Much like the chance of developing akin cancer is increased by daily exposure to sunlight, eye physicians believe the sun's ultraviolet and blue-violet rays are involved in the advancement of Aging Retinal Disease (also called macular degeneration). This is usually a slowly progressing form of vision loss which primarily affects older adults (A fast-progressing but less common-form of the disease can be treated with lasera.) It robs adults of their central vision for reading or watching TV (fortunately complete blindness never results from this disorder) It is the fastest growing cause of blindness in the U.S. It occurs more frequently among females, those
