## Hightower To Co-Chair Punishment Standards Commission

House Speaker Glib Lewis has named Rep. Allan Hightower (D-Harrisville) as Co-Chairman of the Texas Punishment Standards Commission. Hightower was the House sponsor of HB 93 which created the Commission as part of the settlement agreement between the state and counties. Hightower explained, "There is a serious need to restructure the Penal Code. This Commission will conduct a comprehensive study of the way in which criminals are sent to prison. We want to make the crime fit the punishment. Through the restructuring, we hope to keep the violent offenders longer and prevent their early release." Serving as Co-

## Airport Meeting In Jasper

Airport development in four East Texas counties will be discussed at a meeting held by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in Jasper on October 31. The meeting will begin at 10 a.m. in the Schofield Room of the First National Bank drive-in facility, 301 E. Houston Street. TxDOT's Division of Aviation will conduct the meeting, which will focus on airports in Jasper, Newton, Sabine and Tyler Counties. "Local aviation needs are defined at regional meetings such as these," said C.A. Wilkins, director of the Division of Aviation. "By working directly with city and county governments and other parties, we plan and implement airport improvements across the state." Local elected officials, airport board members and airport managers are expected to attend the meeting, which is open to the public. Airport development needs identified in the current Texas Aeronautical Facilities Plan will be reviewed. Other subjects to be discussed include preservation and development of area airport facilities; availability of state and federal funds for airport development; area economic development, and community goals and objectives; and other factors that influence airport development.

## Mayor Signs A Proclamation Supporting 'Forest Products Week'

"Forests Forever - Our Green Guarantee" is the theme of this year's National Forest Products Week, October 20-26. And the City of Woodville is joining Governor Ann Richards and the rest of the State of Texas as well as the Nation, in this week-long salute to America's most renewable natural resource and to the products it provides. Mayor Thomas Knapp signed a proclamation declaring October 20 through October 26, 1991 as Forest Products Week in the City of Woodville at the City Council Meeting held Monday, October 14. National Forest Products Week is sponsored annually by the nation's forestry community to remind all Americans of the importance of the forest and its products in everyday life. This special period also is designed to call attention to the growing need for productive and healthy forests to meet the nation's - and the world's - growing demand for forest products. Forest products are truly indispensable to our way of life. In America alone, the average person uses wood and paper product equivalent to the wood produced from one 100-foot tree each year. "Fortunately, America's forests are healthier today than ever," said Sue Tortello, forester for Champion International Corp. and a member of the Texas Forestry Association. "The United States actually grows more wood each year than it loses to harvest, insects and diseases combined, thanks to the ambitious replanting efforts of our timber landowners." "In fact," said Tortello, "today we have nearly 730 million acres of forestland in the U.S. - more than we had 70 years ago. We're guaranteeing Americans that we'll keep this country green." A properly managed forest yields more than forest products, too. "The forest also produces enormous environmental benefits such as watershed and wildlife protection, and recreation and scenic opportunities for Americans of all ages who love the outdoors," Tortello added. Tortello said the nation's forest products industry ranks among the top ten employers in 40 of the 50 states, directly employing some 1.4 million people with an annual payroll of around \$32 billion. Timber consistently ranks among the top four cash crops in Texas. The wood-based industry in Texas employs almost 60,000 men and women in growing, harvesting and conversion of timber into primary wood-based products. Another 228,000 Texans transport, sell and use wood-based products in construction, printing and publishing.

## Youth Minister: 'Don't Sell Teenagers Short'

"What excites me is the impact that one teenager could have, who was totally committed to Jesus Christ on Junior High and High School students," says Ralph Hester. "My goal or purpose is to lift up Jesus Christ. 'Everyone...teenager or not...if they can get a true picture of who Jesus is, then he will be irresistible to them. The key words here are 'true picture'." First Baptist Church Youth and Education Minister Ralph Hester and his wife Laura have considered youth ministry with "A focus on Jesus Christ, every-thing we do." Hester says his job is to help create a positive environment in his church. "Net to elevate the church itself or glorify it...but simply to exalt Jesus." "I want to make sure The FBC Youth Ministry is a quality one where a young person can expect something every time they come to a non-threatening, positive environment. 'It's been really great working with our Pastor Carl Hanesy. 'We share the same philosophy on teenagers.' Hester, who's only been in Woodville a short while and who is from Dallas, is in charge of the "birth through adult" education of the First Baptist Church here, has a real affection for young and old alike. "Most people say that our young people are our future, and I disagree with that...they are our church...and our community...today! Just to see our teenagers as our future is kind of a narrow view. I think we often sell our teenagers short. They are able to make positive contributions, and make positive contributions for themselves and others." "For example," Hester says, "Some would say we are going to have sex, so we should supply them with birth control...we're selling our teenagers short if we do that." "Every spiritual movement that has started in history and every great revival has started with youth. Teenagers are against a lot, and those who are willing to 'live differently as a Christian' can make a great impact." Hester, who is 27, and who graduated in May 1991, with a Master of Divinity Degree from the Seminary of the Baptist Church in Ft. Worth, also studied Seminary Education at Stephen F. Austin Univer-

sity. He also did undergraduate studies at Texas A & M. He received his BBA in Finance. He was born in Lexington, Kentucky. Ralph says he was called to Christian Service while a sophomore at Texas A & M. He said his "struggle" at discerning what God wanted him to do "Has brought me full circle." "I always thought you had to be a youth minister before you could become a pastor or missionary. I've come to understand that whatever Christian Service I'm needed or called to, I just want to do, and be, the best I can with the Lord's help." Ralph works with an able staff with Vera Johnson on Pre-school and Children's Education; and Sylvia Lois Best with Senior Adults. "My wife Laura helps me with ideas for the youth, she leads the children's choir and teaches the GA's." Hester says he likes the small town life after coming here from Dallas. "I like being able to walk to work...not having to car pool...no traffic." Hester says if the youth minister really has "come full circle" in Woodville,

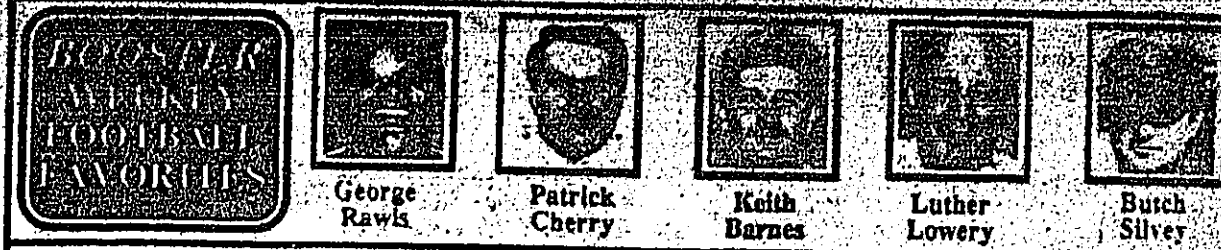

## Chester Undeclared In District

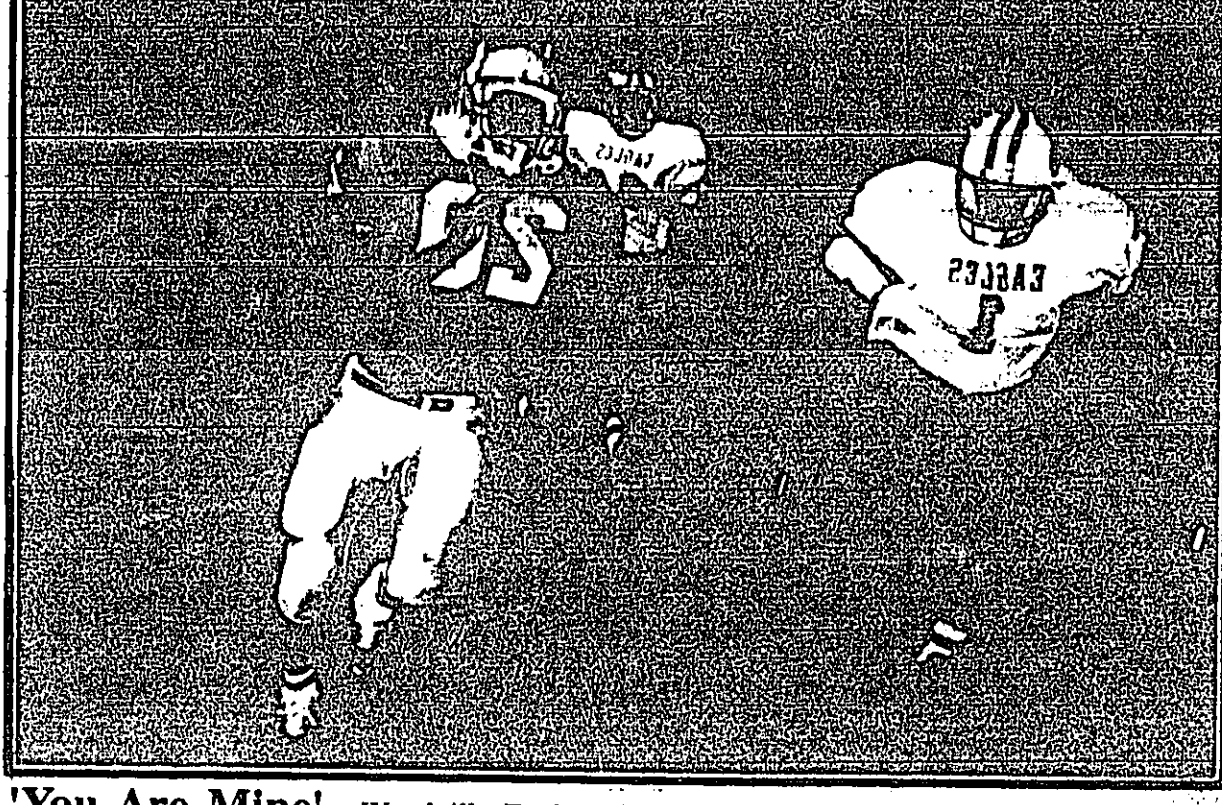

## Woodville To Face Corrigan Friday Night In A Must Win.

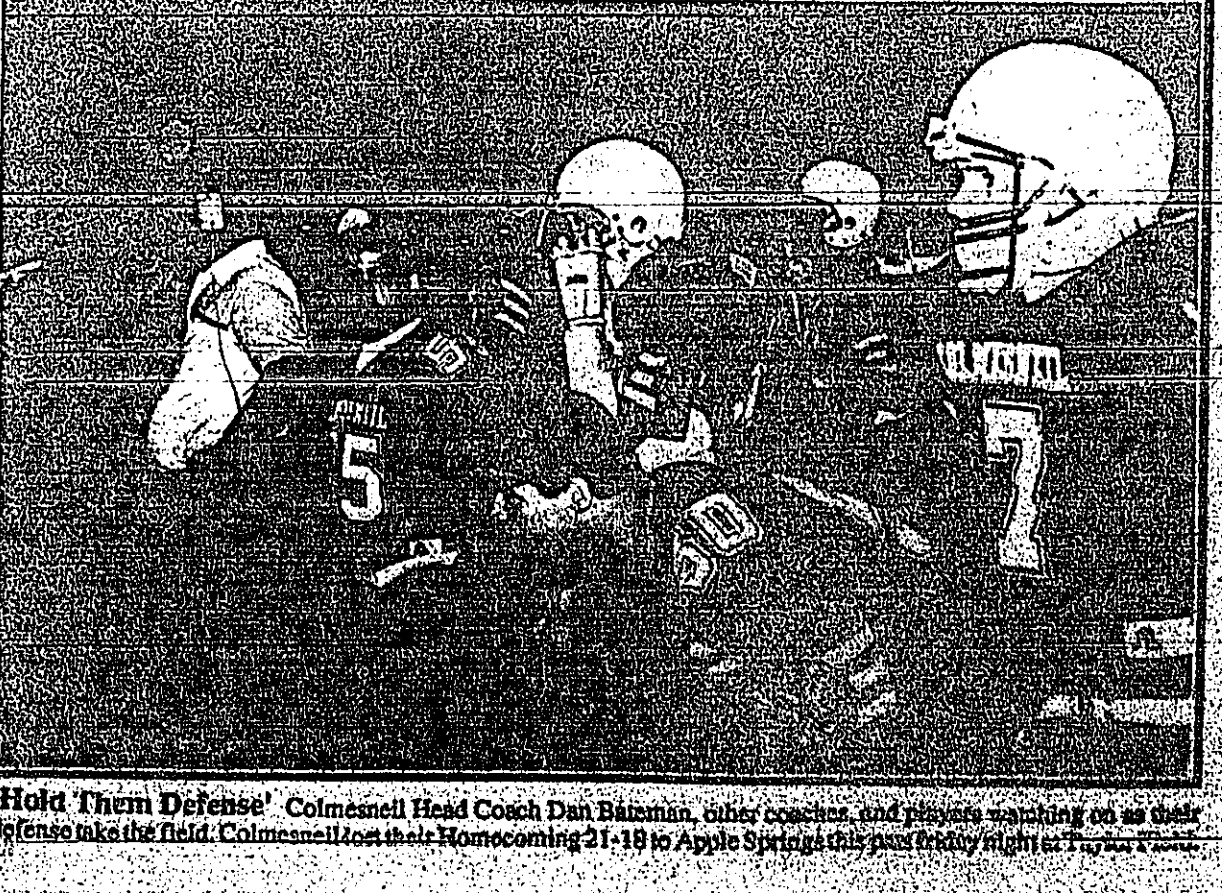
