AUSTIN — A program topic entitled "Interdisciplinary Teaching: Process and Product," was presented by a group of Woodville Middle School teachers and administrators during the first annual PSI Conference hosted by the Texas Education Agency in Austin. During the meeting held Jan. 23, an overflow crowd of educators and school administrators from 83 PSI schools voiced a positive response to the WMS program.

Members of the WMS sixth grade team presented the evolution of learning and the resulting benefits, citing how their individual team members moved through the developmental process to emerge as a mature, functioning team.

The seventh grade team then presented an interdisciplinary thematic unit which they produced. The theme was "Christmas in Texas" and the team members demonstrated how it moves across the curriculum.

Among the items given to those attending the class was a bound booklet describing not only the teaming process, but the interdisciplinary unit. Also distributed were samples of hard-core candy made by the seventh grade science classes and pieces of sausage roots. Numerous student-made products were displayed, including a natural products wreath, math mobiles, greeting cards, personal interviews, an original play, Christmas hall decorations and handmade decorations for the Heritage Village school house's Christmas tree.

WMS Principal Cliff Larson closed the class with a question and answer session.

During the conference, the WMS group attend a luncheon where Commissioner of Education Dr. "Skip" Meso reaffirmed the purpose of the PSI.

"This is a 5-6 year program and we must be patient to see improvement and our goal remains to see how it improves student achievement, improve student achievement," Meso said.

She has attended Blinn College in College Station and Lamar University and is a 1991 graduate of Woodville High School.

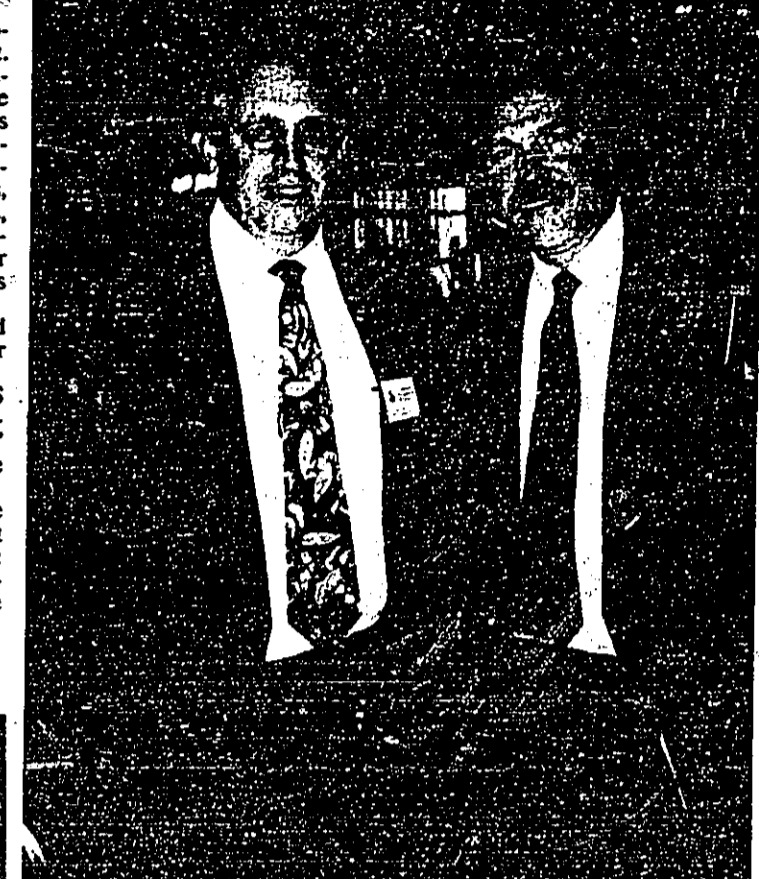
She has previously worked for S & S Drugs as a pharmacy technician and at East Texas Buildings and Bams in Woodville before becoming employed at The Booster.

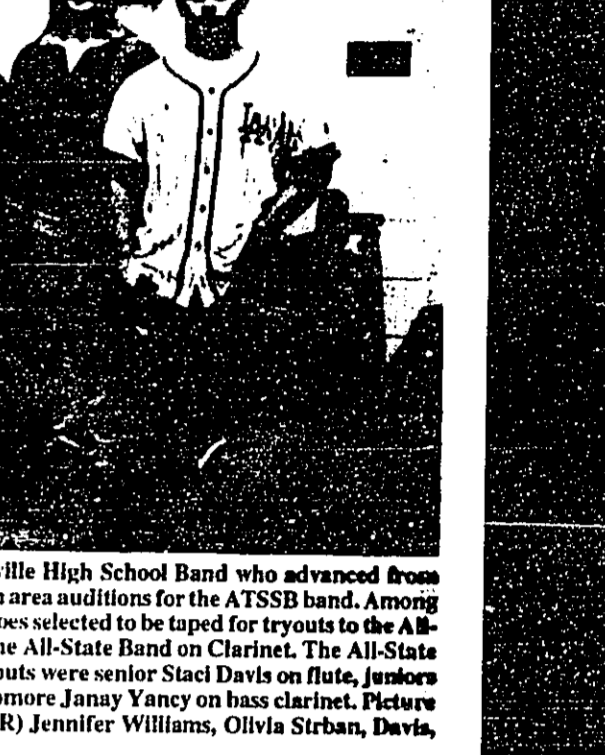

County system complete

- Final equipment added to new computer system -

WOODVILLE — The Tyler County commissioners wrapped up its purchases for a new computer system Monday when they agreed to buy a high speed printer for use by the tax assessor-collector's office.

During a special commissioners meeting Monday, county executive consultant Jesse Sustaure noted he had previously asked the commissioners which would be needed to rapidly produce county tax statements.

"If you recall, just last month I recommended a \$7,900 bid for a high speed printer. Today, however, I am recommending that you accept another bid for \$2,200," Sustaure said. The bid is from Computerware Data Products Inc. and is for an IBM brand printer.

"This is the bid I was holding out for," Sustaure added. "I felt sure we could get a high speed printer in this price range."

In December, the commissioners purchased an IBM AS/400 computer together with sheriff's department, justice of the peace and court management software packages at a cost of \$103,675.

Last month, the court bought nine personal computer terminals, three laser printers, six regular printers and other equipment for the computer system for \$21,754.

The current computer project was initially aimed at the sheriff's department and other Tyler County Justice Center offices but was expanded to enable the county to eventually connect all of its offices to a centralized system.

Sustaure noted that with the purchase of the high speed printer, the county has exceeded its initial budget for computer system by more than \$16,000. Funds originally earmarked for the system included a \$71,115 federal grant and \$40,000 in local matching funds for a total of \$111,115.

With Monday's purchase, the cost of the system topped \$127,500.

"That's not as bad as we thought it was going to be," Precinct 3 Commissioner Jerry Mahan noted. "When we originally bid this, we projected that we could end up \$60,000 to \$80,000 over the grant plus our \$40,000."

County sales tax income declines

WOODVILLE — On the heels of an almost 30 percent increase recorded during December, Tyler County's January sales tax check declined by almost 13 percent when compared to the total received one year earlier.

According to a report issued by State Comptroller John Sharp, the county's latest sales tax payment of \$2,501,995 was over 12.7 percent (or \$238,354) less than the \$18,736,299 check received in January 1992.

The decline in sales tax income follows December's massive 89.7 percent increase. November's slight 5 percent increase followed a 7 percent jump and September's 19.2 percent gain.

The latest check is the first received under the new budget. Last year, the county's 5 percent sales tax generated \$26,978,89.

While the county's sales tax income was declining compared to 1992 totals, the City of Woodville's January payment reflected an increase of over 16 percent. The city's payment of \$31,024,72 was \$4,359,93 more than the city's January 1992 check for \$26,664,79.

This rise in sales tax revenue follows a 26.3 percent increase recorded in December. That \$30,017,48 payment was \$6,234,93 more than was received one year earlier.

Still, a structured meal time, place and routine is one of the most important behavioral patterns for establishing good eating patterns.

Meals and snacks should be scheduled in a pleasant atmosphere. A child who misbehaves should not be allowed to disrupt the family but should be expected to leave the table and not allowed any food until the next snack time.
