

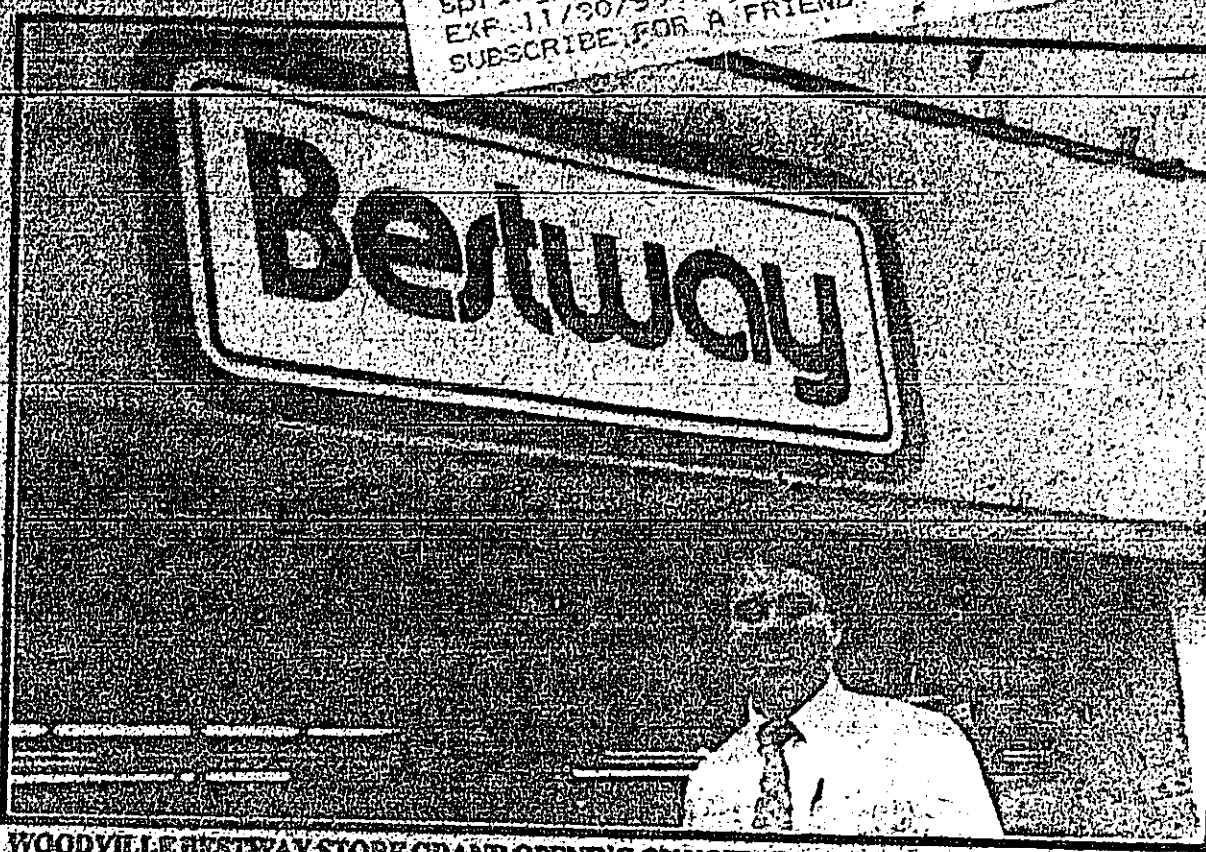

Bestway Food Retailers Here For Grand Opening With Hot Air Balloon

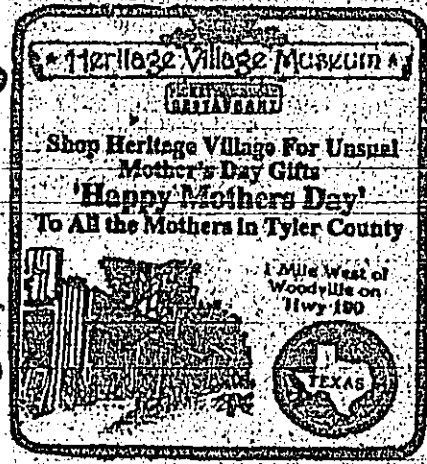

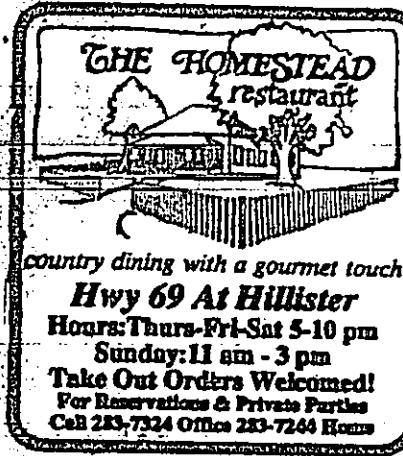

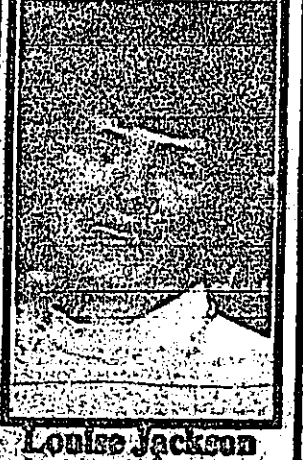

St. Paul's Episcopal To Receive New Deacon Candidate

Native Texan Nick Novak, 40, has been named by the Episcopal Diocese of Texas as a deacon-candidate who will serve St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Woodville beginning Saturday, June 15, according to the Church Bishop's Committee Senior Warden, Gene Tobey in an announcement he made to the congregation Sunday.

Novak will graduate from Trinity School of Ministry, near Pittsburgh, Pa., in May and will assume his new duties at St. Paul's including the role of Headmaster of St. Paul's Episcopal School on Saturday, June 15. He will be ordained as Deacon at St. Paul's Church on Sunday, June 23 as a postulant from St. John's Episcopal Church of LaPorte, Texas.

Novak is a graduate of Deer Park High School, and an alumnus of St. John's in Houston. Before June 23 with ordination he will be assigned to St. John's in Houston. He was ordained from the University of Houston as a postulant.

A nominating committee composed of Debbie Leuter, Cassandra Pate and Ann Maloy was named to select new officers after which nomination from the floor were open.

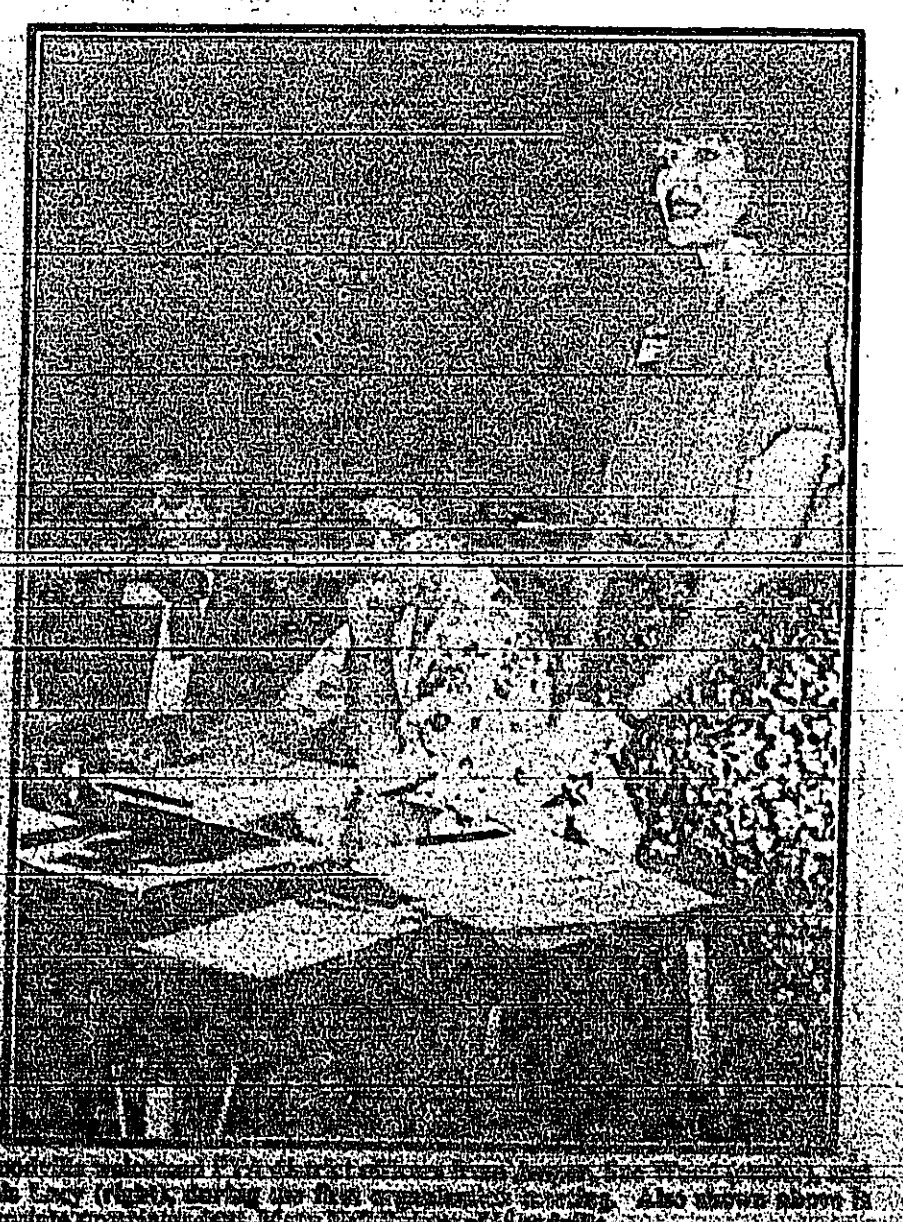

Baylor College of Medicine Doctors Have Choices When Ordering Life Saving Medications

A heart attack patient in the emergency room is probably not aware that the doctor has choices when ordering life saving medications.

After the crisis, the patient may wonder why the physician chose a \$2,200 "clot-busting" drug rather than the one priced at \$200. Many doctors still question which drug is better for patients: tissue plasminogen activator (tPA) or streptokinase.

Physicians from the DeBakey Heart Center of Baylor College of Medicine and The Methodist Hospital in Houston are participating in an international clinical trial that may resolve the issue.

Called CUSTO (Global Utility of Streptokinase and tPA in Occluded Coronary Arteries), the study will involve 40,000 patients in a head-to-head contest of the two drugs used to dissolve the blood

clots that cause heart attacks.

"Studies done so far indicate that streptokinase and tPA are almost equally effective in saving lives of heart attack victims, but tPA appears to dissolve blood clots in arteries faster," said Dr. Neal S. Kleiman, assistant professor of medicine at Baylor and regional director for a nine-state area in the United States' GUSTO study.

Since "time is muscle" for heart attack patients, it would seem that a drug that restores blood flow to the heart faster would be better. But no study so far has proven that," Kleiman said.

tPA, streptokinase or a combination of the two. Patients will also receive an intravenous dose of the blood-thinner heparin, which has been shown to improve the effectiveness of tPA. Other studies comparing the two drugs have not used intravenous heparin.

Some patients receiving streptokinase will be given heparin by injection under the skin as it was given in earlier European studies, Kleiman said.

"We need to know if the time difference translates into something meaningful. Will more heart attack patients be saved? Will hearts be damaged less or heal better?" Kleiman said.

If those hours don't matter, we ought to stick with the \$200 drug and spend the additional money on other things like finding a way to prevent heart attacks from occurring.
