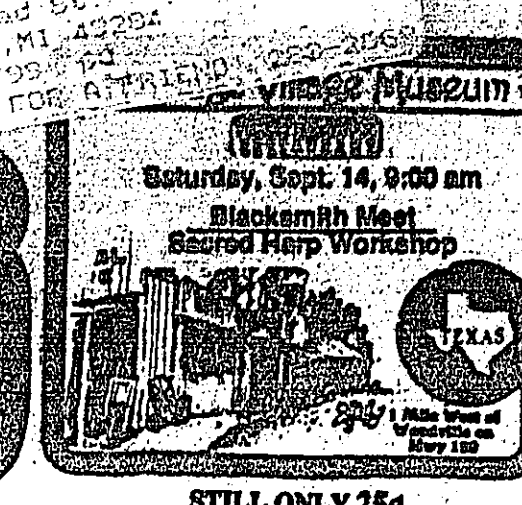

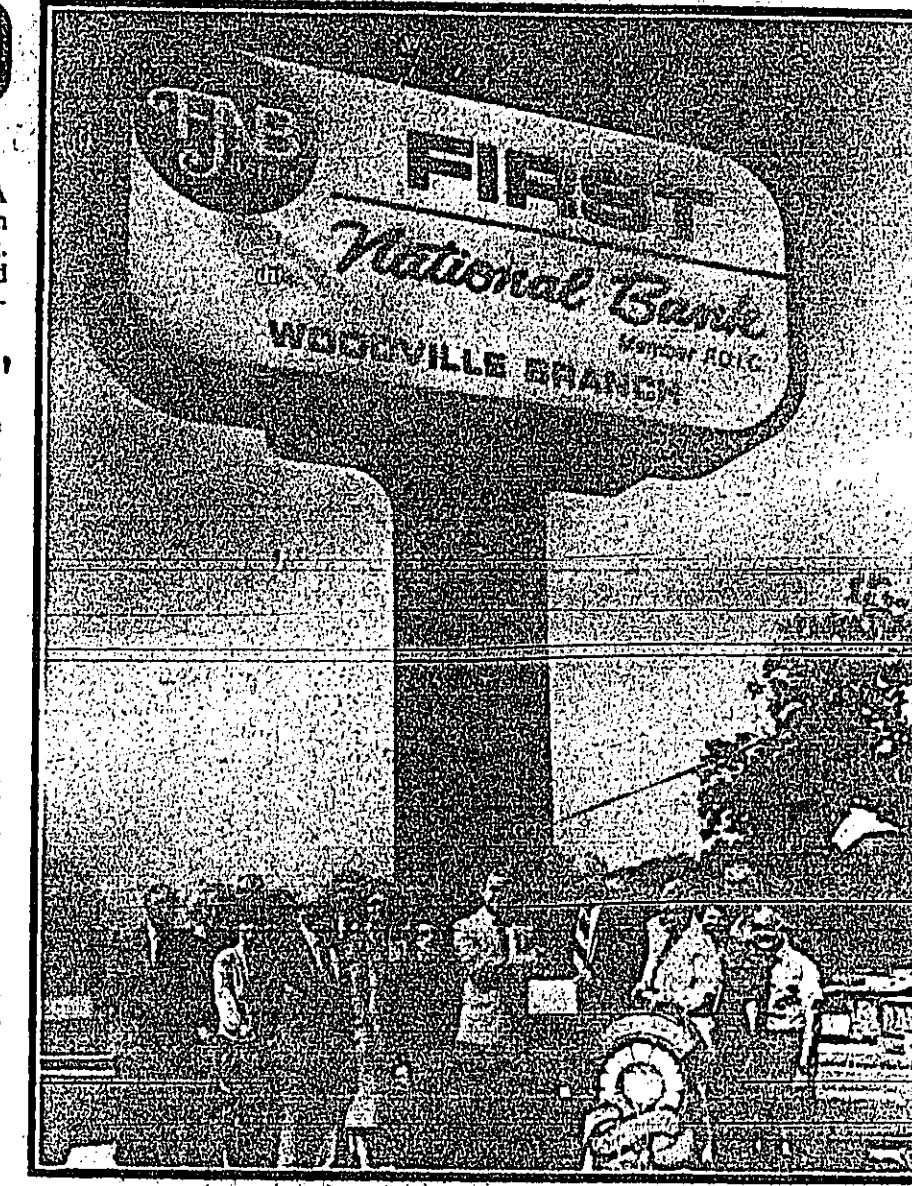
A&M Univ. Mother's Club

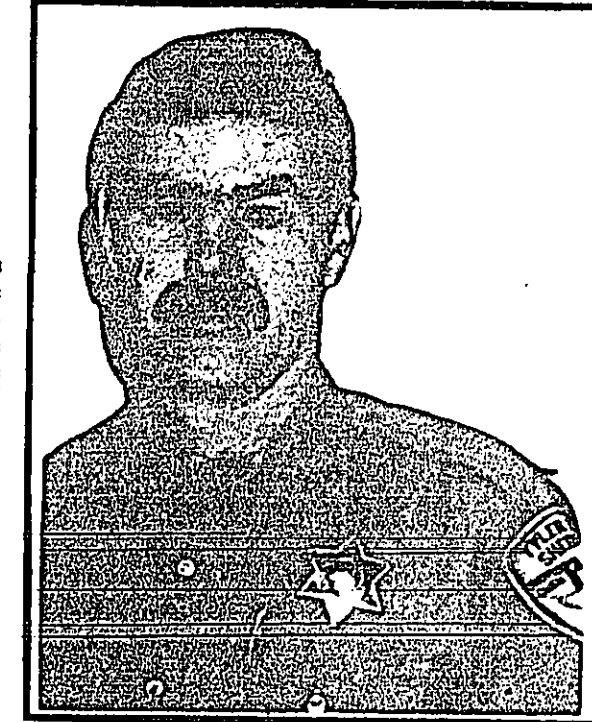
State Hospital Exec To Address DETDA

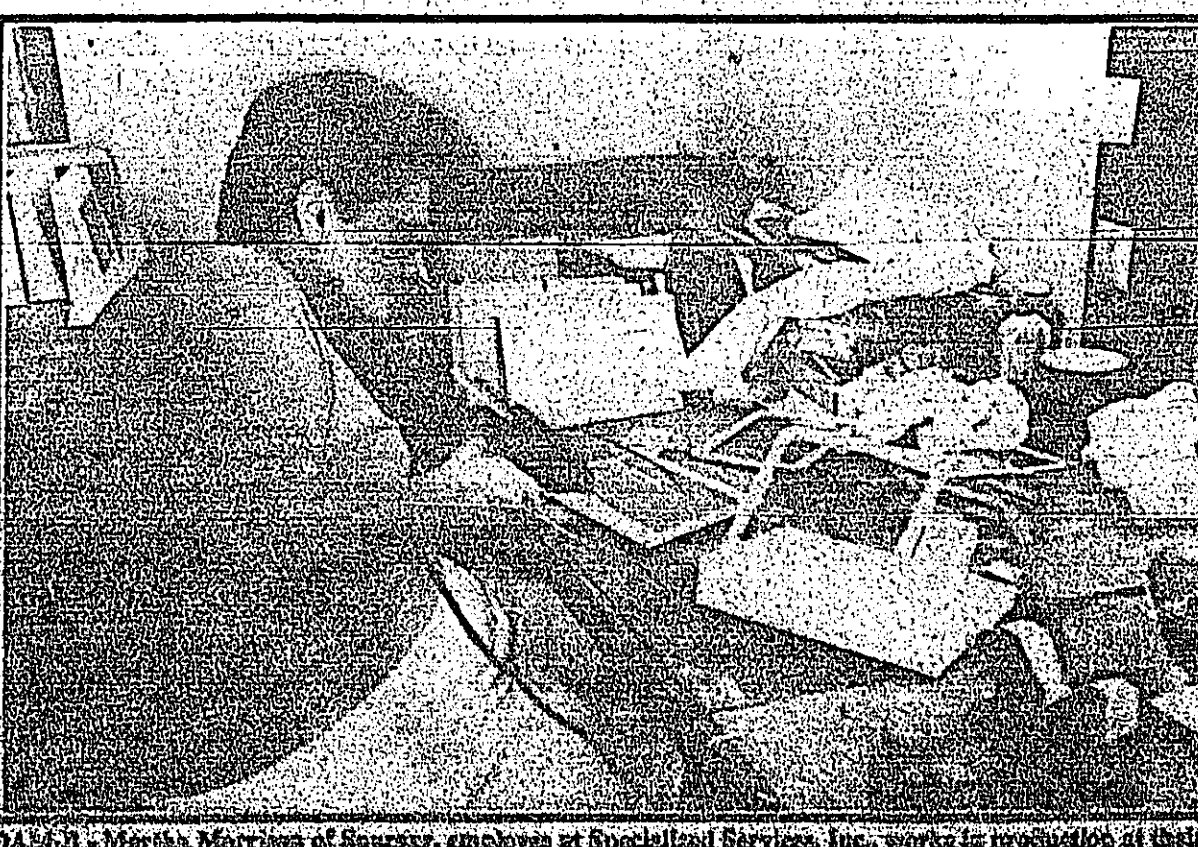

New Jobs Mean Boost For Local Economy

Approximately 120 new jobs have become available in Tyler County recently due to the expansion of Specialized Services, Inc., a business located on Hwy. 190 East of Dam-B. Currently, the company has about 60 employees from our area and they are in the process of doubling that number. According to owner Don Cowart of Colmesnull, "Specialized Services, Inc. is a Texas corporation involved in the design, sale, manufacture and distribution of jewelry displays." adding, "Jewelry displays are the cloth-covered, wood, metal, or plastic forms which are used in retail jewelry stores, counters and windows to hold and display jewelry for sale to the public." Specialized Services currently services over 100 retail jewelers. "The are two large companies in the jewelry display business as well as a number of smaller companies. Our company has a competitive advantage based on flexibility and turn-around time as well as pricing. We have a strong reputation in the industry and are able to compete for major contracts," stated Cowart.

Although Specialized Services began operations at Dam-B back in 1989, they have only recently moved the majority of the business from Houston because the owner, Don Cowart, has re-located back to his home town of Tyler County. "We will keep our Houston office open strictly as a sales base; everything else will be done right here in the county," Cowart said. Cowart feels it is important to grow his employees how their dollars make a difference in the local economy. "I feel that large corporations are not the only ones who boost the economy—each individual can do their part by spending the dollars they earn locally." To prove his point, Cowart has been distributing petty cash two-dollar bills around the county when buying supplies, paying for services rendered, etc. "When I see the \$2 bills, people really stop and take notice. New business means new dollars for our local economy," stated Cowart.

The jobs now available at Specialized Services are of two types. Some employees will work in production on-site at Dam-B, while others can work at their home. The home-workers are paid contract labor for piece-work. The distribution of USDA commodities for certified recipients of Tyler County has been scheduled for Tuesday, September 24, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. The location is to be Lion's Den in Woodville. Only those persons who are certified for 1990 will be able to receive commodities. No reservations.

NOTICE OF COMPARABLE TAX RATES AND REVENUES

The legislature has enacted a statute on school funding to comply with a court mandate enforcing the state constitution. Under prior statutes (SB 1) the tax rate for last year provides \$ 4.528 per student in state and local revenues. Under this statute (SB 351) that same rate now provides \$ 5.281 per student in state and local revenues.

State law only requires a minimum tax rate of \$ 0.83 for county education districts. State law does not require a school district to adopt additional taxes. Neither does state law require a school district to adopt a tax rate that maximizes the receipt of state funds.

The board of trustees of the Colmesneil Independent School District hereby gives notice that it is considering the adoption of a tax rate of \$0.45 that will provide \$ 3.279 per student in state and local revenues.

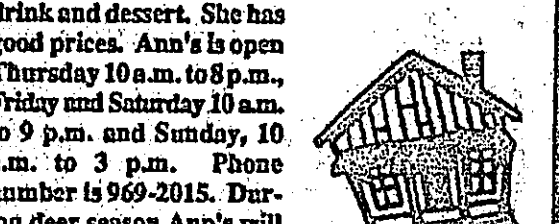

Titles of the fact sheets are: Management Ideas for Farmers, the farmer's guide to controlling erosion, improving water quality by managing external waters, the farmer's guide to controlling erosion, a farmer's guide to pest management, choosing and using pesticides, managing animal waste, and water quality checklist for farmers, protecting water quality at home and on the farm; a water quality checklist for farmers keeping sediment under control; a water quality checklist for farmers managing nutrients; a water quality checklist for farmers, glossary of water quality terms and USDA 1991 water quality projects.

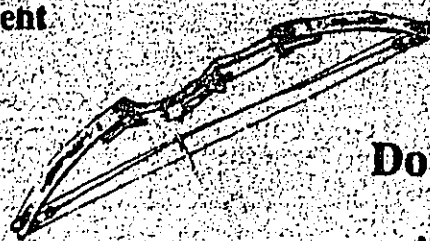
