## Pay Warren Taxes In Woodville

Several changes have been made in school finance for the 1991-92 school year because of state legislation. Some of these changes will affect taxpayers of the Warren School District.

The Warren school tax office has been moved to

the Tyler County Appraisal District. You will pay your school taxes at the Appraisal District.

Your tax statement for 1991 will show a county education district tax (figured on a rate of .83) and a Warren school property tax

(figured on a rate of .50). The sum of the two (\$1.33) make up the effective tax rate for Warren ISD. This is the same rate as last year. The rate did not change.

Your promptness in paying your taxes is greatly appreciated. This is one of the reasons Warren ISD

has been able to lower its tax rate 16¢ over the past four years and has continued to operate without borrowing money.

On behalf of the administration, staff and board of trustees, we thank you for your continued support.

## Harvest Festival Oct. 19-20

A continuous program of music, relating to the pioneer days of East Texas, will provide a lively background for the Fourth Annual Harvest Festival this Saturday and Sunday, October 19 and 20 at Heritage Village Museum.

From 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., both days, visitors will be treated to demonstrations of spinning and weaving, quilting and toy making, shingle splitting and wood carving, along with story telling by some of East Texas' finest folklorists, such as Bill Brett, Timothy Griffith, Sam Barnett and Mary Johnston. Of special interest will be an exhibit in the Whitmeyer Genealogical Library of Magnificent applied cloth wall

hangings, created by Octogenarian Ruby Yount of Lufkin.

Musical highlights of the two-day festival will be the appearance of the Houston Balalaika Society, reminding us of the Slavic and Russian immigrants who came to work in the East Texas stove industry. Joining them for at least one of their sessions will be members of the North Harris County Dulcimer Society, whose delightful music has already been enjoyed at an earlier Heritage Society event.

Also on the program will be the Martin Family Singers, the Tyler County Sacred Harp Singers, Charles Whitmer on the auto-harp, Fiddler Leonard La-

Salle and a variety of good old East Texas Blue Grass.

Providing food inside the Village will be the Pit Stop, which will offer everything from sausage biscuits to complete dinners. Beryl Battise with her famous Indian tacos and fry bread, Preston Woodrome and his hoe cakes and "Booster" Stevenson's mouth-watering sour dough biscuits cooked over the open Chuck Wagon fire. Put a dab of homemade applesauce, bubbling on the pot belly stove in the Heritage Society's Pantry, and you've got a taste treat to remember.

Meanwhile, members of the East Texas Blacksmith Alliance who meet regularly at the Village,

will have their forges blazing, their bellows blowing and their anvils ringing to provide an on-going show inside the Blacksmith Shop.

Admission to the Festival, which helps raise funds for the Tyler County Heritage Society's historic preservation projects in the Village, will be \$5 for adults, \$2.50 for children under 12.

Festival goers are asked to please park at the Fair grounds. Free shuttle bus service will be provided to and from the village throughout the Festival hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
