

As most local historians know, Robert Magee Shiv-

steaded the 640 cores West of Woodville known today as Magnolia Hills. Robert, who had seven sisters, was only fifteen at the time of

their migration. Young Shivers didn't tarry long in Tyler County, bowever. In 1961, wanting to continue his education, he returned to Mississippi to live with an uncle. By the time he got there, war clouds were gathering, and he soon joined the Westville Guards, part of the state militia, which later became part of Com-pany B, 16th Mississippi Volunieers. On July 4, 1861, Robert Mages enlisted in the Confederate Army, which he served

He and his wife, Frances J. McAlister, raised a family of five boys, losing their only daughter in a tragic accident, when she was eight.
