legree of astigmatism has, in most cases, been stablished for the remainder of a person's life. However, changes for better or worse, after age 21 are not impossible. Astigmatism is caused by a slightly misshape cornea, which should be perfectly spherical. If the slope of the cornea is steeper at some points than

others, the light rays passing through will come to a focus at different points, rather than at a single point as required for sharp visual images. There is no need to endure blurred, fuzzy vision. Corrective lenses can correct most vision defects perfectly. The first step to perfect vision is
