Heat stroke kills two Fred children

FRED — Two children who became trapped in a car trunk while playing apparently died of heat stroke last week, according to officials.

Brandin Lee Wolfe, 5, and his three-year-old sister, Brittany Jeanette Wolfe, died after they accidentally shut themselves inside the trunk of a Hyundai car during the hot afternoon of Thursday, July 15. The car, which officers described as in a non-running condition, was parked outside the home of their parents, Christopher and Tona Wolfe of Fred.

Chief Deputy Sam Bible of the Tyler County Sheriff's Department said that while the investigation into the two deaths was still underway, preliminary indications are that the incident was accidental.

"The car trunk could be opened without a key and it was possible for the kids to have reached up and closed the trunk from the inside," Bible said.

Bible said the sheriff's department was notified about 4 p.m. Thursday, July 15, that two children were missing in Fred and that they were found at around 4:30 p.m. inside the trunk.

Brandin Wolfe was subsequently pronounced dead at the scene by Precinct 1 Justice of the Peace Wanda Brasher. Brittany Wolfe was still alive and was rushed to St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Beaumont. However, she was pronounced dead as the result of heat stroke at 4:55 a.m. Saturday, July 17.

"When we got the call Thursday, the two kids had been missing for about an

hour. When their mother first noticed they were missing, she began looking for them herself and got help from a neighbor," the deputy said.

Bible added that the search included checking the roads near the home, the woods and a pond located in the vicinity of the family's home.

"A neighbor had seen them playing in the yard at about 3 o'clock so we feel that they had been trapped inside the trunk for about an hour and a half before they were found," Bible said.

Although the results of an autopsy on the body of Brandin Wolfe will not be final for about a week, it is believed that the boy died of heat stroke.

Because Brittany Wolfe died in a Beaumont hospital and had more medical records available, no autopsy was ordered to determine a cause of death. Her cause of death was listed as apparent heat stroke.

A joint graveside funeral service for the two children was held at 2 p.m. Saturday, July 17, at the Franks Branch Cemetery near Fred under the direction of Riley Funeral Home of Woodville.

Both children were natives of Lake Charles, La., but had resided in Fred for most of their lives.

Survivors included their parents; two brothers, Bradley Daniel Wolfe and David Christopher Wolfe, both of Fred; and their grandparents, David and Willie Mae Wolfe of Fred, Barbara Wharton of Appleton City, Mo., and Claudine and Danny Stuber of Vidor.

Schools set to resume classes

-Registration of new students begins Aug. 2-

TYLER COUNTY — With all five Tyler County school systems set to resume classes for the new year in mid-August, most districts are asking that new students come in early to register.

Registration of students new to both the Woodville and Colmesneil school districts are being asked to sign up for classes on Aug. 2-6.

Colmesneil ISD
The Colmesneil schools will be the first to begin the new year when students begin reporting for the 1993-94 year on Thursday, Aug. 12.

Students new to the district are asked to bring a birth certificate, an immunization record, and previous school records if available. Registration of students in kindergarten through sixth grade will be in the elementary school while those in the seventh through 12th grades will sign up in the high school.

Woodville ISD
Woodville schools, which previously had announced an Aug. 16 start date, are now set to begin classes on Friday, Aug. 13.

Students new to the district are asked to bring previous school records if available, current immunization records, birth certificate, proof of residency and a social security number. Parents or guardians should be present with the student to complete the registration process.

Those entering kindergarten through second grade should register at Wheat

Elementary School, students beginning grades three through five should register at the Woodville Intermediate School while those entering the sixth through seventh grades should register at the Woodville Junior High School during school hours anytime between Aug. 2-6.

New students entering Woodville High School should sign up between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. at the high school.

Students previously enrolled at WHS will be issued their class schedules at the following times:

• **FRESHMEN:** A orientation session to familiarize all members with the school will be held in the WHS Library on Tuesday, Aug. 3, and Wednesday, Aug. 4. Orientation ses-

sions on Aug. 3 will include one from 10 a.m. to noon for all students whose last names begin with the letters A-C, while a 1-3 p.m. session will be held for those whose names begin with D-K. On Aug. 4, a 10 a.m. to noon session is scheduled for those whose last names begin with L-P while a 1-3 p.m. orientation will be held for those whose names begin with R-Z.

• **SENIORS:** Woodville seniors will receive their class schedules between 5:30-6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 3 in the WHS library.

• **JUNIORS:** Members of the incoming WHS junior class will receive class schedules from 5:30-6:30 p.m.

Three men injured in weekend mishaps

WOODVILLE — Three men were treated at Tyler County Hospital in Woodville over the weekend after sustaining injuries in two separate one-car traffic mishaps.

Patrick Parker, 26, of Woodville was admitted to the hospital Saturday for observation while Gregory Jefferson, 26, of Corrigan and David Wayne Laughlin, 27, of Warren were treated and released, according to a hospital spokesperson. All three were transported to the hospital by Eastex EMS Ambulance.

The first mishap occurred about 10:30 p.m. Saturday, July 17, on U.S. Highway 287 about seven miles north of Woodville. According to a report filed by Trooper Richard C. Brown, a 1968 Chevrolet Belair driven by Jefferson was traveling north when it ran off the left side of the road into a ditch.

The vehicle traveled about 300 feet in the ditch before hitting a culvert. Upon the impact, Brown said the vehicle "went airborne" for 100 feet and came to rest in the ditch.

Parker was a front seat passenger in the vehicle.

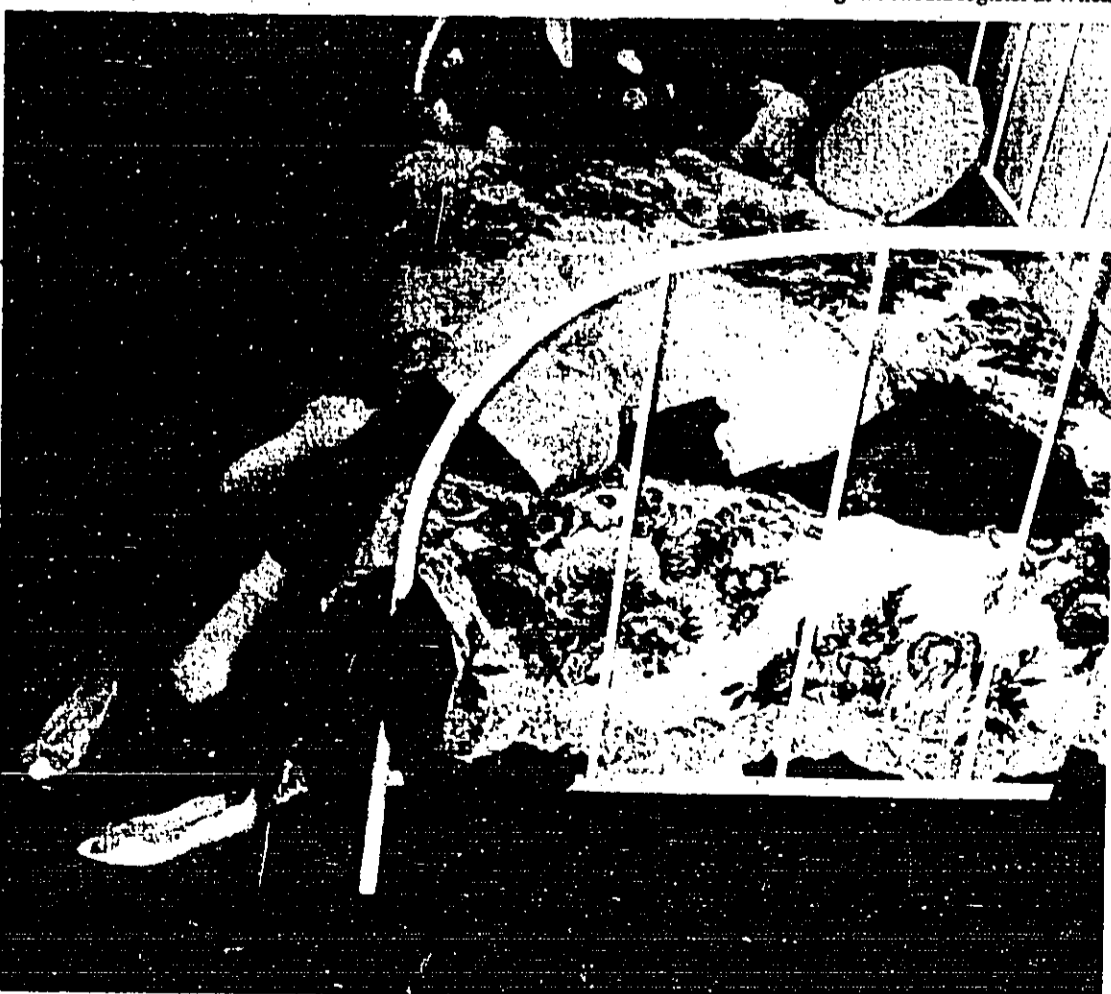
Jefferson was charged with driving while intoxicated.

The second accident happened at about 5:25 p.m. Sunday on U.S. Highway 69 in Warren, about .3 miles south of the FM 1943 intersection.

According to Department of Public Safety reports, a 1985 Chevrolet Cavalier driven by Laughlin was traveling north at a high rate of speed when it failed to negotiate a curve to the left at the Warren overpass. The car reportedly left the east side of the roadway, swung back onto the highway and spun around 180 degrees.

During the spin, the car crossed the road and the front-right portion of the vehicle struck a bridge railing on the west side of the highway. After hitting the railing, the car bounced off and continued its spin, hitting the railing a second time on the back-right portion of the vehicle.

Laughlin was charged with driving while intoxicated.

Over 200 attend Sinclair treatment center opening

WOODVILLE — Over 200 dignitaries, friends and guests got to see the new Kathryn Stanley Sinclair Children's Center, located at 207 Nellius St., during its grand opening and formal dedication on Tuesday, July 13.

Cliff and Kitly Sinclair of Santa Fe, N.M., major benefactors for the program, said the event was, "one of the happiest days in our lives. You will learn to love the staff and children."

The couple, who donated the property and a building to the program, has a multi-handicapped daughter who was unable to attend the opening.

On hand to welcome guests and experience the new facility were three "guest" or potential residents who were visiting from one of the six Mary Lee Foundation residential treatment centers located throughout the state, said Robin Clyne, treatment supervisor for the center.

The facility may house up to 30 abused, neglected or multi-handicapped children ages five through 12. The facility will also be licensed for children up through age 17.

As of Tuesday some seven children within the Mary Lee network of centers have already been identified for possible placement here pending licensing from the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services (TDPRS), Clyne said.

The Center will provide 24-hour care and include room, board supervision and counseling by mental health professionals and recreation.

The administrator of the Woodville center is William Foster, who said, "The community has really been great to us and made us feel at home. A real cross section of Tyler County was

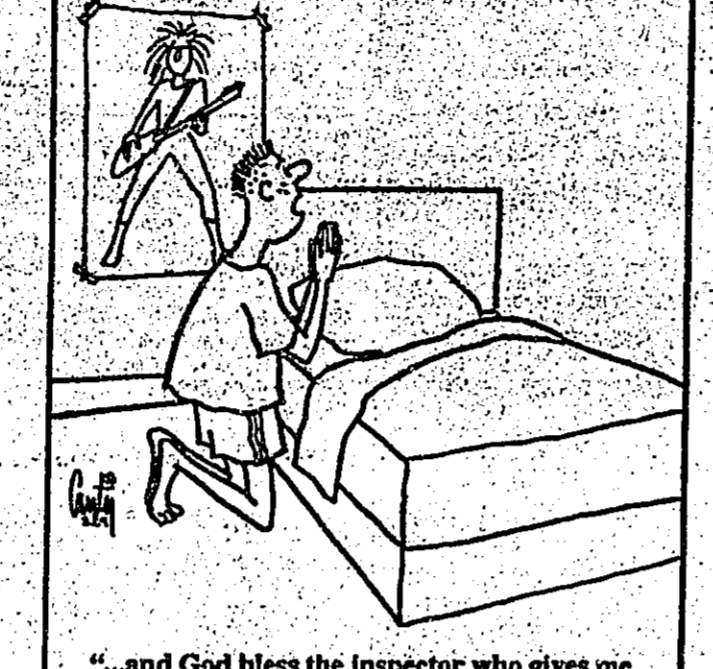

Part B Medicare claims must be submitted by provider

LUFKIN — Medicare Medical Insurance (Part B) claims must be prepared and submitted by the doctor or other service provider. This is true even if the provider does not accept assignment.
 Some important things to know about filing Part B claims are:
 • An extra charge cannot be made by provider for preparing and submitting claims.
 • If a provider does not accept assignment, the beneficiary is still liable for paying what Medicare doesn't pay.
 • The law applies to all physicians and suppliers who provide covered services to Medicare beneficiaries.
 • Time limits for filing claims did not change - i.e. claims must be filed within one year from the date of service.
 • Assignments are not accepted, doctors and providers may request payment in full at the time of service.
 • Exceptions to the claims filing requirements: When Medicare is a secondary payer used durable medical equipment obtained from a third party; services billed directly to a third party insurer and unusual unique situations as evaluated by the Medicare carrier.

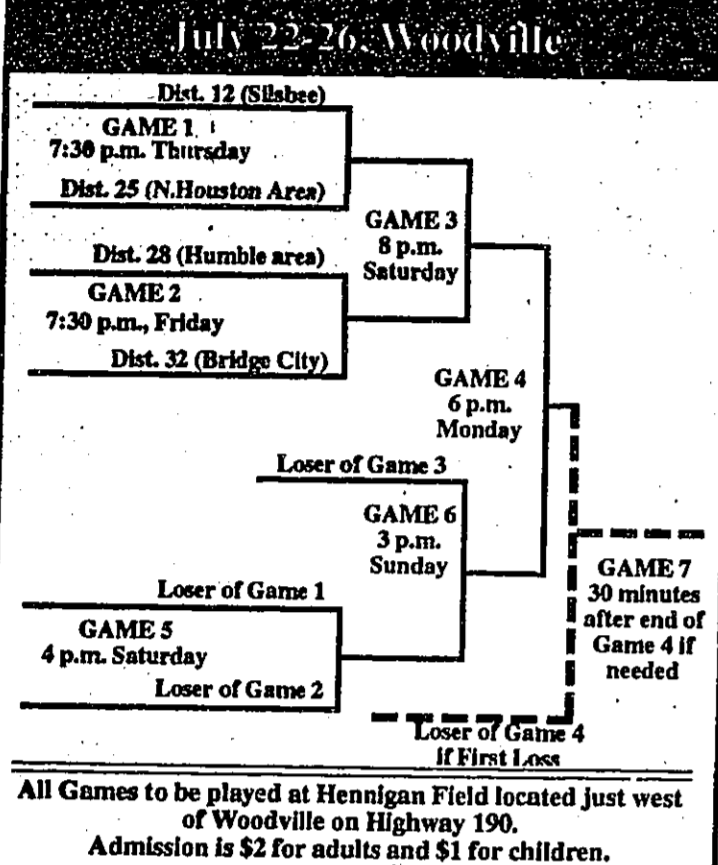

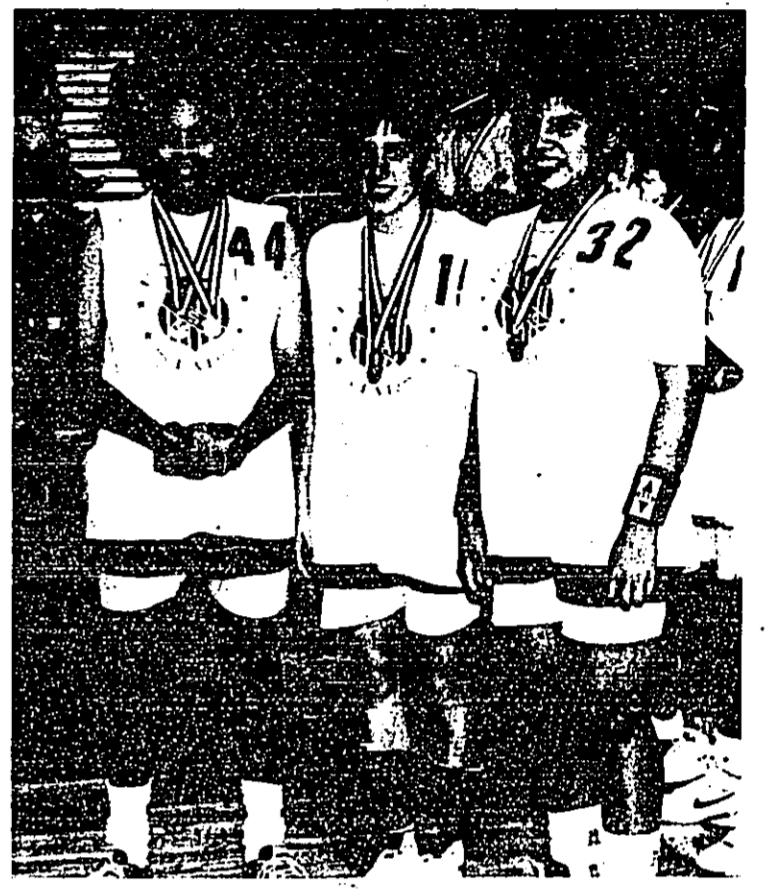

Heat stroke kills two Fred children

FRED — Two children who became trapped in a car trunk while playing apparently died of heat stroke last week, according to officials.

Brandin Lee Wolfe, 5, and his three-year-old sister, Brittany Jeanette Wolfe, died after they accidentally shut themselves inside the trunk of a Hyundai car during the hot afternoon of Thursday, July 15. The car, which officers described as in a non-running condition, was parked outside the home of their parents, Christopher and Tona Wolfe of Fred.

Chief Deputy Sam Bible of the Tyler County Sheriff's Department said that while the investigation into the two deaths was still underway, preliminary indications are that the incident was accidental.

"The car trunk could be opened without a key and it was possible for the kids to have reached up and closed the trunk from the inside," Bible said.

Bible said the sheriff's department was notified about 4 p.m. Thursday, July 15, that two children were missing in Fred and that they were found at around 4:30 p.m. inside the trunk.

Brandin Wolfe was subsequently pronounced dead at the scene by Precinct 1 Justice of the Peace Wanda Brasher. Brittany Wolfe was still alive and was rushed to St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Beaumont. However, she was pronounced dead as the result of heat stroke at 4:55 a.m. Saturday, July 17.

"When we got the call Thursday, the two kids had been missing for about an

hour. When their mother first noticed they were missing, she began looking for them herself and got help from a neighbor," the deputy said.

Bible added that the search included checking the roads near the home, the woods and a pond located in the vicinity of the family's home.

"A neighbor had seen them playing in the yard at about 3 o'clock so we feel that they had been trapped inside the trunk for about an hour and a half before they were found," Bible said.

Although the results of an autopsy on the body of Brandin Wolfe will not be final for about a week, it is believed that the boy died of heat stroke.

Because Brittany Wolfe died in a Beaumont hospital and had more medical records available, no autopsy was ordered to determine a cause of death. Her cause of death was listed as apparent heat stroke.

A joint, graveside funeral service for the two children was held at 2 p.m. Saturday, July 17, at the Franks Branch Cemetery near Fred under the director of Riley Funeral Home of Woodville.

Both children were natives of Lake Charles, La., but had resided in Fred for most of their lives.

Survivors included their parents; two brothers, Bradley Daniel Wolfe and David Christopher Wolfe, both of Fred; and their grandparents, David and Willie Mae Wolfe of Fred, Barbara Wharton of Appleton City, Mo., and Claudine and Danny Stuber of Vidor.

TYLER COUNTY — With all five Tyler County school systems set to resume classes for the new year in mid-August, most districts are asking that new students come in early to register.

Registration of students new to both the Woodville and Colmesnell school districts are being asked to sign up for classes on Aug. 2-6.

Colmesnell ISD
The Colmesnell schools will be the first to begin the new year when students begin reporting for the 1993-94 year on Thursday, Aug. 12.

Students new to the district are asked to bring a birth certificate, an immunization record, and previous school records if available. Registration of students in kindergarten through sixth grade will be in the elementary school while those in the seventh through 12th grades will sign up in the high school.

Woodville ISD
Woodville schools, which previously had announced an Aug. 16 start date, are now set to begin classes on Friday, Aug. 13.

Students new to the district are asked to bring previous school records if available, current immunization records, birth certificate, proof of residency and a social security number. Parents or guardians should be present with the student to complete the registration process.

Those entering kindergarten through second grade should register at Wheat

Elementary School, students beginning grades three through five should register at the Woodville Intermediate School while those entering the sixth through seventh grades should register at the Woodville Junior High school during school hours anytime between Aug. 2-6.

New students entering Woodville High School should sign up between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. at the high school.

Students previously enrolled at WHS will be issued their class schedules at the following times:

FRESHMEN: An orientation session to familiarize all members with the school will be held in the WHS Library on Tuesday, Aug. 3, and Wednesday, Aug. 4. Orientation sessions on Aug. 3 will include one from 10 a.m. to noon for all students whose last names begin with the letters A-C, while a 1-3 p.m. session will be held for those whose names begin with D-K. On Aug. 4, a 10 a.m. to noon session is scheduled for those whose last names begin with L-P while a 1-3 p.m. orientation will be held for those whose names begin with R-Z.

SENIORS: Woodville seniors will receive their class schedules between 5:30-6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 3 in the WHS library.

JUNIORS: Members of the Incoming WHS junior class will receive class schedules from 5:30-6:30 p.m.

Three men injured in weekend mishaps

WOODVILLE — Three men were treated at Tyler County Hospital in Woodville over the weekend after sustaining injuries in two separate one-car traffic mishaps.

Patrick Parker, 26, of Woodville was admitted to the hospital Saturday for observation while Gregory Jefferson, 26, of Corrigan and David Wayne Laughlin, 27, of Warren were treated and released, according to a hospital spokesperson. All three were transported to the hospital by Eastex EMS Ambulance.

The first mishap occurred about 10:30 p.m. Saturday, July 17, on U.S. Highway 287 about seven miles north of Woodville. According to a report filed by Trooper Richard C. Brown, a 1968 Chevrolet Belair driven by Jefferson was traveling north when it ran off the left side of the road into a ditch.

The vehicle traveled about 300 feet in the ditch before hitting a culvert. Upon impact, Brown said the vehicle "went airborne" for 100 feet and came to rest in the ditch.

Parker was a front seat passenger in the vehicle.

Jefferson was charged with driving while intoxicated.

The second accident happened at about 5:25 p.m. Sunday on U.S. Highway 69 in Warren, about 3 miles south of the FM 1943 intersection.

According to Department of Public Safety reports, a 1985 Chevrolet Cavalier driven by Laughlin was traveling north at a high rate of speed when it failed to negotiate a curve to the left at the Warren overpass. The car reportedly left the east side of the roadway, swung back onto the highway and spun around 180 degrees.

During the spin, the car crossed the road and the front-right portion of the vehicle struck a bridge railing on the west side of the highway. After hitting the railing, the car bounced off and continued its spin, hitting the railing a second time on the back-right portion of the vehicle.

Laughlin was charged with driving while intoxicated.

The administrator of the Woodville center is William Foster, who said, "The community has really been great to us and made us feel at home. A real cross section of Tyler County was

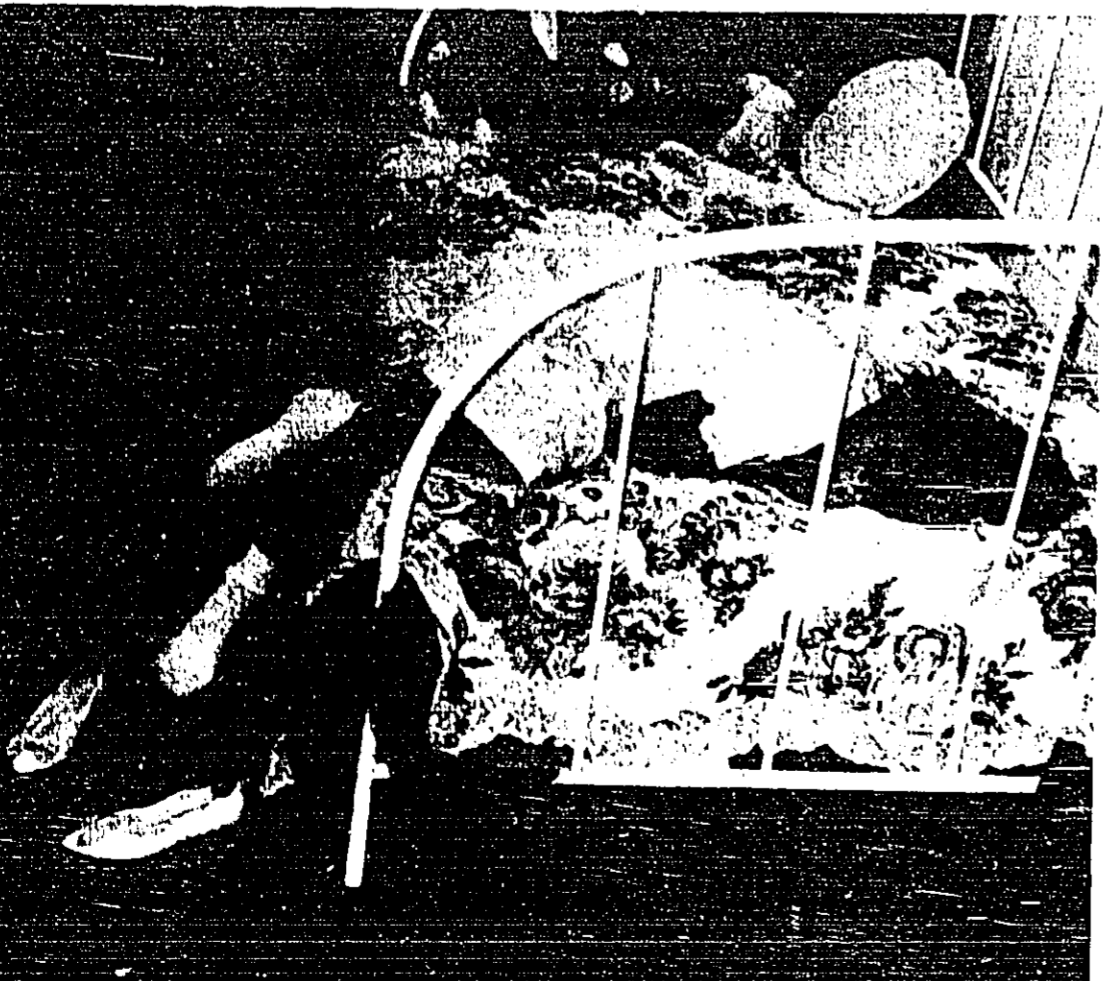

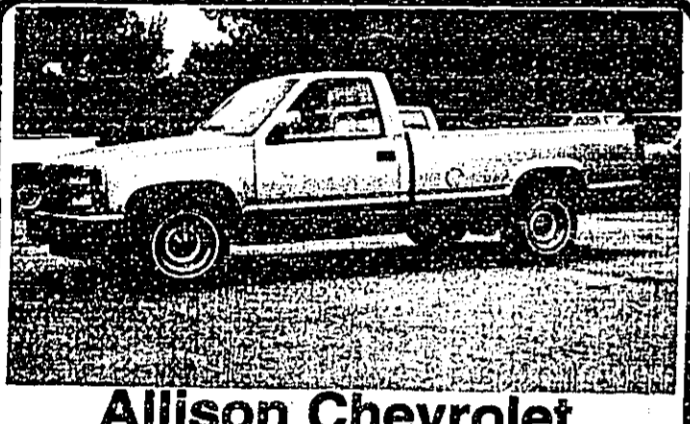
