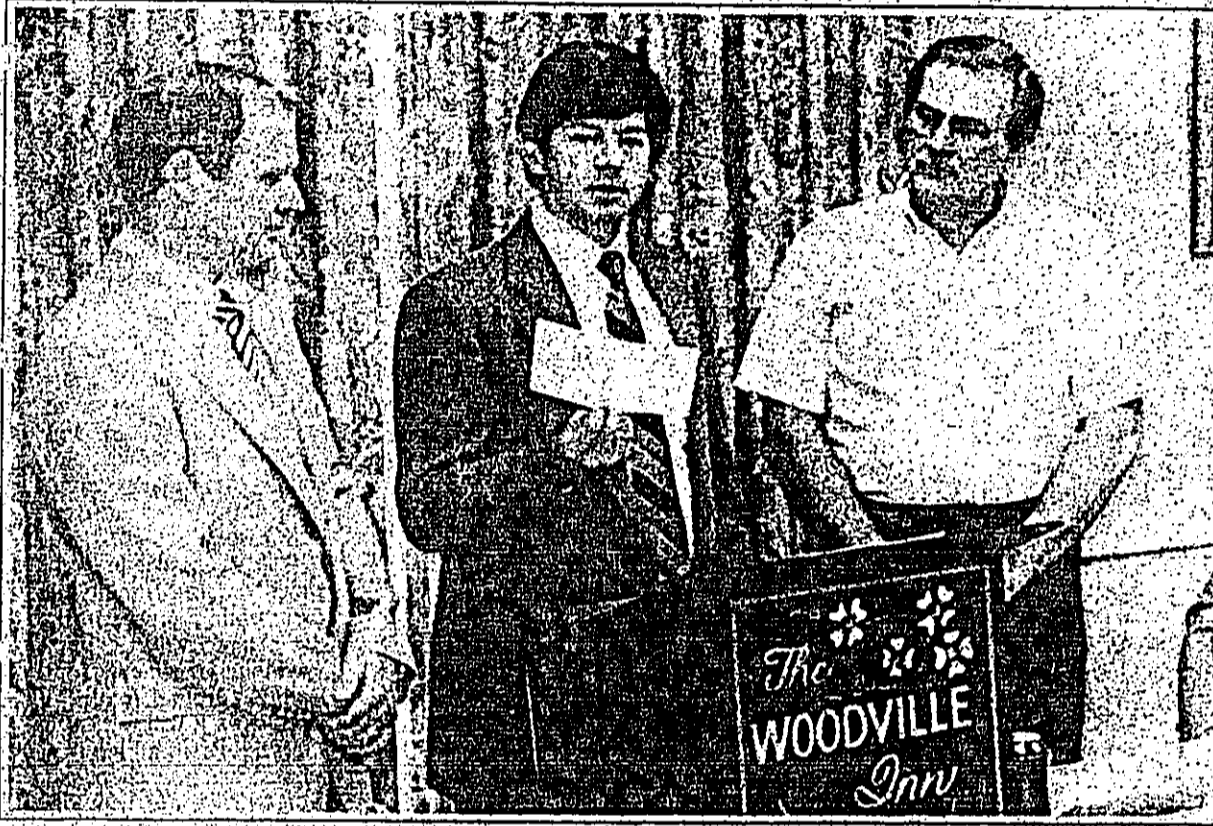
"Merry Christmas Mom!"

Caring Is Sharing Christmas Dinner Feeds Over 500

"Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these, my brethren, ye have done it unto me." The old familiar statement, spoken by Jesus, is from the Holy Bible, Matthew 25:40.
On Dec. 15, Caring Is Sharing served a Christmas Dinner to over 500 people who walk a financial path that is much more difficult than the one most of us walk.
The dinner was held from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the Ballroom of the Woodville Inn.
Dinner guests came from all parts of Tyler County - so did volunteers. Teenagers to senior citizens helped prepare and serve the food.
Tables were laid with alternating red and green cloths. A lighted Christmas tree, taped Christmas music and the appearance of Santa Claus, who gave candy canes to each guest, added a festive air to the occasion along with the smiles of volunteers in the serving line as they heaped plates full of steaming holiday fare.
Officers of CIS are Marjorie Matherne, president; Jack Long, vice president; and Ann Morrison, secretary.
When I asked Ms. Matherne who had been invited who had been invited to the dinner, with a twinkle in her eye, she replied, "Anyone who had a need."
Tickets, which served as invitations to the dinner, were given to all clients who had come to CIS for assistance. The Department of Human Services, The Health Department and Tyler County Churches all were given tickets to give to any person who needed assistance.
The menu consisted of turkey, dressing, green beans, sweet potatoes, gravy, bread and dessert.
Since the guests had no transportation, the Inn's bus, a service of MEMPHIS, was made available to CIS at no cost.
Among the 256 persons who attended the dinner, many came via their own transportation, walked or found rides with others. The mini-bus, with its driver, shuttled the remainder from their homes to the ballroom, turned dining room and home again.
Woodville's Chief of Police Scott Yokes and his family delivered dinners along with pamphlets containing the meaning of Christmas, to prisoners at the Tyler County jail. The Yokes and other volunteers served 270 dinners to guests who were unable to attend in person. These included persons in nursing homes in Woodville and to anyone in the Housing Authority who had a great need. All left overs were delivered to the nursing homes.
Raymond Drouot and his wife, Thelma, were co-chairmen of the dinner. According to Ms. Matherne, those who worked for over a month coordinating the entire affair. Various Tyler County churches assumed an item on the menu, provided the selected food and cooked it. "The spirit of cooperation was beautiful," Ms. Matherne said, "down to and including the volunteers who cleaned up after the dinner."
Ms. Matherne expressed gratitude to the Woodville Inn for its graciousness in making the Ballroom available to CIS for this occasion and for going the extra mile of permitting CIS to use the Inn's kitchen facilities all at no charge.
The CIS Christmas dinner has become a tradition that began five years ago.
Volunteers who have worked with the program believe that weather plays an important part in the attendance. Last year when a frigid cold front bearing miserably cold wet weather moved into the area and lingered, only about 300 people were served. This year the number of persons served topped 500. Volunteers believe that the mild weather that prevailed throughout the day greatly contributed to the number of persons in attendance.
The idea of CIS originated in 1977 when "Butch" Howard, a social worker with the Department of Human Services in Woodville, realized the necessity for the community to help the needy.
For three years prior to the inception of CIS, Ms. Howard kept an emergency store of food in her office to provide for the people who fall through government cracks, or for those who because of long waiting periods of government red tape would otherwise have been without food. The emergency food supply also was given to those who, between applying for food stamps and the arrival of said stamps, had no food.
As the need increased, Ms. Howard asked 10 ministers, who pastor area churches, to work with her and together they started CIS.
Ms. Howard continues to work closely with CIS but only as an ex officio member.
Ann Morrison, secretary of CIS, who has also served two consecutive terms as president, said that most people served by CIS are the working poor people, not those who sit at home waiting for their welfare checks. "These are people who work part time or who are working for minimum wage; those who have lost their job; those who, because of low income and high utility bills, face having their utilities cut off or those who are faced with unforeseen emergencies," she said.
Ms. Matherne said that an average of 1500 families were served during 1990. That's an average of 25 families per week. A family usually consists of

every Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
Several years ago I had the good fortune to become friends with an RN from Jamaica - a woman in her mid-thirties, well educated culturally and academically who had travelled extensively. She asked me the following question: "In what way? I replied, "You judge a country by the way it cares for its poor. It's a good measuring device," she said. "Why do we, here in Tyler County, care for our poor? Because we are called to do this. But for the grace of God, we could be the people in need instead of fulfilling the needs of others."
May God bless, to His glory, all our endeavors to help the poor, and may God give to each giver and to each recipient His divine peace. Have a Blessed Christmas!

The first annual Tyler County Search and Rescue Riders Christmas Turkey Shoot and Caring Is Sharing Food Drive held Dec. 15 was a great success according to the organizers.

There were ten public rounds including two all-women rounds and a round between the public and officers of the city and county as well as eight shoot-offs between local businesses.

The event began with Keith McNeal winning the first public round, following a three way tie with Raymond Henry and Tom Priddy. Round two was won by KVLL's Jesse McKee. Round three was an all-woman shoot-out won by Missy Odgen. After a tie-breaker between Raymond Henry and Carroll Die, Leo Courtney Jr. pulled off Round four. Harold Odgen won round five.
