Summer Fun Swim time is fun

For much of the summer I teach swimming lessons to kids, young and "old" (sometimes teach adults). I am always amazed at how much folks can and will learn, even if a terribly afraid, when they are interested in and determined to master what they are doing.

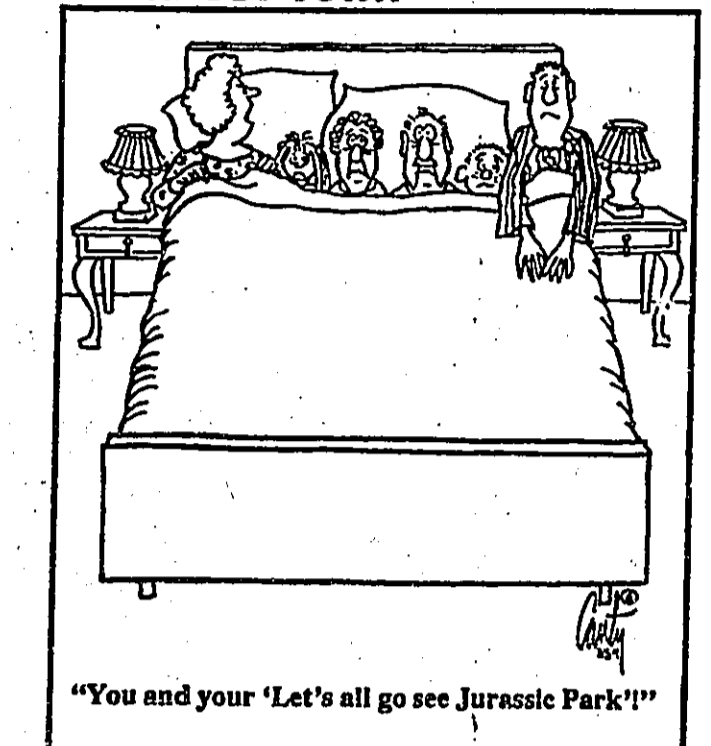
Some kids come so scared of water I think we will never get past "Bubble-Blowing 101!" However, their determination and sheer bravery astounds me over and over. I have seen beginners, so scared they shake, try again and again to put their mouth, then their nose then their whole face and finally their entire head under water. That's BRAVE, folks!

The look on each face when they come up from the first "real" dunking is always a mixture of surprise, joy, and immense self-confidence. They have, after all, challenged themselves and been successful. I always wonder why children have such a hard time with water. It's not that they are afraid of water. They are afraid of the unknown. They are afraid of the "what ifs" that are always present in a new activity. They are afraid of the "what ifs" that are always present in a new activity.

A basic water safety skill is to NEVER LEAVE A CHILD UNATTENDED NEAR OR IN WATER. EVEN FOR A SECOND. It doesn't take a lot of water to be dangerous. Toddlers can fall head-first over the edge of a small pool, they DO tussle every day, and they DO lose their balance, so KEEP YOUR EYES ON THE KIDS and teach your child not to swim without an adult.

Use bath time to get kids to blow bubbles in the water, even if their hair gets wet. From the very first bath, scoop water in your hands and use it to rinse kids. I think when we write washcloths dry and gingerly dab about their faces we send the message that water isn't wet! Use enough water for kids to experience floating. Toddlers can actually float on their backs in a normal bathtub! The object is to keep kids in enough water on a regular basis (they DO tussle every day) that fear of water isn't taught nor developed. Get and maintain a small pool for your yard. We have had the same pool for 16 years now. It really is a 6 ft. metal stock tank from the feed store but the young kids around our house thought it was enormous!

The next time you are sitting around the dinner table, look at your family and home, and think about how easy it might have been, at some point, to lose it all, and end up wandering the woods or streets, alone and without comfort. Most of Austin's homeless have nothing to look forward to. They lead a life of constant struggle on the park lawns, in dark alleys, or under street lamps, hoping someday the world will change.

Maybe someone will give these people another chance; it'll give them a job, a home, help them solve their problems and their lives. Lord, let it be soon.

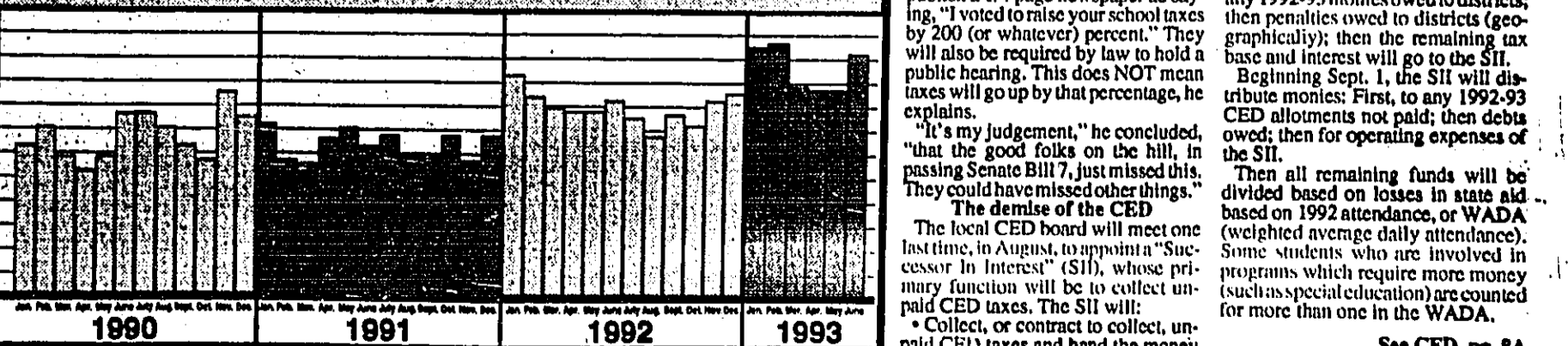

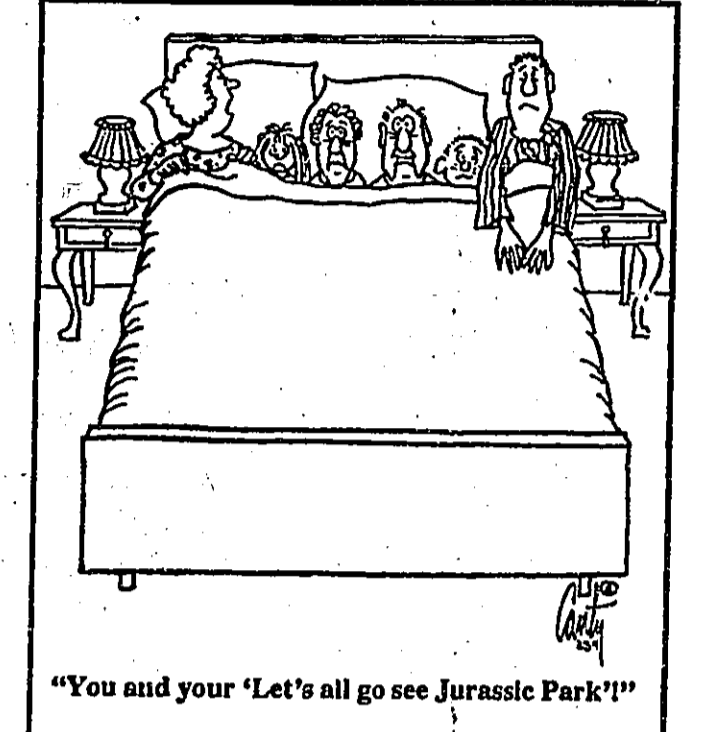
