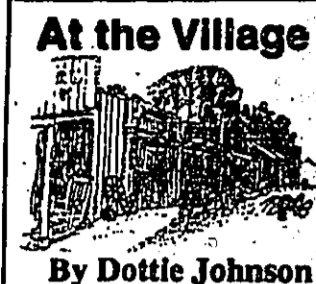

Tennis coaching legend ends 24-year career at Woodville

WOODVILLE — After 24 years of service, backhands, and volleys, Sergio Ramos is hanging up his racket.

Ramos, who coached Woodville to 23 district tennis titles, next week joins the Region V Educational Service Center in Beaumont where he will work as an educational specialist.

"I'm going to miss the kids," admits Ramos, "but I've been thinking about a move for the last five years."

Officially the Woodville coach terminated his duties at the local school system earlier this summer after Region V offered him the head of the Valley Baptist Academy in Hartsville where he graduated, and had several meetings with Lamar University's athletic department.

Ramos says that his background in Spanish is a door opener, especially with Texas' emphasis on bilingual education.

Social Security benefits available for divorcees

LUFKIN — Social Security benefits for divorcees have been around for a good many years. At one time, the duration-of-marriage of 20 years was required and a man to receive benefits in his ex-wife, had to have been supported by her during a specific period of time.

However, support was not required for a woman to receive on an ex-husband. Congress reduced the duration of marriage to 10 years and the Federal court declared the support requirement for ex-husbands to be sex discrimination - so this law was in effect abolished.

A divorcee is entitled to the same benefits he/she would be entitled to as a spouse or widow (er) if the marriage lasted at least 10 years. This is true even if the worker, on whose record the benefit will be paid, remarries. But if the divorcee remarries, he/she may lose the right to Social Security on the former spouse.

Usually a divorcee can receive benefits only when the ex-spouse becomes entitled to disability benefits or dies and the divorcee is unmarried; at age 62 if the worker is living, age 60 if the worker is deceased, age 50 if disabled; not entitled to a higher Social Security benefit on his/her own work; and was married at least 10 years.

However, there is a special rule, not found with other types of benefits, that allows the divorcee to receive retirement benefits if the ex-spouse's record even if the ex-spouse is not receiving benefits. The ex-spouse, however, must meet all requirements for retirement benefits except the filing of a claim. In other words, the ex-spouse could actually receive payment were they to file. In addition, in most situations the divorce must have occurred at least two years before entitlement of divorced men have the same rules for entitlement as women, far fewer men receive benefits on ex-wives than ex-wives on prior husbands. New treatment helps combat vision disorder

HOUSTON — A new treatment speeds recovery from optic neuritis, a vision disorder common among multiple sclerosis (MS) patients.

Researchers discovered that the standard treatment, low-dose steroid pills, did not help, said Dr. Loren Rolak, associate professor of clinical neurology at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

The new treatment, high-dose intravenous (IV) steroids, helps patients recover vision faster and is received in brief doses for three to seven days.

"Optic neuritis is an inflammation of the optic nerve that can strike anyone; however, about one-third of its victims also have MS," Rolak said. "People usually experience central vision loss causing them to 'see the doughnut' but not the hole."

Vision problems can range from fuzzy or blurry vision to complete loss of vision. The video, which is placed behind the eye and the feeling that there is a foreign object in the eye or grease over the eye.

With the IV steroid treatment, vision often improves within a few weeks, and there is a low chance of repeat attacks. The success rate is nearly 95 percent.

The high-dose steroids reduce inflammation and speed healing of the optic nerve and can enhance the nerve's ability to transmit impulses.

The high-dose steroids have few side effects and are not those taken illegally to build muscle," Rolak said. Last year, a study comparing the standard low-dose pill with the high-dose IV was completed.

"With the pills, recovery to 20/20 or 20/40 vision often took six months to a year, and patients had an increased number of recurrences," said Rolak, whose patients participated in a 15-center treatment study.

Patients receiving no treatment recovered at the same rate as the patients receiving pills.

The high-dose steroid treatment can be received in the hospital or at a clinic out-patient.

AC offering correctional officer training program

The program will be held at the Hazlewood campus. All application forms must be completed and returned to the Community Services office of the college by September 22. All persons who return program applications must report at 8:30 a.m., October 8 in the Student Center Gymnasium. TDCJ personnel will be present to conduct height and weight checks and to give a pre-employment test. Program applicants must pass both the height and weight check and the test to continue in the program.

The TDCJ personnel will also schedule program applicants to return to the college October 21 or 22 at an appointed time and place for a personal interview. After the personal interview, the TDCJ will begin to conduct background checks and employment verification checks. The TDCJ will send the college a final list of all persons eligible to enroll in the training program by October 29.

Ultraviolet light may affect eye cells

HOUSTON — The sun's ultraviolet (UV) light causes skin damage, but it may also be linked to age-related eye disorders, say researchers at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

"Understanding how ultraviolet light affects cells in the eye may help doctors treat disorders such as cataracts and macular degeneration, two major causes of vision loss that can be age-related," said Dr. Laurence Rapp, assistant professor of ophthalmology at Baylor.

Rapp is measuring the effects of UV-A light in the eyes of rats. Cells in the retina of the eye are examined to evaluate damage and to determine the influence of that light on the aging process.

Rapp says his research may also answer some questions about one of the mechanisms which may be involved in aging called oxidation.

When oxidation occurs, cells lose the ability to break down matter which leads to a buildup of material known as "debris."

"The debris buildup caused by oxidation may cause several age-related problems in the eye such as detachment of the retina, hemorrhaging and cell death," said Rapp.

Jury returns \$830,000 judgement - Case labeled as 'landmark' ruling on workers comp

WOODVILLE — In what local attorneys hailed as a landmark case, a Tyler County jury last week awarded over \$830,000 in damages to Texas Health Enterprises, a company which operates about 100 Texas nursing homes including Holiday Pines Manor in Woodville.

Woodville attorneys Lindsey Whitehead and Robert Wood, who represented the nine LVEs and nurses aides in the case, said last week's verdict was important because it upheld employees' right to seek injury claims under state workers' compensation law.

Originally filed in September 1991 by two Tyler County residents, Teresita Belen Kirkgard and Thelma Jean Rogers, the lawsuit charged the company with firing the two women because they refused to sign a waiver giving up their right to sue.

The jury verdict was unanimous in awarding the damages and well as in finding that Texas Health Enterprises acted fully or maliciously causing emotional distress to the nine fired employees.

"This is a new concept for the attorney general in putting an office like this in our county," Owens said. "The fact that we're getting this regional office in our county is something we should be proud of. An office like this normally would go to bigger cities."

County to number roads

WOODVILLE — Although Tyler County commissioners agreed to begin assigning numbers to all county roads last week, they remained lukewarm to plans to assign house numbers to every rural residence.

Darius Gooden, county clerk, said the commissioners approved a plan to assign roads in Precinct 1 with numbers in the 100s, in Precinct 2 with numbers in the 200s, in Precinct 3 with numbers in the 300s and Precinct 4 with numbers in the 400s.

Precinct 1 Mayor Jerry Mahan said that by using numbers instead of names, the county would save money on the road signs. He has noted that signs with names are the frequent target of thieves while those with numbers tend to remain in place much longer.

Although it is generally agreed to the plan, Precinct 3 Commissioner Jerry Mahan had a suggested postponing the numbering project until after the county roads are in the precinct lines.

"In that way, at least the numbers will accurately reflect what precinct the roads are in for a few years," Mahan said, noting that after each redistricting effort, the precinct lines will be changed and that roads formerly in the 100s, in Precinct 3 and numbered in the 300s may end up in Precinct 2 or vice versa.

While Jerry said about every other East Texas county has completed their redistricting work, he noted that after each redrawing Tyler County precinct lines has yet to begin. Under federal law, local state and federal election boards while those with numbers tend to remain in place much longer.

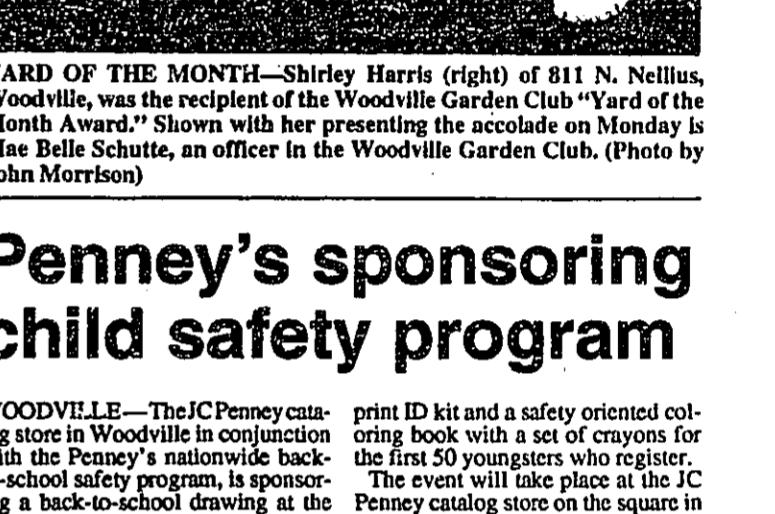

Tennis coaching legend ends 24-year career at Woodville

WOODVILLE — After 24 years of service, backhands, and volleys, Sergio Ramos is hanging up his racket.

Ramos, who coached Woodville to 24 consecutive state tennis titles, is retiring from the Region V Educational Service Center in Beaumont where he will work as an educational specialist.

"I'm going to miss the kids," admits Ramos, "but I've been thinking about a move for the last five years."

Officially, Ramos' coaching career terminated his duties at the local school system earlier this summer after Region V offered him a job that is loaded with challenges and benefits.

"Right now I'm in the social studies curriculum," says Ramos, "but within the next few years the Texas Education Association will place a stronger emphasis on foreign language and athletics. And that is my strong suit."

Before the Region V position was offered, Stephen P. Austin University had talked with him about taking over the varsity tennis program. It didn't pan out because Ramos would have had to take a salary cut to coach there.

He was also considered for the head of Valley Baptist Academy in Harlingen where he graduated, and had several meetings with Lamar University.

Ramos says that his background in Spanish is a door opener, especially with Texas' emphasis on migrant education.

"There are all types of possibilities with bilingual education," Ramos points out.

But while opening the door to other opportunities, Ramos closes the door on 24 years of coaching high school tennis at Woodville along with 26 years of coaching Spanish.

"It was a tough decision, especially with Stephen (his son) still playing high school tennis and kicking for the football team," admits Ramos. "But my age is catching me. I have had knee surgery and some muscle problems in my chest."

The Woodville coach says that he is considering teaching tennis on weekends, something that he was unable to do during the school year as long as he was a high school coach.

Ramos is known throughout the country for his contribution to high school athletics. He was awarded the U.S. Tennis Association's Lloyd Sesson Educational Merit Award in 1989 at Dallas. The award is given to a tennis teaching professional who contributes greatest to the tennis youth of the country.

He was also named the 3A Texas High School Tennis Coach of the Year in 1989, presented by the Texas Tennis Association.

"I'd do it the way again," Ramos says.

Social Security benefits available for divorcees

LUFKIN — Social Security benefits for divorcees have been around for a good many years. At one time, a duration of marriage of 20 years was required and a man, to receive benefits on his ex-wife, had to have been supported by her during a specific period of time.

However, support was not required for a woman to receive on an ex-husband. Congress reduced the duration of marriage to 10 years and the Federal court declared the support requirement for ex-husbands to be sex discrimination - so this law was in effect abolished.

A divorcee is entitled to the same benefits her ex-husband would be entitled to as a spouse or widow if the marriage lasted at least 10 years. This is true even if the worker on whose record the divorcee will be paid, remarries. But if the divorcee remarries, she may lose the right to Social Security on the former spouse.

Usually a divorcee can receive benefits only when the ex-spouse becomes entitled to disability benefits or dies and the divorcee is unmarried; at least age 62 if the worker is living, age 60 if the worker is deceased, age 50 if disabled; not entitled to a higher Social Security benefit on his/her own work; and was married at least 10 years.

However, there is a special rule, not found with other types of benefits, that allows the divorcee to receive payments at age 62 on the ex-spouse's record even if the ex-spouse is not receiving benefits. The ex-spouse, however, must meet all requirements for retirement benefits except the filing of a claim. In other words, the ex-spouse could actually receive payment were they to file. In addition, in most situations the divorce must have occurred at least two years before entitlement.

Though divorced men have the same rules for entitlement as women, far fewer men receive benefits on ex-wives on prior husbands. This is because most men have higher Social Security earnings and will qualify for more benefits on their own work record.

New treatment helps combat vision disorder

HOUSTON — A new treatment speeds recovery from optic neuritis, a vision disorder common among multiple sclerosis (MS) patients.

Researchers discovered that the standard treatment, low-dose steroid pills, did not help, said Dr. Loren Rolak, associate professor of clinical neurology at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

The new treatment, high-dose intravenous (IV) steroids, helps patients recover vision faster and is received in brief doses for three to seven days.

"Optic neuritis is an inflammation of the optic nerve that can strike anyone; however, about one-third of its victims also have MS," Rolak said. "People usually experience central vision loss causing them to 'see the doughnut but not the hole' in the doughnut but not the hole in the doughnut. Vision problems can range from blurry or blurry vision to complete loss of sight. Patients often experience pain behind the eye and the feeling that there is a foreign object in the eye or grease over the eye."

The high-dose steroids have few side effects and are not those taken illegally to build muscle," Rolak said. "Last year, a study comparing the standard low-dose steroid with the high-dose IV was completed. "With the pills, recovery to 20/20 or 20/40 vision often took six months to a year, and patients had an increased number of recurrences," said Rolak, whose patients participated in a 15-center treatment study.

Patients receiving no treatment received the same rate as the patients receiving pills.

The high-dose steroid treatment can be received in the hospital or as a clinic out-patient.

Education's value subject of video

AUSTIN — One out of every fourteen in the United States is a high school dropout. In Texas, the number is one in three. This sobering statistic is the subject of a new public-service video produced by the Texas Young Lawyers Association.

The video, aimed at an adolescent audience, provides a stark view of the shattered lives of five young convicts, all of whom are high school dropouts. The documentary-style video was filmed in the bleak surroundings of the maximum security prison in Huntsville.

"I never thought the police could catch me," says a baby-faced, 20-year-old convict, his face wrought with tension as he fights to hold back the tears welling up in his eyes. "That don't happen to somebody like me. That don't happen to someone who's got it made, someone who's going to college."

The video will be available on a free-lan basis through the Public Information Department of the State Bar of Texas at (512) 463-1520.

AC offering correctional officer training program

LUFKIN — The Community Services Division of Angellina College will offer a correctional officer pre-employment training program on the AC campus.

This 145-hour program will provide the required training for entry into the Texas Department of Criminal Justice pool from which correctional officers are hired for units throughout the State of Texas. While completion of the program does not guarantee employment, approximately 97 percent of persons completing a college correctional officer program are hired within three to six months of completion.

Basic criteria of eligibility to apply to enter the training program are:

- Person must be a U.S. citizen.
- Person must be at least 18 years old.
- Person must have no outstanding warrant for arrest.
- Person must have no pending criminal charges or be serving probation.
- Person must be able to pass a physical examination.
- Person must have a high school diploma or state issued GED.
- Person must not be on active duty in the military.
- Person must have no Class A misdemeanor convictions within the previous six months, no DWI or DUI within the last two years, and no completion of sentence for felony convictions within the last 15 years.
- Person must pass the height/weight and the test to continue in the program.

The TDCJ personnel will also schedule program applicants to return to the college October 21 or 22 at an appointed time and place for a personal interview. After the personal interview, the TDCJ will begin to conduct background checks, and employment reference checks. The TDCJ will send the college a final list of all persons eligible to enroll in the training program by October 29.

Those persons whose names appear on the final list from TDCJ will register and pay fees in the Community Services office of Angellina College in room 111 of the Administration Building between 8 a.m. - 7 p.m., November 1, 2, or 3. The cost of the course will be \$225. A textbook will also be required and will cost about \$12.

The training class will meet 6-10 p.m. Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and 8 a.m. - 2 p.m. Saturday, starting November 3 for six weeks until December 1. For more information, call 409/633-5206.

Ultraviolet light may affect eye cells

HOUSTON — The sun's ultraviolet (UV) light causes skin damage, but it may also be linked to age-related eye disorders, say researchers at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

"Understanding how ultraviolet light ages cells in the eye may help doctors treat disorders such as cataracts and macular degeneration, two major visual disorders that can be age-related," said Dr. Laurence Rapp, assistant professor of ophthalmology at Baylor.

Rapp is measuring the effects of UV. A light in the eyes of rats. Cells in the retina of the eye are examined to evaluate damage and to determine the influence of UV on the aging process.

Rapp says this research may also answer some questions about one of the mechanisms which may be involved in aging called oxidation.

When oxidation occurs, cells lose the ability to break down matter which leads to a buildup of material known as "debris."

"The debris buildup caused by oxidation may cause several age-related problems in the eye such as detachment of the retina, hemorrhaging and cell death," said Rapp.
