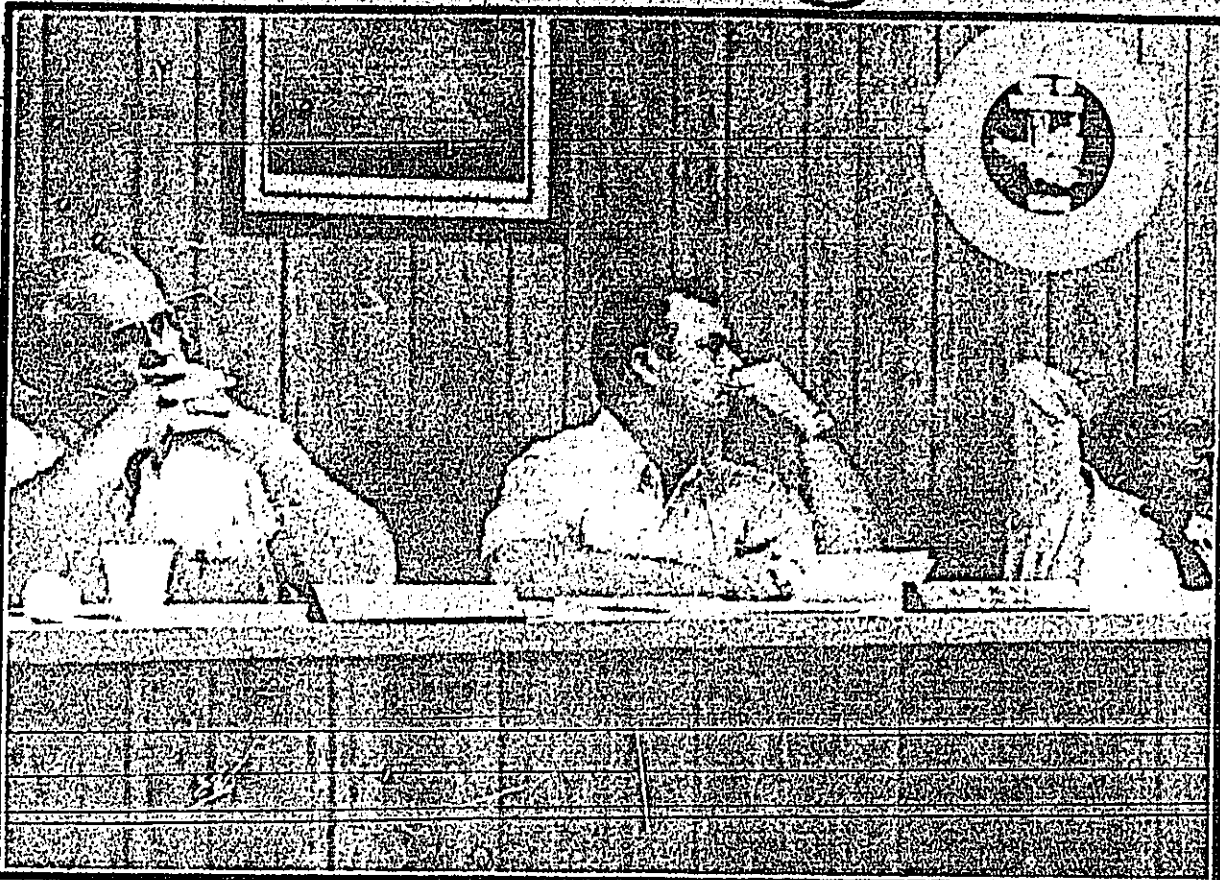


New Nursing Home Will Offer 70 Jobs

Woodville City Fathers met Monday and agreed to plat and restriction changes allowing a 90-bed nursing home to be constructed, full speed ahead, on about two-thirds of the acreage existing in the Timberland West Subdivision located south of Hwy 190 at the west city limits.

The council was pleased to hear from Jeff Smithers, representing Smithers Construction Company, that the facility would create a \$780,000 annual payroll in hiring some 70 personnel.

Smithers told the council that Healthcare Development Inc., currently owns nine nursing homes and has 11 under lease. The new facility comparable to the one scheduled to be built in Woodville, is located in Crockett.

Smithers said the facility would cost \$2 million to construct.

Woodville Mayor Tom Knapp inquired as to the residents costs at the home to which Smithers replied, "32 to \$71 for Medicare and \$45 for private pay."

"It sounds like a real asset to the community," Knapp said.

Smithers said his firm develops nursing homes in Texas, Arkansas and Missouri. The one in Woodville would contain some 30,000 sq. ft., he said. The 70 jobs would equal about \$60,000 or \$75,000 per month.

Smithers said the existing facilities in Woodville were "At about 95 percent of capacity and his firm has been permitted by the state to proceed with the project."

Smithers said his firm, "Would move quickly and the project ought to be completed in 6 or 7 months."

In other city business the council heard from Bobby Gibson, who the

City of Woodville has hired to build a recycling program but has had difficulty in establishing good record keeping habits, according to City manager Walt Davis, who said "I've told him to bring me mileage and pickup records, but he hasn't yet. Gibson quickly said the records would be given to Davis."

The council view seems to be that the participation by the residents of the city has not produced enough material value to be worth the cost to the city of collecting it.

"Is the dollar cost effective...people want police protection...parks and a lot of other things...is this cost effective?" asked Mayor Knapp.

We are learning about recycling...but we are paying a big price", said City Councilman Dr. Larry Phillips.

Councilman Ken Weaver said "We don't want to collect the coun-

ties recyclables", referring to the necessity of recordkeeping which hasn't been accomplished according to directives from the City to Recycle Manager Gibson.

In other city business the council agreed to:

- approve the May financial statement;

- pass a resolution in support of the Jasper Newton, Tyler and Sabine organization in which that group solicited Tyler County support to locate a 2,250 man prison unit in Jasper County....councilman Phillips cast a "no" vote in the action.

- the council was asked to prepare their thoughts for an increase in street rental for Southwestern Bell Telephone Company. According to council SWB leased the streets for 50 years in 1942 for \$3,000 per year and the lease comes up for revision in 1992.

- council also agreed to install several stop signs.

Solid Waste Study Eyed

Everett Griffith and Associates Inc., a Lufkin Engineering company, has been selected by the Deep East Texas Council of Governments to provide a solid waste study and plan for DETGOG's 12 counties.

The project will cover Angelina, Nacogdoches, Polk, Jasper, Tyler, Newton, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby, Houston, Trinity and San Jacinto counties.

In the first stage of the study, EGA will collect data about current solid waste production, collection and disposal in the 12 counties. This phase will be followed by an assessment of the data, along with a determination of projected future quantities and types of waste.

Possible solutions to the solid waste issues in the counties will also be explored and discussed with counties and cities in the

counties. A part of the planning effort will include a newsletter to keep the different entities informed about the planning effort.

EGA was earlier selected by the Pineywoods resource center to serve as the engineering and planning consultant for the development of the pioneering solid waste management plan for Jasper, Newton, Sabine, San Augustine and Tyler counties.

Clerk is my aide and you reach her at 409/755-6322, if you need directions or further information.

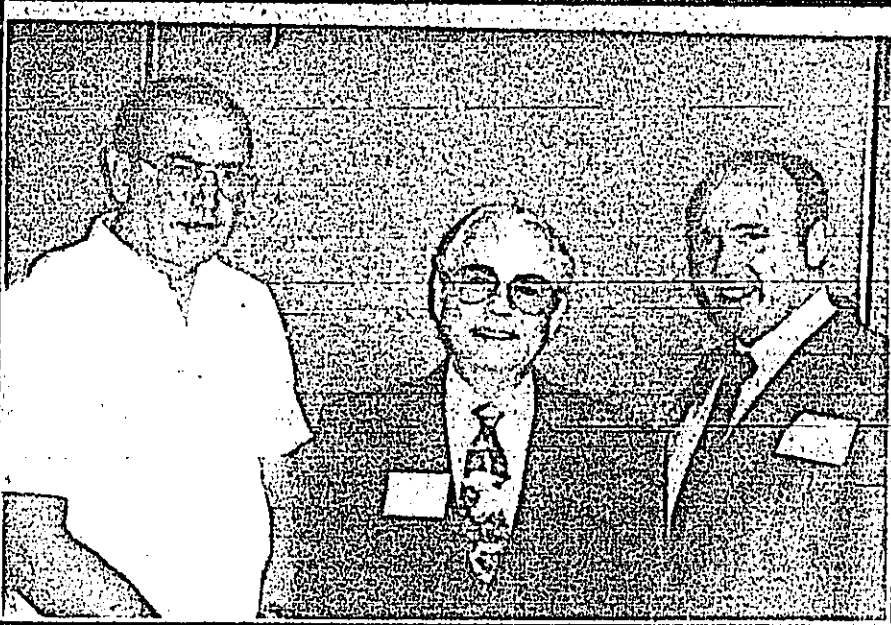

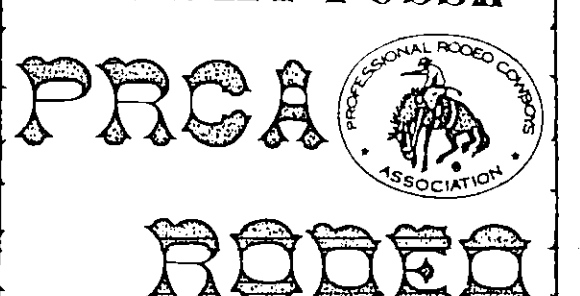

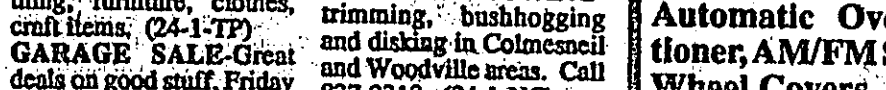
