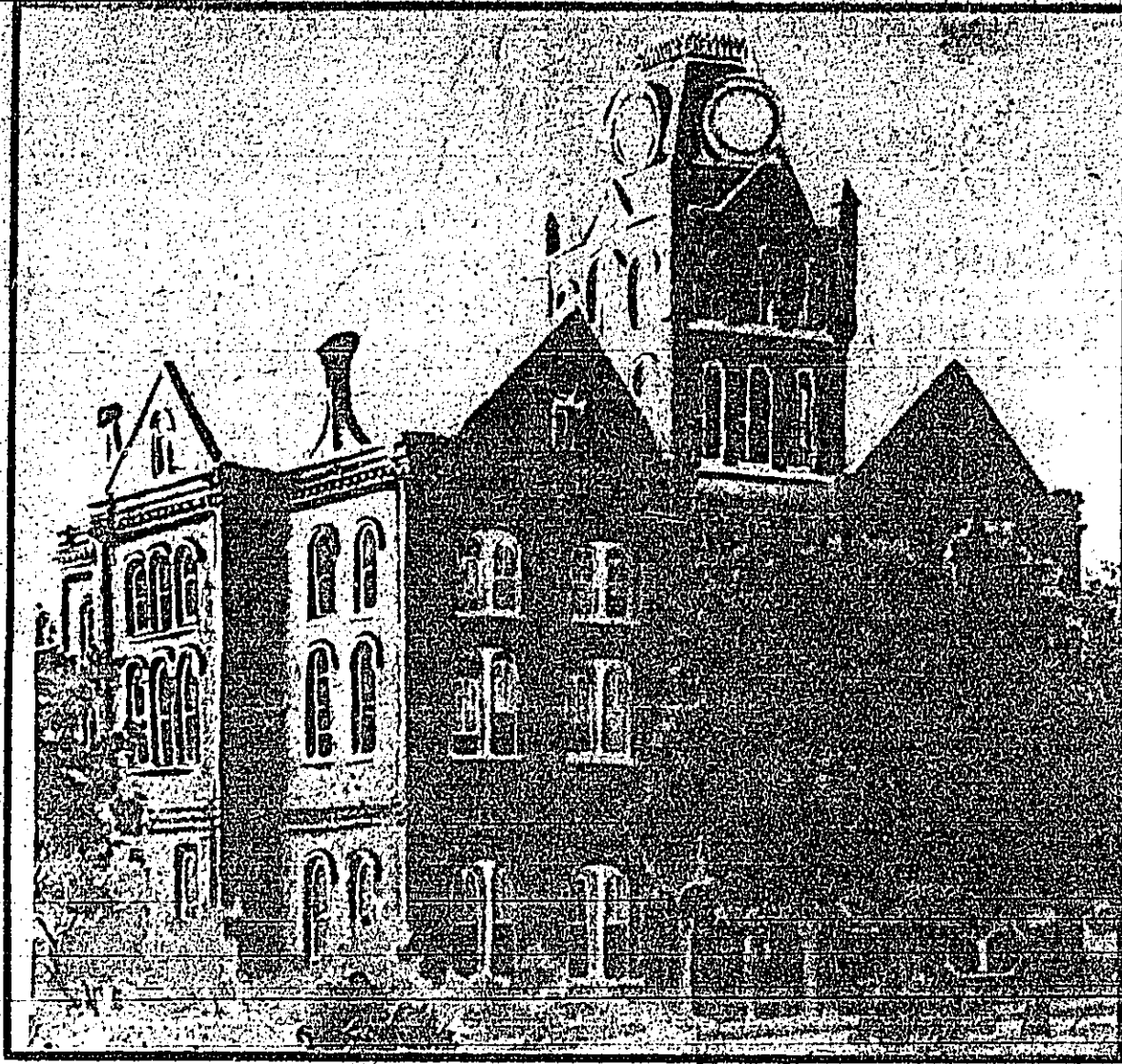


# Santa Arrives At 5! Courthouse Lights Up At 8!

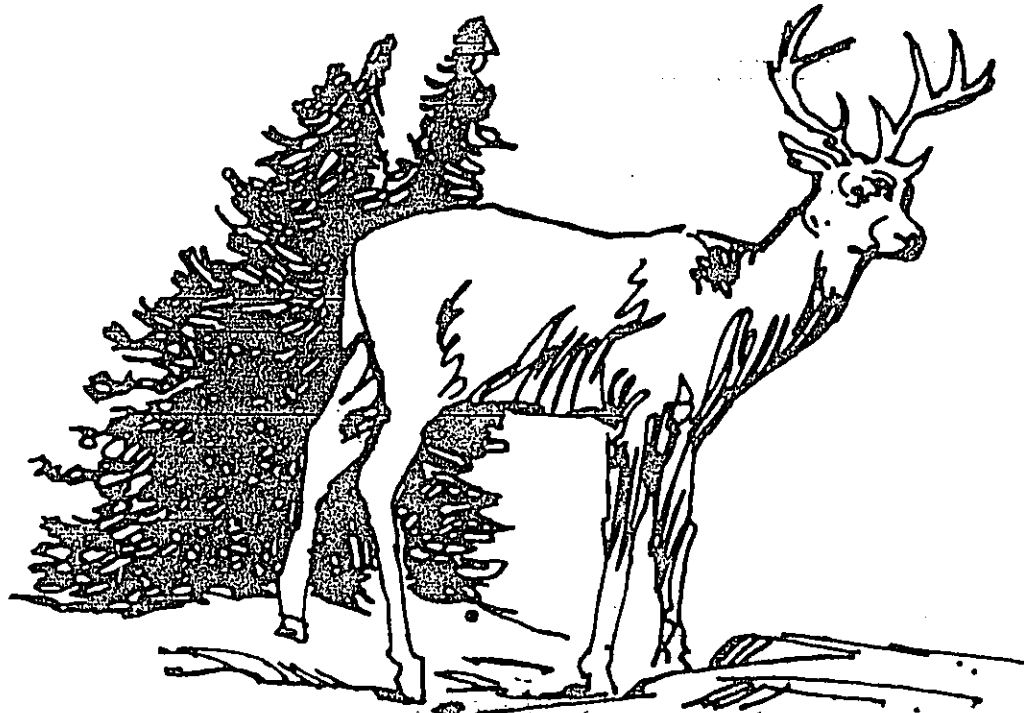
