### THURSDAY JAN. 4, 1990 "McDonald's" Grand Opening Jan. 6

### THURSDAY, JAN. 11, 1990 M.L. King Drive Dedication

Invitations have been sent out by the City of Woodville for the dedication ceremonies of the Martin Luther King Drive scheduled for 11 a.m., Monday, Jan. 15, 1989, which is King's Birthday.

According to City Manager Walt Davis, the event will be held at the corner of South Magnolia and M.L. King Drive. Davis said further weather complications develop that the ceremonies would be held at the Pleasant Hill Baptist Church, at 401 M.L. King Drive.

The Rev. Mike Keppeler who worked the TDC Units near and around Huntsville for over 10 years said further that the only dedicated "religious" space was for the Chaplain of the Unit.

### THURSDAY, AUG. 2; 1990 Gib Lewis, "My Feeling Is We Ought To Have A Dedicated Chapel"

"My feeling is we ought to have a dedicated chapel space at the prison unit in Woodville," said Texas House Speaker Gib Lewis who told the Booster late Tuesday, that he would come to the Units Open House on Saturday, August 11, and look into the issue personally.

"We'll see what we can do" the Speaker said further. "We need proper worship facilities. I'll study the question right away and report back to you."

When the average American child graduates from high school, they have spent more time in front of the family TV set than they have in school. For the benefit of parents who are concerned over possible ill-effects of TV watching on the eyes, there are some reassuring findings.


Watching a properly installed and adjusted TV from a reasonable distance (at least five times the width of the picture), involves less eye strain, than doing other close work, reading or sewing, for example. If a child insists on sitting too close to the set, he may be myopic (nearsighted). Excessive TV watching may cause eyestrain, headache and dizziness but will not damage the eyes.

TV watching and all visual tasks are easier and more fun when the eyesight is normal or corrected to normal. Have your eyes examined at least once a year.
