## "Look At The Tennis Shoe Market" Parks & Wildlife Exec Forecasts For DETDA

Deep East Texas cannot expect changes in the way the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department operates in the future, says the department's new executive director.

Andy Sansom of Austin told the Deep East Texas Development Association at Newton that increasing demands for parks and other recreational activities by non-consumptive users (people who don't hunt and fish) will create a new market in the future for state parks and recreational planners.

Sansom said nearly all of the department's current revenues comes from the 6% of Texans who hunt and fish, but these revenues will not be sufficient to meet additional demands such as parks.

"There used to be a day when most of our park and non-hunting and fishing demands came from little old ladies in tennis shoes," said Sansom. "Today, every minor in Texas is measuring himself for tennis shoes."

"We've got to start looking at this new market from the standpoint of determining how we can get them to pay more of the costs in Texas. Hunters and fishermen cannot continue to support all of the demands in Texas," he said.

Another DETDA speaker, Bob Greene of Luling, discussed the Texas Rural Leadership Program, which is designed to help rural communities in Texas develop new and younger leaders.

Greene said the program provides training in motivation, communications, team building, conflict management, demographic evaluation, consensus building, and community needs assessment.

DETDa will attempt to bring the leadership program to Deep East Texas with the help of rural Chambers of Commerce. Ron Hufford of Lufkin, executive director of the Texas Forestry Association, will coordinate the DETDA project.

DETDa President Tony Bennett also announced nine committees to coordinate the association's 1991 work program. They are Thomas Moore, Lufkin, transportation; Ron Pack, Jasper, economic development; Bill Chadwick, Livingston, history and tourism; Ron Hufford, Lufkin, natural resources; Kent Adair, Nacogdoches, government affairs and ERIC; Joe Smith Hudson, education; Gary Neighbors, Lufkin, and Donnie Henson, Newton, water resources; and Tom Sturdivant, Woodville, healthcare.

DETDa also approved a resolution to the Texas Department of Highways and Public Transportation supporting the extension of Farm Road 92 in Tyler County.

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated a total of 8 rural traffic accidents in Tyler County during the month of April according to Sergeant Roy D. Henry, supervisor of Highway Patrol Area 2B-4. As a result of these accidents, Troopers reported 8 injuries and one traffic fatality.

Thus far in 1991, Tyler County Troopers have investigated a total of 39 motor vehicle accidents which have resulted in 4 deaths and 33 persons being injured.

In the ten East Texas Counties that comprise Highway Patrol Sub-District 2B-4; Angelina, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby, Trinity, and Tyler, Highway Patrol Troopers have responded to a total of 652 rural traffic accidents since January 1, 1991. These accidents have resulted in 20 deaths and 486 injuries. This will compare to 714 accidents, 15 deaths, and 513 injuries during the same 4 month time period last year (1990).

## Services For Hilda Coats Held June 2

Hilda B. Coats, 80, of Woodville died June 2, 1991 at Ramsey Place in Austin.

Mrs. Coats moved from Beaumont in 1947 to Woodville where she became active in the community life of Tyler county. She served 12 years as District Clerk and was very active in church affairs in the First Baptist Church of Woodville. She was a charter member of BPW Club of Woodville and received the honor of serving as district director in 1975. In April of 1991 she received the James E. Wheat award by the Tyler County Dogwood Association for her service to the Dogwood Festival. In May, 1991 the BPW of Woodville established a scholarship fund in her name and she was voted the outstanding citizen of her community.

Funeral services were held Monday, June 3 at Woodville First Baptist Church with Dr. Raymond Parker officiating. Interment followed in Magnolia Cemetery under the direction of Edwards Funeral Home in Woodville.

Survivors include her son, Dr. John R. Coats, Jr. & wife Lynn D. Coats of Austin; brothers, Henry Buchanan of Kerbyville and A.J. Buchanan of Dallas; sisters, Mrs. Ruby Smith of Woodville and Mrs. Mary Gay of Beaumont; two grandchildren, John Daniel Coats and Jennifer Lynn Coats, both of Austin.

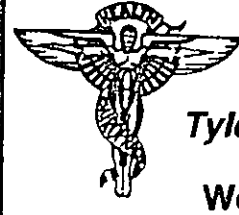
