NOTICE OF COMPARABLE TAX RATES AND REVENUES

The legislature has enacted a statute on school funding to comply with a court mandate enforcing the state constitution. Under prior statutes (SB 1) the tax rate for last year provides \$ 4.598 per student in state and local revenues. Under this statute (SB 351) that same rate now provides \$ 5.281 per student in state and local

State law only requires a minimum tax rate of \$ __0.83___ for county education districts. State law does not require a school district to adopt additional taxes. Neither does state law require a school district to adopt a tax rate that maximizes the receipt of state funds.

The board of trustees of the Golmesneil Independent School District hereby gives notice that it is considering the adoption of a tax rate of 50,45 that will provide \$ 5,279 per student in state and local revenues.



NOTICE OF COMPARABLE TAX RATES AND REVENUES

The legislature has enacted a statute on school funding to comply with a court mandate enforcing the state constitution. Under prior statutes (SB 1) the tax rate for last year provides \$ 4.694 per student in state and local revenues. Under this statute (SB 351) that same rate now provides \$ _5.561 per student in state and local

State law only requires a minimum tax rate of \$ 0.83 for county education districts. State law dees not require a school district to adopt additional taxes. Neither does state law require a school district to adopt a tax rate that maximizes the receipt of state funds.
