PUBLIC NOTICE BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS SPECIAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 2, 1993

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT Senate Joint Resolution 9 proposes a constitutional amendment that would authorize the Texas Legislature to provide for the issuance of bonds for the state financing of start-up costs for historically underutilized businesses.

PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT House Joint Resolution 86 proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature, by general law, to exempt from ad valorem taxation all or part of real and personal property used, constructed, acquired, or installed wholly or partly to meet or exceed rules or regulations adopted by any environmental protection agency of the United States.

PROPOSITION NO. 3 ON THE BALLOT House Joint Resolution 3 proposes a constitutional amendment to clear land titles in which the State of Texas relinquishes and releases any claim of sovereign ownership or title to an undivided one-third interest in and to the lands and minerals within the Shelby, Frazier, and McCormick Leases (now located in Fort Bend and Austin counties) arising out of the interest in the lands originally granted under the Mexican Colonization Law of 1825 to John McCormick or his heirs.

PROPOSITION NO. 4 ON THE BALLOT Senate Joint Resolution 41 proposes a constitutional amendment that would prohibit a state personal income tax without voter approval and would dedicate the proceeds of any income tax, if enacted, to property tax relief and education.

PROPOSITION NO. 5 ON THE BALLOT House Joint Resolution 57 proposes a constitutional amendment that repeals article XII, section 6, of the Texas Constitution, which currently provides that no corporation shall issue stock or bonds except for money paid, labor done, property actually received, and that all fictitious increase of stock or indebtedness shall be void.

PROPOSITION NO. 6 ON THE BALLOT House Joint Resolution 21 proposes a constitutional amendment that would abolish the office of county surveyor in Jackson County.

PROPOSITION NO. 7 ON THE BALLOT House Joint Resolution 57 proposes a constitutional amendment that repeals article XII, section 6, of the Texas Constitution, which currently provides that no corporation shall issue stock or bonds except for money paid, labor done, property actually received, and that all fictitious increase of stock or indebtedness shall be void.

PROPOSITION NO. 8 ON THE BALLOT House Joint Resolution 22 proposes a constitutional amendment that would authorize the county commissioners court of McLennan County to call an election to amend the constitution of that county.

PROPOSITION NO. 9 ON THE BALLOT Senate Joint Resolution 19 proposes an amendment to Article VIII, section 13 of the Texas Constitution that would modify the provisions for the redemption of real property sold at a tax sale.

PROPOSITION NO. 10 ON THE BALLOT Senate Joint Resolution 54 proposes a constitutional amendment that would authorize the legislature to prescribe the qualifications of sheriffs.

Rural healthcare topic of DETDA meeting

LUFKIN — Rural healthcare in Deep East Texas, a major concern of local governments and medical providers, will be the focus of a Deep East Texas Development Association meeting in Lufkin Friday, Sept. 24. Commissioners kept busy during series of meetings

WOODVILLE — Tyler County commissioners experienced a busy Monday, working their way through four meeting agendas before noon, including a public hearing on a proposed tax increase (see related story this page).

While the tax hearing drew a standing-room only crowd and occupied the commissioners for over an hour, the three other meetings were held in a basically routine manner.

During the last of the sessions, the court authorized the filing of an application for a \$250,000 Texas Commu-

nity Development grant to install water lines and a water tower in the Cypress Creek community located west of Woodville.

Under the grant, if approved, the county would not be required to provide matching funds or in-kind services for the project.

In other action, the commissioners received the annual independent audit report from the accounting firm of Padillo, Brown and Hill.

Representatives of the firm told commissioners their report contained a

"clean opinion" regarding county finances. They also told commissioners that the county record keeping practices were sound and noted that "the citizens can be proud."

During their day of meetings, the commissioners also approved extending the sale of landfill garbage permits through Dec. 31.

The county had planned to stop issuing the landfill permits on Sept. 30 and begin switching trash disposal over to a new county collection center located west of Woodville on the Old Livingstone Road. New federal and state regulations which were set to go into effect in early October have prompted the county to announce plans to shut down the landfill and begin compacting its trash and hauling it to a regional dump site in Polk County.

However, federal regulators are now attempting to postpone the implementation of the new landfill regulations by six months which would allow the county to keep the local dump open through the extension.

"Basically, they have told us it's a done deal and that the extension will be made, but it still has to be published in the federal register," County Judge Jerome Owens said.

Precinct 3 Commissioner Jerry Mahan said that if for some reason the delay in implementing the new landfill regulations is not implemented, the county could still shut down the landfill and collect trash containers at the site or allow commercial haulers to use the landfill until Dec. 31.

In other business, the commissioners tabled action on a proposal by Star Tel Long Distance Telephone Co. of Lufkin.

Pat Young Bordenkircher, a sales representative for the company, told the county that her service could save the county \$2,710 per year, based on what the county paid during recent months.

The commissioners asked the auditor's office to check with other government agencies using the service to verify the claims and to report back at a later date.

Other action:

- Authorized the county to seek bids on the sale of a sheriff's department 1989 Crown Victoria car.
- Renewed the county's contract with the Deep East Texas Mental Health

Mental Retardation services under which they agency picks up half the cost of transporting patients to residential psychiatric facilities.

- Renewed the county's agreement with the attorney general's office regarding child support services.
- Appointed Jerry Mahan to a full term as the county's representative on the Tyler County Appraisal District's board.
- Authorized the county to advertise for bids for office space in Woodville to house the Texas Attorney General's Child Support Enforcement Division office.
- Authorized the county to seek bids on the sale of a sheriff's department 1989 Crown Victoria car.

Public comments

One of the speakers appearing at Monday's meeting, Mike Stacey, brought with him a petition signed by about 700 people opposing both the county and hospital tax increases.

"The people you work for say they don't want a tax increase," Stacey told the commissioners.

The resident of the Colmesneer area of Precinct 3 was more emphatic in his statement Monday regarding the county tax hike, but also showed some criticism regarding the planned hospital increase.

Although he said the county needs the hospital, and indicated some sympathy for its need for higher taxes, he said improved management of the hospital is the key to reducing the need for more tax revenue.

"As far as the hospital goes, I think everyone concerned needs to pick up the dictionary and read what Mr. Webster calls 'indigent,'" he said.

"One board member—and I don't want to call his name—told me he knew of people with bass boats, houses and some who had a little insurance, who just would not pay the rest of their bills."

"I don't mind helping the indigent but I don't feel that these people are really in need. I don't feel that we should be taking care of people who are not in need."

In regard to the FM 92 project, Stacey objected to the county paying for the utilities moved from the existing county road right-of-way.

"The utilities on 92 are not mine. I don't think I should pay to move someone else's utilities," he said, adding that the utility companies and the people who stand to be benefiting from the highway extension should be the ones to pay for the right-of-way and utility relocation.

In response to Stacey's remarks, Hospital Administrator Jim Gaines explained that Webster's definition of "indigent" is not the same one used by state law. Under the state's rules, the hospital is obligated to "deliver services, whether or not we collect for them."

"The taxes we collect in Tyler County would not operate the hospital for one and half months," Gaines explained. "We have a large budget and we pretty well carry our own weight. Only when it comes to meeting the obligations the law requires (in the area of indigent care) do we need help and I'm going to ask the commissioners court to look favorably on our request."

Gaines explained that the hospital needs to acquire new medical equipment, replace air conditions and repair its roof, expenses that could not be met if the hospital has to continue diverting revenue to handle the growing indigent expense of Chester, president of the hospital board, later added that the hospital has been working in the last nine to 10 months to improve its management and cut operating costs.

"One year ago we were \$450,000 in debt," she said. "We now have a new administrator and a new man in the

"I just can't see where we need all these county taxes. People are building new houses and the tax bases is growing all the time," he said.

Another person to speak was Dr. Jim Brown, who was representing local physicians at the meeting.

"I'm here in support of the hospital's 3 cent tax hike," he said, adding that he and other physicians are probably the most conservative people around in terms of paying taxes.

"We reluctantly support this because it is a necessity," he said.

"Tyler County is a good hospital—it's a great hospital—but for a community our size it is what we need," he added. "There have been management changes and we've been doing a lot better in the last 8-9 months. Things are looking up."
