Woman shot during Doucette raid

DOUCETTE—A 19-year-old Woodville woman remained hospitalized in stable condition this week after being wounded early Saturday during a joint Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission and law enforcement raid on the club.

Wille Ann Digges was wounded in both lower legs when officers entered the club and, as a result, many of the officers switched from looking for illegal drug and alcohol activity to providing medical assistance to the wounded woman.

Tyler County Sheriff Gary Hennigan noted that the raid occurred after his office received a number of complaints from residents of the area involving illegal drugs and drinking in and around the Doucette club.

"We had the club under surveillance Friday night and we did see what appeared to be after-hours drinking," the sheriff said.

Hennigan noted that while some of those inside the club claim that the officers fired the gunshot as they entered the club, investigators currently believe that the bullet was accidentally fired by a club patron as he or she tried to get rid of or hide an illegal weapon.

The sheriff added that while only four people in the club were arrested on alcohol-related charges, officers could have arrested many more.

"There were 100-plus people inside the club and quite a number appeared to be intoxicated. We could have arrested as many as 50 or 60 but because of the gunfire and the woman being wounded, we only arrested the more belligerent people."

In addition, Hennigan said officers found 25 packs of crack cocaine scattered on the club floor, apparently thrown there by club patrons who did not wish the drug to be found in their possession.

"It is unfortunate that the shooting occurred but we are going to investigate to find out what happened," the sheriff said, adding that because his department was involved in the raid, he is asking the Texas Rangers to investigate the shooting.

"I want to leave nothing uncovered," Hennigan said.

The Saturday morning raid involved officers with the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, Deep East Texas Narcotics Trafficking Task Force, the Southeast Texas Narcotics and Intelligence Task Force, the county sheriff's department, the Texas Department of Public Safety, as well as two county constables and other area officers.

"Just about every law enforcement agency operating in Tyler County was represented," Ferguson said.

In addition to Digges, Ferguson said three others reported minor injuries, ranging from scrapes to bruises and were treated and released from the Tyler County Hospital in Woodville. Ferguson indicated that additional details concerning the shooting would be released when the investigation was completed.

Runoffs elections set for city, school races

TYLER COUNTY — While the votes in city and school elections are relatively uncommon, two such results were recorded during Saturday's balloting for runoff elections in the Colmesneil and Chester school races.

In Colmesneil, city voters were electing a mayor and two councilmen but the polls on June 5, city residents will be asked to decide between incumbent councilman Thomas J. Svatek, 74, and challenger Kenneth Davis, 34. Both men received 80 votes in the May 1 election.

In that election, incumbent Mayor C.J. Riley, 67, was re-elected to a second term, while challenger Henry B. Ogden Sr., 63, a local realtor, was elected to the council seat.

In the Chester school board race, the two candidates were James E. Richardson, 61, and Bryan Davis, 41. Richardson received 56 votes and Davis 25 votes.

Members of the Chester school board will formally schedule the runoff vote during a meeting scheduled Friday.

Winning one of the two Chester school board seats with a first place finish of 98 votes were Gordon W. Toler, 45, and local realtor Mike Davis, 34. During the race for two at-large school board seats, the two candidates were Gordon W. Toler, 45, and local realtor Charlie Fairchild, 41, with 25 votes.

Amendments
 In other voting Saturday, Tyler County voters favored two of the proposed constitutional amendments although all three of the school-related amendments went down to defeat statewide.

Locally, voters voted their approval for Proposition 1, the so-called "Robin Hood" school financing plan, by a margin of 1,581 (or 57.9 percent) "for" and 1,151 "against."

The Proposition 1 would have legalized the existing school funding plan which redistributes tax income from rich school districts to poor districts. Because of Saturday's voters rejection, the state legislature has until June 1 to come up with an acceptable alternate plan or state courts will cut off all state funds going to local school systems.

Proposition 2, which would have required the state legislature to provide funds to pay for any program in which local schools to follow was rejected locally as well as statewide.

Tyler County voters opposed the proposition by a margin of 1,451 (55.2 percent) "against" to 1,161 "for."

Proposition 3, which would have provided \$750 million for loans and grants to enable poor school districts to upgrade their buildings, was narrowly favored by local voters but was rejected statewide.

In Tyler County, this measure received 1,364 (51.9 percent) "for" votes and 1,264 "against" votes.

U.S. Senate race
 Also on the statewide ballot was the 24-candidate race to fill the unexpired U.S. Senate term created when Lloyd Benetsen resigned to accept President Bill Clinton's appointment as secretary of the treasury.

The two-top winners in large field, Democrat Robert "Bob" Krueger and Republican Kay Bailey Hutchison will face each other in a runoff. Krueger, a former state railroad commissioner,

Engineers picked for trash center

WOODVILLE — Although a contract has not yet been finalized, Tyler County Commissioners indicated Tuesday their selection of Everett Griffith and Associates of Lufkin to perform design work on the new garbage drop-off center to be located west of Woodville.

The collection center will replace the county's landfill which is scheduled to be closed sometime before an Oct. 1 deadline established by state and federal regulatory agencies.

Once in operation, area residents will drop off their trash at the center, paying a volume-based user fee. The trash will then be compacted, loaded into trucks and hauled to a regional landfill located in central Polk County.

Although the cost of performing soil tests at the collection center site was not available Monday, commissioners were told by a representative of the engineering firm that other fees it would charge for the survey, design and inspection work would total \$13,000.

The actual construction and equipment costs for the collection center has not yet been determined.

The commissioners had received two engineering proposals for the project during a special meeting last week but tabled action until Tuesday.

Under the procedures followed by the commissioners, the proposals ranked the firm first, then they will attempt to negotiate a contract with DP Consulting Engineers of Woodville and Woodville, DP was listed as the second choice, although commissioners agreed that both firms were qualified to do the job.

Although Griffith and Associates indicated they were expressing an interest in the project, Griffith and Associates said they would not have received as wide a distribution as everyone may have liked. 




Views On Dental Health

EARLY TOOTH OVERCROWDING

When should crooked teeth be straightened? As soon as they are detected! The old adage about an ounce of prevention is especially true in orthodontics, where crooked teeth can be prevented by early treatment.

Diagnosed at a sufficiently early age, an unusual trend can often be stopped in its tracks and its effects completely erased. To ensure early detection, a child should have a checkup by the family dentist at intervals of about six months, beginning at 21/2 to 3 years of age. Overcrowded and crooked teeth are most likely to make their entrance with the arrival of the four permanent incisors and the four molars at around age six.

Prompt treatment is recommended when teeth are overcrowded. Some baby teeth may be removed ahead of their normal shedding time to allow nature to do a certain amount of tooth straightening. Known as interceptive orthodontics, it involves a one-to-one extraction in a well-planned sequence to make room for a better bite.

College courses slated in Woodville

WOODVILLE — Angelina College has scheduled eleven credit courses for the summer term in Woodville. Registration for the courses will be conducted May 18 and 19 from 5:30 - 7 p.m. at the Woodville High School library. Several documents are required to complete the registration process and these vary depending on the individual student's status.

A student entering college for the first time must complete an application for admission, available at the Woodville registration session. Other documents required, in this case, are an official high school transcript and proof of Texas residency for at least one year. A year old Texas driver's license, and a voter registration card are examples of qualifying documents.

If the student has attended another college, an official copy of the college transcript is required instead of the high school transcript along with the completed application for admission and residency proof. Failure to provide residency proof, in either case will result in the student paying out-of-state tuition fees which are considerably higher than in-state tuition.

Individual courses meet from 6-9 p.m., two nights a week for eight weeks. The first class meeting is scheduled for June 1 with final exams scheduled for July 21 and 22. Courses scheduled for Monday and Wednesday nights are world classics to 1500, ENG 231, United States history from the beginning to 1877, and speech communications, SPH 131.

Tuesday and Thursday night courses include Introduction to data processing, CIS 133, English composition, ENG 131, federal and state government, GOV 231, and introductory sociology, SOC 131. June opening projected for center - Administrator named for children's treatment center-

 WOODVILLE — The Sinclair Children's Home administrator, William Foster, 54, predicts a mid-June opening of the residential treatment center facility, which is expected to serve some 30 abandoned, troubled, abused, traumatized or neglected youth ages 5 to 12.

Foster will be the first-ever administrator for the 13,000-square-foot facility, located at 107 Nellius in Woodville, and offered to host them for a day's outing riding horses, for example. I have not had one person object to what we are doing since I've arrived here. What we want is for them to have as normal a situation as possible under the circumstances."

Foster, and his wife Cynthia, have three grown children including: Cindy, 29, of San Pedro; Kristina, 26, of New Waverly; and a son, Kevin, 22, who is a senior English major at Sam Houston State University in Woodville.

Foster was born in San Saba, and attended High School in West Columbia in Brazoria County. He obtained his undergraduate degree in sociology and criminology at Sam Houston State University and went to work for the Department of Public Welfare in the cities of Plainview, Galveston and in Brazoria County. He attended graduate school at Our Lady of the Lake College in San Antonio where he earned his masters level degree.

He was employed as head of the McClendon County, Waco, Child Welfare Unit where he served in Children's Protective Services for a period of three years.

Foster was transferred from Waco to the main state welfare offices in Austin where he became involved in planning for Medicaid Program Development. During his time in Austin he worked part-time for the Mary Lee Foundation. Following his service in Austin he went back to Waco where he worked for the United Fund family services section dealing with family counseling and work with adolescents. He also worked with the McClendon County Rehabilitation Center which focused on concerns about physical therapy and occupational therapy.

Foster then moved to Houston where he became the executive director of the Florence Crittendon Services, a residential program for adolescents including Live Oak, Rockdale, Kaye, Buda, Giddings and Lockhart.

College courses slated in Woodville

WOODVILLE — Angelina College has scheduled eleven credit courses for the summer term in Woodville. Registration for the courses will be conducted May 18 and 19 from 5:30 - 7 p.m. at the Woodville High School library. Several documents are required to complete the registration process and these vary depending on the individual student's status.

A student entering college for the first time must complete an application for admission, available at the Woodville registration session. Other documents required, in this case, are an official high school transcript and proof of Texas residency for at least one year. A year old Texas driver's license, and a voter registration card are examples of qualifying documents.

If the student has attended another college, an official copy of the college transcript is required instead of the high school transcript along with the completed application for admission and residency proof. Failure to provide residency proof, in either case will result in the student paying out-of-state tuition fees which are considerably higher than in-state tuition.

Individual courses meet from 6-9 p.m., two nights a week for eight weeks. The first class meeting is scheduled for June 1 with final exams scheduled for July 21 and 22. Courses scheduled for Monday and Wednesday nights are world classics to 1500, ENG 231, United States history from the beginning to 1877, and speech communications, SPH 131.

Tuesday and Thursday night courses include Introduction to data processing, CIS 133, English composition, ENG 131, federal and state government, GOV 231, and introductory sociology, SOC 131. A non course based remediation program will be offered for students needing developmental instruction in English and math. The date and times of the

Woman shot during Doucette raid

DOUCETTE—A 19-year-old Woodville woman remained hospitalized in stable condition this week after being wounded Saturday during a joint Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission-drug task force-sheriff department raid in Doucette.

Willetta Ann Diggle was wounded in both lower legs when officers entered the home at 1100 S. Main Street. Rump officers to investigate complaints of alcoholic beverages being served illegally in the dance club located north of Woodville in Doucette.

According to Lt. Tracy Ferguson of the Tyler County Sheriff's Department, the type of weapon used in the shooting as well as who actually fired the shot were still under investigation. Only one shot is believed to have been fired during the incident.

The sheriff added that while only four people in the club were arrested on alcohol-related charges, officers could have arrested many more.

"There were 100-plus people inside the club and quite a number appeared to be intoxicated. We could have arrested as many as 50 or 60 but because of the gunfire and the woman being wounded, we only arrested the more belligerent people."

In addition, Hennigan said officers found 25 rocks of crack cocaine scattered on the club floor, apparently thrown there by club patrons who did not wish the drug to be found in their possession.

"It is unfortunate that the shooting occurred but we are going to investigate to find out what happened," the sheriff said, adding that because his department was involved in the raid, he is asking the Texas Rangers to investigate the shooting.

"I want to have everything uncovered," Hennigan said.

The Saturday morning raid involved officers with the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, Deep East Texas Narcotics Trafficking Task Force, Southeast Texas Narcotics and Intelligence Task Force, the county sheriff's department, the Texas Department of Public Safety, as well as two county constables and other area officers.

"Just about every law enforcement agency operating in Tyler County was represented," Ferguson said.

In addition to Diggle, Ferguson said three others reported minor injuries ranging from scrapes to bruises and were treated and released from the Tyler County Hospital in Woodville.

Ferguson indicated that additional details concerning the investigation would be released when the shooting was completed.

Runoffs elections set for city, school races

TYLER COUNTY—While the votes in city and school elections are relatively uncommon, two such races were recorded during Saturday's balloting for runoff elections in the Colmesnell city and Chester school races.

In Colmesnell, city voters were electing a mayor and two councilmen but a vote in the race for the school board council seat will bring voters back to the polls on June 5. City residents will be asked to decide between incumbent councilman Thomas J. Svalbert, 74, and challenger Kenneth Davis, 34. Both men received 80 votes in the May election.

In that election, incumbent Mayor C.J. Riley, 67, was re-elected to a second term. Svalbert, 74, and local logger Mike Davis, 34. During the race for two at-large school board seats, the two finished in a second place tie with 83 votes each.

Members of the Chester school board will formally schedule the runoff vote during a meeting scheduled Friday.

Winning one of the two Chester school board seats with a first place finish of 98 votes was Jamie R. Johnson, a 31-year-old housewife. Two other candidates in the race finished out-of-the-money and included Gordon W. Toler, 45, with 80 votes and Charlie Fairchild, 41, with 25 votes.

In other voting Saturday, Tyler County voters favored two of the proposed state constitutional amendments although all three of the school-related amendments went down to defeat statewide.

Locally, voters voiced their approval for Proposition 1, the so-called "Robin Hood" school financing plan, by a margin of 1,581 (or 57.9 percent) "for" and 1,151 "against."

The Proposition 1 would have legalized the existing school funding plan which redistributes tax income from rich school districts to poor districts. Because of Saturday's voters rejection, the state legislature has until June 1 to come up with an acceptable alternative plan or state courts will cut off all state funds going to local school systems.

Proposition 2, which would have required the state legislature to provide funds to pay for any program it requires local schools to follow was rejected locally as well as statewide.

Tyler County voters opposed the proposition by a margin of 1,431 (55.2 percent) "against" to 1,161 "for."

Proposition 3, which would have provided \$750 million for loans and grants to enable poor school districts to upgrade their buildings, was narrowly favored by local voters but was rejected statewide.

In Tyler County, this measure received 1,364 (51.9 percent) "for" votes and 1,264 "against" votes.

Also on the statewide ballot was the 24-candidate race to fill the unexpired U.S. Senate term created when Lloyd Bentsen resigned to accept President Bill Clinton's appointment as secretary of the treasury.

The two-term winners in large field, Democrat Robert "Bob" Krueger and Republican Kay Bailey Hutchison will face each other in a runoff. Krueger, a former state railroad commissioner,

was appointed to the senate seat earlier this year by Gov. Ann Richards while Hutchison, the state treasurer, is seeking to place both of Texas's senate seats in Republican hands for the first time since Reconstruction.

Although Krueger was the number one pick among Tyler County voters—gathering 1,349 or 50.1 percent of the total—Hutchison narrowly finished in first place statewide. Overall, she edged out Krueger for first place by only 497 votes between receiving 29 percent of the total cast vote.

Locally, Hutchison finished in second place with 784 votes (29.1 percent) while Krueger received 772 votes (29.4 percent). Republican Joe Barton garnered 101 local votes (3.7 percent).



Engineers picked for trash center

The actual construction and equipment costs for the collection center has not yet been determined, Tyler County Commissioners indicated Tuesday their selection of Everett Griffith and Associates of Lufkin to perform design work on the new garbage drop-off center to be located west of Woodville.

The collection center will replace the county's landfill which is scheduled to be closed sometime before Oct. 1 deadline established by state and federal regulatory agencies.

Once in operation, area residents will drop off their trash at the center, paying a volume-based user fee. The trash will then be compacted, loaded into trucks and hauled to a regional landfill located in central Polk County.

Although the cost of performing soil tests at the collection center site was not available Monday, commissioners were told by a representative of the engineering firm that other fees it would charge for the survey, design and inspection work would total \$13,000.





Colmesneil boys win regional track title

KILGORE — The Colmesneil boys track team used four gold medal performances, including one in the 400 meter relay, to win the class A Region III track title Saturday.

Colmesneil totaled 46 points in the meet held at Kilgore Junior College, nine points better than second place O'Connell. Detroit took third with 46 points.

Greg Bean saw his chance for the state meet slip away when he fell trying to clear the next to the last hurdle in the 300 meter hurdles, but he most likely would have finished second in the event, caught his trailing foot on the hurdle and fell to the ground. McQueen will get his trip to Austin after all. He will go as an alternate on the 400 meter relay.
