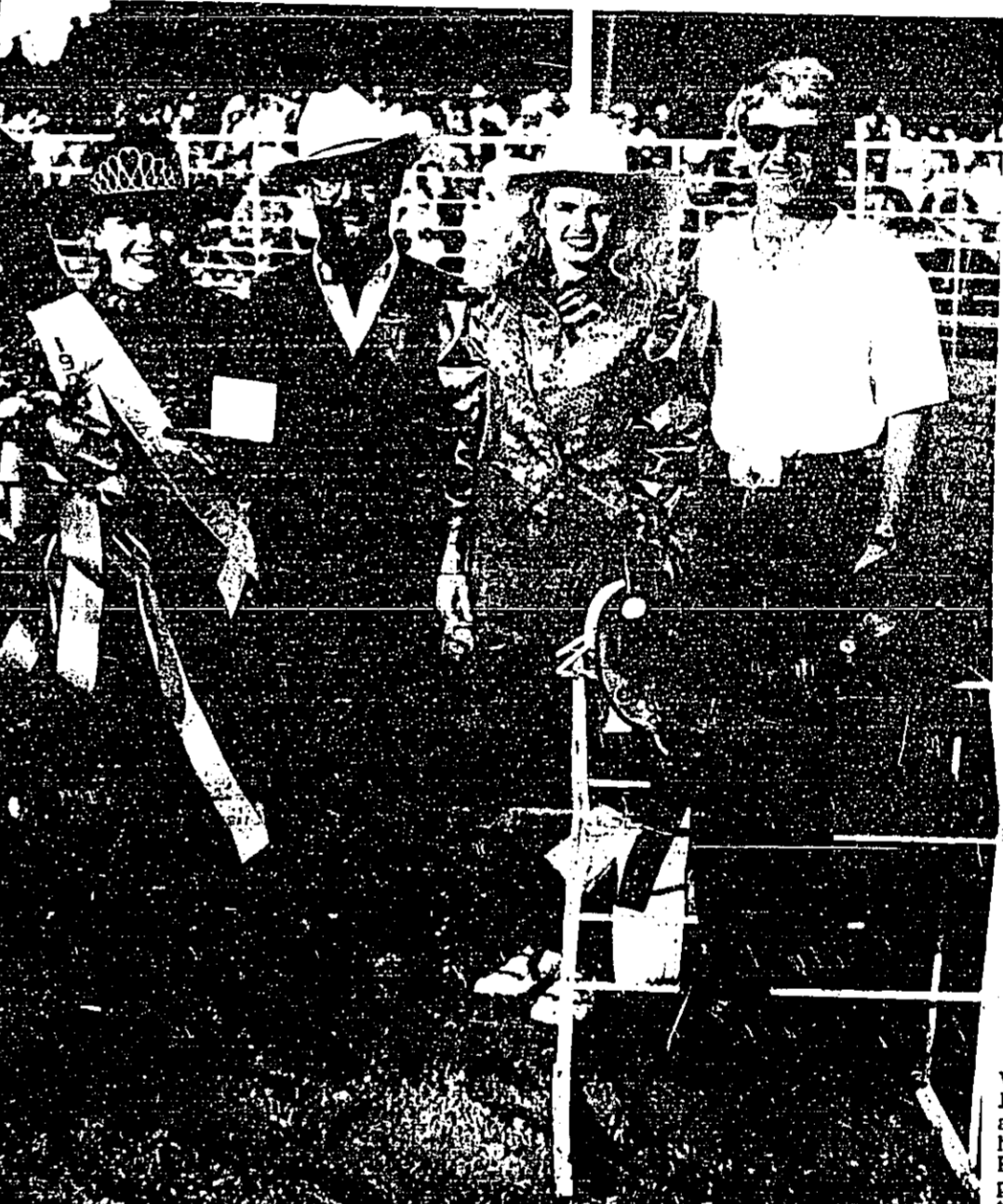

WISD eyes health career courses

WOODVILLE — Woodville High School may be offering health career courses in the future, if Superintendent Carol Moffett's March 23 recommendations are approved in the coming months.

Moffett reported during last week's WISD board meeting that The Deep East Texas Quality Work Force Planning Committee has conducted a survey whose results correspond with a recent Woodville High School student survey revealing a strong interest in health care occupations.

She has recommended to the board a series of three courses to be offered students in grades 10 and above. The first would be "Health Care Science," a general survey course. The succeeding two courses would be called "Health Occupations Education I" and "Health Occupations Education II," both of which would involve off-campus training in health care settings.

"Our goal," said Moffett, "would be to have this graduate as certified nurses aides." It would also give a base for careers in all areas of the health care field. Next month, she will seek the board's approval for the first of the three courses.

Concerning the state finance bill and the upcoming May 1 vote, Moffett expressed concern that the WISD board's views on the matter be communicated to the public, adding that she will be working with board members Tillman Johnson and Brian Babin in reviewing school finance issues and preparing a statement.

"Over the last week," she said, "I've heard so many conflicting accounts of what these amendments mean. I hate

to see in recent years," Western Weekend Director Marcus Payne said. "I don't have an exact count on the number of riders in the parade, but I talked with a couple of the parade judges and one gave a count of over 3,000, while another said it was close to 3,500 — and that is just those riding horses. It did not include the people who were riding in wagons."

Payne said that he and other Dogwood Festival organizers were "very pleased" with the turnout at both the Western Weekend Parade and the Friday-Saturday rodeo performances.

"The weather was terrific and that helped with the turnout. I saw a lot of

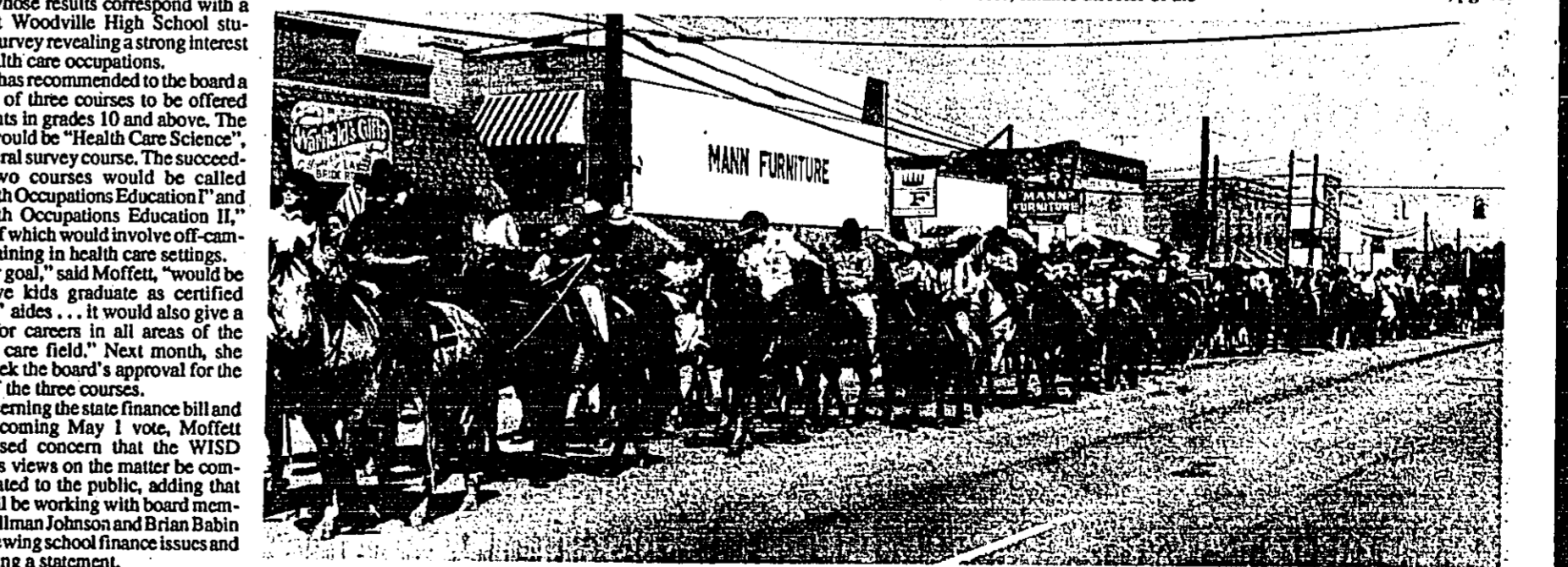
Section Two will feature antique and universal quilts. The show will also feature a display on the various star quilt blocks. In addition to the quilt show, a variety

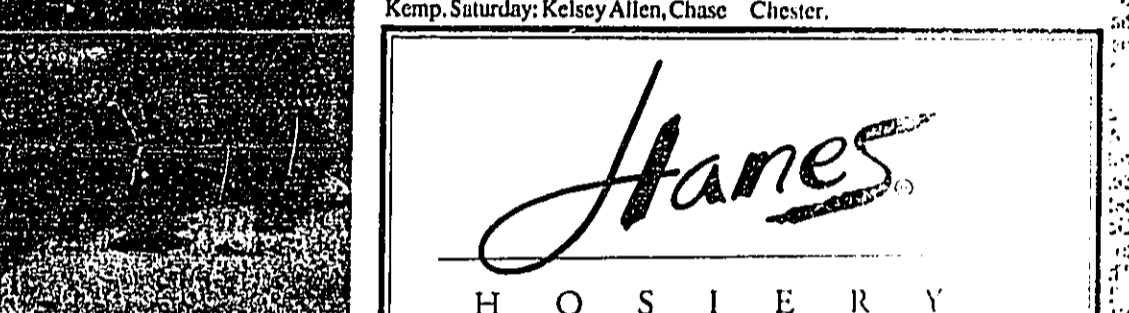

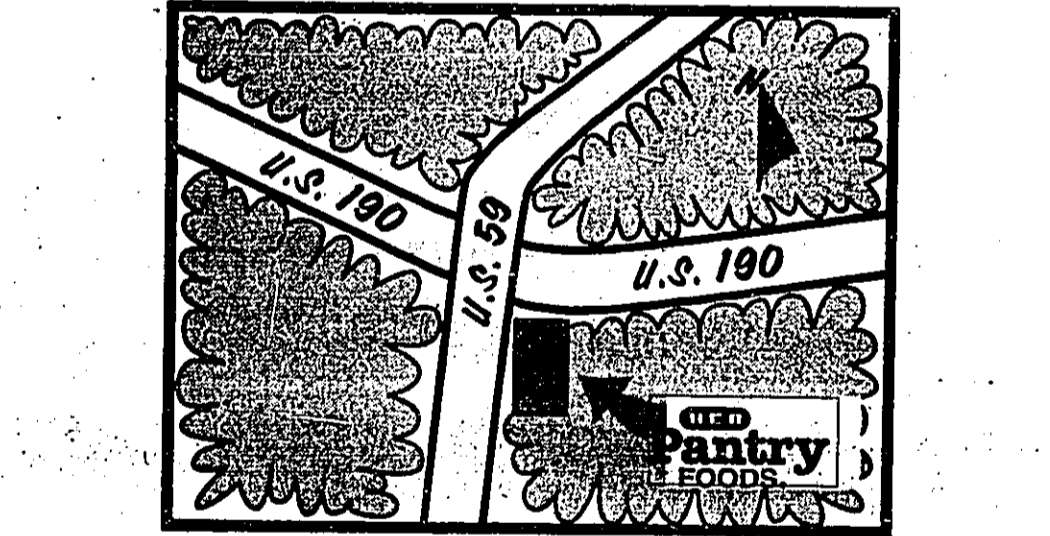

WISD eyes health career courses

WOODVILLE—Woodville High School may be offering health career courses in the future, if Superintendent Carol Moffett's March 23 recommendations are approved in the coming months. Moffett reported during last week's WISD board meeting that the Deep East Texas Quality Work Force Planning Committee has conducted a survey whose results correspond with a recent Woodville High School student survey revealing a strong interest in health care occupations. She has recommended to the board a series of three courses to be offered students in grades 10 and above. The first would be "Health Care Science," a general survey course. The succeeding two courses would be called "Health Occupations Education I" and "Health Occupations Education II," both of which would involve off-campus training in health care settings. "Our goal," said Moffett, "would be to have kids graduate as certified nurses' aides... it would also give a base for careers in all areas of the health care field." Next month, she will seek the board's approval for the first of the three courses. Concerning the state finance bill and the upcoming May 1 vote, Moffett expressed concern that the WISD board's views on the matter be communicated to the public, adding that she will be working with board members Tillman Johnson and Brian Ebbin in reviewing school finance issues and preparing a statement. "Over the last week," she said, "I've heard so many conflicting accounts of what these amendments mean. I hate
