PUBLIC NOTICE BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS SPECIAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 2, 1993

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 9 proposes a constitutional amendment that would authorize the Texas Legislature to provide for the issuance of bonds for the state financing of start-up costs for historically underutilized businesses. The amendment provides that the legislature by law may establish a Texas historically underutilized business capital growth and development fund. The money in the fund may be used without further appropriation for the start-up costs of a business or for the start-up costs of a historically underutilized business, as defined by the legislature. To carry out the program, the legislature may issue up to \$50 million of general obligation bonds to provide for the start-up costs of the program. The bonds may be issued for the purpose of financing the start-up costs of the program. The bonds may be issued for the purpose of financing the start-up costs of the program.

PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT
House Joint Resolution 86 proposes a constitutional amendment that would authorize the legislature, by general law, to exempt from ad valorem taxation all or part of real and personal property used, constructed, acquired, or installed wholly or partly to meet or exceed rules or regulations of the Texas Department of Transportation agency of the United States, Texas, or a political subdivision of this state for the prevention, monitoring, control, or reduction of air, water, or land pollution. The amendment applies to real property used for the first time on or after January 1, 1994. The amendment also provides that the maximum rate for a school district may not exceed 25 percent of the total value of the property subject to the tax. The legislature may amend or repeal the amendment.

PROPOSITION NO. 3 ON THE BALLOT
House Joint Resolution 3 proposes a constitutional amendment to clear land titles in which the State of Texas relinquishes and releases any claim of ownership or title to an unperfected interest in land. The amendment applies to interests in land that were acquired by the State of Texas before January 1, 1994. The amendment also provides that the maximum rate for a school district may not exceed 25 percent of the total value of the property subject to the tax. The legislature may amend or repeal the amendment.

PROPOSITION NO. 4 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 49 proposes a constitutional amendment that would prohibit a state personal income tax without voter approval and would dedicate the proceeds of any income tax, if enacted, to property tax relief and education. The amendment provides that the legislature by law may establish a Texas historically underutilized business capital growth and development fund. The money in the fund may be used without further appropriation for the start-up costs of a business or for the start-up costs of a historically underutilized business, as defined by the legislature. To carry out the program, the legislature may issue up to \$50 million of general obligation bonds to provide for the start-up costs of the program. The bonds may be issued for the purpose of financing the start-up costs of the program.

PROPOSITION NO. 5 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 16 proposes a constitutional amendment that would authorize the legislature to prescribe the qualifications of sheriffs. Currently, the constitution authorizes the legislature to prescribe the duties, penalties, and terms of office, but not the qualifications for the office of sheriff. The proposed amendment would allow the legislature to prescribe the qualifications of sheriffs.

House Joint Resolution 57 proposes a constitutional amendment that repeals article VII, section 6, of the Texas Constitution, which currently provides that no corporation shall issue stock or bonds or other securities for the purpose of raising money to pay for the construction, reconstruction, or improvement of a public building or other public structure. The amendment provides that the legislature may issue bonds for the purpose of financing the start-up costs of a business or for the start-up costs of a historically underutilized business, as defined by the legislature. To carry out the program, the legislature may issue up to \$50 million of general obligation bonds to provide for the start-up costs of the program.

House Joint Resolution 22 proposes a constitutional amendment that would authorize the legislature to prescribe the qualifications of sheriffs. County, hospital tax hikes win final approval

WOODVILLE — After hearing from about 19 people regarding the merits of proposed 3 cent increases in both the county and the hospital tax, commissioners voted Friday to approve both measures.
The county's 1993 tax rate now stands at 56 cents per \$100 assessed valuation — up from last year's 53 cents — while the Tyler County Hospital's tax rate is now 9.5 cents — up from the 1992 level of 6.5 cents.
During the special meeting Friday, the increases passed without opposition, although Precinct 4 Commissioner Henry Earl Sawyer was absent and unable to vote. Sawyer, who underwent back surgery earlier this month, previously was the only member of the board to vote "no" when both the county and hospital tax increases were formally proposed by the commissioners on Aug. 30.
Sawyer also was unable to attend the Sept. 13 public hearing at which the hospital tax increase received strong public support while the county hike won mixed reviews with speakers almost equally divided over the need for the higher rate.
Under the plan adopted, the 3 cent county tax increase will be allocated entirely to the road and bridge funds, although \$60,000 of the expected \$132,000 to be generated by the increase would eventually be transferred into the county's right-of-way fund.
The fund currently contains about \$67,000 and this amount, coupled with the \$60,000 to be added next year, is expected to be used for the FM 92 extension project now being planned by the Texas Department of Transportation. That \$7 million project, which would extend FM 92 north from Dan center to R 255, is now in the survey stage.
Highway officials have indicated that they will provide the county with the list of needed projects in December. Under Texas law, the county is required for acquiring the right-of-way for the road as well as for handling utility matters, in whose territory along the existing county right-of-way, Precinct 3 Commissioner James noted that the extension of the project will be built, has indicated that while most of the right-of-way that being donated by the landowners in the area, the cost of moving telephone, electric and water lines may total \$100,000.
In other business during the Friday meeting, the commissioners tabled for additional study a request from County Extension Agency Jerry James to purchase or lease a new copy machine for the extension office.

included: Timberline Constructors of Lufkin, with a bid of \$2,910,000; Lincoln Builders of Seavenport, La., with a bid of \$2,326,980.
The \$2,257,000 bid from Weathers, less several alternatives, still came in approximately \$300,000 over the amount currently available for the amount currently available for the project.
"The Woodville Housing Authority is not permitted to negotiate bids," Poik said at the meeting. "But, we are allowed to seek HUD for the additional funding." The Housing Authority began with only \$1,886,903 budgeted for construction this year.
According to Poik, the Woodville Housing Authority, which oversees

54 units now, has been waiting patiently for several years to get this project underway.
The letter, which the Woodville executive director brought to Houston Friday, outlines the various delays in the project development to date including:
-delays due to having to pick three sites which was not practical for such a small community;
-delays due to environmental concerns. Considerable time was expended proving that wetlands did not exist on the proposed site;
-poor soil conditions on the approved site were not known at the time the site was purchased;

Accident claims teen's life

WARREN — A 17-year-old Big Sandy High School senior announced death near Warren Friday night after being thrown head first into a ditch during a four-wheeler accident.
Karen Elaine Vincent of Livingston was pronounced dead at the scene of the mishap after suffering a crushed skull. The mishap occurred about 7:35 p.m. Friday on Burnstead Cemetery Road, 3.7 miles south of Warren.
The cause of the death is under investigation by the Texas Department of Public Safety accident report filed by Trooper Richard C. Brown. Vincent was driving a Honda Fourtrax 250 north on Burnstead Cemetery Road when the four-wheeler ran off the road.

After traveling about 90 feet down the road's shoulder, the vehicle struck a tree and Vincent was thrown forward, head first into a second tree. Funeral services for Vincent were held Monday, Sept. 20, from the Peace Funeral Home Chapel in Livingston with burial in the Holly Grove Cemetery near the Polk County community of Segoe.





Big Thicket National Preserve to recover search and rescue costs

BEAUMONT—Big Thicket National Preserve Superintendent Ronald Switzer will begin a program to recover costs associated with search and rescue efforts of those intentionally engaged in high risk recreation activities in the Preserve.

"This program follows directly from the Preserve's commitment to provide the expected basic level of public safety that every visitor deserves. Yet, we recognize that those involved in high risk activities create a drain on scarce dollars throughout the park and that they must assume the responsibility and cost for search and rescue," Switzer said.

Already in place is a program designed to recover costs related to any search and rescue efforts required by hunters during the popular hunting season in the preserve.

"Our costs for search and rescue efforts have been small thus far. The costs are related to hiking and boating incidents. As visitation to the Preserve grows we will see growth in rescue costs as well," Switzer said.

The trial program was recently introduced by Roger Kennedy, director of the National Park Service, Washington, D.C. Kennedy cited examples of the cost involved with search and rescue efforts. The cost of rescue efforts can be staggering. As an example, in mountaineering activities, Alaska's Denali National Park, 23 rescue missions in 1992 at a cost of more than \$3,000,000.

McKinley cost the park service \$206,000. Military flight training missions diverted to assist the park brought the cost to over \$430,000.

A single four day search cost an estimated \$150,000 in Yosemite National Park, California.

"The Park Service conducted 4,300 search and rescue missions in 1992 at a cost of more than \$3,000,000.

Drug, alcohol use down among elementary students

AUSTIN—Forty-six percent of Texas sixth graders have drunk alcohol at least once, with 22 percent stating that alcohol is very easy to get, according to a survey recently released by the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse which measures alcohol and other drug use among fourth through sixth graders.

A total of 34,025 Texas public school students in grades four through six were randomly selected from school districts throughout the state. The students were asked questions concerning their use of tobacco, alcohol, inhalants and marijuana.

While the survey shows a general decrease in drug and alcohol use among fourth through sixth graders between 1990 and 1992, the use of tobacco and inhalants remained about the same. Lifetime use of alcohol showed the most significant decreases: 33 percent of elementary students in 1992 admitted drinking alcohol, compared to 42 percent in 1990.

"These results parallel the decreases

we are seeing in the secondary school population, indicating that use of these substances is down across all grades," said Bob Dickson, Executive Director of TCADA. "While we are pleased that prevention efforts are having a positive effect on our youth, we are certainly not going to back down on these efforts, particularly in the elementary grades."

What happens in elementary school sets the stage for events in later years. When fewer elementary students use alcohol and tobacco, fewer then go on to use marijuana in secondary school. Similarly, the fewer that use marijuana, the fewer that move on to use other drugs. Therefore, the factors that delay the onset of substance use among elementary students are exceedingly important.

The survey found that, on the average, sixth graders were 10 years old when they first tried alcohol, which is the same average age of first use as tobacco. Students were also asked where they obtained the alcohol they

drank. Students in fourth grade (13 percent) and fifth grade (15 percent) were most likely to indicate that they got alcohol at home. Twenty-two percent of sixth graders indicated that they had obtained alcohol from home, 16 percent from friends, and 17 percent from other sources other than home or friends.

Sixth graders were also asked how many times during the past year they consumed five or more drinks at a time, which is a lot of alcohol for a person 12 years old or younger. Seventeen percent of sixth graders stated that they had drunk five or more beers in a row during the school year; two percent claimed doing so several times per week. In addition, almost 18 percent reported having drunk five or more wine coolers in a row.

The survey also found that more Texas elementary students (19 percent) had used tobacco (cigarettes as well as smokeless tobacco) than any other substance except alcohol. Eleven percent of fourth graders, 18 percent of fifth graders and 27 percent of sixth graders have used tobacco. Twenty percent of fourth graders said cigarettes were very easy to obtain. Only 59 percent of fourth graders and 52 percent of fifth graders believe that it is "very dangerous" to smoke cigarettes

lower than the average for all eight substances, suggesting that fourth and fifth graders may be less fearful of cigarette smoking than using most of the other substances.

Other findings include:

- 3 percent of sixth graders have tried marijuana
- 9 percent of elementary students in 1992 had ever sniffed glue, 7 percent had sniffed gasoline and 6 percent had sniffed correction fluid.
- The most noticeable substance use increase is between fifth and sixth grades, indicating that many students begin experimenting with substances for the first time in sixth grade.

The Texas School Survey is a collaborative effort between the Commission and the Public Policy Research Institute at Texas A&M University.

Diet is vital factor in controlling disease

HOUSTON—Your mother was right when she said, "You are what you eat."

Experts at the DeBakey Heart Center of Baylor College of Medicine and The Methodist Hospital in Houston agree what we eat plays an important role in reducing heart disease risk, controlling high blood pressure, diabetes, and preventing and treating obesity.

For good health does not require large doses of vitamins and minerals or purchasing special foods, according to Lynne Scott, R.D., director of Baylor's Diet Modification Clinic and co-author of "The Living Heart Diet" and "The Living Heart Brand Name Shopping's Guide."

The key to healthy eating, Scott said, is eating a well-balanced diet that includes a variety of foods.

"It is much better to get the vitamins and minerals we know are beneficial from food rather than from supplements," Scott said. "Supplements can cause side effects and consuming too much of some vitamins and minerals can be toxic."

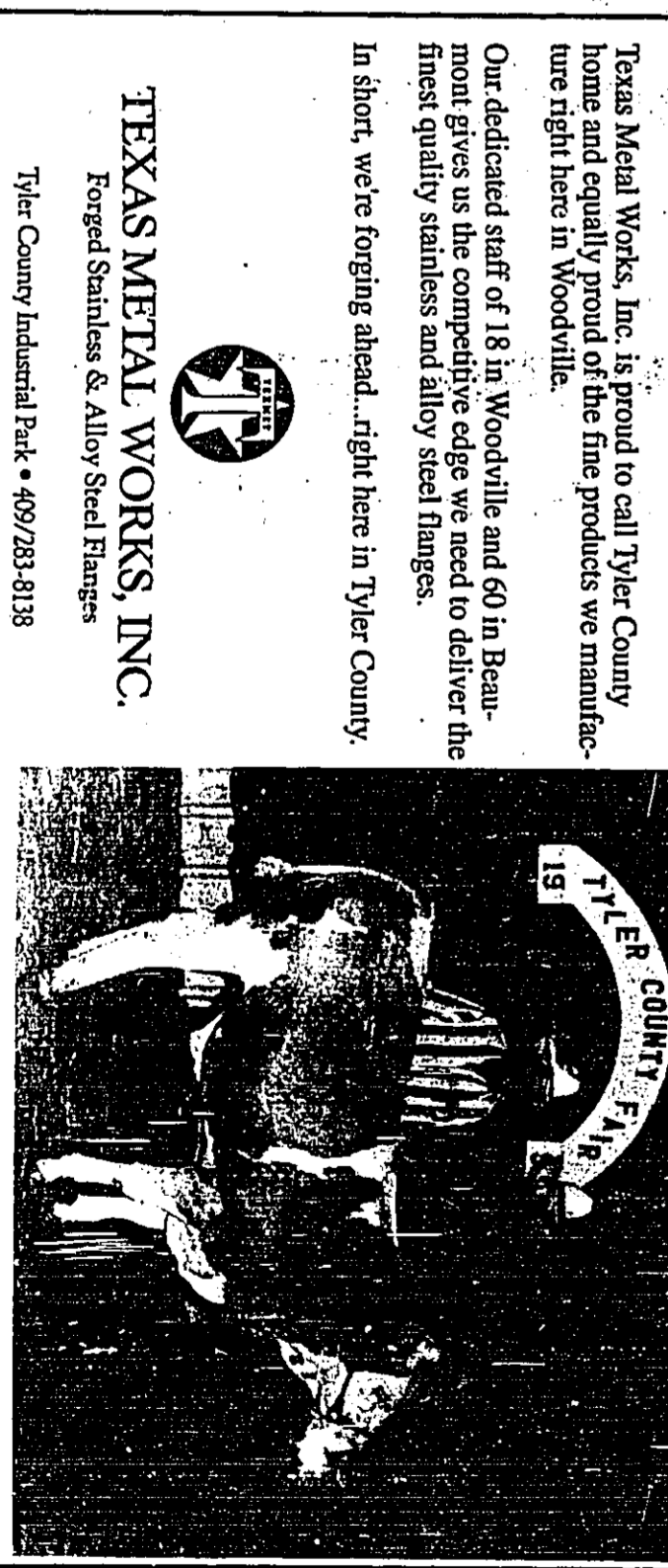

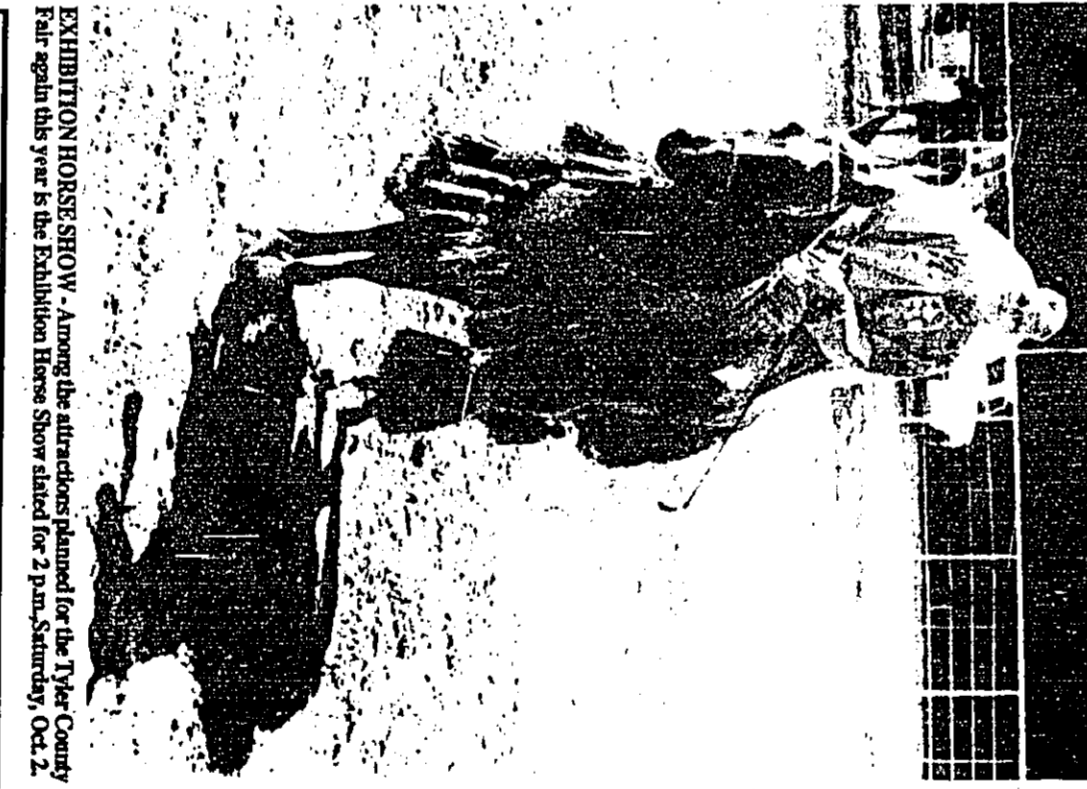

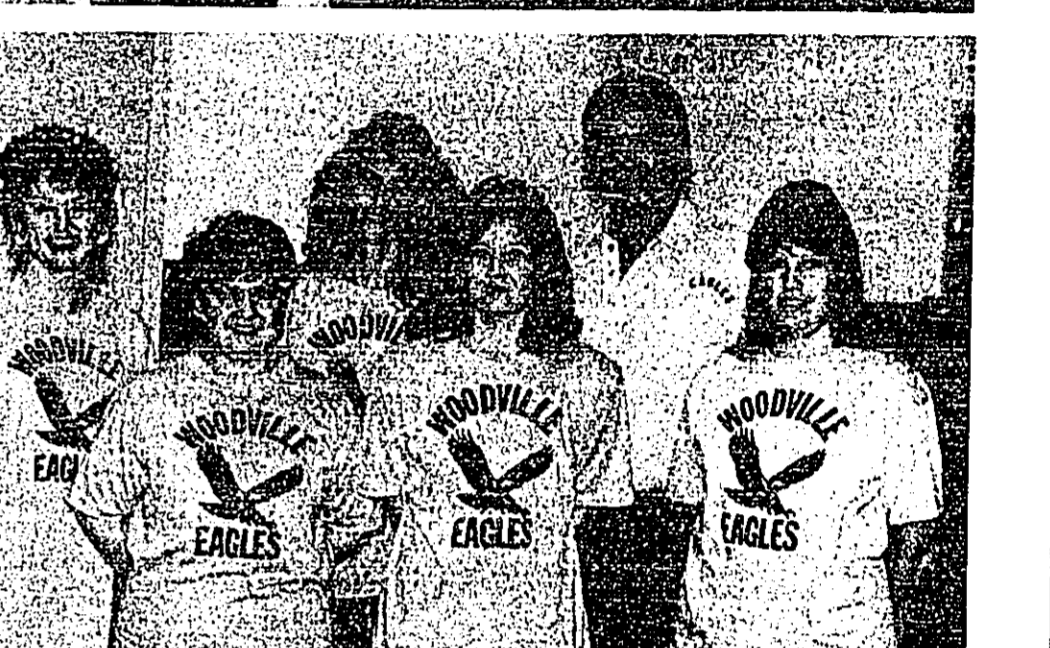

TYLER COUNTY — Woodville and Warren open district play while the Colmesneil Bulldogs host their annual homecoming to highlight week number four in high school football this weekend.

Woodville and head football coach Craig McCallion are still searching for their first win after tying Anahuac, 16-16, in its last non-district game of the season last week.

The Eagles meet up with the Hardin-Jefferson Hawks, a team which lost its first game of the season last week. The Hawks fell to Hampshire-Fannett, 13-

0, after opening the season with a 19-7 win over Lumberton and taking a 32-19 win over Huffman in week two.



Big Thicket National Preserve to recover search and rescue costs

BEAUMONT—Big Thicket National Preserve Superintendent Ronald Switzer will begin a program to recover costs associated with search and rescue efforts of those intentionally engaged in high risk recreation activities in the Preserve.

This program follows directly the Lufkin area. Holcomb said the alternatives not included in this bid resolution were: flagpole, gutters and downspouts; wood fencing; wrought iron fencing; a new power source and construction of a playground area. Left in the bid, however, was necessary landscaping.

Woodville Housing Authority Commissioners include: Willie Jerue, chairman; and McKinley Jackson and Anne Tolbert. The new units will provide 20 three-bedroom units and 10 four-bedroom facilities.

According to Architect Charles R. Holcomb, of The Architectural Group, Inc., of Houston, the additional money being requested by the Woodville authority "are in line with 105 percent of the current prototype cost for the

National Park Service nationwide effort to provide the expected basic level of public safety that every visitor deserves. Yet, we recognize that those involved in high risk activities create a drain on scarce dollars throughout the parks and that they must assume the responsibility and cost for search and rescue," Switzer said. Already in place is a program designed to recover costs related to any search and rescue efforts required by hunters during the popular hunting season in the preserve. "Our costs for search and rescue efforts have been small thus far. The costs are related to hiking and boating incidents. As violation to the Preserve grows we will see growth in rescue costs as well," Switzer said.

The trial program was recently introduced by Roger Kennedy, director of the National Park Service, Washington, D.C. Kennedy cited examples of the cost involved with search and rescue efforts. The cost of rescue efforts can be staggering. As an example, in mountaineering activities, Alaska's Denali National Park, 23 rescue missions in 1992 at a cost of more than \$3,000,000.

Drug, alcohol use down among elementary students

AUSTIN — Forty-six percent of Texas sixth graders have drunk alcohol at least once, with 22 percent stating that alcohol is very easy to get, according to a survey recently released by the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse which measures alcohol and other drug use among fourth through sixth graders.

A total of 34,025 Texas public school students in grades four through six were randomly selected from school districts throughout the state. The students were asked questions concerning their use of tobacco, alcohol, inhalants and marijuana.

While the survey shows a general decrease in drug and alcohol use among fourth through sixth graders between 1990 and 1992, the use of tobacco and inhalants remained about the same. Lifetime use of alcohol decreased from 33 percent in 1990 to 33 percent in 1992, while use of alcohol in 1992 admitted ever drinking alcohol, compared to 42 percent in 1990.

"These results parallel the decreases we are seeing in the secondary school population, indicating that use of these substances is down across all grades," said Bob Dickson, Executive Director of TCADA. "While we are pleased that prevention efforts on alcohol and drug abuse which measures alcohol and other drug use among fourth through sixth graders.

What happens in elementary school sets the stage for events in later years. When fewer elementary students use alcohol and tobacco, fewer then go on to use marijuana in secondary school. Similarly, the fewer that use marijuana, the fewer that move on to use other drugs. Therefore, the factors that delay the onset of substance use among elementary students are exceedingly important.

The survey found that, on the average, sixth graders were 10 years old when they first tried alcohol, which is the same average age of first use as tobacco. Students were also asked whether they obtained the alcohol they

per cent claimed doing so several times per week. In addition, almost 18 percent reported having drunk five or more wine coolers in a row.

The survey also found that more Texas elementary students (19 percent) had used tobacco (cigarettes as well as smokeless tobacco) than any other substance except alcohol. Eleven percent of fourth graders, 18 percent of fifth graders and 27 percent of sixth graders have used tobacco. Twenty percent of sixth graders said cigarettes were very easy to obtain. Only 59 percent of fourth graders and 52 percent of fifth graders believe that it is "very dangerous" to smoke cigarettes

lower than the average for all eight substances, suggesting that fourth and fifth graders may be less fearful of cigarette smoking than using most of the other substances.

Other findings include:

- 3 percent of sixth graders have tried marijuana
- 17 percent of elementary students are unsure of their parents' attitude about kids their age drinking beer, and 13 percent do not know how parents feel about marijuana use; among secondary students these numbers are much lower (only 9 and 7 percent, respectively).
- 25 percent of fourth graders and 27 percent of fifth graders have been offered beer to drink.

The Texas School Survey is a collaborative effort between the Commission and the Public Policy Research Institute at Texas A&M University.

Diet is school year; two 'very dangerous' to smoke cigarettes

HOUSTON — Your mother was right when she said, "You are what you eat."

Experts at the DeBakey Heart Center of Baylor College of Medicine and The Methodist Hospital in Houston agree what we eat plays an important role in reducing heart disease risk, controlling high blood pressure and diabetes, and preventing and treating obesity.

Eating for good health does not require large doses of vitamins and minerals or purchasing special foods, according to Lynne Scott, R.D., director of Baylor's Diet Modification Clinic and co-author of "The Living Heart Diet" and "The Living Heart Brand Name Shopper's Guide."

The key to healthy eating, Scott said, is eating a well-balanced diet that includes a variety of foods.

For healthy eating, Scott recommends following the basic, daily guidelines of the American Heart Association and the National Cholesterol Education Program:

- Less than 30 percent of calories from fat (To determine grams of fat for the whole day, multiply your daily calories by 0.20 and divide by 9).
- Less than 10 percent of calories from saturated fat such as meat fat, poultry skin, butter, fat in dairy products, tropical oils, cocoa butter and coconut. To determine grams of saturated fat for the whole day, divide total grams of fat by 3.
- 50 to 55 percent of calories from carbohydrates such as bread, cereal, pasta and starchy vegetables.
- 15 to 20 percent of calories from protein.
- Five servings of fruits and vegetables, preferably fresh or frozen.

"Consuming total calories to reach and maintain desirable body weight is important," Scott said. "In addition, Scott recommends that daily servings of meat, poultry and fish total no more than six ounces, cooked, and that dairy products be low-fat or fat-free. People who need to lower cholesterol should also limit egg yolks to three a week.

Recent research indicates antioxidants (vitamins A, C, and E and beta carotene) may help reduce risk for cancer, immune diseases, cataracts, aging and heart disease. Scott recommends selecting foods that are concentrated sources of these substances when choosing vegetables and fruits. Carrots, broccoli, spinach, yams, oranges and bananas are good choices.

"It is much better to get the vitamins and minerals we know are beneficial from food rather than from supplements," Scott said. "Supplements can cause side effects and consuming too much of some vitamins and minerals can be toxic."
