

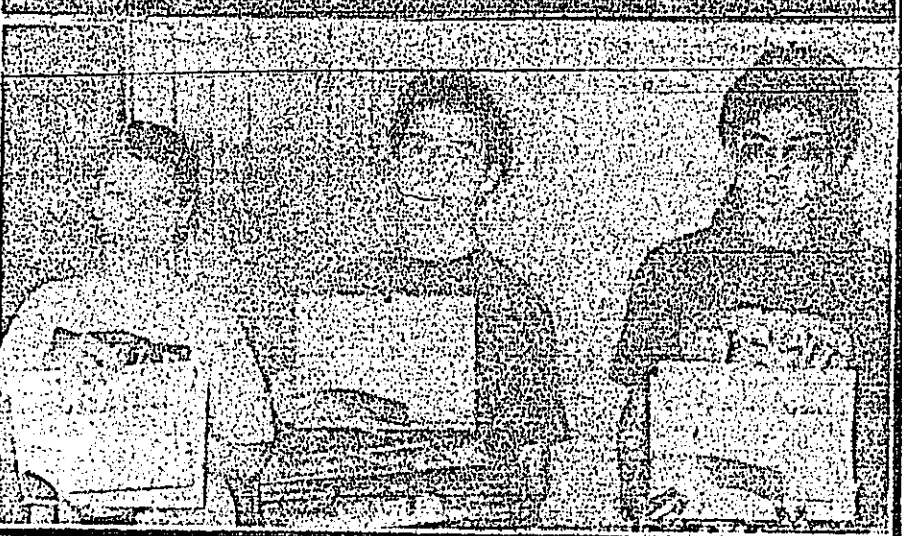
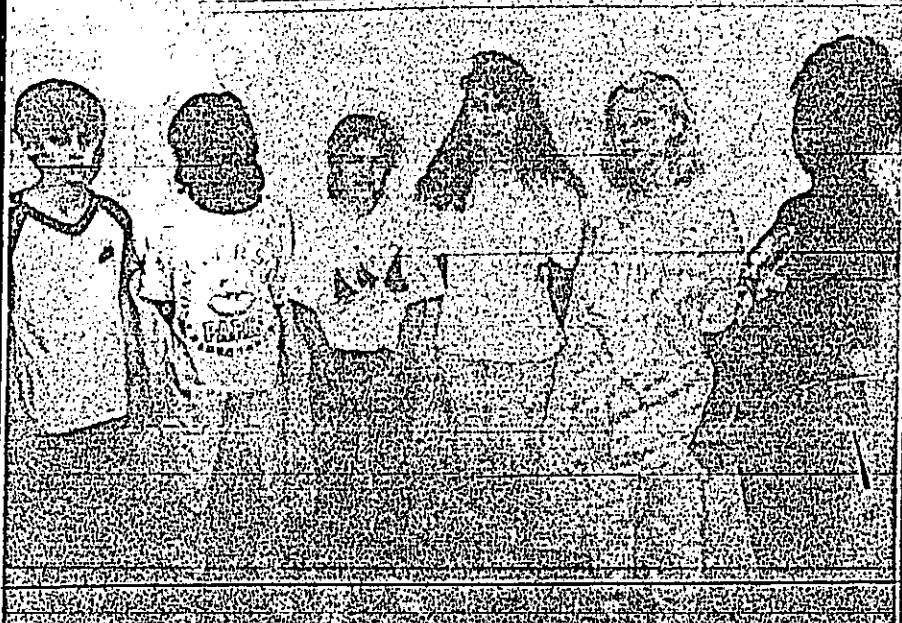
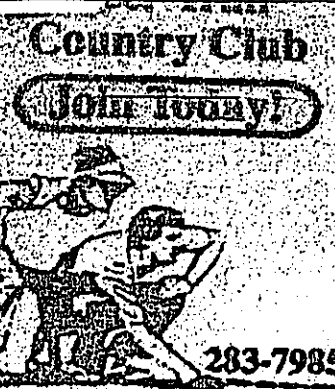

## Haley Aide Bashaw Here Soon

AUSTIN — Bob Bashaw, district aide for State Senator Bill Haley (D) will be at the Tyler County Courthouse at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, April 30, to visit with the senator's constituents.

"I know there are constituents who have problems they need help with from time to time who can't visit with me in Austin and may miss me when I am in the district office in Center," said Senator Haley. "Having Bob visit in the counties in Senate District three will ensure that all of the needs of individual constituents are being heard. These visits in the different counties will allow constituents to be heard one on one and give them a bigger role in state government. Bob will then report to me and we will do what we can to help solve them."

## Women's Federation Marks 100th Birthday

"Federation Day", marks the centennial of the G.F.W.C. Centennial Celebration. Club Women throughout our nation and world have been involved during 1990-1991.

In Tyler County, the mayor was contacted and a proclamation was issued proclaiming this as "Federation Week". The three Federated Clubs in Tyler County are: Heritage, Reading and Study, who joins with others in a salute to the General Federation of Women's Clubs and the role and importance of this organization.

The three clubs are involved in making good things happen in Woodville. All participate in the "Tour of Homes". Each stresses the importance of G.F.W.C. and Volunteerism.

The Heritage Club has twenty-three members. They sponsor a Valentine Dance with the proceeds going to the Cancer Society. During the summer, at least three classes are taught, by the members, at the Library. Reading sessions are held for children. Classes are provided for arts and crafts. Stain glass is raffled to raise extra funds.

The Reading Club has twenty-five members. Four \$500 scholarships were given to High School Seniors. One \$250 scholarship was given for a "Girls' State". Members volunteer serving at the hospital and nursing homes. Donations are made to M.D. Anderson Hospital, Library, Battered Women, etc. \$50 was given to Red Cross, and \$50 was given to the Christmas Tree of Lights for Children.

The Study Club has forty-one members. A scholarship is given to the Valedictorian and the Salutatorian of the Senior Class in High School. A \$50 recognition award is given to the Senior with the highest score on the ACT test. Also, an award is given to the one with the highest score on the SAT test. \$100 is given to a boy to attend "Boys' State". Members work with "Young Historians" at Heritage Village. The Study Club donates books and magazines for the Tyler County Library.

The three clubs joined together in hosting the Magnolia District GPWC Spring Convention. Volunteerism impact on daily lives and the influence members have in the betterment of the community: Past, Present, Future.

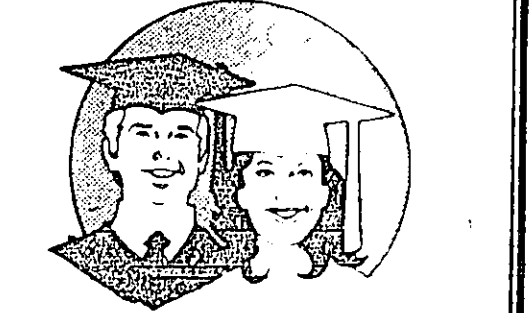
