Vicki Warfield's 35 Years of Red Cross Volunteerism Will Be Hard To Replace

Vicki Warfield To Be Honored Thursday, 7 p.m. At Woodville Inn

"Red Cross is my very heart but I really have had to give it up", explains retiring Red Cross Volunteer Vicki Warfield of her 35 years of leadership in provision for aid and support to families in the Tyler County area through a wide variety of disaster and emergency situations. Vicki continues "you know I did turn 81 just this last February".

Reservations are required by Noon Thursday, March 14, for Vicki Warfield Recognition Dinner and Ceremony to be held (Dutch Treat) Thursday March 14 at the Woodville Inn at 7 p.m. in the Ballroom. "Ninety percent of people don't realize that if anything bad happens at Beaumont or Port Arthur, those people are coming here and Red Cross would be what pro-

vides for that", says Warfield of her role in coordinating assistance in the several natural disasters affecting the county over the past 35 years. "I remember Hurricane Carla as a teenager when traffic from the south was bumper to bumper and we were putting people everywhere. My brother Ronnie and I took the car down by the outdoor theater which is now the Chrysler Dealer with

a sign on the back of the car saying "follow me". We took a line of cars over to St. Paul's Episcopal Church. (120 people spent the night there that evening) "recalls Warfield's daughter Jane Spencer of Jasper, Tx. "My main memories as a child of the Red Cross work was of people knocking on the door; of one family who spent the night with us

Indian Reservation Opens Saturday March 16

A formal ribbon cutting ceremony at 10 a.m. will officially open the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation Spring season on Sat. March 16.

Following the ribbon cutting ceremony at 1 p.m., there will be a special reception at the Indian Health Services Clinic, for Chief Fulton Battise mark-

ing his 55 yrs. of service and his 82nd birthday. An art and crafts show and sale will be held on March 16-18 featuring

Texas Artisans and Artists from adjoining states, who will help kick off this new spring season at the reservation. The Indian

Reservation is located between Livingston and Woodville on US 190. Opening hours will be from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Fridays

and Saturdays and 12:30 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Sundays. The Indian Reservation is located near the Big Thicket National Preserve

which is one section of the unique forested area extending throughout the southern states. The East Texas region is a known habitat for rare species of wildlife including birds long believed to be extinct.

In addition to the tours, the 26-acre Tombigbee Lake provides campers with primitive sites to full service RV sites. The 137 campsites surrounds the lake stocked with game fish open to the public for a fee. Food service at the Indian Reservation includes selected Indian menu items.

Visitors are permitted to tour a designated area preserved for conducting tours at the Indian Reservation on specially designed Big Thicket tour vehicles. Additional tours include miniature train ride through a Living Indian Village featuring demonstrations of food preparation, weapon making and basketry depicts an authentic era in the homelife of the Alabama-Coushatta Indian people.

The Alabama-Coushatta Indian basket makers traditionally weave their baskets during the winter months making individually designed baskets including effigies of Big Thicket wildlife. Several noted Alabama-Coushatta Indian basket makers will be featured at the Arts and Crafts show. For more information on the Indian Reservation visit S. City Council Hears Appeal From Woodville NAACP

Woodville City Fathers met in regular session Monday hearing an appeal from the Woodville National Association for the Advancement of Colored People represented by Willie Jerue asking for more black representation on the City Police Force. Jerue said "For some time the NAACP has discussed this issue and would like to bring this appeal before you tonight."

According to Woodville Mayor Tom Knapp, "I appreciate you're coming...this has been a concern of mine for quite a long time. Maybe 30 percent of our community is black," Knapp said. "Speaking personally, as long as qualified people are available."

The City of Woodville was presented the Tree City USA Flag by Forestry Professionals Sue Turfella and John Nelevitz. Along with the official flag were plaques and other indicators of Woodville's new and honored status.

City Police Chief Scott Yosko told the council and Jerue, that the problem was in getting qualified blacks to apply and meet the requirements for the jobs when they become available. Yosko said one candidate was only about two weeks from being considered, however.

Jerue asked "That as early as possible hire one or more blacks on the Woodville Police Force." In other police business, Chief Yosko made an appeal for a co-signature request for some \$3,000 for the Regional Narcotics Task Force to assist in drug activity in Tyler County. Councilmen Ken Weaver and Don Shaw initiated motions to authorize the action. The motion is not payable next year, according to Yosko.

City Housing Director Billie Hoke reported to the Council on handicap unit construction within the Woodville Housing complex and asked for support from the council to submit for new grants for remodeling some of the older units.
