Absentee **Vote Ends** At 324 For Aug. 10th Election

Absentee voting for the Saturday, August 10 election ended Tuesday with 324 Ballotts cast, according to County Clerk

Doneco Gregory. On election day, August 10, all Tyler County voting boxes will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m.

Each school district is also conducting an election August 10 on behalf of the newly-formed Tyler County Education District (CED).

Voters in the CED elec-tion must cast their ballots in the school district in which they reside.

On Saturday, CED voting will be held in the usual school election voting locetions.



Reggie Williams, a 4-year letterman and Woodville High superathlete and "Most Valuable Player" of his 3-A district decided to make the important trip to Stevensville where he will start his new baseball career at Tarleton State.

According to Tyler County Allstar Head Coach Gary Hennigan, Reggie was mainly recruited because of his power hitting and should be a mianstay on the Texans baseball squad." Reggie, who is also an all-district football running back, had to make a tough decision to drop the pigskin in order to play baseball.

Pitchers Mark Dorsey and Coy Lavergne signed also and will be joining Reggie. Mark, an all-district right-hand pitcher from Woodville, and who lead the Eagles in wins, will hopefully be trying to make a name for himself at Tarleton State.

That team advanced to a Second Place Standing in the State Tournament in Waco and were defeated Thursday in the finals by San Antonio.

Tarleton Coach Jack Allen said, "I believe all three of these players can play college baseball and will definately be an asset to our program here at Tarleton State. We feel fortunate to be able to land these players for our team."

The fourth local talent from Woodville High is Shannon Foster. Foster was also an all-district defensive tackle for Woodville.
