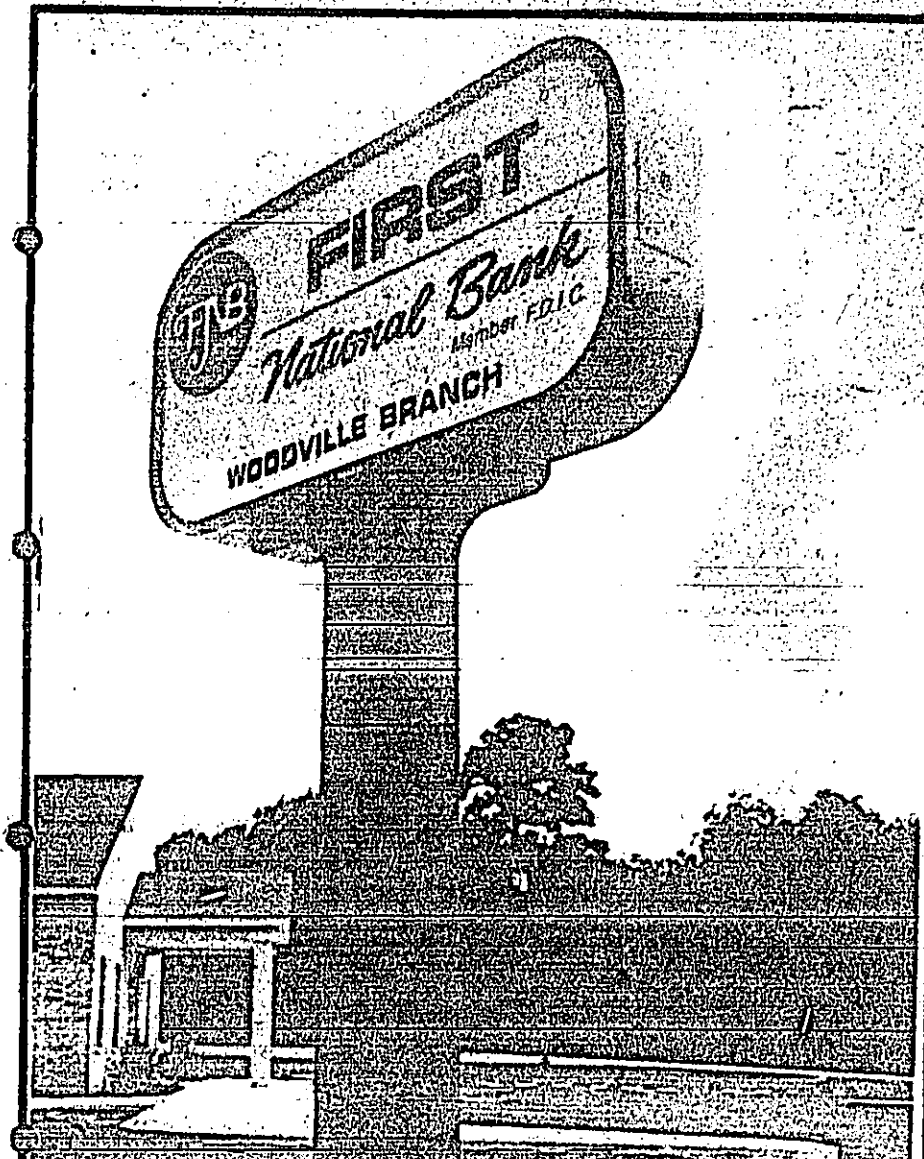

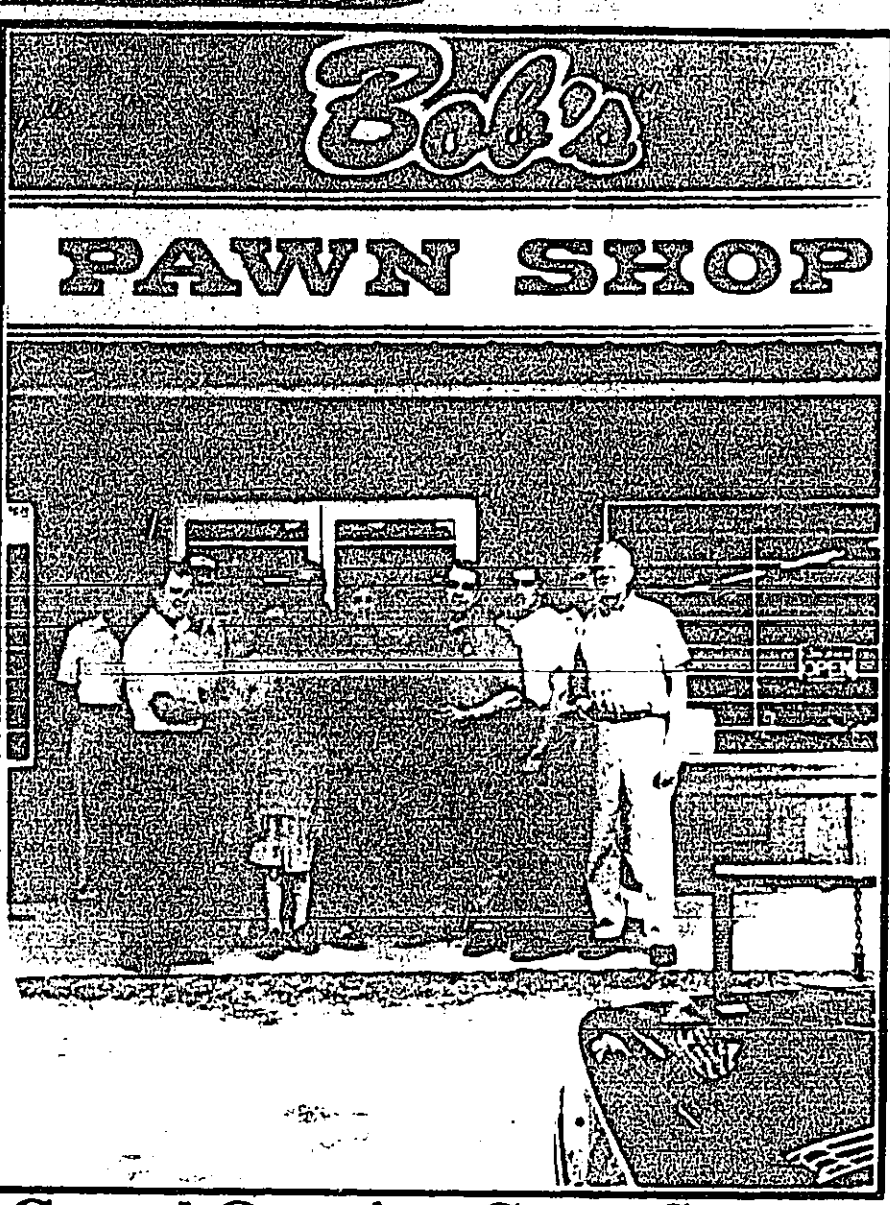
One Vehicle Accident Fatal

Woodville Schools Are Focusing On Drug Problems

The Woodville Independent School District Board of Trustees were made aware Tuesday, July 23, that the percentage of students identified as using drugs and alcohol in Woodville schools is above the national average. The report, which is available to the public at the Administration Office, details the ages of students, the type of drug use, where the drugs are being obtained and used, and other facets of the alcohol and drug abuse problem. During the 1990-91 school year, 277 Woodville students were identified at risk. Contacts were made with 222 students and 168 parents. Visits were made in 96 homes. These contacts and visits were made by counselors hired by the district to try to curb the alcohol and drug problem. The main reason students gave for using alcohol and drugs was "because we don't have anything else to do". The possibility of starting a YMCA in Woodville is being looked into. Wanda Brasher, who is heading that committee said, "We just need to provide a good place for our kids to go for recreation."

In other business, the Board awarded the milk bid for the district to Land-O-Pines and the bread bid to Flowers Bakery. The Board selected Crowell, Pipes and Associates of Nacogdoches as the accounting firm to perform the annual audit. Athletic and student insurance will remain with United Insurance Company for the 1991-92 school year. The maintenance agreement for central office computer equipment was awarded to Texas Computer Associates.

'Quality' Is Key To Future

The new president of Stephen F. Austin State University, Dr. Donald Bowen, says he feels SFA should make a stronger effort in the future to provide quality education for East Texas students without focusing too much on student population growth. "Uncontrolled growth," he said, "almost always leads to a dilution of quality in education."

Addressing the Deep East Texas Development Association at San Augustine, Dr. Bowen said his vision for SFA includes these goals: "We want SFA to become an institution with a strong commitment to serve people and less focus on buildings and material issues." "The university will seek uncompromising integrity in everything we do." "SFA will see a commitment to quality in academics, athletics and other endeavors."

"The institution will have less of an interest in becoming a larger university and will put more emphasis on providing individual attention to students." "We will broaden our efforts to attract the best and brightest students in East Texas." "More attention will be put on student retention."

Dr. Bowen said he wants to make sure SFA becomes the premier educational institution for East Texas with the ability to turn out students sought by business and other employers all over the world.

DETDA President Tony Bennett announced that DETDA directors have given their approval to three study efforts.

One will be directed to the development of a proposal for a leadership training program for Deep East Texas counties. Another will examine effects of the proposed state government reorganization plan on Deep East Texas.

Hunter Ed Course Soon

A course in hunter education has been scheduled for August 13 and 14 at the Spurger High School Agriculture Building, according to Don Barker, Hunter Education Instructor.

The course can be made during the week of August 5-9 by calling 429-5230. A \$5 certification fee is required for the course. Classes will meet from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each of the two days.

According to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's mandatory requirements, those persons whose date of birth is during the period of September 2, 1971 through August 31, 1975, must have successfully completed the course in order to hunt in Texas this fall. By September 1, 1993, all hunters born after September 2, 1971, must have successfully completed the course to hunt in Texas. However, any individual may take the course on a voluntary basis and is encouraged to attend regardless of requirements.

The course is open to youngsters and adults and will include instruction in rifle, shotgun and bowhunting handling and safety; outdoor responsibility and ethics; laws and regulations; hunting traditions; conservation; wildlife identification; field care of game; wilderness first aid and survival.

Students 12 years of age or older successfully completing the course will be issued a hunter education certificate from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. Those less than 12 years of age will receive a certificate of attendance, but must take the course again for proper certification.

GSU Tracks Lightning

A state-of-the-art lightning network now being used by Gulf States Utilities Co. allows utility engineers to track and analyze lightning activity in Southeast Texas and South Louisiana.

Using high-tech sensors placed around the country and special software called "Thunder", the satellite-linked lightning detection network pinpoints lightning strikes and displays them on a GSU computer monitor in Beaumont within seconds of the actual event.

"The new system gives us a head start when it comes to service restoration efforts following bad weather," explained Rod Griffith, principle engineer for GSU. "When our monitor shows a storm with a lot of lightning approaching an area, we can send crews in that direction. As soon as it's safe, they are on hand to repair the anticipated damage."

According to Griffith, the system can even assist trouble-shooting crews by showing the absence of lightning when bad weather causes service interruptions. "In those cases, our employees can be instructed to look for broken limbs, downed trees or other causes of outages," he said.

The lightning detection system, which cost GSU roughly \$9,000 for computer hardware and \$6000 for a year's subscription to the satellite network, paid for itself many times over within three weeks of installation, according to Office Steward, manager-risk management service for GSU.

Contel Telephone Becomes GTE In Texas Market

On August 1, Contel telephone operations will begin doing business as GTE Telephone Operations. Customers will be greeted with "Hello, this is GTE, may I help you?" when calling Contel and items such as signage on buildings and public telephones, stationery, telephones bills and company vehicles will gradually be changed.

Contel of California, which is not changing to the GTE name, includes all of Contel's local exchanges in California, Nevada and the western half of Arizona. Also not changing to the GTE name is the former Contel Western Region headquarters in Berkeley, California.

GTE Telephone Operations, the largest of GTE Corporation's three business groups, provides local phone service through 18.4 million access lines in portions of 40 states and two foreign countries. In addition, GTE Telephone Operations markets telecommunications products and services internationally, and supplies computer software and data processing nationwide. Revenues in 1990 totaled \$15.4 billion. GTE Telephone Operations has approximately 114,000 employees.
