Jury rejects pollution charges

-E&L mill liable for only \$5,900 in land damages-

WOODVILLE — Rejecting damage claims of well over \$1 million, a Tyler County jury decided last week that E&L Lumber Co. and E&L Chipping Co. were not guilty of pollution charges leveled in four separate lawsuits.

Following an eight-day civil trial, the jury in Woodville deliberated for less than two hours on May 19 before exonerating the Woodville mill of all but one charge — that of damaging adjoining property owned by Margaret Lane Walker by allowing surface water and/or sediment to flow from E&L's property.

In that decision, the jury ruled the overall damage was both temporary and unintentional and awarded \$5,900 in damages to the Woodville woman. No other monetary damages were awarded to any other plaintiff in the lawsuit and E&L was found neither to have discharged pollution into Magnus Branch nor to have damaged any other property owned by the defendants.

Four lawsuits were filed against the company in 1989 and 1990 charging that the firm has negligently discharged pollution into the stream which in turn damaged land and a series of downstream lakes. They also maintained that noise emanating from the mill had caused a nuisance which deprived them of the enjoyment of their property.

The lawsuits, which remained as separate complaints, were tried at the same time before District Judge Monte Lawlis.

The jury verdict on all charges against E&L was by 10-2 vote. Under Texas law, juries in civil cases do not have to reach a unanimous verdict but all decisions must be approved by a minimum of 10 of the 12 panel members.

Lawsuits charging the company with discharging pollution were filed by Dorothy Miller of Woodville in November 1989, by Walker in February 1990, by Beverly Barclay Collic of Beaumont in March 1990 and by Kenneth and Curle Bailey of Beaumont in December 1990.

In a written statement issued by E&L President Buddy Lowery following the jury's decision, the company official said the complaints against E&L stemmed from October 1988 when a barkpile fire occurred at the chipmill located just south of Woodville off Highway 69.

Following the fire, which Lowery said began as a result of spontaneous combustion, several downstream landowners made serious allegations against the company charging that pollution emanated from the mill and the alleged pollution pertains to the initial barkpile fire and primarily to water simply being sprayed upon the inventory of hardwood logs at the chipmill, Lowery said.

"These pollution allegations have not only been asserted by several downstream landowners, but also by the Texas Water Commission, when, in fact, there are no chemicals whatsoever utilized at the chipmill and the alleged pollution pertains to the initial barkpile fire and primarily to water simply being sprayed upon the inventory of hardwood logs at the chipmill," Lowery said.

WISD graduation policy questioned

WOODVILLE — One Woodville parent captured the attention of the WISD board of trustees last Tuesday night, May 18, with a well-rounded appeal for the revision of a local graduation policy which prohibits students from participating if they have failed to pass all portions of the TAAS exam.

"I'm here," she said, "on behalf of several of the students in the Woodville school district. Other parents and I are concerned that, while the TAAS test is necessary to pass, we feel that the 12 years of schooling are important too. My child has not passed the math portion of the TAAS test. The student has invested 12 years of school... If they have credits and grades but fail the TAAS test, the district should show appreciation for that child's investment of 12-13 years of schooling by allowing that child to go through graduation ceremonies."

She brought along with her one of the pamphlets which are available in the administration building waiting room. She held the pamphlet up before the board members, and read from it. "This pamphlet says 'affirming the dignity and potential of each individual' and 'provide a quality education for all children.' Those (students) that are serious take pride in their school. It would take away their dignity to allow them to leave the school without being recognized for their years of attendance and hard work."

"I realize this is a rule in the student manual. This is a tradition, and sometimes tradition is not always good. She (her daughter) is determined and we are determined to go back and get the diploma because being a quitter, no one wins."

Charles Spurlock, president of the board, thanked the parent for her comments, however, no action could be taken due to the fact that Texas state law prohibits action on any matter which is not on the agenda for that meeting.

Superintendent Carol Moffett also expressed her gratitude for the woman's comments.

"I encourage (her) to come and speak to you about this. I was moved by her arguments, but for every rule we make, there is someone who

Jury rejects pollution charges

-E&L mill liable for only \$5,900 in land damages-

WOODVILLE — Rejecting damage claims of well over \$1 million, a Tyler County jury decided last week that E&L Lumber Co. and E&L Chipping Co. were not guilty of pollution charges leveled in four separate lawsuits. Following an eight-day civil trial, the jury in Woodville deliberated for less than two hours on May 19 before exonerating the Woodville mill of all but one charge — that of damaging adjoining property owned by Margaret Lane Walker by allowing surface water and/or sediment to flow from E&L's property.

In that decision, the jury ruled the Branch mill was not responsible for overflow damage to both temporary and unintentional and awarded \$5,900 in damages to the Woodville woman.

No other monetary damages were awarded to any other plaintiff in the lawsuit and E&L was found neither to have discharged pollution into Magnolia Branch nor to have damaged any other property owned by the defendants.

Four lawsuits were filed against the company in 1989 and 1990 charging that the firm has negligently discharged pollution into the stream which in turn damaged land and a series of downstream lakes. They also maintained that noise emanating from the mill was a nuisance which deprived them of the enjoyment of their property.

The lawsuits, which remained as separate complaints, were tried at the same time before District Judge Monte Lawlis.

The jury verdict on all charges against E&L was by a 10-2 vote. Under Texas law, juries in civil cases do not have to reach a unanimous verdict but all decisions must be approved by a minimum of 10 of the 12 panel members.

Lawsuits charging the company with discharging pollution were filed by Dorothy Wilter of Woodville in November 1989, by Walker in February 1990, by Beverly Barclay Coffie of Beaumont in March 1990 and by Kenneth and Carole Bailey of Beaumont in December 1990.

An written statement issued by E&L President Buddy Lowery following the jury's decision, the company official said the complaints against E&L stemmed from October 1988 when a barkpile fire occurred at the chipmill located just south of Woodville off Highway 69.

Following the fire, which Lowery said began as a result of spontaneous combustion, several downstream landowners made serious allegations against the company charging that pollution emanated from the mill and that noise coming from the chipmill's debarker created a nuisance.

"These pollution allegations have not only been asserted by several downstream landowners, but also by the Texas Water Commission, when, in fact, there are no chemicals whatsoever utilized at the chipmill and the alleged pollution pertains to the initial firewater run-off and primarily to water simply being sprayed upon the inventory of hardwood logs at the chipmill," Lowery said.

WISD graduation policy questioned

WOODVILLE — One Woodville parent captured the attention of the WISD board of trustees last Tuesday night, May 18, with a well-rounded appeal for the revision of a local graduation policy which prohibits students from participating if they have failed to pass all portions of the TAAS exam.

"I'm here," she said, "on behalf of several of the students in the Woodville school district. Other parents and I are concerned that, while the TAAS test is necessary to pass, we feel that the 12 years of schooling are important too. My child has not passed the math portion of the TAAS test. Our parents have invested a lot in their child's education and to see them fail to graduate is a tragedy. If they have credits and grades but also on the TAAS test, the districts should show appreciation for that child's investment of 12-13 years of schooling by allowing that child to go through graduation ceremonies."

She brought along with her one of the pamphlets which are available in the administration building waiting room. She held the pamphlet up before the board members, and read from it. "This pamphlet says 'affirming the dignity and potential of each individual' and 'provide a quality education for all children.' Those (students) that are serious take pride in their school. It would take away their dignity to allow them to leave the school without being recognized for their years of attendance and hard work."

Charles Spurlock, president of the WISD trustees, thanked the parent for her comments. However, he said, could be taken due to the fact that Texas state law prohibits action on any matter which is not on the agenda at that meeting.

Superintendent Carol Moffett also expressed her gratitude for the woman's comments.

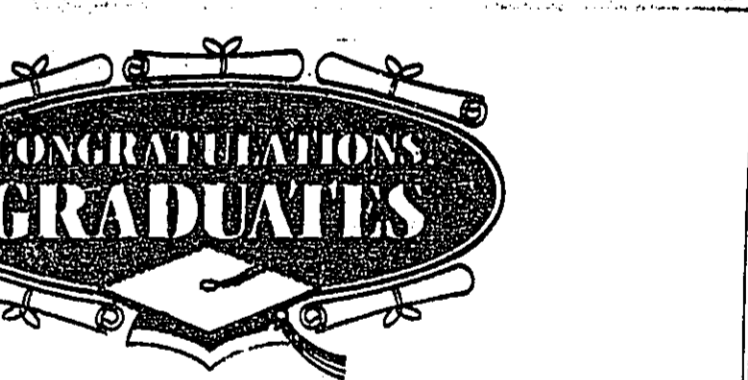

WOODVILLE — The Spurger Pirates rolled over the Wildcats 8-2, winning their final bi-district baseball crown Friday.

The Pirates' victory enabled them to move into the area championship game Tuesday against Carleton. A win there would push the Pirates into the regional semifinals next week. Spurger could play one of four teams, including Anderson, Centerville, Dawson, or Wotnam.

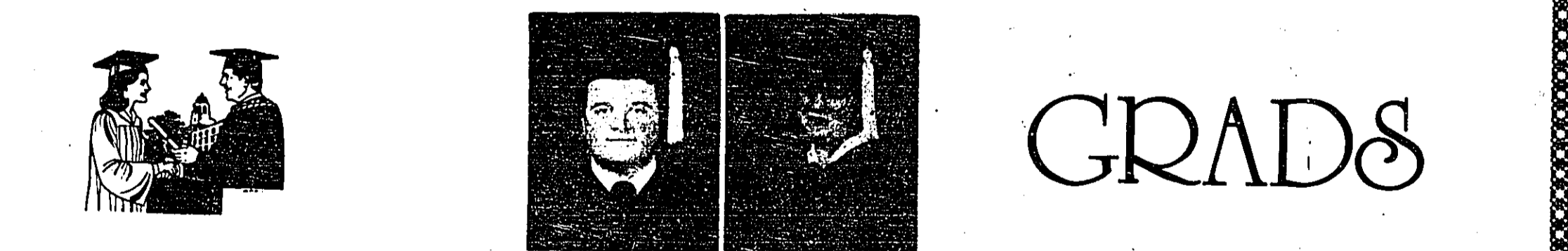

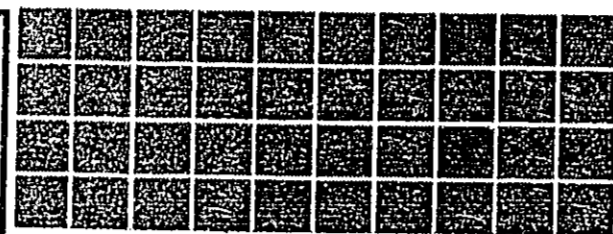
