

The most common evidence of financial responsibility is a liability insurance card issued to the policyholder by the insurance company. Examples of other types of acceptable proof include insurance policies and binders, pool

tificates of self insurance, and certificates of bond.

The new law applies to registration handled in person or by mail. The original or a photocopy of the evidence will satisfy the requirement of proof of financial responsibility. All original documentation will be returned.

Locking up Texas' violent offenders Texans are fed up with the the spectacle of violent criminals being released from prison after serving only a fraction of their sentence. They are frustrated and angry with the revolving doors in

And they should be. Because the first responsibility of any government is to insure the safety of its citizens.

On August 25, 1991, however, Texas' state government took a historic step toward fulfilling its fundamental responsibility to the people of this state. The Legislature passed a criminal justice. package on that date which I am honored to sign into law.

For the first time - not just in Texas, but in the nation - we have enacted legislation that will keep violent criminals locked up and will attack the root cause of crime: addiction to drugs and It is impossible to overstate the importance of this legislation.

No longer will Texas be ranked 50th in the nation when it comes to

dealing with crime. Senator Ted Lyon said it best when he noted that, in the future, other states will follow "the Texas plan" as they try to come to grips with their own crime problems. This "Texas plan" works by simply addressing what law

enforcement officers have always known, but politicians have been reluctant to acknowledge. And that is this basic formula that continues to drive our crime rates upward:

Addicts commit crimes. Addicts go to prison.

Addicts come out of prison. Addicts commit crimes again.

It is this vicious cycle that must be halted. Since it is an addiction to drugs and alcohol that is at the core of many of our crime problems, it is this addiction that we must combat. And this legislation does that.

At least 15 new prison facilities will be constructed under this legislation (House Bill 93) which is designed to allow our prisons to hold an additional 25,300 inmates. These new facilities will be built in the next two years to four years.

Almost half of the new cells (12,000) will be utilized to deal with those prisoners who have drug and alcohol addictions. That's four times as many as the next closest state in the country - and a thousand times more than had previously existed in Texas.

But new prisons and treating addictions aren't the only aspects to this legislation. H.B. 93 will also get the state out of court, keep violent offenders locked up for longer periods of time, clear the backlog of state prisoners currently being held in county jails and make Texas communities safer. It does this in several ways. The legislation:

-- Establishes 13,300 maximum security beds, ensuring that the worst criminals will remain incarcerated as long as possible. -- Creates a "substance abuse felony punishment" and provides space for 12,000 inmates punished under this provision.

-- Settles the Harris County and Nueces County lawsuits (which included 13 counties) against the state and provides a mechanism to reimburse counties for keeping state prisoners - thus reducing the tax load on local taxpayers.

-- Expands the use of private prisons from 2,000 to 4,000 beds. - Adopts the recommendation of Comptroller John Sharp to facilitate the release of elderly and seriously ill prisoners who are no longer a threat to our safety.

Our focus must be on reserving maximum security beds for violent offenders. When we work together - state, county and local officials, along with law enforcement officers and judges - I am confident that we will be able to achieve this goal. With the adoption of this progressive legislative package, I

believe this government has taken a big step toward fulfilling its responsibility to the people of Texas. But this is only the first step. We must continue to work together on both the local and statewide level to keep our

Southwestern Bell will provide Digital Loop Service within the customer's serving central office where facilities are available.

If approved by the Commission, the rates for the Digital Loop Service facilities will be \$445 per month for each digital transmission loop arrangement which provides a capacity of up to 24 line terminations, plus \$5 per month for each line termination and \$9 per month for each channel termination. The proposed rate for the unlimited use of the central office varies from \$12.25 up to \$18.90 per month for each line termination depending on the rate group classification, determined by the customer's location. Southwestern Bell estimates revenue of \$2.1 million from this offering during the first year.

As proposed by Southwestern Bell, customers who currently receive digital loop compatibility through facilities installed under a special construction agreement will have the option to receive their current digital loop arrangements pursuant to the Digital Loop Service Tariff or continue to pay their current charges until they make a change of location or account. Any increase in the number of line terminations to a customer's current digital transmission loop arrangement will be provided pursuant to the proposed Digital Loop Service Tariff; however, the customer will continue to have the option of paying current charges for the existing digital transmission loop capacity. Southwestern Bell's proposal to "grandfather" existing digital loop facility arrangements is subject to review and approval by the
