Pvt. Whitaker Completes Basic

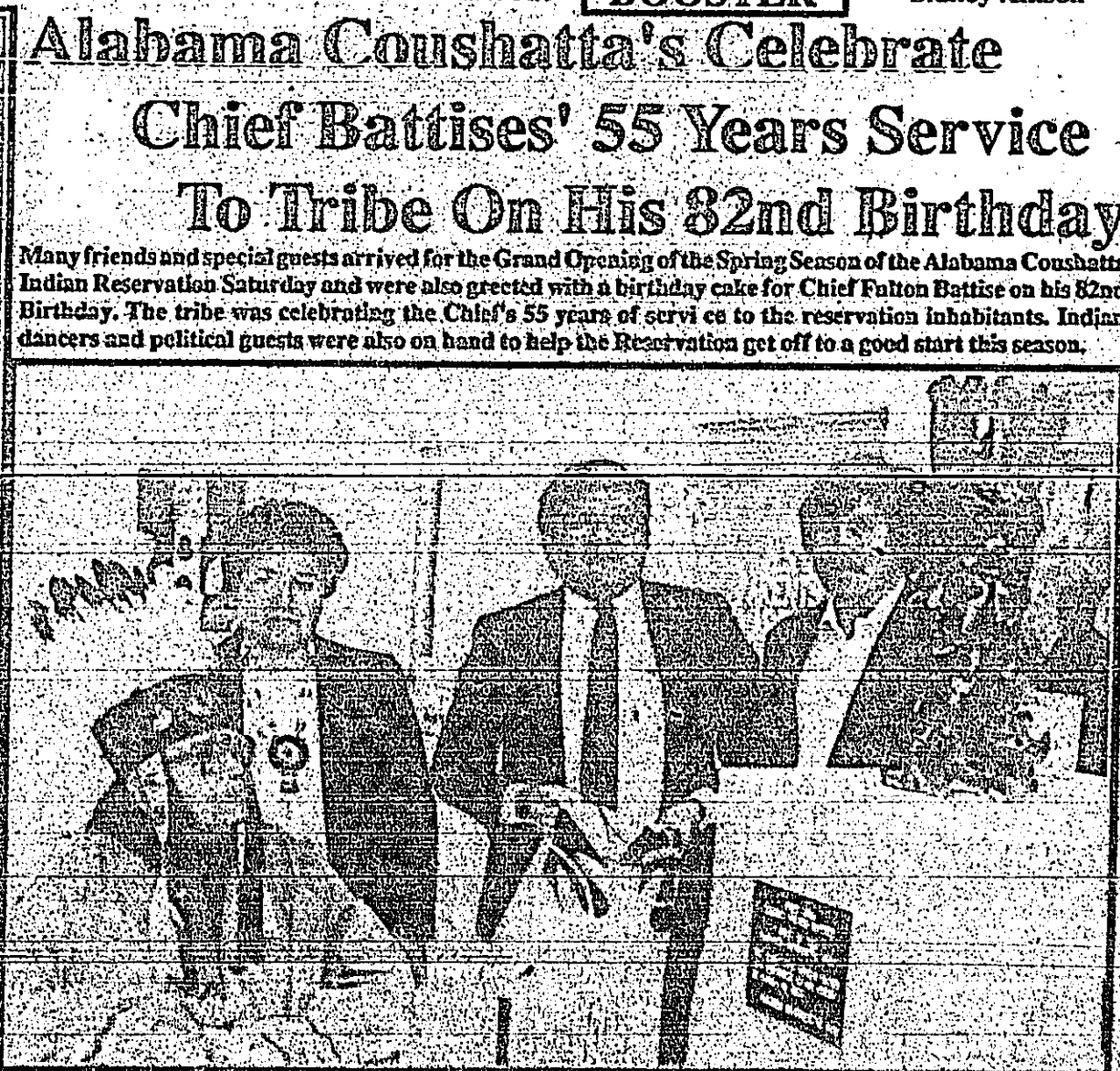

Helping Americans Have Children

Thanks to modern medicine, hundreds of babies are born to couples who once thought they could not have children.

The growing national trend to delay having children until marriages and careers have been firmly established, coupled with possible environmental factors, makes infertility an increasing problem among American couples.

Over 5.6 million people in the U.S. have reproductive impairments. Many of them do not seek treatment because they don't know about all the available options. Often, the problem can be solved.

One organization alone has helped bring over 400 American babies into the world. Called IVF Australia, it has two facilities, one at United Hospital in Fort Worth, Texas, and one at Westwood Hospital & Medical Center just outside Boston, Massachusetts. IVF Australia is now seeking to expand throughout the country.

It uses a non-surgical method of retrieving the wife's eggs, fertilizing them with the husband's sperm, then transferring the fertilized eggs back into the wife. At the couple's request, additional embryos may be frozen (cryopreserved). After about two weeks, a blood test indicates if a pregnancy is developing, which is later confirmed by ultrasound.

The organization provides counseling and support before, during and after the procedure. It's available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. What's more, in vitro fertilization is increasingly covered by health insurance.

Now, five years later, the World Conductor Facility is world famous.

The Living Lightning Rod

Living trees are lightning rods for electrical trouble. In a system similar to human circulation, water and sap move constantly from root to leaf. The water and the chemicals in the sap are excellent conductors of electricity.

If a tree has grown into contact with a power line, the potential for electrical path to the ground exists. Never attempt to trim a tree that has power lines running through it. Have a tree trimming professional, preferably one that works with your utility, handle the job.

Even when power lines do not contact a tree, danger of contact exists. Treehouses and upper limbs may bring children within reach of the adjacent lines. Be sure that children do not climb trees with limbs within 10 feet of any power source; double check the location of any treehouse before construction.

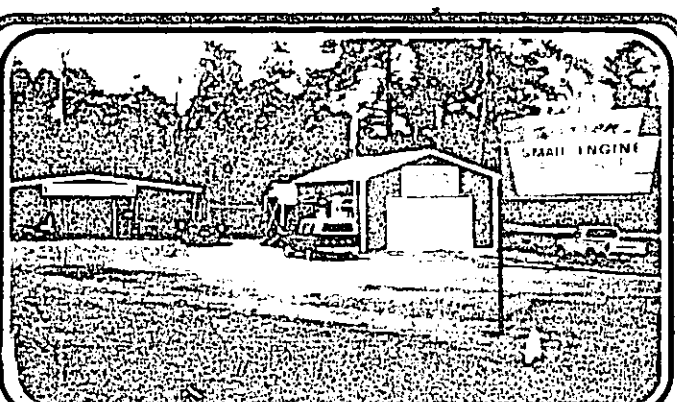

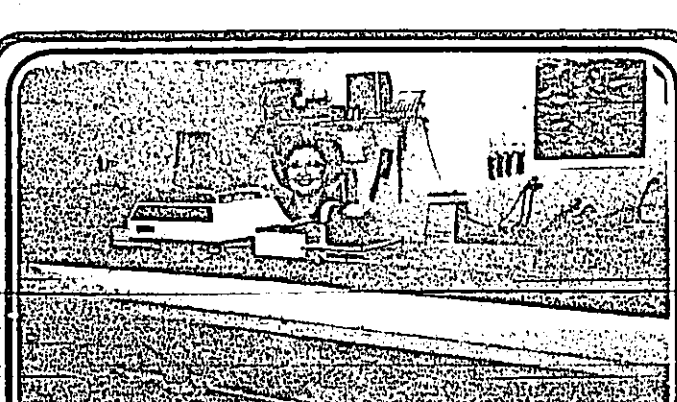
