Woodville Schools Are Focusing On Drug Problems

The Woodville Independent School District Board of Trustees were made aware Tuesday, July 23, that the percentage of students identified as using drugs and alcohol in Woodville schools is above the national average. The report, which is available to the public at the Administration Office, details the ages of students, the type of drug use, where the drugs are being ob-tained and used, and other facets of the alcohol and drug abuse problem. Dur-ing the 1990-91 school year, 277 Woodivlle sudents were identified at risk. Contacts were made with 222 students and 168 parents. Visits were made in 96 homes.
