11. *Chlorophyll a* (Chl *a*) is the primary photosynthetic pigment in most plants and algae. It is a green pigment that absorbs light energy in the blue and red regions of the visible spectrum. Chl *a* is located in the thylakoid membranes of chloroplasts. It plays a central role in the light-dependent reactions of photosynthesis, where it captures light energy and converts it into chemical energy in the form of ATP and NADPH. The structure of Chl *a* consists of a central magnesium atom coordinated by four nitrogen atoms in a porphyrin-like ring, with a long phytol side chain attached to one of the ring carbons.

Beware This Insect Enemy

Maquitos! These common insect pests are not just a pain in the neck—or anywhere else. They can also be a dangerous health hazard.

The Asian Tiger Mosquito (*A. albopictus*) pictured at right is a mosquito new to the United States that poses a potentially serious health risk in this country. Already common in 17 states, it has been found to be an efficient transmitter of a disease called La Crosse (LAC) encephalitis, as well as dengue fever, a temporarily incapacitating disease that is excruciatingly painful. The mosquito often makes its home in used tires, and is later transported across state lines.

To help control the spread of the Asian Tiger Mosquito, many health officials recommend consumer and professional mosquito control programs to eliminate breeding sites. Spray applications of an insecticide such as malathion have been found effective in destroying adult Asian Tigers.

Many veterans of the Vietnam War are eligible for entitlements some of them may not know about. They can expect these entitlements thanks in part to efforts by the Veterans of Foreign Wars in encouraging Congress to formulate and pass legislation.

As a result of the organization's encouragement, Congress has developed and adopted special legislation for Vietnam Veterans that includes:

- Priority hospital care for Agent Orange veterans.
- Expansion of the scope of the multi-million dollar Agent Orange epidemiological study to include exposure to other herbicides, chemical, biological or environmental hazards or conditions.
- A three year extension of the Readjustment Counseling Program.
- Two extensions of time period for Vietnam Era veterans to use their GI Bill benefits by writing to: Veterans of Foreign Wars, National Headquarters, Broadway at 34th Street, Kansas City, MO 64111.
