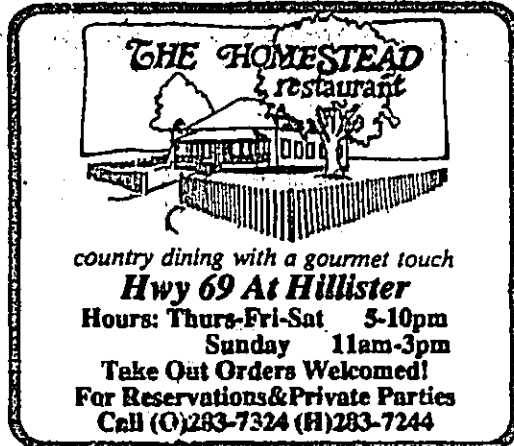

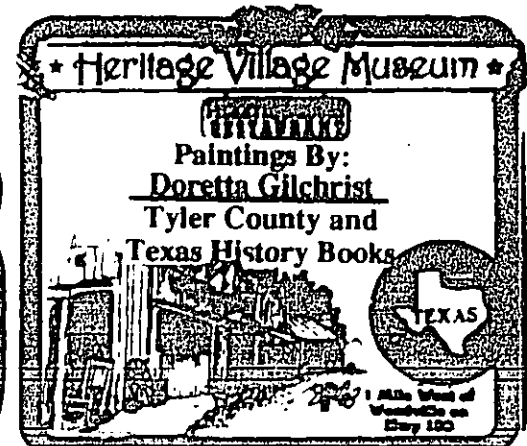

New Nursing Home Will Open May 1 Says Operator

Nursing home operator Larry Simpson, of Lufkin, says the planned 90-bed nursing home to be located in the Timberland West Subdivision on Hwy 190 in Woodville will open around May 1, 1992.

Simpson and his partner, Doris Moore, run a company called Care Concepts of East Texas and are operators of seven other nursing homes in East Texas.

Monthly payroll, Simpson says, will average around \$60,000 or \$720,000 annually.

He says the Woodville facility will employ some 75-80 personnel and offer 12 levels of care for the residents including, "Everything from ambulatory to bed fast and heavy care", he said.

The modern building will contain approximately 20,000 square feet of space.

According to the operators, "Both of our families have been in the nursing home business all our lives."

"We are looking forward to coming to Woodville and although we are not able to take applications at this time because we've not even started construction...people are welcomed to call 409-639-5855 if they would like to."

The seven other locations where the Care Concepts of East Texas Company operates are: Nacogdoches, Longview, Jacksonville, Cushing, two in Tyler and one in Lindale.

U.S. Rep. Wilson Intercedes To Help County Hospital

U.S. Representative Charles Wilson (D-Lufkin), responded to a call from Tyler County Hospital recently, that resulted in the hospital receiving a Medicare payment within a few weeks instead of the usual several months, according to hospital Administrator Tom Sturdivant.

"Due to our present financial troubles, the Board of Directors at the hospital felt that Charles Wilson was the one person who could help us...Mr. Wilson deserves the thanks of all Tyler County residents for helping us in our time of need."

Sturdivant also said that the emergency room will now be asking for payment in advance for any non-emergency service rendered through the emergency room. "We are trying to discourage people from using the emergency room as a substitute for a

family doctor. This practice is too costly for the hospital and the percentages of non-payments on this type of service is extremely high," Sturdivant said.

In addition to slow Medicare payments and bad debt, the hospital also sustains indigent care. Sturdivant said, "We are a non profit organization and we would appreciate anyone who is interested in making a tax deductible donation to Tyler County Hospital."

"Our troubles really began last year when we lost a local physician. This resulted in a 20 to 25% reduction in our patient load," Sturdivant said, adding, "We now have an average of 13 patients per day in comparison to 20 patients per day in September of 1990."

Haley's Ed Committee Meets

State Senator Bill Haley (D-Center) has outlined the charges and explained the functions of the Senate Interim Committee on Education as the committee prepares for its initial meeting November 6. Senator Haley was named by Lieutenant Governor Bob Bullock to serve as chairman of the committee and describes the work of the committee as instrumental in identifying problems in public education which will be addressed during the 73rd session of the State Legislature in 1992.

"The focus of the committee during the interim will be the study of the reorganization of the Texas Education Agency, implementation of legislation regarding school finance, and use of appropriated funds with a focus on the technology allotment and vocational and compensatory education funds," said Senator Haley.

Education Commissioner Lionel "Skip" Memo has been invited to attend the organizational meeting of the committee to explain his recent proposal for reorganization of the TEA.

"As I read the charges, the committee will identify ways to eliminate costly programs in public education. I want to determine the feasibility of a system of state mandated programs which are fully funded by the state and state participation programs which receive only partial state funding. Partially state funded programs could be optional at the local level depending on the need locally and ability of the district to afford its share."

"We need to ensure that full funding for the technology allotment for public schools is available," said the senator. "Vocational education is an important and essential aspect of public education and one of the charges for the committee is a study to determine if the funding allocated is adequate. Whether students are in rural or urban schools, vocational training is necessary in order to ensure that students are ready to enter the workforce trained with marketable skills."

Senator Haley also said the committee will take a hard look at local property taxes in relation to the current system of funding public education. "The responsibility for public education has always been shared by the state and the

local school districts," he said. "Because of changes in the economy, increased state mandates and recent Supreme Court rulings, we need to look not only at the property tax system itself but alternatives to the current tax system which could reduce the heavy burden on local property owners for financing public education."

Following the interim studies made by the Education Committee, the committee will submit a report to the 73rd Legislature, with a draft bill containing any recommended statutory changes necessary as a result of the committee's study.

Senator Haley will be joined on the Interim Committee on Education by two other members, Senators Teel Bivins and Gonzalo Barrientos.

"During the course of the year," Senator Haley stated, "the committee will meet in Senate District Three in order to afford our people an opportunity to express their ideas in relation to public education. I also intend to have the Commissioner of Education in the district to see first hand, small rural schools in operation. He needs to see first hand our strengths and weaknesses."

Tyler County Jail Rates 'Excellent'

The Texas Commission on Jail Standards inspected the Tyler County Jail and gave it an excellent rating for the professionalism used in how it is being run. Bob Dearing of the Texas Jail Commission said, "The jail is exceptionally clean and meet all standards that are required by the Jail Commission of Texas. This is the third year in a row that the jail has been

given these high marks of excellence."

Sheriff Hennigan said he was proud of the results. "It is somewhat harder to achieve these marks because we are averaging about 40 inmates a day in our jail," Hennigan said, adding, "The jail has a maximum capacity of 44 and stay at that mark nearly all the time."

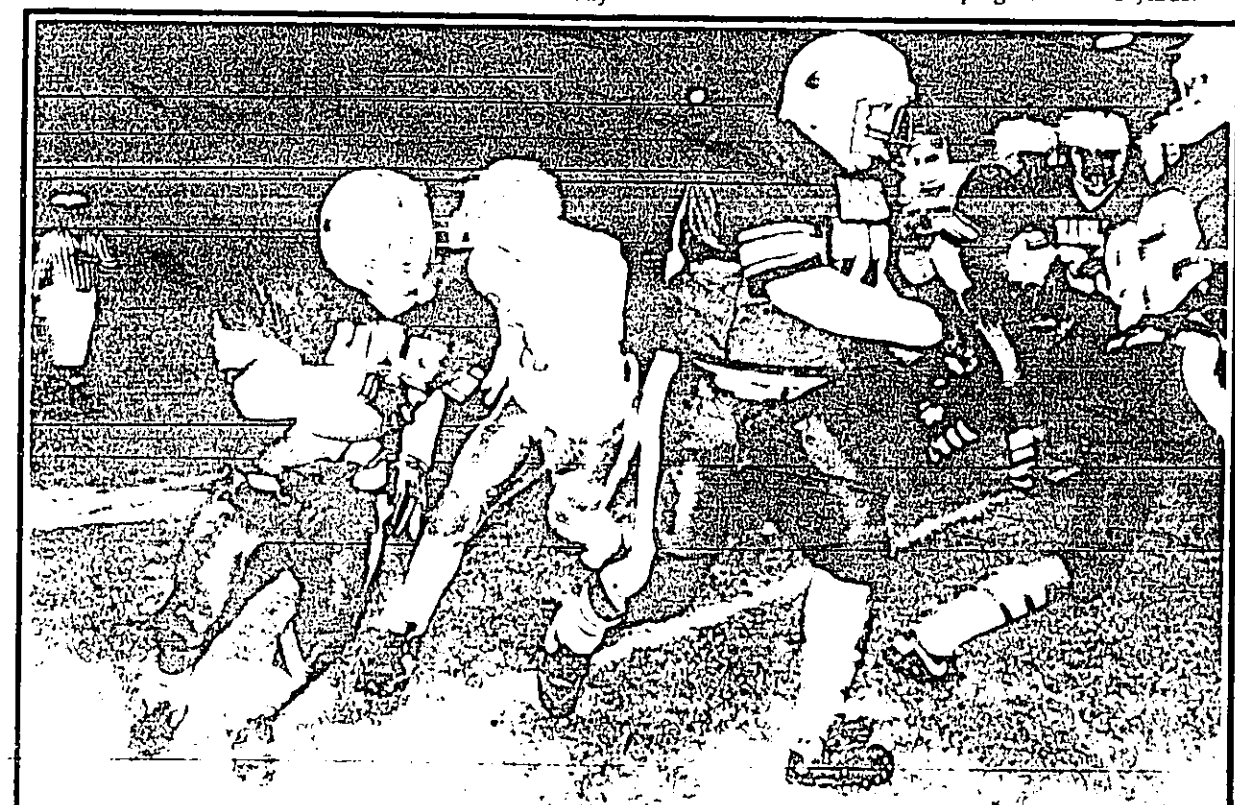
Woodville Eagles Egged San Augustine Wolves

Immunization Clinic Nov. 12

The Texas Department of Health, Public Health Region 7 Office, announced plans today for the continuation of a series of monthly immunization clinics for all children needing immunizations, who meet the required family income determination guidelines.

The clinic will be conducted at The Texas Department of Health, 717 W. Bluff (Hwy 190 E.) in Woodville, Texas. The next clinic will be held on November 12, 1991. Clinic hours will be from 1:00-3:30 p.m. Future clinics will be held on the first, second, third and fourth Tuesday of each

month. The Health Department emphasizes that this clinic is available to all preschool and school age children who meet the family income guidelines, beginning at two (2) months of age. Immunizations to be offered include Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR), Oral Polio (OPV), Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis (DTP) and Tetanus/diphtheria (Td). The Haemophilus Influenzae type b (Hib) vaccine is also available to medically eligible children between the ages of 2 months and 60 months. The pneumonia vaccine is available to all high risk patients meeting income

guidelines. All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Parents are reminded to bring the child's immunization record and Social Security Number if it is available. The Tetanus/diphtheria (Td) vaccine is available to medically eligible adults. Should a parent or legal guardian have any questions, please contact the above listed field office staff.
